The sophomore left fielder is coming off a 5-for-9 day
 with seven RBIs in a doubleheader against Arkansas
 Little Rock on Tuesday. Johnson has eight hits in the last
 six games after starting the year with four hits in the first
 six contests.

SERIES PREVIEW

No. 16 Sooners are 9-3 on the season and continue their
 eight-game home stand this weekend against UCLA (2-
 7). The Bruins began the year ranked in the top 10 but
 have since fallen out of the polls since dropping their
 last four to ranked opponents. The three-game series
 starts on Friday, March 6 at 3 p.m. at L. Dale Mitchell
 Park. Game two is slated for a noon first pitch on Satur-
 day and the series concludes on Sunday at 1 p.m.

The Bruins, under eighth- year head coach John Savage,
 started the season 2-0 but have lost seven straight.
 UCLA was picked to finish second in the Pac 10 Confer-
 ence after finishing third with a 33-27 overall record
 (13-11 in conference play) in 2008. The Bruins return
 22 letterwinners from a squad that like OU, played in
 the championship game of a NCAA Regional in 2008.

UCLA has a 4.08 ERA and will start Rob Rasmussen (1-0,
 2.45 ERA), a lefty, in game one. Offensively, the Bruins
 are hitting .289 as a team with Casey Haerther leading
 the way with a .472 batting average, two homers and
 seven RBIs.

The Sooners and Bruins have met in nine previous
 games with UCLA holding a 5-4 edge. The Sooners have
 won two out of the last three meetings. The teams
 opened the 2008 season in Los Angeles and the Sooners
 split the two games against then-No. 1 UCLA. Six of the
 nine all-time meetings have taken place in postseason
 play, including the first meeting, a 5-3 OU win in the
 1992 NCAA Regional played in Starkeville, Miss.



HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY



Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to three NCAA Regional Finals, 127 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his four years at the helm of the OU program. In 2008, OU returned to the NCAA Tournament for the 31st time in program history, two years after Golloway became the second coach in

NCAA Division I history to guide his club to a Super Regional Appearance in his first year at the helm. The 2006 season was highlighted by the Sooners' 45-22 overall mark, a third-place finish in the Big 12 and an NCAA regional title, a program first since 1995.

The Sooners posted a 36-26-1 overall record during the 2008 campaign and advanced to the championship game of the NCAA Tempe Regional. Three Sooners, Aljay Davis, Aaron Baker and Mike Gosse were named to the all-tournament team giving OU such 13 honorees since Golloway took over at the end of the 2005 season.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 462-234-1 (.664). The winning percentage ranks in the top 25 nationally among active head coaches with a minimum of five years of experience.

In 2006, his first full year as head coach, Golloway guided the Sooners to a 45-22 mark, a third-place finish in the Big 12, an NCAA regional title and the program's first Super Regional appearance (format originated in 1999).

The Sooners' run in 2006 was the best in Norman since the 1994 and 1995 teams made back-to-back appearances in the College World Series. OU was one win away from reaching the program's 10th appearance in Omaha after Golloway and the Sooners dropped a best of three series to then-No. 1 Rice.

Not only did the Sooners enjoy a top 10 ranking for three weeks during the regular season, but they finished the year ranked No. 9 (Baseball America) and led the nation in fielding percentage with a .983 mark (highest in school history and the second best mark in NCAA history).

Golloway was named the eighth head baseball coach at the University of Oklahoma on July 15, 2005. His appointment was made after successful stints on the Sooner staff as an assistant and interim head coach, and a strong eight-year run as the head coach at Oral Roberts.

When Golloway took over the Sooners in 2005, the team was 23-20 with a seventh-place Big 12 mark of 7-11. The team won its last three Big 12 series to move its overall record to 35-26 and its Big 12 mark to 14-13, good for a fifth-place finish.

And the first 250 fans will receive schedule magnets and the team will sign autographs, weather permitting ... On Sunday, the first 250 fans will receive OU beanies and season ticket holders will receive a special gift and can attend an appreciation event inside the new indoor practice facility. After the game, kids can run the bases, weather permitting.

UP NEXT

The Sooners close out the eight-game home stand with three midweek games. OU hosts Cal on Monday, March 9 at 1 p.m. and then hosts Houston Baptist for a two-game set on March 10-11. Both games are slated to start at 3 p.m.

LAST TIME OUT

The Sooners swept their third doubleheader of the season with a pair of wins over visiting Arkansas Little Rock on Tuesday, March 3. OU won game one, 11-7, and then topped the Trojans in the night cap, 16-6, in eight innings.

SCORING RUNS

The Sooners have scored 10 or more runs in seven of the 12 games this season with a 11-plus runs average per contest. OU is 7-0 when they score 10-plus runs in a game in 2009. In addition, the Sooners are averaging 13 hits per game with 10 or more hits in all but three games. The Sooners are 8-1 when they connect for 10-plus hits in a contest.

OU IN BIG 12 RANKS

The Sooners can be found up and down the Big 12 statistics released on March 5. The Sooners' offense leads all conference teams in batting average (.364), runs (133), hits (156), doubles (33), triples (8), homers (17) and RBI's (120).

ONE-TWO PUNCH

Individually, Bryant Hernandez ranks first in batting average (.523), second in hits (23), runs (20) and doubles (5) and fifth in slugging percentage (.818). Jamie Johnson is not far behind as he ranks third in batting average (.490), first in slugging percentage (1.020), hits (24), triples (3) and runs (25) and second in doubles (5)..

JOHNSON LEADS OFF

Jamie Johnson has been highly successful as OU's leadoff hitter this season and for a majority of 2008. So far in 2009, Johnson has already equaled his home run total of five from a year ago. Five of Johnson's 10 career bombs, have led off a game, including three this season.

BAKER WALKING

Aaron Baker leads the Big 12 in walks with 14 on the season. The total was boosted on Tuesday during game one of the Arkansas Little Rock doubleheader. Baker walked four times in that game, a first for a Sooner since Feb. 21, 2004 when Eric Thornton was also issued four walks.

DOYLE AS THE NO. 1

Andrew Doyle has settled into his No. 1 spot in OU's rotation since making five starts in that role last season. After two starts in 2009 series openers, Doyle is 1-1 with 14 strikeouts (fourth in Big 12) in 13 innings pitched. In his seven career starts on Friday night, which includes the openers in the Big 12 Tourney and NCAA Regional in 2008, Doyle is averaging 5.4 strikeouts and 6 1/3 innings pitched per start.

THE BIG INNING

The Sooners have hit through the batting order on eight occasions this year and scored five or more runs in seven different frames. OU is 5-1 when the plate five or more runs in a game. The Sooners had two big innings in game three of the Western Illinois series and lost the second game of the San Diego series.

SOONER DEBUTS

Several newcomers have enjoyed successful debuts for Oklahoma in 2009. Half of the position players recorded a hit in their first game but none were bigger than freshman Cameron Seitzer's three-run homer in his debut. Not only did the long ball come in his first game, but in his first collegiate at-bat. On the mound, four of the six hurlers blanked the opposition in their first appearance and Jason Chowning posted a win in his first outing.

5-0 STARTS

Following the Feb. 24 win at San Diego, OU improved to 5-0. The last time OU started a season 5-0 was in 1998 when it rattled off 12 straight wins to begin the campaign.

NUMBER CHANGES

Two Sooners from the 2008 squad, Ryan Duke and Tyson Seng, will sport different numbers this season. Duke will go from No. 28 last season to No. 17 and Seng, No. 33 in 2008, will wear No. 8.

BASEBALL AMERICA TABS SOONERS NO. 16

The Sooners were slotted at No. 16 in *Baseball America's* top 25 preseason poll. The last time OU was ranked in the preseason was prior to the 2006 season, when the Sooners went on to win the NCAA Norman Regional. It also marks the highest preseason ranking for OU by Baseball America since the 1996 season when it appeared at No. 14.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

Oklahoma will face 12 opponents, for a total of 27 games, that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament, including nine teams that finished the season ranked in the top 25. Six of those opponents (Nebraska, Oklahoma State, San Diego, TCU, Texas A&M, Wichita State) posted 40 wins a year ago, while Texas A&M and Wichita State both advanced to the Super Regional round of the NCAA Tournament.

The Sooners will face seven of the teams ranked in *Baseball America's* preseason poll for a combined 18 games. Six of those contests will be played at L. Dale Mitchell Park with No. 12 UCLA (March 6-8) and No. 1 Texas A&M (May 15-17) coming to town for a pair of three-game series.

BAKER AND DOYLE NAMED TO WALLACE WATCH LIST

Juniors Aaron Baker and Andrew Doyle were named to the 2009 Preseason Brooks Wallace Award as announced by the College Baseball Foundation. The Wallace Award is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate baseball player in conjunction with the College Baseball Hall of Fame induction ceremonies. The 2009 award banquet will be at 7 p.m., Thursday, July 2, in the United Spirit Arena on the campus of Texas Tech University. The recognition marks the fifth consecutive year that a Sooner was named to the preseason list and the second consecutive season for Baker.

FACILITY UPGRADES

The new year brought several new additions to L. Dale Mitchell Park. OU added a player developmental facility which includes indoor hitting cages and a full-size practice infield. In addition, the Sooners upgraded the fan experience as a new sound system consisting of 20-plus speakers was added to accompany the new scoreboard in left field. The scoreboard also includes a full LED video display board and the entire structure stands 50-feet high.

COMING BACK FOR MORE

OU returns 18 letterwinners from the 2008 squad that appeared in the final game of the NCAA Tempe Regional, including seven position starters and nine pitchers that started a game on the mound last season. The deep pitching staff is led by five hurlers that made at least five starts in 2008. That excludes junior Stephen Porlier, who led OU with 99 innings and 99 strikeouts in 2007 before missing last season with surgery.

2010 SIGNING CLASS

The OU coaching staff inked 10 high school players, including four Oklahoma products, and six players from the junior college ranks. The Sooners concentrated on adding players to all areas of the field as the signing class features eight positions players and eight pitchers, including five left-handers.

Overall, 11 of the recruits are rated by Perfect Game Cross-checker as prospects for the 2009 MLB Draft.

OU's signees feature some of the best prep stars from the state in Brandon Bargas (LHP) and Austin Kirk (LHP/1B) from Owasso High School, Jarek Pritchard (OF) from Charles Page H.S. and Ryan Gibson (LHP) from Yukon H.S.

Rounding out the group of high school recruits are six talented players from the state of Texas with Abel Baker (C/1B), the brother of current Sooner Aaron Baker, from Denton H.S., Drew Harrison (1B) from Waxahachie H.S., Jordan John (LHP) from Calallen H.S., Chad Kettler (SS) from Coppell H.S., Jack Mayfield (SS) from Del Rio H.S. and Drew Verhagen (RHP) from Heath H.S.

The Sooners' junior college recruits include Danny Black (INF/OF) from Feather River C.C. (Calif.), Anthony Collazo (LHP) from Howard College (Texas), Rickey Eisenberg (OF) from Cypress College (Calif.), Zach Neal (RHP) from Howard College (Texas), Eric Ross (OF) from Grayson College (Texas) and Bobby Shore (RHP) from Palomar College (Calif.).

WEBCAST SCHEDULE

The University of Oklahoma Athletics Department will web cast 24 of the Sooners' 28 home games this season. The only games that will not be aired are; Feb. 21 (DH vs. Western Illinois), March 7 (UCLA) and April 11 (Texas Tech). The webcasts can be seen on Oklahoma All-Access, SoonerSports.com's premium site.

The entire 56-game regular season schedule will be broadcast live on the internet via Yahoo. In addition, KOKC 1520 AM will again serve as the flagship station of Sooner baseball and 40-plus games are scheduled to broadcast live.
