WEEKEND PREVIEW

• No. 12 Oklahoma (23-6, 3-4 Big 12) welcomes Missouri to town for a three-game Big 12 Conference series over the weekend. The action gets underway on Friday, April 9 at 6:30 p.m. at L. Dale Mitchell Park. The Sooners have lost four straight in conference play, despite winning two of their first three series, while the Tigers (17-11, 2-4) have won one game in each of its two Big 12 series.

• The Sooners are ranked as high as No. 12 this week by *Collegiate Baseball* (No. 16-USA, No. 17-NCBWA and No. 19-Baseball America). and are off to their best start under Sunny Golloway, tying the same mark set a year ago.

• Missouri returns 19 letterwinners from the 2009 team that was 35-27 overall and finished third in the Big 12 with a 16-11 mark before falling in the NCAA Oxford Regional. The Tigers are coming off a pair of midweek wins over Southern Illinois-Edwardsville and Illinois. Last weekend, Missouri dropped two of the three games played in Columbia against Baylor in Big 12 action.

BOBBY SHORE

The junior right-hander has been OU's most consistent starter with four wins in his six starts. Shore has lasted five or more innings in all but one start (predetermined vs. Richmond) and

tossed seven innings in his last start against Texas, tying a season high. He ranks sixth in the Big 12 with a 2.21 ERA but only one of the five pitchers ahead of him has started more games (7-Barrett Loux, Texas A&M).

HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY

Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to four NCAA Regional Finals, 170 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his five years at the helm of the OU program. In 2009, the Sooners were awarded the program's first national seed (No. 7) in the NCAA Tournament.

The 2009 season was highlighted by Oklahoma hosting another NCAA Regional and making its 32nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Sooners were 43-20 overall and 17-10 in Big 12 play.

OU finished half of a game out of first place in the conference standings in 2009 and also dominated the award circuit with seven All-Big 12 honorees, including the Big 12 Player of the Year in J.T. Wise and the Big 12 Freshman of the Year in Garrett Buechele. The league honors were program firsts since the Big 12's inception in 1997 and were followed up by Wise being named a consensus All-American and the first Sooner to be given the Johnny Bench Award (top catcher).

Wise was one of four Sooners awarded All-America status in 2009 and joined a group of nine Sooners to be selected in the 2009 MLB Draft, a Big 12 high last season. The nine selections tied the nine selected under Golloway in 2006, the third most in program history. Since 2005, 29 Sooners have been drafted under Golloway at the helm.

The 2009 season was the second time the Sooners hosted a NCAA Regional in four years. In 2006, Golloway led OU to the NCAA Norman Regional title and became the second coach in NCAA Division I history to guide his club to a Super Regional Appearance in his first year at the helm. The NCAA regional title was a program first since 1995.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 505-254-1 (.665). The winning percentage ranks in the top 15 nationally among active head coaches (minimum five years).

QUICK HITS

- OU ranks third in the Big 12 in ERA (3.46) and fielding percentage (.975) and leads the conference with 37 home runs.
- The OU pitching staff ranks second in the Big 12 with 280 strikeouts and has 17 games with 10 or more K's, including the last five.
- The Sooners have homered in 17 of the last 22 contests with 27 in that span, including seven multiple-homer games.
- The OU bullpen is 11-0 with nine saves on the season with a 2.47 ERA and 148 Ks in 123.2 IP.
- Cameron Seitzer hit for the cycle in the Sooners' 26-3 win over UAPB. Seitzer had a homer and a triple in the second inning.
- Seitzer ranks in the Big 12's top 10 in five offensive categories (HR - 7, 2B-10, TB-67, OBP%-.491 and SLG%-.753).
- Garrett Buechele (6) is tied for sixth in home runs and Seitzer (7) is right above him. Both have surpassed their 2009 totals.
- Ryan Duke is a perfect 9-for-9 in save situations this year and ranked third in the nation in that category with 8 as of April 6.
- Jeremy Erben is second in the Big 12 with a 0.73 ERA and his six wins is tied for the highest total. He was second in the nation in ERA heading into last Tuesday's action and his scoreless streak came to an end after 22 2/3 innings on April 1. He has not allowed a run in 10 of his 13 appearances.
- Zach Neal has 20 strikeouts and zero walks in his last two starts which lasted a combined 12 2/3.
- Buechele (3B) is the only Sooner to start all 29 games. Caleb Bushyhead (SS) ranks second on the team with 28 starts.
- Bushyhead registered one hit in 22 games last season and already has 31 hits after 29 games played in 2010. Bushyhead ranks second on OU with 10 multiple-hit games.
- Casey Johnson's 13-game hitting streak ended on April 1. It is was a career best and the longest by a Sooner in 2010.
- Max White has five homers in his 13 starts and ranks third on the team in that category.
- Oklahoma has started 19 different players in the lineup after Cale Ellis made his first start vs. Texas on April 2.
- Buechele, Erben, Ross Hubbard and Chris Ellison were named to the Whataburger Collegiate Classic all-tournament team.

OU-MISSOURI SERIES

OU dropped the last series meeting in Norman with Missouri, 2-1, but rebounded in 2009 in Columbia with a 2-1 series win (2-1, 7-4, 4-5). The two also met in the Big 12 Championship last year, with the Tigers posting a 5-4 victory. Other series notes: The Sooners have won eight of the 13 Big 12 series ... The home team is 9-4 overall in series played ... OU has won five of the six Big 12 series in Norman, with 2008 marking Mizzou's first series win ... OU has swept four of the last five series in Norman ... OU is 53-19 against MU at home since 1962 ... 42 of the games since 1962 in the series have been decided by one run with OU holding a 22-20 edge ... The team that wins the series opener has won 11 of the 13 series meetings ... 10 of the 13 Big 12 series have been decided after the first two games.

UP NEXT

The first of four games in the Bedlam Series, presented by the *Oklahoman* and Oklahoma Farm Bureau, kicks off on Tuesday, April 13 in Stillwater at 6:30 p.m. OU and OSU will be meeting in a non-conference game and it marks the first contest on a campus site between the two since 1996. The series moved to a three-game set at neutral sites when the Big 12 Conference was formed in 1997.

LAST TIME OUT

The Sooners recorded a big road win in non-conference play after topping No. 11 TCU, 4-2, on Tuesday. OU is 8-0 in midweek action this year and has won five straight over the Horned Frogs. OU and TCU meet again on April 20 in Norman.

TWO HOME GAMES ADDED TO SCHEDULE

OU added two games to the regular season schedule in order to make up for games lost in March against Baylor due to inclement weather. The two non-conference home games include Arkansas Little Rock on May 4 and Texas Southern on May 19. Both games will get underway at 7 p.m. at L. Dale Mitchell Park.

ERBEN RETURNS TO ROTATION

Jeremy Erben, the Sooners' top reliever in 2010 with six wins and a save, will make his first start this Sunday since June 1, 2008 in the NCAA Tempe Regional. Erben made 10 starts two years ago, including opening day at then-No. 1 UCLA and the Big 12 opener at Nebraska. Eight of his 10 starts came in Big 12 play. He made all 14 of his appearances out of the bullpen in 2009. He is 1-4 as a starter but lasted at least five innings in six of his 10 career starts.

LATE-INNING PRODUCTION

OU has scored 94 of its 222 runs, or 42 percent, in the sixth inning and later. In addition, the Sooners have outscored the opposition, 41-11, in the eighth and ninth innings combined, which includes seven home runs.

SCORING FIRST

OU has scored first in 10 of the last 21 games and in 14 overall. OU has a 12-2 record in those contests. The opposition has tallied the game's first run in 15 games and OU is 11-4 with a loss to Nebraska on March 28 and three against Texas.

ONE-RUN GAMES

The Sooners have recorded one-run victories in six games this year. OU is 5-1 in those situations this year and the Sooners are 55-20-1 (.730) under head coach Sunny Golloway. The Sooners' skipper entered 2010 with the best winning percentage among Big 12 coaches over the last five years (.721).

THE BIG INNING

OU has hit through the batting order already 11 times this season, three times in game one of the UAPB series, twice in game two of the SDSU series, and once each against Richmond, Mississippi State, Texas A&M-CC, UMass (GM2), Nebraska (GM3) and UAPB (GM2). OU accomplished the feat on 23 occasions last year.

That 2009 team also scored five or more runs in 22 different frames. In 2010, OU has scored five or more runs in 10 different frames, including a season-high 10 runs in game one of the UAPB series (second inning). OU had three five-plus run innings in that UAPB game and also accomplished the feat twice in game two of the SDSU series and once versus Valparaiso, Western Illinois, Mississippi State, Baylor and Nebraska.

WINNING STREAKS

The 10-game winning streak from Feb. 28-March 13 marked the fifth time under head coach Sunny Golloway that OU has won 10 or more consecutive games and the 26th in program history.

ERBEN ON PITCHER WATCH LIST

Jeremy Erben is one of seven hurlers from the Big 12 named to the Pitcher of the Year watch list on March 23 as presented by the College Baseball Foundation. This is the second year for the award and it will be presented in Lubbock, Texas, on July 2 as part of the College Baseball Awards Show. He is second in the Big 12 in wins (5) and ERA (0.61) and was named the Big 12 Pitcher of the Week for games played through March 7.

TIME FOR A RALLY

The Sooners have come from behind to win 11 of the 29 games this season. Of Sunny Golloway's 196 wins at OU, 97 (.499) have been in come-from-behind fashion, including 22 last year. Below is a breakdown of the 2010 comebacks:

DOUBLE DIGITS

The Sooners have recorded 10 or more hits in 17 of the first 29 games of the season, including a season-high 19 vs. Mississippi State and UAPB (March 30). OU is averaging 10.34 hits per game despite losing five regular starters from last season's club. The Sooners are also averaging 7.65 runs per game with nine games with 10 or more scores, including the 26 posted in game one of the UAPB series, the most since exploding for 29 runs on March 22, 2009 at Kansas State.

DUKE MOVING UP SAVES LIST

Ryan Duke recorded two saves on the opening weekend to move into sole possession of second place on OU's all-time saves list (below). Duke led the Big 12 in saves with 16 last year (ranked sixth in the nation), the second most in a single season

by a Sooner (Jeff Bajenaru - 20, 2000).

He ranked third this week in the nation as of April 6 with eight saves and currently leads the Big 12 with nine.

DUKE ON PRESEASON LISTS

Junior closer Ryan Duke was named a 2010 preseason All-American by the NCBWA and was also selected to the Stopper of the Year watch list. Duke was named a third team All-American in 2009 and is the first Sooner since David Purcey in 2003, now with the Toronto Blue Jays, to appear on a preseason AA list.

OGLE ON JOHNNY BENCH WATCH LIST

Sophomore catcher/DH Tyler Ogle was named to the Johnny Bench watch list for 2010 on March 2. Ogle caught in 10 games last year, including eight starts behind J.T. Wise (2009 winner). Wise became the first Sooner to collect the award in program history and just the second in Big 12 history.

BUECHELE, ERBEN & HUBBARD NAMED CAPTAINS

Seniors Jeremy Erben and Ross Hubbard and sophomore Garrett Buechele were voted as the 2010 captains by their teammates back in October during the team's annual visit to Willow Springs Boys Ranch in Chandler, Okla. All three are first time captains.

BACK-TO-BACK PRESEASON POLLS

The Sooners started the 2010 season ranked in three of the four major polls. The last time Oklahoma started consecutive seasons ranked in one of the preseason top 25 polls was prior to the 1995 (No. 3) and 1996 campaigns (No. 14). The Sooners started last season ranked No. 16 according to *Baseball America*.



HOME RUN NOTES

1 - Max White homered in his first official at-bat against Jacksonville on Feb. 27. It came during White's first start as a Sooner. He walked earlier in the year as a pinch hitter. He is third on the team with five homers.

3 - OU has recorded multiple-homer outings in 10 of the 28 games this year, including a season-high three against SDSU (GM2), Nebraska (GM1) and UAPB (GM 1 and 2). The Sooners had 18 multi-HR games in 2009.

4 - Tyler Ogle hit the Sooners' first grand slam of 2010 in game two at SDSU and added another in game one vs. UAPB. Garrett Buechele also had a grand slam against Valpo and Cameron Seitzer had OU's third vs. Western Illinois. OU has had at least one four-run homer in each of the last seven seasons, including three in 2009.

7 - Cameron Seitzer ranks fourth in the Big 12 with seven home runs. Garrett Buechele (6) ranks fifth in the Big 12 with six home runs and Max White is ninth with five. Both Buechele and Seitzer connected for four in 2009.

11 - OU has cracked 11 homers that have broke ties or put the Sooners ahead this season.

14 - The Sooners have cracked 14 of their 37 homers in the seventh inning or later this year.

18 - The Sooners have blasted 19 of their 36 home runs with two outs on the board, including 11 of the last 18. In addition, 16 of the dingers have been solo shots.

33 - For the second consecutive season, No. 33 Cameron Seitzer homered on opening day. In his first at-bat as a freshman, Seitzer homered in the 2009 opener vs. Western Illinois.

40 - OU had 54 homers after the first 29 games a year ago, which included the school-record 11 at Kansas State. 14 different Sooners have combined to clear the fences 37 times in 2010.

91 - The Sooners cracked 91 home runs a year ago, the most since the 1998 OU club. Only 24 of those dingers return in 2010, including seven from Casey Johnson.

CLEARING THE FENCES

After 29 games, the Sooners lead the Big 12 lead with 37 home runs. 14 different Sooners have cleared the fences with Cameron Seitzer (7) and Garrett Buechele (6) leading the way. Below is a closer look at OU's homers in 2010:
