- No. 8 Oklahoma (25-8, 6-5) meets No. 18 Oklahoma State (25-8, 8-4) this weekend in the Oklahoma Farm Bureau Bedlam Series.
- Friday's game in Tulsa is slated for a 7:35 p.m. first pitch. Saturday's games will be played in Oklahoma City (7:05 p.m. & 4:05 p.m.)
- OU is ranked No. 8 by the NCBWA, No. 10 by USA Today/Coaches, No. 14 by Baseball America and No. 16 by Collegiate Baseball.
- The Sooners return seven position starters from the 2010 squad that finished 50-18 and advanced to the program's 10th CWS.
- Oklahoma State returns 14 letterwinners from the 2010 team that finished 29-26 overall and 10th in the Big 12 (8-19).
- OSU is third in the standings ahead of OU and second in hitting (.304), led by sophomore Dane Phillips (.404, 3 HR, 26 RBI)
- Cowboys' Rotation: GM1 - LHP Mike Strong (3-0, 2.41 ERA); GM2 - RHP Brad Probst (6-1, 1.25 ERA); GM3 - TBA

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PLAYER TO WATCH



TYLER OGLE

The Sooners' catcher has hit safely in eight of the last nine games with 11 hits and five RBIs. He had two base hits out of the leadoff spot against Oklahoma State on April 5 and has since moved back

into the cleanup slot. Ogle is tied for fifth in the Big 12 with five home runs, ranks sixth with 29 runs scored and ninth on-base percentage (.462) and 10th in slugging percentage (.538).

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HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY

Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to five NCAA Regional finals, 220 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his six years at the helm of the OU program. In 2010, the Sooners made the program's 10th appearance in the College World Series and first since 1995.

The path started after OU hosted an NCAA Regional for the second straight year and advanced to the program's second Super Regional appearance. The series win over then-No. 1 Virginia propelled back to the final season at Rosenblatt Stadium in Omaha, Neb.

OU finished 2010 with a No. 5 national ranking and a 50-18 overall record, marking the fifth season in program history with 50 or more wins. Fifteen of those wins came in Big 12 play as OU finished in second place in the standings for the second straight year. In addition, Garrett Buechele and Max White were named All-Americans.

The run in 2010 was even more impressive when considering the nine Sooners lost to the MLB Draft, a Big 12 best in 2009. The nine selections tied for the third most in program history. Since 2005, 34 Sooners have been drafted under Golloway.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 555-272-1 (.671). The winning percentage ranked No. 15 nationally among active head coaches (min. five years) prior to 2011.

BEDLAM SERIES

Since 1942, OSU leads 135-128. Oklahoma won last year's series, 2-1, and the 2011 non-conference game (8-3) in Norman on April 5. OU has won six out of the last nine games and each of the last two Big 12 series. Below is a closer look at the rivalry between the Sooners and Cowboys.

- Since 1997, 30 of the 49 games have been decided by three runs or less (OU leads 18-12). Fourteen of those games were one-run decisions where OU is 9-5.
- The 2011 meeting marks the fifth straight season that at least one of the teams is ranked in the top 25. The 2006 season is the last time both teams entered a three-game set ranked (No. 8 OU vs. No. 24 OSU).
- The two have split the 14 Big 12 series meetings since 1997.
- Seven of those Big 12 regular season series have been decided in the third game where OU is 5-2.
- Since Big 12 play began, the winner in Tulsa has gone on to win the series in 10 of the 14 chances.
- OU is 11-9 in games played in Tulsa (1991-present).
- The Sooners won nine of the first 10 meetings in Tulsa, but have lost eight of the last 10. Won in 2009 and 2010.
- Since the series shifted to its current setting (game one in Tulsa and games two and three in OKC) in 1991, OU is 15-22 in games played in Oklahoma City.
- Each team has won 12 games during the regular season at Redhaws Field since it opened in 1998.
- Sunny Golloway has coached in 49 Bedlam games as an assistant coach and head coach (OU is 23-26 in those games).

MORE ON BEDLAM

While OU has more in-state players than OSU by a 12-9 advantage, OSU has more experience in games played in the series among those players (22-20). Six of OU's 12 in-state players are freshmen, while OSU has one. The 12 OU players from the state include Chris Ellison (Norman), Cale Ellis (Tonkawa), Casey Coyle (Oklahoma City), Caleb Bushyhead (Mannford), Max White (Durant), Drew Dahlberg (Edmond), Dillon Overton (Weatherford), Tyson Seng (Enid), Cayle Shambaugh (Jay), Drew Krittenbrink (Okarche), Ryan Gibson (Yukon), and Cale Coshow (Edmond).

ON DECK

OU begins a five-game home stand next week, featuring a pair of midweek games against Dallas Baptist (April 19) and Bacone College (April 20). The game against Bacone was added to the schedule to make up for the contest lost at Arkansas on March 29. Following the two midweek games, the Sooners return to Big 12 play over the weekend against Nebraska (April 22-24).

LAST TIME OUT

The Sooners posted a 13-6 victory over No. 9 TCU on Tuesday night at L. Dale Mitchell Park. It marked the Sooners' seventh straight win in the series. OU and TCU meet again in Fort Worth on April 26.

MISC NOTES

- After 33 games, OU leads the Big 12 in batting average (.330), and ranks fourth in earned run average (3.08) and fifth in fielding percentage (.975).
- OU leads the Big 12 with 29 home runs, at least double the total recorded by four teams.
- OU leads the conference with 266 runs, the next closest team, Texas Tech, has scored 228 runs. The Sooners lead the Big 12 in hits with 376 and TTU and OSU are second with 347.
- The Sooner offense has outscored the opposition 266-122.
- OU has outscored opponents 39-15, 39-19, 39-10 and 44-12 in the third, fifth, sixth and eighth innings, respectively.
- Garrett Buechele, the Big 12 Player of the Week on Feb. 21 and 28, leads the Big 12 with 55 hits and 42 RBI's (5th and 9th in nation, respectively) ... Ranks second in Big 12 with a .401 batting average and seven homers ... Also ranks third with 80 total bases, fourth in slugging percentage (.584) and fifth with a .462 on-base percentage.
- In 20 of the Sooners' 33 starts, the hurlers have lasted at least five innings, including four complete games by Jordan John, Bobby Shore and Michael Rocha (2). OU owns four of the 13 complete games tossed in 2011.
- Seven freshmen have seen playing time and 10 newcomers overall have taken the field.
- Michael Rocha and the Sooner bullpen limited the Tribe to one hit on Feb. 18, the fewest allowed since OU's last no-hitter, a combined effort on March 9, 2005 vs. Arkansas Pine Bluff
- Rocha struck out 13 batters in the March 18 shutout vs. Texas A&M, the most by a Sooner since Daniel McCutchen also sat down 13 Aggies on April 7, 2006.
- Rocha, a two-time 2011 Big 12 Pitcher of the Week, has lasted at least seven innings in seven of eight starts with five or more strikeouts in seven outings. Rocha has also limited the opposition to three hits or less in four of his starts ... He leads the Big 12 with a 1.02 ERA (seventh nationally) and a 1.58 opponent batting average ... Tied for the Big 12 lead with two complete games and ranks second with 61.2 innings pitched and seven wins (second nationally).

ATHLETICS COMMUNICATIONS

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SCORING FIRST

OU is 16-3 when scoring first this season, including a 5-2 mark in Big 12 play. The Sooners have scored first in five of the last seven contests with a 5-2 record.

THE BIG INNING

OU has hit through the batting order 17 times in 33 games. OU had 23 such occasions in 2010. In addition, the Sooners have plated five or more runs in nine different innings, including 14 in the eighth inning on Feb. 22 vs. UAPB. The 14 runs tied an OU record for most scored in an inning with the 1998 Sooners that plated 14 in one frame against Emporia State on Feb. 17.

ONE-RUN GAMES

The Sooners are 3-1 this season in games decided by one run. OU was 14-7 in those situations in 2010 and the Sooners are 66-27-1 (.707) under head coach Sunny Golloway. The Sooners' skipper entered 2011 with the best winning percentage among Big 12 coaches over the last five years in that category.

DOUBLE DIGITS

The Sooners recorded 10 or more hits in 18 games this season with a 17-1 mark (42 in 2010 with a 38-4 record), including seven out of the last nine and are averaging 11.4 hits per game this season.

OU is averaging eight runs per game, featuring 13 contests scored in double digits with a 13-0 record. (23 in 2010 with 22-1 record). OU posted 27 in game one of the UAPB series, the most since exploding for 29 runs on March 22, 2009 at Kansas State.

ROCHA NAMED BIG 12 PITCHER OF THE WEEK, AGAIN

After tossing a three-hit, one-run complete game, senior captain Michael Rocha was named the Big 12 Pitcher of the Week on April 4. It marks the third career honor from the conference office for Rocha and the second of 2011 (March 7). It also represents the fifth time a Sooner has been recognized by the Big 12 this season after Garrett Buechele has twice been named the player of the week (Feb. 21 and 28) and Jordan John was tabbed the newcomer of the week (Feb. 28).

TOUGH SCHEDULE

The Sooners are 4-4 in games against Top 25 teams this year after defeating then-No. 14 Cal (W, 5-3), then-No. 11 Texas A&M (W, 1-0), No. 23 Oklahoma State (W, 8-3) and No. 9 TCU (13-6). OU also dropped two games to Texas A&M and two to then-No. 9 Arizona State. OU is set to face three teams that appear in this weeks' top 25 polls, to combine for seven games. OU also has OSU, Texas and TCU left on the schedule.

Overall, OU faces 10 opponents from 2010 NCAA tournament (23 games) in 2011, including five foes with 40-plus wins a year ago. OU also will face two 2010 CWS participants (Arizona State & TCU) and two Super Regional hosts (Texas and Arkansas).

SHUTOUTS

Michael Rocha's 13 strikeouts and Ryan Duke's first save of 2011 led OU to a 1-0 shutout over then-No. 11 Texas A&M on March 18. The Sooners have two shutouts in the books, also blanked SDSU 4-0 on March 3, after posting three in 2010. OU has also limited opponents to one run in eight games. The most shutouts recorded in a single season during the Sunny Golloway era is five, recorded in 2009, 2007 and 2006.

DUKE IS ALL-TIME SAVES LEADER AT OU

Ryan Duke, who is on the NCBWA Stopper of the Year watch list for the second straight year, recorded his first save of 2011 on March 18 vs. Texas A&M and moved into sole possession of first place on OU's all-time saves list (below).

Duke finished with 12 saves in 2010, the nation's 12th best total, and ranked second in the Big 12. He led the Big 12 in saves with 16 in 2009 (ranked sixth in the nation), the second most in a single season by a Sooner (Jeff Bajenaru - 20, 2000). He is the first Sooner in OU history to have 10 or more saves in two seasons.

TIME FOR A RALLY

DUKE AND BUSHYHEAD RETURN

Junior shortstop Caleb Bushyhead and senior right-handed pitcher Ryan Duke returned to action against Arkansas-Little Rock. Bushyhead had two hits and two walks in his first start on March 11 after having surgery on his torn ACL (right) in October. On March 12, Ryan Duke made his first relief appearance of 2011 and did not register a save, but recorded his 14th career win.

16-0 RECORD START

The 16-0 start is the best for a Sooner club, topping the 12 straight wins to begin the 1998 season. Other double-digit undefeated streaks to begin a season include 1984 (11-0) and 1974 (10-0). It marks the longest undefeated streak in the Big 12 era (since 1997), tied with the 2005 Texas team.

The 16-game winning streak is also the best under head coach Sunny Golloway and the sixth double-digit streak in his tenure (13 in 2006, 11 in 2007, 11 in 2008, 10 in 2009 and 10 in 2010). Its also the 25th in program history and longest since 1985 (19).

BACK-TO-BACK COMPLETE GAMES

The Sooners received back-to-back complete games on March 4 and March 5 from seniors Michael Rocha (shutout) and Bobby Shore (one run), respectively. Junior Burch Smith followed Rocha and Shore with 7 1/3 innings (two earned runs) on March 6 vs. then-No. 14 Cal. OU has three of the five complete games thrown in the Big 12 this year. OGLE ON JOHNNY BENCH WATCH LIST

For the second straight season, junior catcher Tyler Ogle was named to the Johnny Bench watch list for the 2011 season. Ogle caught in 42 games last year as he hit .331 with 11 homers and 46 RBIs, while recording a .992 fielding percentage and throwing out 11 base stealers. The Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission released the Watch List for the 2011 Coleman Company-Johnny Bench Award on March 10.

BUECHELE ON PRESEASON LISTS

Junior Garrett Buechele was named to the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and *Collegiate Baseball* preseason All-America teams. He also appears on the watch list for the Golden Spikes Award (nation's top player). While the preseason accolades are new for Buechele, he was tabbed a second team All-American following the Sooners' 2010 season. Buechele led OU in every offensive category. The Arlington native was taken in the 18th round of the 2010 MLB Draft (Texas Rangers).

BLAIR, BUECHELE, OGLE & ROCHA NAMED CAPTAINS

Seniors Elliott Blair and Michael Rocha and juniors Garrett Buechele and Tyler Ogle were voted as the 2011 captains by their teammates back in October. Buechele is the only two-time captain (2010).

SOONERS FAVORED TO WIN BIG 12 REGULAR SEASON

For the first time since 1995, OU is the preseason favorite to claim the Big 12 baseball regular season championship, in a vote of the league's head coaches. In 2010, the Sooners made their 10th College World Series appearance and first trip to Omaha since 1995. It marks the first time since 1995 that OU was selected as the top pick in the conference preseason poll. The Sooners have twice been picked No. 2 in the Big 12 preseason poll (1999 and 2001) with the highest prediction under Golloway coming in 2010 (fourth). In 1995, OU was the No. 1 team headed into the Big Eight season after winning the program's second National Championship the previous year.

BASEBALL ON KREF 1400 AM IN 2011

The 2011 season marks the second with KREF 1400 AM serving as the flagship station of Sooner baseball. The partnership features 54 regular season games live over the air. Additionally, 23 of the games are set to be carried on the Sooners Sports' Network, enabling fans to listen to OU baseball on the radio state-wide. The network coverage begins on April 1 vs. Texas Tech and continues throughout the Big 12 schedule. The network schedule also includes OU's midweek games at home vs. Oklahoma State (April 5) and TCU (April 12).

In 2011, 13 baseball games will be televised locally for the 2011 season by Sooner Vision and Sooner Sports Properties. The broadcasts will air via the Sooner Sports Network on Cox Channel 3 in Oklahoma City and Tulsa. Local sports personality Toby Rowland from KWTW News 9 (Oklahoma City) will call the play-by-play with color analyst Kenny Mossman, Oklahoma Associate Athletics Director for Communications. 1 - For the second straight year, Garrett Buechele homered on opening day.

4 - Four players on the current roster have a grand slam under their belts as a Sooner. Tyler Ogle leads that group with two grand slams while Garrett Buechele, Cale Ellis and Cameron Seitzer each have one. All five grand slams came during the 2010 season. OU has had at least one four-run homer in each of the last seven years.

6 - OU has cracked six homers that tied games or put the Sooners ahead in 2011 (24 in 2010).

8 - OU recorded multiple-homer outings in seven of the 33 games, including a season-high three on Feb. 20 vs. William and Mary and on Feb. 22 vs. UAPB. The Sooners had 30 multi-HR games in 2010.

11 - The Sooners have bashed 11 of their 29 homers in the sixth inning or later this year.

17 - While OU has 12 solo shots, 17 of the dingers have come with runners on base (54 in 2010).
