WEEKEND PREVIEW

Winner of 12 of the last 14 games, the No. 13 University of Oklahoma baseball team (17-4) travels to Fort Worth, Texas, to battle its second ranked opponent of the season, No. 14 TCU (10-4). First pitch on Tuesday, March 17 is slated for 6:30 p.m. at Lupton Stadium.

TCU hosted Minnesota over the weekend and lost the first two games. The third and final game of the series is on Monday night. TCU returns 19 letterwinners from a 2008 team that won the Mountain West Conference with a 19-5 record. TCU finished 44-19 overall last year after going 1-2 in the NCAA Coral Gables Regional.

The Sooners lead the all-time series with TCU, 47-21. OU won the first meeting in 2008 on April 15, 5-4 in 12 innings, in Fort Worth and completed the season sweep with an 11-6 win on April 22 in Norman.



PLAYER TO WATCH - MICHAEL ROCHA

The sophomore tossed the second complete game of his career on Tuesday with an eight-inning performance against Houston Baptist. Rocha surrendered just one run, unearned, off five hits and three walks. The hurler also struck out a season-high seven batters.

MORE ON THE OU-TCU SERIES:

- The teams have met each of the last 19 seasons dating back to 1991.
- In seven of the last nine meetings, the winner has tallied 10 or more runs. OU owns an 8-2 advantage in the last 10 meetings. Six of the last 13 meetings have been decided by one run (Meetings tied).
- Overall, OU is 11-4, when a game in the series is decided by one run
- From 1996 - 2000, the Sooners won nine straight meetings in the series, the longest winning streak by either team in the series.

Tuesday's game will be broadcast live on KOKC 1520 AM and on the internet via Oklahoma All-Access with Chuck Kelly calling the play-by-play. TCU's site, gofrogs.com, will provide a live video web cast. Live stats will be available on SoonerSports.com.

LAST TIME OUT

OU went 2-1 in the USF Bulls Baseball Classic and opened the tourney with a 5-4 victory in 10 innings over Bethune Cookman. On Saturday, OU topped the host Bulls, 10-1, before falling 8-6 to Eastern Illinois on Sunday.

HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY



Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to three NCAA Regional Finals, 127 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his four years at the helm of the OU program. In 2008, OU returned to the NCAA Tournament for the 31st time in program history, two years after Golloway became the second coach in

NCAA Division I history to guide his club to a Super Regional Appearance in his first year at the helm. The 2006 season was highlighted by the Sooners' 45-22 overall mark, a third-place finish in the Big 12 and an NCAA regional title, a program first since 1995.

The Sooners posted a 36-26-1 overall record during the 2008 campaign and advanced to the championship game of the NCAA Tempe Regional. Three Sooners, Aljay Davis, Aaron Baker and Mike Gosse were named to the all-tournament team giving OU such 13 honorees since Golloway took over at the end of the 2005 season.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 462-234-1 (.664). The winning percentage ranks in the top 25 nationally among active head coaches with a minimum of five years of experience.

In 2006, his first full year as head coach, Golloway guided the Sooners to a 45-22 mark, a third-place finish in the Big 12, an NCAA regional title and the program's first Super Regional appearance (format originated in 1999).

The Sooners' run in 2006 was the best in Norman since the 1994 and 1995 teams made back-to-back appearances in the College World Series. OU was one win away from reaching the program's 10th appearance in Omaha after Golloway and the Sooners dropped a best of three series to then-No. 1 Rice.

Not only did the Sooners enjoy a top 10 ranking for three weeks during the regular season, but they finished the year ranked No. 9 (Baseball America) and led the nation in fielding percentage with a .983 mark (highest in school history and the second best mark in NCAA history).

Golloway was named the eighth head baseball coach at the University of Oklahoma on July 15, 2005. His appointment was made after successful stints on the Sooner staff as an assistant and interim head coach, and a strong eight-year run as the head coach at Oral Roberts.

When Golloway took over the Sooners in 2005, the team was 23-20 with a seventh-place Big 12 mark of 7-11. The team won its last three Big 12 series to move its overall record to 35-26 and its Big 12 mark to 14-13, good for a fifth-place finish.

UP NEXT

OU opens Big 12 play on the road against Kansas State (15-3). The series begins on Friday, March 20 at 6:30 p.m. On Saturday, the teams meet at 2 p.m. before concluding the three-game set on Sunday at noon.

EXTRA INNINGS UNDER GOLLOWAY

OU is 2-0 this season in games played in extra innings with victories over Bethune Cookman (5-4 in 10 innings) and Washington State (game two, 9-7 in 11 innings). Since Golloway took over the helm of the Sooner program at the end of the 2005 season, OU is 14-1-1 in extra innings.

10-PLUS WINNING STREAKS

The Sooners' recent 10-game winning streak was the fourth under head coach Sunny Golloway since he took over the program four years ago. In addition, since 1962, OU has recorded 14 winning streaks over 10 games and Coach Golloway was at the head of three of those (13-2006, 11-2007 and 11-2008). The 13-game winning streak in 2006 is tied for the seventh best in school history.

LUCK OF THE IRISH

Tuesday's game marks the third time in the last four years that Oklahoma baseball will play a game on Saint Patrick's Day (March 17). The Sooners are 13-5 on that date since 1962 and Tuesday's game also marks the third time that OU will play TCU on the Irish Holiday. OU won 7-6 over TCU in 1998 in Fort Worth and 16-6 in 1998 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. In addition, the Sooners have scored 132 runs on that date (7.33 runs/game) and recorded a 3.92 margin of victory in the 13 wins. OU has won the close games with a 7-2 record when the game is decided by three runs or less and a 3-1 mark when one run is the difference.

TIME FOR A RALLY

The Sooners have come from behind to win 11 games this season, including two decisions in extra innings. Of Sunny Golloway's 144 wins at OU, 75 have been in come-from-behind fashion. Below is a breakdown of all of the comeback wins in 2009:

BACK-TO-BACK COMPLETE GAMES

Michael Rocha and C.J. Blue achieved a rare feat during Tuesday's doubleheader against Houston Baptist as both starters went the distance to allow a combined 11 hits and zero earned runs in 18 innings of action. The last time two Sooners threw back-to-back complete games was during the 2001 season. On April 27 of that year, Evan Greusel lasted nine innings (seven hits, zero runs) to top visiting Centenary. The next day, also against the Gents, Austin Mix went the distance after giving up one run off two hits.

12-0 AT HOME

Oklahoma won its 12th game in as many chances on March 10. The perfect start matches the second best by an OU team at home. The 1975 Sooners started the home campaign with a 12-0 mark while the 1974 team started 17-0.

SCORING RUNS

The Sooners have scored 10 or more runs in nine of the 21 games this season with a 9.43 runs/game average. OU is 9-0 when they score 10-plus runs in a game in 2009. In addition, the Sooners are averaging 11.67 hits per game with 10 or more hits in all but seven games. The Sooners are 13-1 when they connect for 10-plus hits in a contest.

OU IN BIG 12 RANKS

The Sooners can be found up and down the Big 12 statistics released on March 16. The Sooners' offense leads all conference teams runs (198), hits (245), doubles (54), triples (9), homers (25) and RBIs (178). OU is second in batting average with a .337 clip.

ONE-TWO PUNCH

The Sooners have a productive 1-2 punch at the top of the lineup and the proof is in the Big 12's top 10 statistics as of March 16. Individually, Bryant Hernandez ranks first in hits (34), second in runs (27), third in batting average (.420), total bases (51) and RBIs (22), and ninth in slugging percentage (.667). Jamie Johnson ranks first in runs scored (33), triples (3) and total bases (63), second in hits (28) and triples (3), third in home runs (6), fourth in RBIs (21) and slugging percentage (.741), seventh in on-base percentage (.485) and 10th in batting average (.388).

JOHNSON LEADS OFF

Jamie Johnson has been highly successful as OU's leadoff hitter this season and for a majority of 2008. So far in 2009, Johnson has already equaled his home run total of five from a year ago. Six of Johnson's 11 career bombs, have led off a game, including three this season.

MORE ON JOHNSON'S HOMERS

All but one of Jamie Johnson's team-leading six homers (third in the Big 12) this year have been game tying or go-ahead shots. His first HR against Western Illinois tied the game at one apiece. Against San Diego, his grand slam gave OU a 4-2 lead. In games 11 and 12 of the season against UALR, his leadoff homer gave OU a 1-0 lead. Finally, Johnson's solo homer against Bethune Cookman tied the game at one apiece.

BAKER WALKING

Aaron Baker leads the Big 12 in walks with 18 on the season. The total was boosted on March 3 during game one of the Arkansas Little Rock doubleheader. Baker walked four times in that game, a first for a Sooner since Feb. 21, 2004 when Eric Thornton was also issued four walks.

THE BIG INNING

The Sooners have hit through the batting order on 10 occasions this year and scored five or more runs in eight different frames. OU is 6-1 when the plate five or more runs in a game. The only loss in came the second game of the San Diego series. The Sooners had two big innings in game three of the Western Illinois series.

SOONER DEBUTS

Several newcomers have enjoyed successful debuts for Oklahoma in 2009. Half of the position players recorded a hit in their first game but none were bigger than freshman Cameron Seitzer's three-run homer in his debut. Not only did the long ball come in his first game, but in his first collegiate at-bat. On the mound, four of the six hurlers blanked the opposition in their first appearance and Jason Chowning posted a win in his first outing.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

Oklahoma will face 12 opponents, for a total of 27 games, that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament, including nine teams that finished the season ranked in the top 25. Six of those opponents (Nebraska, Oklahoma State, San Diego, TCU, Texas A&M, Wichita State) posted 40 wins a year ago, while Texas A&M and Wichita State both advanced to the Super Regional round of the NCAA Tournament. The Sooners will face seven of the teams ranked in *Baseball America's* preseason poll for a combined 18 games. Six of those contests will be played at L. Dale Mitchell Park with No. 12 UCLA (March 6-8) and No. 1 Texas A&M (May 15-17) coming to town for a pair of three-game series.

BAKER AND DOYLE NAMED TO WALLACE WATCH LIST

Juniors Aaron Baker and Andrew Doyle were named to the 2009 Preseason Brooks Wallace Award as announced by the College Baseball Foundation. The Wallace Award is presented annually to the nation's top collegiate baseball player in conjunction with the College Baseball Hall of Fame induction ceremonies. The 2009 award banquet will be at 7 p.m., Thursday, July 2, in the United Spirit Arena on

the campus of Texas Tech University. The recognition marks the fifth consecutive year that a Sooner was named to the preseason list and the second consecutive season for Baker.

FACILITY UPGRADES

The new year brought several new additions to L. Dale Mitchell Park. OU added a player developmental facility which includes indoor hitting cages and a full-size practice infield. In addition, the Sooners upgraded the fan experience as a new sound system consisting of 20-plus speakers was added to accompany the new scoreboard in left field. The scoreboard also includes a full LED video display board and the entire structure stands 50-feet high.

2010 SIGNING CLASS

The OU coaching staff inked 10 high school players, including four Oklahoma products, and six players from the junior college ranks. The Sooners concentrated on adding players to all areas of the field as the signing class features eight positions players and eight pitchers, including five left-handers. Overall, 11 of the recruits are rated by Perfect Game Crosschecker as prospects for the 2009 MLB Draft.

OU's signees feature some of the best prep stars from the state in Brandon Bargas (LHP) and Austin Kirk (LHP/1B) from Owasso High School, Jarek Pritchard (OF) from Charles Page H.S. and Ryan Gibson (LHP) from Yukon H.S.

Rounding out the group of high school recruits are six talented players from the state of Texas with Abel Baker (C/1B), the brother of current Sooner Aaron Baker, from Denton H.S., Drew Harrison (1B) from Waxahachie H.S., Jordan John (LHP) from Calallen H.S., Chad Kettler (SS) from Coppell H.S., Jack Mayfield (SS) from Del Rio H.S. and Drew Verhagen (RHP) from Heath H.S.

The Sooners' junior college recruits include Danny Black (INF/OF) from Feather River C.C. (Calif.), Anthony Collazo (LHP) from Howard College (Texas), Rickey Eisenberg (OF) from Cypress College (Calif.), Zach Neal (RHP) from Howard College (Texas), Eric Ross (OF) from Grayson College (Texas) and Bobby Shore (RHP) from Palomar College (Calif.).
