• Oklahoma is off to its best start since 1998 (12-1) and is ranked as high as No. 15 this week by the *USA Today*/ESPN Coaches' poll.

• *Dallas Baptist*, an independent, returns 20 letterwinners from the 2009 club that was 38-17 overall. The Patriots (7-4) opened the year with a three-game sweep of UT-Arlington and are 0-2 against the Big 12 with losses against Texas and Texas Tech.

HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY

Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to four NCAA Regional Finals, 170 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his five years at the helm of the OU program. In 2009, the Sooners were awarded the program's first national seed (No. 7) in the NCAA Tournament.

The 2009 season was highlighted by Oklahoma hosting another NCAA Regional and making its 32nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Sooners were 43-20 overall and 17-10 in Big 12 play.

OU finished half of a game out of first place in the conference standings in 2009 and also dominated the award circuit with seven All-Big 12 honorees, including the Big 12 Player of the Year in J.T. Wise and the Big 12 Freshman of the Year in Garrett Buechele. The league honors were program firsts since the Big 12's inception in 1997 and were followed up by Wise being named a consensus All-American and the first Sooner to be given the Johnny Bench Award (top catcher).

Wise was one of four Sooners awarded All-America status in 2009 and joined a group of nine Sooners to be selected in the 2009 MLB Draft, a Big 12 high last season. The nine selections tied the nine selected under Golloway in 2006, the third most in program history. Since 2005, 29 Sooners have been drafted under Golloway at the helm.

The 2009 season was the second time the Sooners hosted a NCAA Regional in four years. In 2006, Golloway led OU to the NCAA Norman Regional title and became the second coach in NCAA Division I history to guide his club to a Super Regional Appearance in his first year at the helm. The NCAA regional title was a program first since 1995.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 505-254-1 (.665). The winning percentage ranks in the top 15 nationally among active head coaches (minimum five years).

UP NEXT

OU plays in its third and final regular season tournament of the year at the Whataburger Classic in Corpus Christi, Texas. The Sooners will play Mississippi State, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and UCLA in the tournament.

LAST TIME OUT

The Sooners recorded five victories in as many games this week starting with UT-Arlington on Tuesday in the home opener. Over the weekend, OU hosted the Sooner Classic and posted victories over South Florida (twice), Western Illinois and Stephen F. Austin.

QUICK HITS

- OU ranks third in the Big 12 in batting average (.323) and ERA (3.48).
- Garrett Buechele ranks in the top five of eight offensive categories in the Big 12 and has nine multiple hit games.
- Buechele and Cameron Seitzer are tied for the Big 12 lead in homers with four. Buechele has already tied his total from 2009 while Seitzer has surpassed his (three).
- Danny Black has hit safely in 10 of OU's 12 games and owns a team-best eight-game hitting streak.
- Ryan Duke is a perfect 5-for-5 in save situations this year and leads the Big 12 in that category.
- Jeremy Erben leads the Big 12 with five wins and seven appearances and ranks second with a 0.57 ERA.
- Black (2B), Buechele (3B) and Caleb Bushyhead (SS) are the only Sooners to start every game.

BEST START SINCE 1998

After 12 games, OU is off to its best start under Golloway. The Sooners have started a season 11-1 on six different occasions in program history and the 1998 club was the last to do so (12-1). Other Sooner teams to start 11-1 include 1991 (11-1), 1985 (23-1), 1984 (11-1) and 1981 (22-1).

SCORING FIRST

OU has scored first in seven of the 12 games this season with a 6-1 record in those contests. The opposition has tallied the game's first run on five occasions, but OU is 5-0 in those games.

ONE-RUN GAMES

The Sooners have recorded one-run victories in four of the last five games. OU is 4-1 in those situations this year and the Sooners are 54-20-1 (.727) under head coach Sunny Golloway. The Sooners' skipper entered 2010 with the best winning percentage among Big 12 coaches over the last five years.

BULLPEN IN LAST FOUR GAMES

The Sooner bullpen combined to throw 15 innings in the four games of the Sooner Classic. In that span, the relievers have held the opposition scoreless and allowed six hits and five walks while striking out 23 hitters. Jeremy Erben recorded all four wins in those games.

THE BIG INNING

OU has hit through the batting order already three times this season, twice in game two of the SDSU series and once against Richmond. OU accomplished the feat on 23 occasions last year. That 2009 team also scored five or more runs in 22 different frames. In 2010, OU has scored five or more runs in four different frames, twice in game two of the SDSU series and versus and Western Illinois.

TIME FOR A RALLY

The Sooners have come from behind to win five of the 12 games this season. Of Sunny Golloway's 182 wins at OU, 91 (.500) have been in come-from-behind fashion, including 22 last year. Below is a breakdown of the 2010 comebacks:

DOUBLE DIGITS

The Sooners have recorded 10 or more hits in eight of the first 12 games of the season. OU is averaging 11 hits per game despite losing five regular starters from last season's club. The Sooners are also averaging 7.83 runs per game with four games with 10 or more scores, including the 17 posted in game two of the San Diego State series, the most since exploding for 29 runs on March 22, 2009 at Kansas State. OU leads the Big 12 with 17 homers and ranks second in hits (132), runs (94) and third in batting average (.323).

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

Prior to the season, OU Head Coach Sunny Golloway discussed the fact that the 2010 team was the deepest he has tutored in 13 years as a DI head coach. During the opening weekend, Golloway used all 33 players that traveled to San Diego, including 15 newcomers. OU used 30 in week two at the Jacksonville Invitational. Only two players on the 2010 35-man roster have not seen action (Jordan John and Michael Whitney).

TOUGH SCHEDULE

Overall, Oklahoma will face 11 opponents, for a total of 27 games, that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament, including four non-conference opponents in Arkansas, Jacksonville, San Diego State and TCU. Five of the 11 NCAA participants from 2009 (Arkansas, Kansas State, San Diego State, TCU and Texas) recorded 40 or more wins a year ago, while Arkansas (College World Series), TCU (Super Regional) and Texas (College World Series) advanced deep into the tournament.

DUKE MOVING UP SAVES LIST

Ryan Duke recorded two saves on the opening weekend to move into sole possession of second place on OU's all-time saves list (below). Duke led the Big 12 in saves with 16 last year (ranked sixth in the nation), the second most in a single season by a Sooner (Jeff Bajenaru - 20, 2000).

He currently leads the Big 12 lead in 2010 with five saves.

DUKE ON PRESEASON LISTS

Junior closer Ryan Duke was named a 2010 preseason All-American by the NCBWA and was also selected to the Stopper of the Year watch list. Duke was named a third team All-American in 2009 and is the first Sooner since David Purcey in 2003, now with the Toronto Blue Jays, to appear on a preseason AA list.

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OGLE ON JOHNNY BENCH WATCH LIST

Sophomore catcher/DH Tyler Ogle was named to the Johnny Bench watch list for 2010 on March 2. Ogle caught in 10 games last year, including eight starts behind J.T. Wise (2009 winner). Wise became the first Sooner to collect the award in program history and just the second in Big 12 history.

BUECHELE, ERBEN & HUBBARD NAMED CAPTAINS

Seniors Jeremy Erben and Ross Hubbard and sophomore Garrett Buechele were voted as the 2010 captains by their teammates back in October during the team's annual visit to Willow Springs Boys Ranch in Chandler, Okla. All three are first time captains.

DRAFTED SOONERS

SOONERS WIN CLOSE ONES UNDER GOLLOWAY

Since 2005, OU is 50-19-1 (.721) in one-run games under Golloway, the best winning percentage in the Big 12 in that span, heading into 2010. In addition, OU is 15-2-1 in extra innings under Golloway since the end of the 2005 season. The two losses came at Arkansas in 2009 and vs. Missouri in 2008 (tie at Nebraska in 2008). The Sooners were 3-1 last season.

BACK-TO-BACK PRESEASON POLLS

The Sooners will start the 2010 season ranked in three of the four major polls. The last time Oklahoma started consecutive seasons ranked in one of the preseason top 25 polls was prior to the 1995 (No. 3) and 1996 campaigns (No. 14). The Sooners started last season ranked No. 16 according to Baseball America.

BASEBALL ON KREF 1400 AM IN 2010

The 2010 season marks the first with KREF 1400 AM serving as the flagship station of Sooner baseball and the new partnership provides expanded coverage for OU fans to listen to 50-plus regular season games over the air. Additionally, 22 of the Big

12 games are set to be carried on the Sooners Sports' Network, enabling fans to listen to OU baseball on various stations across the state starting on April 1, nearly double the amount from previous seasons.

The entire 56-game regular season schedule will be broadcast live for free on SoonerSports.com.

SOONER SPORTS NETWORK TO TELEVIEW 20 OU GAMES

The University of Oklahoma will locally televise 19 home baseball games for the 2010 season. The broadcasts will air via the Sooner Sports Network on Cox Channel 7 in Oklahoma City and Cox Channel 3 in Tulsa. The games will be simulcast with the OU radio broadcast on the Sooner Sports Network with Chuck Kelly calling the play-by-play and DeWayne Vaughn providing the color analysis. The first game can be seen on Wednesday, March 10 against Houston Baptist at 3 p.m.

GOLLOWAY BY THE NUMBERS

1994 - The last season OU won a National Championship, Golloway was an OU assistant.

505 - Golloway has accumulated 505 wins over his 13 years as a head coach. Excluding the 2005 season where he won 12 of 18 games as an interim head coach, Golloway has averaged 40-plus wins per season.

100 - Golloway reached the 100-win plateau at OU in his 154th game. The total was achieved in 2008, his third full season at the helm, tied for the best mark in program history.

67 - Golloway has coached 67 all-conference honorees at Oklahoma and Oral Roberts. In the last five years, 34 Sooners have garnered All-Big 12 accolades, including J.T. Wise and Garrett Buechele in 2009, the Big 12 Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year, respectively.

53 - The number of players taken in the MLB Draft during Golloway's 13 seasons as a head coach. As an assistant and head coach at OU, 61 Sooners have been drafted under him.



HOME RUN NOTES

1 - Max White homered in his first official at-bat against Jacksonville on Feb. 27. It came during White's first start as a Sooner. He walked earlier in the year as a pinch hitter.

2 - Tyler Ogle hit the Sooners' first grand slam of 2010 in game two and Garrett Buechele later added one against Valpo and Cameron Seitzer had OU's third vs. Western Illinois. OU has had at least one four-run homer in each of the last seven seasons, including three in 2009.

3 - OU has recorded multiple-homer outings in five of the 12 games this year, including a season-high three in game two of the SDSU series. The Sooners had 18 multi-HR games in 2009.

4 - Garrett Buechele and Cameron Seitzer are tied for the Big 12 lead in homers with four.

8 - Eight of the Sooners' 17 home runs have come with two outs on the board. In addition, 10 of the dingers have been solo shots.

7 - The Sooners have cracked seven of their 17 homers in the seventh inning or later this year.

7 - OU has cracked seven homers that have broke ties or put the Sooners ahead this season.

17 - OU also had 17 homers after the first 12 games a year ago. 11 different Sooners have combined to clear the fences 10 times in 2010.

24 - The Sooners cracked 91 home runs a year ago, the most since the 1998 OU club. Only 24 of those dingers return in 2010, including seven from Casey Johnson.

33 - For the second consecutive season, No. 33 Cameron Seitzer homered on opening day. In his first at-bat as a freshman, Seitzer homered in the 2009 opener vs. Western Illinois.
