CORNHUSKERS**WEEKEND PREVIEW**

• No. 12 Oklahoma (18-2) has won 13 of their last 14 games and returns to the road for a three-game series at Nebraska (11-9, 1-2) this weekend ... The Huskers are a perfect 7-0 at home after topping Northern Colorado in a two-game set earlier this week ... OU is 9-2 away from home this year and this series marks the fourth road trip in the first six weekends of the season.

• OU sits atop the Big 12 standings and is off to its best start under Sunny Golloway and best since 1985. The Sooners are ranked as high as No. 12 this week by the *USA Today*/ESPN Coaches' poll.

• *Nebraska* returns 18 letterwinners from the 2009 team that was 25-28-1 overall (8-19, 10th in Big 12) ... The Huskers opened Big 12 play last weekend in Austin, Texas and suffered a 2-1 series defeat, including a three-run walk-off homer by Texas on Friday. Friday – RHP Casey Hauptman (1-2, 2.48) | Saturday – RHP Michael Mariot (2-2, 4.50) | Sunday – RHP Tom Lemke (3-1, 4.50)

SERIES HISTORY

• While OU won last year's series, 2-1, in Norman, the home team has not fared well in recent history ... In the previous six series meetings, the visiting team has come away with at least two victories ... Excluding 2009, the last time the home team won a series between OU and Nebraska was in 2002 in Lincoln ... In 39 all-time Big 12 games, OU and Nebraska have played 22 of those games decided by three runs or less, including nine of the last 13 meetings ... In those close contests, NU holds a 11-10-1 edge.

PLAYER TO WATCH**CHRIS ELLISON**

The sophomore has hit safely in a career-best seven straight games and has driven in 10 runs in that span. He is hitting .345 (10-for-29) during the streak with two home runs and five stolen bases.

Ellison has already equaled his homer total from his freshman season and is seven RBIs shy of tying the 2009 mark. In addition, the speedy outfielder has doubled his stolen base total from a year ago with eight in 2010.

HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY

Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to four NCAA Regional Finals, 170 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his five years at the helm of the OU program. In 2009, the Sooners were awarded the program's first national seed (No. 7) in the NCAA Tournament.

The 2009 season was highlighted by Oklahoma hosting another NCAA Regional and making its 32nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Sooners were 43-20 overall and 17-10 in Big 12 play.

OU finished half of a game out of first place in the conference standings in 2009 and also dominated the award circuit with seven All-Big 12 honorees, including the Big 12 Player of the Year in J.T. Wise and the Big 12 Freshman of the Year in Garrett Buechele. The league honors were program firsts since the Big 12's inception in 1997 and were followed up by Wise being named a consensus All-American and the first Sooner to be given the Johnny Bench Award (top catcher).

Wise was one of four Sooners awarded All-America status in 2009 and joined a group of nine Sooners to be selected in the 2009 MLB Draft, a Big 12 high last season. The nine selections tied the nine selected under Golloway in 2006, the third most in program history. Since 2005, 29 Sooners have been drafted under Golloway at the helm.

The 2009 season was the second time the Sooners hosted a NCAA Regional in four years. In 2006, Golloway led OU to the NCAA Norman Regional title and became the second coach in NCAA Division I history to guide his club to a Super Regional Appearance in his first year at the helm. The NCAA regional title was a program first since 1995.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 505-254-1 (.665). The winning percentage ranks in the top 15 nationally among active head coaches (minimum five years).

A LOOK BACK AT THE 2009 OU-NEBRASKA SERIES

The Sooners last met the Huskers in a three-game series in 2009 in Norman. The two split the first two games of the series, both decided by three runs or less (OU, 12-9; NU, 11-9), while the Sooners cruised 16-6 in the finale. Turn to page 11 for OU's career stats versus NU and results since 1964.

UP NEXT

OU returns home to begin a five-game home stand and a stretch that will feature eight of the next nine played at L. Dale Mitchell Park. It begins with a two-game series on March 30-31 against Arkansas-Pine Bluff and continues April 1-3 against No. 8 Texas.

LAST TIME OUT

The Sooners posted a 3-0 record in last week's action at home that was shortened due to a winter storm that hit Norman. OU started the week with a two-game sweep of visiting UMass on Tuesday and Wednesday and then won its third straight game with a 7-6 victory over Baylor in the Big 12 opener.

QUICK HITS

- OU ranks third in the Big 12 in batting (.328) and ERA (3.29).
- The OU bullpen is 9-0 with eight saves on the season with a 1.86 ERA with 97 Ks in 77.1 IP.
- The Sooners have homered in 13 straight contests with 17 in that span, including four multiple-homer games.
- OU has stolen at least one base in 11 of the last 12 games. The Sooners stole eight bases on March 13 vs. TAMUCC, the most in a game since OU had eight on Feb. 12, 2006 versus Western Illinois.
- Garrett Buechele ranks in the Big 12's top 10 in eight offensive categories.
- Buechele (5) and Cameron Seitzer (5) are tied for second in the Big 12 lead in homers in the Big 12. Both have surpassed their 2009 totals.
- Ryan Duke is a perfect 7-for-7 in save situations this year and leads the nation in that category.
- Jeremy Erben leads the Big 12 with five wins and a 0.39 ERA,

both marks rank second nationally. Erben entered 2010 with a career 1-4 record.

- Buechele (3B) and Caleb Bushyhead (SS) are the only Sooners to start every game.
- Bushyhead registered one hit in 22 games last season and already has 27 hits after 20 games in 2010. Bushyhead ranks second on OU with nine multiple-hit games.
- Oklahoma has started 18 different players in the lineup after Jack Mayfield made his first start vs. UCLA.
- Buechele, Erben, Ross Hubbard and Chris Ellison were named to the Whataburger Collegiate Classic all-tournament team.

ERBEN ON PITCHER WATCH LIST

Jeremy Erben is one of seven hurlers from the Big 12 named to the Pitcher of the Year watch list on March 23 as presented by the College Baseball Foundation. This is the second year for the award and it will be presented in Lubbock, Texas, on July 2 as part of the College Baseball Awards Show. He leads the Big 12 in wins (5) and ERA (0.39) and was named the Big 12 Pitcher of the Week for games played through March 7.

BIG 12 ROAD OPENERS

The Sooners have lost five straight Big 12 road openers, but have bounced back to win two of those series. OU's last win in a Big 12 road opener was in 2004 at Kansas. The Sooners are 2-11 all-time in Big 12 openers and have series victories in five of the 13 sets.

WINNING STREAKS

The 10-game winning streak from Feb. 28-March 13 marked the fifth time under OU Head Coach Sunny Golloway that the Sooners have won 10 or more consecutive games and the 26th in program history.

BEST START SINCE 1985

After 20 games, OU is off to its best start under head coach Sunny Golloway. The last time the Sooners started a season with a 18-2 record was in 1985. That team went 23-1 before suffering its second loss of the season.

LATE-INNING PRODUCTION

OU has scored 65 of its 159 runs, or 41 percent, in the sixth inning and later. In addition, the Sooners have outscored the opposition, 35-7, in the eighth and ninth innings combined, which includes seven home runs.

SCORING FIRST

OU has scored first in seven of the last 12 games and in 11 overall. OU has a 9-2 record in those contests. The opposition has tallied the game's first run in nine games, but OU is 9-0.

ONE-RUN GAMES

The Sooners have recorded one-run victories in five of the last 13 games. OU is 5-1 in those situations this year and the Sooners are 55-20-1 (.730) under head coach Sunny Golloway. The Sooners' skipper entered 2010 with the best winning percentage among Big 12 coaches over the last five years (.721).

BULLPEN IN LAST 13 GAMES

The Sooner bullpen combined to throw 48.2 innings in the last 13 games with a 1.29 ERA. In that span, the relievers have allowed seven earned runs off 32 hits and 17 walks, while striking out 61 hitters. Jeremy Erben recorded three wins and a save in that span while Ryan Duke posted four saves.

THE BIG INNING

OU has hit through the batting order already six times this season, twice in game two of the SDSU series, and once each against Richmond, Mississippi State, Texas A&M-CC and UMass (GM2). OU accomplished the feat on 23 occasions last year. That 2009 team also scored five or more runs in 22 different frames. In 2010, OU has scored five or more runs in six different frames, twice in game two of the SDSU series and once versus Valparaiso, Western Illinois, Mississippi State and Baylor.

TIME FOR A RALLY

The Sooners have come from behind to win nine of the 20 games this season. Of Sunny Golloway's 188 wins at OU, 95 (.505) have been in come-from-behind fashion, including 22 last year. Below is a breakdown of the 2010 comebacks:

DOUBLE DIGITS

The Sooners have recorded 10 or more hits in 13 of the first 20 games of the season, including a season-high 19 vs. Mississippi State. OU is averaging 11.25 hits per game despite losing five regular starters from last season's club. The Sooners are also averaging 7.95 runs per game with six games with 10 or more scores, including the 17 posted in game two of the San Diego State series, the most since exploding for 29 runs on March 22, 2009 at Kansas State. OU leads the Big 12 with 27 homers and 225 hits.

DUKE MOVING UP SAVES LIST

Ryan Duke recorded two saves on the opening weekend to move into sole possession of second place on OU's all-time saves list (below). Duke led the Big 12 in saves with 16 last year (ranked sixth in the nation), the second most in a single season by a Sooner (Jeff Bajenaru - 20, 2000).

He currently leads the nation in 2010 with seven saves.

DUKE ON PRESEASON LISTS

Junior closer Ryan Duke was named a 2010 preseason All-American by the NCBWA and was also selected to the Stopper of the Year watch list. Duke was named a third team All-American in 2009 and is the first Sooner since David Purcey in 2003, now with the Toronto Blue Jays, to appear on a preseason AA list.

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

Prior to the season, OU Head Coach Sunny Golloway discussed the fact that the 2010 team was the deepest he has tutored in 13 years as a DI head coach. During the opening weekend, Golloway used all 33 players that traveled to San Diego, including 15 newcomers. OU used 30 in week two at the Jacksonville

Invitational. Only two players on the 2010 35-man roster have not seen action (Jordan John and Michael Whitney).

OGLE ON JOHNNY BENCH WATCH LIST

Sophomore catcher/DH Tyler Ogle was named to the Johnny Bench watch list for 2010 on March 2. Ogle caught in 10 games last year, including eight starts behind J.T. Wise (2009 winner). Wise became the first Sooner to collect the award in program history and just the second in Big 12 history.

BUECHELE, ERBEN & HUBBARD NAMED CAPTAINS

Seniors Jeremy Erben and Ross Hubbard and sophomore Garrett Buechele were voted as the 2010 captains by their teammates back in October during the team's annual visit to Willow Springs Boys Ranch in Chandler, Okla. All three are first time captains.

BACK-TO-BACK PRESEASON POLLS

The Sooners will start the 2010 season ranked in three of the four major polls. The last time Oklahoma started consecutive seasons ranked in one of the preseason top 25 polls was prior to the 1995 (No. 3) and 1996 campaigns (No. 14). The Sooners started last season ranked No. 16 according to Baseball America.

BASEBALL ON KREF 1400 AM IN 2010

The 2010 season marks the first with KREF 1400 AM serving as the flagship station of Sooner baseball and the new partnership provides expanded coverage for OU fans to listen to 50-plus regular season games over the air. Additionally, 22 of the Big 12 games are set to be carried on the Sooners Sports' Network, enabling fans to listen to OU baseball on various stations across the state starting on April 1, nearly double the amount from previous seasons.

The entire 56-game regular season schedule will be broadcast live for free on SoonerSports.com.



HOME RUN NOTES

1 - Max White homered in his first official at-bat against Jacksonville on Feb. 27. It came during White's first start as a Sooner. He walked earlier in the year as a pinch hitter.

3 - OU has recorded multiple-homer outings in seven of the 20 games this year, including a season-high three in game two of the SDSU series. The Sooners had 18 multi-HR games in 2009.

4 - Tyler Ogle hit the Sooners' first grand slam of 2010 in game two and Garrett Buechele later added one against Valpo. Cameron Seitzer had OU's third vs. Western Illinois. OU has had at least one four-run homer in each of the last seven seasons, including three in 2009.

5 - Garrett Buechele and Cameron Seitzer rank second in the Big 12 with five home runs. Both Buechele and Seitzer connected for four in 2009.

10 - OU has cracked 10 homers that have broke ties or put the Sooners ahead this season.

11 - The Sooners have cracked 11 of their 27 homers in the seventh inning or later this year.

15 - The Sooners have blasted 15 of their 27 home runs with two outs on the board, including seven of the last eight. In addition, 14 of the dingers have been solo shots.

24 - OU had 24 homers after the first 20 games a year ago. 14 different Sooners have combined to clear the fences 27 times in 2010.

33 - For the second consecutive season, No. 33 Cameron Seitzer homered on opening day. In his first at-bat as a freshman, Seitzer homered in the 2009 opener vs. Western Illinois.

91 - The Sooners cracked 91 home runs a year ago, the most since the 1998 OU club. Only 24 of those dingers return in 2010, including seven from Casey Johnson.

CLEARING THE FENCES
