HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY

Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to four NCAA Regional Finals, 170 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his five years at the helm of the OU program. In 2009, the Sooners were awarded the program's first national seed (No. 7) in the NCAA Tournament.

The 2009 season was highlighted by Oklahoma hosting another NCAA Regional and making its 32nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Sooners were 43-20 overall and 17-10 in Big 12 play.

OU finished half of a game out of first place in the conference standings in 2009 and also dominated the award circuit with seven All-Big 12 honorees, including the Big 12 Player of the Year in J.T. Wise and the Big 12 Freshman of the Year in Garrett Buechele. The league honors were program firsts since the Big 12's inception in 1997 and were followed up by Wise being named a consensus All-American and the first Sooner to be given the Johnny Bench Award (top catcher).

Wise was one of four Sooners awarded All-America status in 2009 and joined a group of nine Sooners to be selected in the 2009 MLB Draft, a Big 12 high last season. The nine selections tied the nine selected under Golloway in 2006, the third most in program history. Since 2005, 29 Sooners have been drafted under Golloway at the helm.

The 2009 season was the second time the Sooners hosted a NCAA Regional in four years. In 2006, Golloway led OU to the NCAA Norman Regional title and became the second coach in NCAA Division I history to guide his club to a Super Regional Appearance in his first year at the helm. The NCAA regional title was a program first since 1995.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 505-254-1 (.665). The winning percentage ranks in the top 15 nationally among active head coaches (minimum five years).

UP NEXT

OU concludes the five-game home stretch with the first conference series of the season. Friday's Big 12 opener at L. Dale Mitchell is set for a 6:30 p.m. first pitch. Saturday's game is set for 2 p.m. and Sunday's finale is at 1 p.m. The Sooners swept the Bears last year in Waco and have won the last two Big 12 series.

LAST TIME OUT

The Sooners went 4-1 and extended their winning streak to 10 games before falling 5-2 in the finale of the Whataburger Collegiate Classic to No. 10 UCLA on Sunday. Prior to the second loss of the season, OU recorded three victories away from home (Dallas Baptist, Mississippi State and Texas A&M-CC), while topping Houston Baptist at home on Wednesday.

QUICK HITS

- OU ranks third in the Big 12 in batting (.328) and ERA (3.36).
- The Sooners have homered in nine straight contests with 13 in that span, including three multiple-homer games.
- OU has stolen 19 bases in the last nine games after starting off the year with 11 swipes in the first eight games. The Sooners stole eight base on march 13 vs. TAMUCC, the most in a game since OU had eight on Feb. 12, 2006 versus Western Illinois.
- Garrett Buechele is tied for the Big 12 with 29 hits and five homers and ranks in the top five of eight offensive categories overall.
- Buechele (5) and Cameron Seitzer (5) are tied for the Big 12 lead, respectively, in homers in the Big 12. Both have surpassed their 2009 totals.
- Ryan Duke is a perfect 6-for-6 in save situations this year and leads the Big 12 in that category. Duke led the Big 12 in 2009 after registering 16 saves in 18 opportunities.
- Jeremy Erben leads the Big 12 with five wins and ranks second with a 0.45 ERA. Erben entered 2010 with a career 1-4 record.
- Buechele (3B) and Caleb Bushyhead (SS) are the only Sooners to start every game.
- Bushyhead registered one hit in 22 games last season and already has 23 hits after 17 games in 2010. Bushyhead ranks second on OU with eight multiple-hit games.
- Chris Ellison has led off each of his last three starts by reaching base safely. Since returning to the leadoff role, Ellison has five hits and three walks and four stolen bases.
- Oklahoma has started 18 different players in the lineup after Jack Mayfield made his first start on Sunday vs. UCLA.
- Buechele, Erben, Ross Hubbard and Chris Ellison were named to the Whataburger Collegiate Classic all-tournament team.

BEST START SINCE 1998

After 17 games, OU is off to its best start under head coach Sunny Golloway. The last time the Sooners started a season with a 15-2 record was in 1998.

LATE-INNING PRODUCTION

OU has scored 58 of its 140 runs or 41 percent in the sixth inning and later. In addition, the Sooners have outscored the opposition, 31-7, in the eighth and ninth innings combined, which includes six home runs.

SCORING FIRST

OU has scored first in six of the last nine games and in 10 overall. OU has a 8-2 record in those contests. The opposition has tallied the game's first run on seven occasions, but OU is 7-0 in those games.

ONE-RUN GAMES

The Sooners have recorded one-run victories in four of the last 10 games. OU is 4-1 in those situations this year and the Sooners are 54-20-1 (.727) under head coach Sunny Golloway. The Sooners' skipper entered 2010 with the best winning percentage among Big 12 coaches over the last five years.

BULLPEN IN LAST 10 GAMES

The Sooner bullpen combined to throw 32.2 innings in the last 10 games with a 1.10 ERA. In that span, the relievers have allowed four earned runs off 22 hits and 12 walks, while striking out 46 hitters. Jeremy Erben recorded three wins in that span while Ryan Duke posted three saves.

THE BIG INNING

OU has hit through the batting order already five times this season, twice in game two of the SDSU series, once against Richmond, Mississippi State and Texas A&M-CC. OU accomplished the feat on 23 occasions last year. That 2009 team also scored five or more runs in 22 different frames. In 2010, OU has scored five or more runs in five different frames, twice in game two of the SDSU series and once versus Valparaiso, Western Illinois and Mississippi State.

TIME FOR A RALLY

The Sooners have come from behind to win seven of the 17 games this season. Of Sunny Golloway's 185 wins at OU, 93 (.503) have been in come-from-behind fashion, including 22 last year. Below is a breakdown of the 2010 comebacks:

DOUBLE DIGITS

The Sooners have recorded 10 or more hits in 12 of the first 17 games of the season, including a season-high 19 vs. Mississippi State. OU is averaging 11.65 hits per game despite losing five regular starters from last season's club. The Sooners are also averaging 8.24 runs per game with six games with 10 or more scores, including the 17 posted in game two of the San Diego State series, the most since exploding for 29 runs on March 22, 2009 at Kansas State. OU leads the Big 12 with 23 homers and 198 hits and ranks second in RBIs (129), runs (140) and third in batting average (.336).

DUKE MOVING UP SAVES LIST

Ryan Duke recorded two saves on the opening weekend to move into sole possession of second place on OU's all-time saves list (below). Duke led the Big 12 in saves with 16 last year (ranked sixth in the nation), the second most in a single season by a Sooner (Jeff Bajenaru - 20, 2000).

He currently leads the Big 12 lead in 2010 with six saves.

ATHLETICS COMMUNICATIONS

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DUKE ON PRESEASON LISTS

Junior closer Ryan Duke was named a 2010 preseason All-American by the NCBWA and was also selected to the Stopper of the Year watch list. Duke was named a third team All-American in 2009 and is the first Sooner since David Purcey in 2003, now with the Toronto Blue Jays, to appear on a preseason AA list.

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

Prior to the season, OU Head Coach Sunny Golloway discussed the fact that the 2010 team was the deepest he has tutored in 13 years as a DI head coach. During the opening weekend, Golloway used all 33 players that traveled to San Diego, including 15 newcomers. OU used 30 in week two at the Jacksonville Invitational. Only two players on the 2010 35-man roster have not seen action (Jordan John and Michael Whitney).

TOUGH SCHEDULE

Overall, Oklahoma will face 11 opponents, for a total of 27 games, that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament, including four non-conference opponents in Arkansas, Jacksonville, San Diego State and TCU. Five of the 11 NCAA participants from 2009 (Arkansas, Kansas State, San Diego State, TCU and Texas) recorded 40 or more wins a year ago, while Arkansas (College World Series), TCU (Super Regional) and Texas (College World Series) advanced deep into the tournament.

OGLE ON JOHNNY BENCH WATCH LIST

Sophomore catcher/DH Tyler Ogle was named to the Johnny Bench watch list for 2010 on March 2. Ogle caught in 10 games last year, including eight starts behind J.T. Wise (2009 winner). Wise became the first Sooner to collect the award in program history and just the second in Big 12 history.

BUECHELE, ERBEN & HUBBARD NAMED CAPTAINS

Seniors Jeremy Erben and Ross Hubbard and sophomore Garrett Buechele were voted as the 2010 captains by their teammates back in October during the team's annual visit to Willow Springs Boys Ranch in Chandler, Okla. All three are first time captains.

DRAFTED SOONERS

SOONERS WIN CLOSE ONES UNDER GOLLOWAY

Since 2005, OU is 50-19-1 (.721) in one-run games under Golloway, the best winning percentage in the Big 12 in that span, heading into 2010. In addition, OU is 15-2-1 in extra innings under Golloway since the end of the 2005 season. The two losses came at Arkansas in 2009 and vs. Missouri in 2008 (tie at Nebraska in 2008). The Sooners were 3-1 last season.

BACK-TO-BACK PRESEASON POLLS

The Sooners will start the 2010 season ranked in three of the four major polls. The last time Oklahoma started consecutive seasons ranked in one of the preseason top 25 polls was prior to the 1995 (No. 3) and 1996 campaigns (No. 14). The Sooners started last season ranked No. 16 according to Baseball America.

BASEBALL ON KREF 1400 AM IN 2010

The 2010 season marks the first with KREF 1400 AM serving as the flagship station of Sooner baseball and the new partnership provides expanded coverage for OU fans to listen to 50-plus regular season games over the air. Additionally, 22 of the Big 12 games are set to be carried on the Sooners Sports' Network, enabling fans to listen to OU baseball on various stations across the state starting on April 1, nearly double the amount from previous seasons.

The entire 56-game regular season schedule will be broadcast live for free on SoonerSports.com.

SOONER SPORTS NETWORK TO TELEVISION 20 OU GAMES

The University of Oklahoma will locally televise 19 home baseball games for the 2010 season. The broadcasts will air via the Sooner Sports Network on Cox Channel 7 in Oklahoma City and Cox Channel 3 in Tulsa. The games will be simulcast with the OU radio broadcast on the Sooner Sports Network with Chuck Kelly calling the play-by-play and DeWayne Vaughn providing the color analysis. The first game can be seen on Wednesday, March 10 against Houston Baptist at 3 p.m.

4 - Tyler Ogle hit the Sooners' first grand slam of 2010 in game two and Garrett Buechele later added one against Valpo and Cameron Seitzer had OU's third vs. Western Illinois. OU has had at least one four-run homer in each of the last seven seasons, including three in 2009.

5 - Garrett Buechele leads the Big 12 with five home runs after connecting for four in 2009. Cameron Seitzer is tied for the Big 12 lead with Buechele and also had four a year ago.

7 - OU has cracked eight homers that have broke ties or put the Sooners ahead this season.

9 - The Sooners have cracked nine of their 23 homers in the seventh inning or later this year.

11 - The Sooners have blasted 11 of their 23 home runs with two outs on the board. In addition, 12 of the dingers have been solo shots.

21 - OU had 21 homers after the first 17 games a year ago. 12 different Sooners have combined to clear the fences 23 times in 2010.

24 - The Sooners cracked 91 home runs a year ago, the most since the 1998 OU club. Only 24 of those dingers return in 2010, including seven from Casey Johnson.

33 - For the second consecutive season, No. 33 Cameron Seitzer homered on opening day. In his first at-bat as a freshman, Seitzer homered in the 2009 opener vs. Western Illinois.

CLEARING THE FENCES
