**PLAYER TO WATCH - RYAN DUKE**

The sophomore closer was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Pitcher of the week and earned national distinction as part of the Collegiate Baseball Foundation's All-Star lineup for week three after posting three saves and allowing one hit in three games vs. UCLA last weekend.

**WEEKEND PREVIEW**

Winners of its last eight games and 10 of the last 11, the No. 15 University of Oklahoma baseball team travels to Tampa, Fla., for the USF Bulls Baseball Classic. The tournament marks the final non-conference weekend for the Sooners who begin Big 12 play next weekend.

OU kicks off the weekend against Bethune Cookman (8-7) on Friday at 2 p.m. CST at Red McEwen Field on the USF campus. On Saturday, the Sooners battle the host Bulls (7-5) at 6 p.m. before concluding action on Sunday against Eastern Illinois (6-4) at 11 a.m.

Friday's meeting Bethune Cookman will be the first in the series.

The Sooners and Bulls have met in five previous games with OU holding a 3-2 edge. The Sooners won the last two meetings in 2008 in Tampa. OU won game one, 6-1, and topped the Bulls in game two, 7-5. The first meeting came during the 1981 season and resulted in a 9-3 Sooner victory, also in Tampa.

Oklahoma and Eastern Illinois have met eight times in the series but not since the 2005 season. The Sooners have won all eight games, including a three-game sweep the last time they played the Panthers in 2005.

### HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY



Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to three NCAA Regional Finals, 127 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his four years at the helm of the OU program. In 2008, OU returned to the NCAA Tournament for the 31st time in program history, two years after Golloway became the second coach in

NCAA Division I history to guide his club to a Super Regional Appearance in his first year at the helm. The 2006 season was highlighted by the Sooners' 45-22 overall mark, a third-place finish in the Big 12 and an NCAA regional title, a program first since 1995.

The Sooners posted a 36-26-1 overall record during the 2008 campaign and advanced to the championship game of the NCAA Tempe Regional. Three Sooners, Aljay Davis, Aaron Baker and Mike Gosse were named to the all-tournament team giving OU such 13 honorees since Golloway took over at the end of the 2005 season.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 462-234-1 (.664). The winning percentage ranks in the top 25 nationally among active head coaches with a minimum of five years of experience.

In 2006, his first full year as head coach, Golloway guided the Sooners to a 45-22 mark, a third-place finish in the Big 12, an NCAA regional title and the program's first Super Regional appearance (format originated in 1999).

The Sooners' run in 2006 was the best in Norman since the 1994 and 1995 teams made back-to-back appearances in the College World Series. OU was one win away from reaching the program's 10th appearance in Omaha after Golloway and the Sooners dropped a best of three series to then-No. 1 Rice.

Not only did the Sooners enjoy a top 10 ranking for three weeks during the regular season, but they finished the year ranked No. 9 (Baseball America) and led the nation in fielding percentage with a .983 mark (highest in school history and the second best mark in NCAA history).

Golloway was named the eighth head baseball coach at the University of Oklahoma on July 15, 2005. His appointment was made after successful stints on the Sooner staff as an assistant and interim head coach, and a strong eight-year run as the head coach at Oral Roberts.

When Golloway took over the Sooners in 2005, the team was 23-20 with a seventh-place Big 12 mark of 7-11. The team won its last three Big 12 series to move its overall record to 35-26 and its Big 12 mark to 14-13, good for a fifth-place finish.

### UP NEXT

The Sooners return home before heading to Fort Worth, Texas to battle No. 12 TCU on Tuesday, March 17. Following the non-conference game, OU opens Big 12 play at Kansas State on Friday, March 20 for a three-game set.

### LAST TIME OUT

The Sooners swept their fourth doubleheader of the season with a pair of wins over visiting Houston Baptist on Tuesday, March 10. OU won game one, 10-1, and then topped the Huskies in the night cap, 6-0.

### DUKE NAME BIG 12/NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore closer Ryan Duke was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Pitcher of the Week on Monday following his three saves in three consecutive days against UCLA. Two days later, Duke was named to the Collegiate Baseball Foundation's "National All-Star Lineup." Duke did not surrender a run or a walk in his 3 1/3 innings of relief against the Bruins and only gave up one hit while striking out four batters.

### BACK-TO-BACK COMPLETE GAMES

Michael Rocha and C.J. Blue achieved a rare feat during Tuesday's doubleheader against Houston Baptist as both starters went the distance to allow a combined 11 hits and zero earned runs in 18 innings of action. The last time two Sooners threw back-to-back complete games was during the 2001 season. On April 27 of that year, Evan Greusel lasted nine innings (seven hits, zero runs) to top visiting Centenary. The next day, also against the Gents, Austin Mix went the distance after giving up one run off two hits.

### 12-0 AT HOME

Oklahoma won its 12th game in as many chances on Tuesday night. The perfect start matches the second best beginning to a season by an OU team at home. The 1975 Sooners started the home campaign with a 12-0 mark while the 1974 team started 17-0.

### SCORING RUNS

The Sooners have scored 10 or more runs in eight of the 18 games this season with a 9.83 runs/game average. OU is 8-0 when they score 10-plus runs in a game in 2009. In addition, the Sooners are averaging 12 hits per game with 10 or more hits in all but five games. The Sooners are 12-1 when they connect for 10-plus hits in a contest.

### OU IN BIG 12 RANKS

The Sooners can be found up and down the Big 12 statistics released on March 12. The Sooners' offense leads all conference teams in batting average (.352), runs (177), hits (219), doubles (50), triples (9), homers (22) and RBI's (158).

### ONE-TWO PUNCH

The Sooners have a productive 1-2 punch at the top of the lineup and the proof is in the Big 12's top 10 statistics. Individually, Bryant Hernandez ranks first in hits (30), second in runs (20) and total bases (46), fourth in batting average (.435) and RBI's (19), and ninth in slugging percentage (.667). Jamie Johnson ranks first in runs scored (28), triples (3) and total bases (54), second in hits (28) and triples (3), fifth in RBI's (18), seventh in slugging percentage (.730) and 17th in batting average (.378).

### JOHNSON LEADS OFF

Jamie Johnson has been highly successful as OU's leadoff hitter this season and for a majority of 2008. So far in 2009, Johnson has already equaled his home run total of five from a year ago. Five of Johnson's 10 career bombs, have led off a game, including three this season.

### BAKER WALKING

Aaron Baker leads the Big 12 in walks with 18 on the season. The total was boosted on March 3 during game one of the Arkansas Little Rock doubleheader. Baker walked four times in that game, a first for a Sooner since Feb. 21, 2004 when Eric Thornton was also issued four walks.

### DOYLE AS THE NO. 1

Andrew Doyle has settled into his No. 1 spot in OU's rotation since making five starts in that role last season. After three starts in 2009 series openers, Doyle is 2-1 with 18 strikeouts in 19.1 innings pitched. In his eight career starts on Friday night, which includes the openers in the Big 12 Tourney and NCAA Regional in 2008, Doyle is averaging over five strikeouts a game and 6-plus innings pitched per start.

### THE BIG INNING

The Sooners have hit through the batting order on 10 occasions this year and scored five or more runs in eight different frames. OU is 6-1 when the plate five or more runs in a game. The only loss in came the second game of the San Diego series. The Sooners had two big innings in game three of the Western Illinois series.

#### SOONER DEBUTS

Several newcomers have enjoyed successful debuts for Oklahoma in 2009. Half of the position players recorded a hit in their first game but none were bigger than freshman Cameron Seitzer's three-run homer in his debut. Not only did the long ball come in his first game, but in his first collegiate at-bat. On the mound, four of the six hurlers blanked the opposition in their first appearance and Jason Chowning posted a win in his first outing.

#### 5-0 STARTS

Following the Feb. 24 win at San Diego, OU improved to 5-0. The last time OU started a season 5-0 was in 1998 when it rattled off 12 straight wins to begin the campaign.

#### NUMBER CHANGES

Two Sooners from the 2008 squad, Ryan Duke and Tyson Seng, will sport different numbers this season. Duke will go from No. 28 last season to No. 17 and Seng, No. 33 in 2008, will wear No. 8.

#### BASEBALL AMERICA TABS SOONERS NO. 16

The Sooners were slotted at No. 16 in *Baseball America's* top 25 preseason poll. The last time OU was ranked in the preseason was prior to the 2006 season, when the Sooners went on to win the NCAA Norman Regional. It also marks the highest preseason ranking for OU by Baseball America since the 1996 season when it appeared at No. 14.

#### TOUGH SCHEDULE

Oklahoma will face 12 opponents, for a total of 27 games, that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament, including nine teams that finished the season ranked in the top 25. Six of those opponents (Nebraska, Oklahoma State, San Diego, TCU, Texas A&M, Wichita State) posted 40 wins a year ago, while Texas A&M and Wichita State both advanced to the Super Regional round of the NCAA Tournament. The Sooners will face seven of the teams ranked in *Baseball America's* preseason poll for a combined 18 games. Six of those contests will be played at L. Dale Mitchell Park with No. 12 UCLA (March 6-8) and No. 1 Texas A&M (May 15-17) coming to town for a pair of three-game series.

#### BAKER AND DOYLE NAMED TO WALLACE WATCH LIST

Juniors Aaron Baker and Andrew Doyle were named to the 2009 Preseason Brooks Wallace Award as announced by the College Baseball Foundation. The Wallace Award is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate baseball player in conjunction with the College Baseball Hall of Fame induction ceremonies. The 2009 award banquet will be at 7 p.m., Thursday, July 2, in the United Spirit Arena on the campus of Texas Tech University. The recognition marks the fifth consecutive year that a Sooner was named to the preseason list and the second consecutive season for Baker.

#### FACILITY UPGRADES

The new year brought several new additions to L. Dale Mitchell Park. OU added a player developmental facility which includes indoor hitting cages and a full-size practice infield. In addition, the Sooners upgraded the fan experience as a new sound system consisting of 20-plus speakers was added to accompany the new scoreboard in left field. The scoreboard also includes a full LED video display board and the entire structure stands 50-feet high.

#### COMING BACK FOR MORE

OU returns 18 letterwinners from the 2008 squad that appeared in the final game of the NCAA Tempe Regional, including seven position starters and nine pitchers that started a game on the mound last season. The deep pitching staff is led by five hurlers that made at least five starts in 2008. That excludes junior Stephen Porlier, who led OU with 99 innings and 99 strikeouts in 2007 before missing last season with surgery.

#### 2010 SIGNING CLASS

The OU coaching staff inked 10 high school players, including four Oklahoma products, and six players from the junior college ranks. The Sooners concentrated on adding players to all areas of the field as the signing class features eight positions players and eight pitchers, including five left-handers. Overall, 11 of the recruits are rated by Perfect Game Crosschecker as prospects for the 2009 MLB Draft.

OU's signees feature some of the best prep stars from the state in Brandon Bargas (LHP) and Austin Kirk (LHP/1B) from Owasso High School, Jarek Pritchard (OF) from Charles Page H.S. and Ryan Gibson (LHP) from Yukon H.S.

Rounding out the group of high school recruits are six talented players from the state of Texas with Abel Baker (C/1B), the brother of current Sooner Aaron Baker, from Denton H.S., Drew Harrison (1B) from Waxahachie H.S., Jordan John (LHP) from Calallen H.S., Chad Kettler (SS) from Coppell H.S., Jack Mayfield (SS) from Del Rio H.S. and Drew Verhagen (RHP) from Heath H.S.

The Sooners' junior college recruits include Danny Black (INF/OF) from Feather River C.C. (Calif.), Anthony Collazo (LHP) from Howard College (Texas), Rickey Eisenberg (OF) from Cypress College (Calif.), Zach Neal (RHP) from Howard College (Texas), Eric Ross (OF) from Grayson College (Texas) and Bobby Shore (RHP) from Palomar College (Calif.).

#### WEBCAST SCHEDULE
