TUESDAY PREVIEW

- The No. 17 Sooners return to Norman for the home opener on Tuesday, March 2 against UT-Arlington at 3 p.m. Six of OU's next seven games will be played inside the friendly confines of L. Dale Mitchell Park, including this weekend's Sooner Classic.
- The Sooners are ranked No. 17 this week by Collegiate Baseball and No. 22 by the NCBWA and the USA Today/ESPN Coaches' poll.
- OU opened the season with seven road games and is 6-1 after topping Valpo and Richmond in the Jacksonville Invite last week.
- UTA is 2-4 after winning two out of three games at home against Missouri State | Starter: RHP Preston Beck (first appearance)
- The Mavericks return nine letterwinners from last year's team that was 30-26 overall and 19-13 in the Southland Conference (fifth). UTA was picked to finish sixth in the Southland this season.

SERIES HISTORY

- The Sooners are seeking revenge after dropping an 8-5 contest at UT-Arlington last season. The defeat snapped the Sooners' four-game winning streak against the Mavericks. The series has been about streaks as UTA won six straight games from 2002-2004 and OU won 10 straight from 1989-2001.

- The first meeting was a 9-3 victory for OU during the 1972 home opener on March 7. Overall, 13 of the contest have been decided by three runs or less, with OU owning a 7-6 advantage, including a 3-3 mark in one-run games.

PLAYER TO WATCH**DANNY BLACK**

The junior second baseman is just one of several newcomers contributing early in the season. Black is the only Sooner to hit safely in all seven games and he ranks second on Oklahoma's

roster with 10 hits and seven RBIs. Black has made every start at second base and has one error.

HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY

Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to four NCAA Regional Finals, 170 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his five years at the helm of the OU program. In 2009, the Sooners were awarded the program's first national seed (No. 7) in the NCAA Tournament.

The 2009 season was highlighted by Oklahoma hosting another NCAA Regional and making its 32nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Sooners were 43-20 overall and 17-10 in Big 12 play.

OU finished half of a game out of first place in the conference standings in 2009 and also dominated the award circuit with seven All-Big 12 honorees, including the Big 12 Player of the Year in J.T. Wise and the Big 12 Freshman of the Year in Garrett Buechele. The league honors were program firsts since the Big 12's inception in 1997 and were followed up by Wise being named a consensus All-American and the first Sooner to be given the Johnny Bench Award (top catcher).

Wise was one of four Sooners awarded All-America status in 2009 and joined a group of nine Sooners to be selected in the 2009 MLB Draft, a Big 12 high last season. The nine selections tied the nine selected under Golloway in 2006, the third most in program history. Since 2005, 29 Sooners have been drafted under Golloway at the helm.

The 2009 season was the second time the Sooners hosted a NCAA Regional in four years. In 2006, Golloway led OU to the NCAA Norman Regional title and became the second coach in NCAA Division I history to guide his club to a Super Regional Appearance in his first year at the helm. The NCAA regional title was a program first since 1995.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 505-254-1 (.665). The winning percentage ranks in the top 15 nationally among active head coaches (minimum five years).

LAST TIME OUT

The Sooners went 2-1 in the Jacksonville Invitational wrapping up a seven-game road trip to begin the 2010 campaign at 6-1. OU topped Valparaiso, 12-9, in the opener and also posted an 11-3 victory in Sunday's finale against Richmond. The Sooners' lone loss of the weekend came on Saturday opposite host Jacksonville in a 4-3 defeat.

HOME OPENERS

Since 1962, OU is 44-4 in home openers and has won 28 straight, including a 4-0 mark under head coach Sunny Golloway. The last lost came in 1981 against Southeastern State L, 5-6). During OU's four openers under Golloway, the offense has outscored the opposition 39-8.

JUST FOR OPENERS - AFTER 7 GAMES

The Sooners' 6-1 start is the best under Sunny Golloway when looking at the first seven games of a season. The 2006 and 2009 clubs were 5-2. The last time OU started 6-1 was in 2004, Golloway's first year back to Norman as an assistant. That team was 8-1 before suffering its second loss.

5-0 STARTS

Despite suffering its first loss on Feb. 27, OU won five straight games to begin 2010. The last time an OU team started a season 5-0 was in 2009 when the Sooners rattled off five straight wins to begin the campaign. In 1998, OU recorded its longest undefeated streak to start a season with a 12-0 mark.

COAST-TO-COAST

In the first two weekends of the season, the Sooners traveled coast-to-coast with stops in San Diego, Calif., and Jacksonville, Fla. The total mileage covered in those trips to and from Norman total is 5,158. The trek from Norman to San Diego in week one was a round trip of 2,750 miles, while the journey to Jacksonville covers 2,408 miles.

SCORING FIRST

OU has scored first in four of the five games this season with a 3-1 record in those contests. The opposition has tallied the game's first run on two occasions, but OU is 2-0 in those situations.

THE BIG INNING

OU has hit through the batting order already three times this season, twice in game two of the SDSU series and once against Richmond. OU accomplished the feat on 23 occasions last year. That 2009 team also scored five or more runs in 22 different frames. In 2010, OU has scored five or more runs in three different frames, twice in game two of the SDSU series and vs. Valpo.

TIME FOR A RALLY

The Sooners have come from behind to win two of the seven games this season. Of Sunny Golloway's 174 wins at OU, 88 (.506) have been in come-from-behind fashion, including 22 last year. Below is a breakdown of the 2010 comebacks:

DOUBLE DIGITS

The Sooners have recorded 10 or more hits in six of the first seven games of the season. OU is averaging 12.4 hits per game despite losing five regular starters from last season's club. The Sooners are also averaging 9.14 runs per game with three games with 10 or more scores, including the 17 in game two of the San Diego State series, the most since exploding for 29 runs on March 22, 2009 at Kansas State.

OU ranks second in the Big 12 in batting average (.341), hits (87) and runs (64).

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

Prior to the season, OU Head Coach Sunny Golloway discussed the fact that the 2010 team was the deepest he has tutored in 13 years as a DI head coach. During the opening weekend, Golloway used all 33 players that traveled to San Diego, including 15 newcomers. OU used 30 in week two at the Jacksonville Invitational. Only two players on the 2010 35-man roster have not seen action (Jordan John and Michael Whitney).

BUECHELE, ERBEN & HUBBARD NAMED CAPTAINS

Seniors Jeremy Erben and Ross Hubbard and sophomore Garrett Buechele were voted as the 2010 captains by their teammates back in October during the team's annual visit to Willow Springs Boys Ranch in Chandler, Okla. All three are first time captains.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

Overall, Oklahoma will face 11 opponents, for a total of 27 games, that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament, including four non-conference opponents in Arkansas, Jacksonville, San Diego State and TCU.

Five of the 11 NCAA participants from 2009 (Arkansas, Kansas State, San Diego State, TCU and Texas) recorded 40 or more wins a year ago, while Arkansas (College World Series), TCU (Super Regional) and Texas (College World Series) advanced deep into the tournament.

DUKE ON PRESEASON LISTS

Junior closer Ryan Duke was named a 2010 preseason All-American by the NCBWA and was also selected to the Stopper of the Year watch list. Duke was named a third team All-American in 2009 and is the first Sooner since David Purcey in 2003, now with the Toronto Blue Jays, to appear on a preseason AA list.

DUKE MOVING UP SAVES LIST

Ryan Duke recorded two saves on the opening weekend to move into sole possession of second place on OU's all-time saves list. Duke had the second best season in Sooner history in regards to saves recorded with 16 in 2009 (Jeff Bajenaru - 20, 2000). Duke led the Big 12 in that category in 2009 and ranked sixth in the nation. He currently is tied for the Big 12 lead in 2010 with three saves.

DRAFTED SOONERS

Nine current Sooners have been drafted in their careers (third most in Big 12 this season), including four newcomers on the 2010 squad that were selected in 2009. (Danny Black, Ryan Gibson, Chad Kettler and Bobby Shore). Last season, OU led all Big 12 programs with nine players selected off the 2009 roster. SOONERS WIN CLOSE ONES UNDER GOLLOWAY

Since 2005, OU is 50-19-1 (.721) in one-run games under Golloway, the best winning percentage in the Big 12 in that span heading into 2010. In addition, OU is 15-2-1 in extra innings under Golloway since the end of the 2005 season. The two losses came at Arkansas in 2009 and vs. Missouri in 2008 (tie at Nebraska in 2008). The Sooners were 3-1 last season.

BACK-TO-BACK PRESEASON POLLS

The Sooners will start the 2010 season ranked in three of the four major polls. The last time Oklahoma started consecutive seasons ranked in one of the preseason top 25 polls was prior to the 1995 (No. 3) and 1996 campaigns (No. 14). The Sooners started last season ranked No. 16 according to Baseball America.

BASEBALL ON KREF 1400 AM IN 2010

The 2010 season marks the first with KREF 1400 AM serving as the flagship station of Sooner baseball and the new partnership provides expanded coverage for OU fans to listen to 50-plus regular season games over the air. Additionally, 22 of the Big 12 games are set to be carried on the Sooners Sports' Network, enabling fans to listen to OU baseball on various stations across the state starting on April 1, nearly double the amount from previous seasons.

The entire 56-game regular season schedule will be broadcast live for free on SoonerSports.com.

SOONER SPORTS NETWORK TO TELEVISION 20 OU GAMES

The University of Oklahoma will locally televise 19 home baseball games for the 2010 season. The broadcasts will air via the Sooner Sports Network on Cox Channel 7 in Oklahoma City and Cox Channel 3 in Tulsa. The games will be simulcast with the OU radio broadcast on the Sooner Sports Network with Chuck Kelly calling the play-by-play and DeWayne Vaughn providing the color analysis. The first game can be seen on Wednesday, March

GOLLOWAY BY THE NUMBERS

1994 - The last season OU won a National Championship, Golloway was an OU assistant.

505 - Golloway has accumulated 505 wins over his 13 years as a head coach. Excluding the 2005 season where he won 12 of 18 games as an interim head coach, Golloway has averaged 40-plus wins per season.

100 - Golloway reached the 100-win plateau at OU in his 154th game. The total was achieved in 2008, his third full season at the helm, tied for the best mark in program history.

67 - Golloway has coached 67 all-conference honorees at Oklahoma and Oral Roberts. In the last five years, 34 Sooners have garnered All-Big 12 accolades, including J.T. Wise and Garrett Buechele in 2009, the Big 12 Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year, respectively.

53 - The number of players taken in the MLB Draft during Golloway's 13 seasons as a head coach. As an assistant and head coach at OU, 61 Sooners have been drafted under him.

15 - Golloway's .665 winning percentage ranks in the top 15 among active coaches in Division I baseball.

8 - The number of 40-plus win seasons that Golloway has led his teams to as a head coach, including eight of the last 10 years.

5 - Golloway has been a part of the Sooners' last five regional titles (2006, 1995, 1994 and 1992) and last three College World Series Appearances (1995, 1994 and 1992).



HOME RUN NOTES

1 - Max White homered in his first official at-bat against Jacksonville on Feb. 27. It came during White's first start as a Sooner. He walked earlier in the year as a pinch hitter.

2 - Tyler Ogle hit the Sooners' first grand slam of 2010 in game two and Garrett Buechele later added one against Valpo. OU has had at least one four-run homer in each of the last seven seasons, including three in 2009.

3 - OU has recorded multiple-homer outings in three of the seven games this year, including a season-high three in game two of the SDSU series. The Sooners had 18 multi-HR games in 2009.

4 - Garrett Buechele, who leads OU in 2010 with two homers, had four dingers in 2009.

6 - Six of the Sooners' eight home runs have come with two outs on the board. In addition, six of the dingers have been solo shots.

7 - The Sooners have cracked four of their 10 homers in the seventh inning or later this year.

9 - OU had nine homers after the first seven games a year ago. Nine different Sooners have combined to clear the fences 10 times in 2010.

24 - The Sooners cracked 91 home runs a year ago, the most since the 1998 OU club. Only 24 of those dingers return in 2010, including seven from Casey Johnson.

33 - For the second consecutive season, No. 33 Cameron Seitzer homered on opening day. In his first at-bat as a freshman, Seitzer homered in the 2009 opener vs. Western Illinois.

CLEARING THE FENCES
