WICHITA STATE PREVIEW

No. 11 Oklahoma (25-7 overall) will look for its eighth win in midweek games this season on Wednesday, April 8 at Wichita State (17-11). First pitch at Eck Stadium is slated for 7 p.m.

The Shockers are 14-10 in non-conference action this season and host Saint Mary on Tuesday night in search of their third straight victory. WSU is 1-1 against Big 12 competition in 2009 with a win over Nebraska last week at home and a loss at Kansas on March 11.

Wichita State was picked third in the Missouri Valley Conference after winning the title a year ago with a 19-5 record. The Shockers were 48-17 last year after losing to Florida State in the Tallahassee Super Regional. Returning from the 2008 team are 14 letterwinners.



PLAYER TO WATCH - GARRETT BUECHELE

OU's third baseman has been one of the Sooners' hottest hitters since Big 12 play began with a .447 clip and 10 RBIs. In addition, Buechele is riding a season-best 12-game hitting streak and is batting .449 in that span with 22 hits, including four homers and 13 RBIs.

MORE ON THE OU-WICHITA STATE SERIES

The Sooners last met the Shockers in Norman on April 30, 2008 and OU won 12-11 in the only game played last season. The two were scheduled to play in Wichita on April 9, 2008, but rain cancelled the contest in Wichita for the second consecutive season. The Sooners have won the last four meetings, dating back to the two postseason victories in the 2006 Norman Regional.

LAST TIME OUT

The Sooners posted a 3-1 mark last week which started with a 16-6 win over Nebraska on Monday. Over the weekend, OU won two games in a Big 12 series at Missouri. The Sooners began the three-game set with a 2-1 win, as Andrew Doyle out duelled Kyle Gibson. OU rallied to win game two, 7-4, before falling 5-4 in the finale.



HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY



Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to three NCAA Regional Finals, 127 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his four years at the helm of the OU program. In 2008, OU returned to the NCAA Tournament for the 31st time in program history, two years after Golloway became the second coach in

NCAA Division I history to guide his club to a Super Regional Appearance in his first year at the helm. The 2006 season was highlighted by the Sooners' 45-22 overall mark, a third-place finish in the Big 12 and an NCAA regional title, a program first since 1995.

The Sooners posted a 36-26-1 overall record during the 2008 campaign and advanced to the championship game of the NCAA Tempe Regional. Three Sooners, Aljay Davis, Aaron Baker and Mike Gosse were named to the all-tournament team giving OU such 13 honorees since Golloway took over at the end of the 2005 season.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 462-234-1 (.664). The winning percentage ranks in the top 25 nationally among active head coaches with a minimum of five years of experience.

In 2006, his first full year as head coach, Golloway guided the Sooners to a 45-22 mark, a third-place finish in the Big 12, an NCAA regional title and the program's first Super Regional appearance (format originated in 1999).

The Sooners' run in 2006 was the best in Norman since the 1994 and 1995 teams made back-to-back appearances in the College World Series. OU was one win away from reaching the program's 10th appearance in Omaha after Golloway and the Sooners dropped a best of three series to then-No. 1 Rice.

Not only did the Sooners enjoy a top 10 ranking for three weeks during the regular season, but they finished the year ranked No. 9 (Baseball America) and led the nation in fielding percentage with a .983 mark (highest in school history and the second best mark in NCAA history).

Golloway was named the eighth head baseball coach at the University of Oklahoma on July 15, 2005. His appointment was made after successful stints on the Sooner staff as an assistant and interim head coach, and a strong eight-year run as the head coach at Oral Roberts.

When Golloway took over the Sooners in 2005, the team was 23-20 with a seventh-place Big 12 mark of 7-11. The team won its last three Big 12 series to move its overall record to 35-26 and its Big 12 mark to 14-13, good for a fifth-place finish.

UP NEXT

OU remains home to host its second and final meeting with TCU on Tuesday, April 14. First pitch is slated for 7 p.m. at L. Dale Mitchell Park. Following the midweek contest, the Sooners return to Big 12 play with a three-game series at No. 9 Texas (April 17-19).

SERIES WINS

The Sooners sit atop the Big 12 standings with a 6-3 record after winning each of their first three series in conference play (Kansas State, Nebraska and Missouri). The last time OU won three consecutive conference series to begin a season was in 1996 (Nebraska, Kansas and Iowa St.). OU has not lost a weekend series in the Big 12 or during non-conference play this season. It tied Washington State 2-2.

OU IN BIG 12 RANKS

The Sooners can be found up and down the Big 12 statistics for overall games released on April 6. The Sooners' offense leads all conference teams in batting average (.341), runs (310), hits (382), doubles (69), homers (57) and RBI's (282). Turn to page 6 for national rankings.

DOUBLE DIGITS

The Sooners have scored 10 or more runs in 14 of the 32 games this season with a 9.7 runs/game average. OU is 14-0 when they score 10-plus runs in a game in 2009. In addition, the Sooners are averaging 11.9 hits per game with double digit hits in all but 11 games. The Sooners are 19-2 when they connect for 10-plus hits in a contest. OU ranks fifth nationally in total hits and fourth in runs.

SCORING FIRST

OU has scored first in 19 games this season with a 14-5 record in those contests. The opposition has tallied the game's first run on 13 occasions but OU is 11-2 in those situations. The Sooners have scored first in five of the last six games and in six of the nine Big 12 games.

PITCHING STAFF RECEIVES BOOST

OU's pitching staff received a boost over the weekend as Antonie Hubbard, Jeremy Erben and Stephen Porlier were all active at the same time for the first time this season. Porlier made his official return on March 24 two weeks ago after missing the entire 2008 season with shoulder surgery. Erben made his first appearance on Sunday, April 5 after missing the first 31 games with a strained ligament in his elbow. Hubbard missed three weeks with a stress reaction in his fibula and started Saturday's game against Mizzou.

While Hubbard's start lasted 1 2/3 innings, Porlier and Erben pitched well in extended relief. Porlier tossed 4 1/3 scoreless frames and Erben blanked the Tigers for 1 2/3 innings. Those two combined with the rest of the bullpen for a 0.68 ERA in 13 1/3 innings of action. Overall, the Sooners' pitching staff recorded a 2.08 ERA.

HOME RUN NOTES (Game by Game listing on pg. 4)

OU has homered in eight of the last nine games with 32 in that span ... That total is more than half of the other teams' season totals in the Big 12.

With three home runs against Missouri, the Sooners have 57 this season, a mark that already has surpassed the 2008 total after 63 games ... The total also is the most in a season in the last seven years (OU had 76 in 2002).

OU has 30 homers in Big 12 play, marking the most in conference play since 2002 (30).

The Sooners have homered in all but eight games this season and have 12 games with multiple homers, including six in Big 12 play.

The Sooners tied a Big 12 record with 11 home runs during the series finale against Kansas State. OU hit five dingers in the first inning and four more in the seventh.

OU has 16 homers this season that led off an inning, including four from Jaime Johnson that began a game.

After 32 games last season, the Sooners had 28 home runs.

J.T. Wise ranks second in the Big 12 with 10 HR and is the first Sooner since Joe Dunigan (2007) to have double digits.

Despite the 1.78 HR/game average this season, the 2009 Sooners are still behind the school record of 114 homers hit in 1998 in 62 games, also a 1.8 average per game. That team had 74 dingers after 32 games.

Since the NCAA schedule expanded in 1972, OU already has more homers this season than 18 OU teams since that year.

DOUBLE PLAY MACHINE

The Sooners lead the Big 12 with 34 double plays turned this season in 32 games and rank 14th in the nation. OU has turned a double play in eight of the last 10 games (20 overall). In addition, OU has turned multiple double plays in seven games this season. In 2008, OU finished 12th in the nation with 65 double plays.

THE BIG INNING

The Sooners have hit through the batting order on 16 occasions this year and scored five or more runs in 13 different frames. OU is 10-1 when the plate five or more runs in a game. The only loss came in the second game of the San Diego series. The Sooners had two big innings (5-plus runs) in game three of the Western Illinois series and game three of the Kansas State series.

ONE-TWO PUNCH

OU has a productive 1-2 punch at the top of the lineup and the proof is in the Big 12's overall statistics and the national rankings released on April 6. Johnson and Hernandez combine to rank atop five different categories in the conference. Johnson leads the Big 12 in runs (46) and total bases (89). In addition, he ranks sixth in the nation in runs scored. Hernandez leads the Big 12 in hits (55), RBIs (38) and batting average (.433). Hernandez ranks fifth in the country in hits and 19th in runs scored (41).

RECORDS FALL IN SOONERS' 29-4 VICTORY

The Sooners' school record 11 home runs in Sunday's finale at Kansas State tied a Big 12 record (OSU hit 11 versus Chicago State) and was two shy of tying an NCAA record. OU hit five home runs in the first inning of that game after putting 17 batters at the plate to score 13 runs (one run shy of tying school record). In the fifth inning, OU hit four more dingers to plate 11 more runs. Refer to page four of the notes for additional notes on the Sooners' homers.

29 RUNS!

The Sooners' 29 runs in Sunday's victory is tied for the fourth most runs scored in school history and the most since 1986. OU scored 20-plus runs for the second time this season and the sixth time under head coach Sunny Golloway, three of those games against Big 12 opponents.

HITS GALORE

The Sooners' 27 hits on March 22 at KSU was the most hits recorded by an OU team since Feb. 17, 1991 (29 vs. Kearney State). The total is three shy of the school record of 30,

set on March 22 1989 vs. Northern Iowa. The Sooners also had 27 hits on March 6, 1986 against Southwestern State. Under Golloway, OU has recorded 20 or more hits in nine games (two this season), including four against Big 12 opponents.

JOHNSON LEADS OFF

Jamie Johnson has been highly successful as OU's leadoff hitter this season and for a majority of 2008. So far in 2009, Johnson has already surpassed his home run total of five from a year ago. Johnson is tied for the Big 12 lead with nine and ranks seventh nationally. Seven of Johnson's 14 career bombs, have led off a game, including four this season.

MORE ON JOHNSON'S HOMERS

All but three of Jamie Johnson's team-leading nine homers this year have been game tying or go-ahead shots. His first HR against Western Illinois tied the game at one apiece. Against San Diego, his grand slam gave OU a 4-2 lead. In games 11 and 12 of the season against UALR, his leadoff homer gave OU a 1-0 lead. Johnson's solo homer against Bethune Cookman tied the game at one apiece. Finally, Johnson's leadoff homer in game three of the KSU series gave OU a 1-0 lead.

14-0 START AT HOME

Oklahoma won its 14th home game in as many chances on March 29 against Nebraska. The perfect start is the second best by an OU team at home. The winning streak was snapped by Nebraska later that day and was at 16 games after dating back to last season. The 1974 Sooners started the home campaign 17-0. OU is currently 15-1 in 2009 at home.

BAKER WALKING

Aaron Baker is first in the Big 12 in walks with 29 on the season. He entered the week ranked sixth in the nation in that category. The total was boosted on March 3 during game one of the UALR doubleheader. Baker walked four times in that game, a first for a Sooner since Feb. 21, 2004 when Eric Thornton was also issued four walks.

EXTRA INNINGS UNDER GOLLOWAY

OU is 2-0 this season in games played in extra innings with victories over Bethune Cookman (5-4 in 10 innings) and Washington State (game two, 9-7 in 11 innings). Since Golloway took over the helm of the Sooner program at the end of the 2005 season, OU is 14-1-1 in extra innings. The lone loss came against Missouri on April 19, 2009.

SOONERS ON TELEVISION

OU is 3-0 during televised games this season with wins over Kansas State (March 21-22) and Missouri (April 4). OU has three more games currently scheduled for telecasts.

The Sooner Sports Network will carry the Texas Tech series opener from Norman on April 10 at 6:30 p.m. The game can be seen live on Cox Ch. 7 in OKC and Cox Ch. 3 in Tulsa. SSN will also televise game two of the Bedlam Series on May 9 in Oklahoma City at 7:05 p.m.

Fox Sports Southwest (Cox Ch. 37 in OKC) will televise the Sooners' game at Baylor on April 25 from Waco at 1 p.m.

2010 SIGNING CLASS

The OU coaching staff inked 10 high school players, including four Oklahoma products, and six players from the junior college ranks. The Sooners concentrated on adding players to all areas of the field as the signing class features eight position players and eight pitchers, including five left-handers. Overall, 11 of the recruits are rated by Perfect Game Crosschecker as prospects for the 2009 MLB Draft.

OU's signees feature some of the best prep stars from the state in Brandon Bargas (LHP) and Austin Kirk (LHP/1B) from Owasso High School, Jarek Pritchard (OF) from Charles Page H.S. and Ryan Gibson (LHP) from Yukon H.S.

Rounding out the group of high school recruits are six talented players from the state of Texas with Abel Baker (C/1B), the brother of current Sooner Aaron Baker, from Denton H.S., Drew Harrison (1B) from Waxahachie H.S., Jordan John (LHP) from Calallen H.S., Chad Kettler (SS) from Coppell H.S., Jack Mayfield (SS) from Del Rio H.S. and Drew Verhagen (RHP) from Heath H.S.

The Sooners' junior college recruits include Danny Black (INF/OF) from Feather River C.C. (Calif.), Anthony Collazo (LHP) from Howard College (Texas), Rickey Eisenberg (OF) from Cypress College (Calif.), Zach Neal (RHP) from Howard College (Texas), Eric Ross (OF) from Grayson College (Texas) and Bobby Shore (RHP) from Palomar College (Calif.).

10-PLUS WINNING STREAKS

The Sooners' recent 10-game winning streak was the fourth under head coach Sunny Golloway since he took over the program four years ago. In addition, since 1962, OU has recorded 14 winning streaks over 10 games and Coach Golloway was at the head of three of those (13-2006, 11-2007 and 11-2008). The 13-game winning streak in 2006 is tied for the seventh best in school history.

BACK-TO-BACK COMPLETE GAMES

Michael Rocha and C.J. Blue achieved a rare feat during Tuesday's doubleheader against Houston Baptist as both starters went the distance to allow a combined 11 hits and zero earned runs in 18 innings of action. The last time two Sooners threw back-to-back complete games was during the 2001 season. On April 27 of that year, Evan Greusel lasted nine innings (seven hits, zero runs) to top visiting Centenary. The next day, also against the Gents, Austin Mix went the distance after giving up one run off two hits.

SOONER DEBUTS

Several newcomers have enjoyed successful debuts for Oklahoma in 2009. Half of the position players recorded a hit in their first game but none were bigger than freshman Cameron Seitzer's three-run homer in his debut. Not only did the long ball come in his first game, but in his first collegiate at-bat. On the mound, four of the six hurlers blanked the opposition in their first appearance and Jason Chowning posted a win in his first outing.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

OU will face 12 opponents, for a total of 27 games, that participated in last year's NCAA Tournament, including nine teams that finished the season ranked in the top 25. Six of those teams (Nebraska, Oklahoma State, San Diego, TCU, Texas A&M, Wichita State) posted 40 wins a year ago, while Texas A&M and Wichita State both advanced to the Super Regional round. The Sooners will face seven of the teams ranked in *Baseball America's* preseason poll for a combined 18 games. Six of those contests will be played at L. Dale Mitchell Park with No. 12 UCLA (March 6-8) and No. 1 Texas A&M (May 15-17) coming to town for three-game series.

FACILITY UPGRADES

The new year brought several new additions to L. Dale Mitchell Park. OU added a player developmental facility which includes indoor hitting cages and a full-size practice infield. In addition, the Sooners upgraded the fan experience as a new sound system consisting of 20-plus speakers was added to accompany the new scoreboard in left field. The scoreboard also includes a full LED video display board and the entire structure stands 50-feet high.

COMING BACK FOR MORE

OU returns 18 letterwinners from the 2008 squad that appeared in the final game of the NCAA Tempe Regional, including seven position starters and nine pitchers that started a game on the mound last season. The deep pitching staff is led by five hurlers that made at least five starts in 2008. That excludes junior Stephen Porlier, who led OU with 99 innings and 99 strikeouts in 2007 before missing last season with surgery.

WISE NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior catcher J.T. Wise was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week on March 23 after he helped lead OU to three wins on the road over TCU and KSU. The award is the first for Wise and the second this season by a Sooner. Wise finished last week with eight hits in 15 plate appearances, good for a .533 batting average. In four games last week, Wise hit two home runs and drove in 11 runs while recording a .933 slugging percentage. In Sunday's finale at Kansas State, Wise tied a school record with five hits and hit homers.

DUKE NAME BIG 12/NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Sophomore closer Ryan Duke was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Pitcher of the Week on March 9 following his three saves in three consecutive days against UCLA. Two days later, Duke was named to the Collegiate Baseball Foundation's "National All-Star Lineup." Duke did not surrender a run or a walk in his 3 1/3 innings of relief against the Bruins and only gave up one hit while striking out four batters.
