WEEKEND PREVIEW

• No. 11 Oklahoma (25-8, 5-5 Big 12) looks to move above .500 in the Big 12 standings with a three-game road series at Texas Tech (18-18, 6-6) this weekend. The Sooners, Red Raiders and Baylor are all tied for fourth place in the conference with .500 marks. The series gets started on Friday, April 16 at 6:30 p.m. at Dan Law Field in Lubbock, Texas. Game two on Saturday is set for a 5 p.m. first pitch while the series finale on Sunday is slated for 1 p.m.

• The Sooners are ranked as high as No. 11 this week by *Collegiate Baseball* (No. 14-USA and No. 16-Baseball America) and are 25-8 after 33 games. OU was 26-7 at this same point a year ago.

• Texas Tech returns 18 letterwinners from the 2009 team that finished seventh in the Big 12 standings with a 12-15 conference mark and 25-32 overall record. The Red Raiders are 6-4 in their last 10 games and have won their last two Big 12 series against Oklahoma State (in Stillwater) and Kansas State at home. Tech dropped its first two conference sets against Texas A&M and Texas.

PLAYER TO WATCH

GARRETT BUECHELE

The 2009 Big 12 Freshman of the Year is putting together another impressive campaign and is coming off the first two-home run game of his career at Oklahoma State on Tuesday.

Buechele has hit safely in all but seven of his 30 games played in 2010 and is riding a five-game hitting streak. During the streak, Buechele is hitting .350 (7-for-20) with a double, two homers and four RBIs.

HEAD COACH SUNNY GOLLOWAY

Sunny Golloway has led the Sooners to four NCAA Regional Finals, 170 victories and a top 25 ranking in each of his five years at the helm of the OU program. In 2009, the Sooners were awarded the program's first national seed (No. 7) in the NCAA Tournament.

The 2009 season was highlighted by Oklahoma hosting another NCAA Regional and making its 32nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Sooners were 43-20 overall and 17-10 in Big 12 play.

OU finished half of a game out of first place in the conference standings in 2009 and also dominated the award circuit with seven All-Big 12 honorees, including the Big 12 Player of the Year in J.T. Wise and the Big 12 Freshman of the Year in Garrett Buechele. The league honors were program firsts since the Big 12's inception in 1997 and were followed up by Wise being named a consensus All-American and the first Sooner to be given the Johnny Bench Award (top catcher).

Wise was one of four Sooners awarded All-America status in 2009 and joined a group of nine Sooners to be selected in the 2009 MLB Draft, a Big 12 high last season. The nine selections tied the nine selected under Golloway in 2006, the third most in program history. Since 2005, 29 Sooners have been drafted under Golloway at the helm.

The 2009 season was the second time the Sooners hosted a NCAA Regional in four years. In 2006, Golloway led OU to the NCAA Norman Regional title and became the second coach in NCAA Division I history to guide his club to a Super Regional Appearance in his first year at the helm. The NCAA regional title was a program first since 1995.

Including eight seasons (1996-2003) as the head coach at Oral Roberts and his record at OU's helm, Golloway is 505-254-1 (.665). The winning percentage ranks in the top 15 nationally among active head coaches (minimum five years).

QUICK HITS

- OU ranks third in the Big 12 in ERA (3.64) and ranks fourth in fielding percentage (.974) and hitting (.310). OU leads the conference with 46 home runs.
- The OU pitching staff ranks second in the Big 12 with 311 strikeouts and has 18 games with 10 or more K's, including the six of the last nine.
- The Sooners have homered in 21 of the last 26 contests with 36 in that span, including 10 multiple-homer games.
- The OU bullpen is 11-2 (lost to Missouri and OSU) with 10 saves on the season and a 2.65 ERA and 158 Ks in 135.2 IP.
- Cameron Seitzer hit for the cycle in the Sooners' 26-3 win over UAPB. Seitzer had a homer and a triple in the second inning.
- Seitzer ranks in the Big 12's top 10 in three offensive categories (HR - 8, TB-73 and SLG%-716).
- Garrett Buechele (8) is tied for fourth in the Big 12 in homers and Max White ranks sixth with seven homers.
- White has seven homers after starting just 17 games.
- Ryan Duke is a perfect 10-for-10 in save situations this year and ranked second in the nation in that category with 10 as of April 12.
- Jeremy Erben is seventh in the Big 12 with a 2.61 ERA and his six wins is tied for the second highest total. His scoreless streak ended after 22 2/3 innings on April 1. He has not allowed a run in 10 of his 14 appearances.
- Bobby Shore ranks fifth in the Big 12 with a 2.27 ERA.
- Zach Neal has 25 strikeouts and one walk in his last three starts which lasted a combined 20 2/3.
- Caleb Bushyhead (SS) is the only Sooner to play in all 33 games and he leads the team with 32 starts.
- Bushyhead registered one hit in 22 games last season and already has 37 hits after 33 games played in 2010. Bushyhead ranks second on OU with 11 multiple-hit games.
- Casey Johnson's 13-game hitting streak ended on April 1. It was a career best and the longest by a Sooner in 2010.
- Oklahoma has started 19 different players in the lineup after Cale Ellis made his first start vs. Texas on April 2.

OU-TEXAS TECH SERIES

The Sooners won the last three-game series with Texas Tech in Lubbock in 2008, 2-1. OU also two out of three games in last year's meeting in Norman and topped the Red Raiders, 5-2, in the Big 12 Championship in Oklahoma City.

- OU has won 14 of the last 17 games against Texas Tech and each of the last five series meetings.
- OU is 9-11 in games played in Lubbock, including series wins in the last two meetings.
- Texas Tech has won six of the 12 Big 12 series.
- The 2001 series in Norman was split with a tie in the series finale (7-7).
- Sooners swept the series in 2003, 2005 and 2006
- OU won the series opener in each of the last seven series
- OU is 8-3 in one-run games against Texas Tech, winning four of the last six games in that fashion

UP NEXT

OU hosts No. 10 TCU on Tuesday, April 20 at 7 p.m. at L. Dale Mitchell Park. The game is the second and final meeting of 2010 between OU and TCU. The Sooners won game one, 4-2, on April 6 in Fort Worth.

LAST TIME OUT

The No. 11 Sooners fell 7-6 in extra innings at Oklahoma State on Tuesday. Garrett Buechele homered twice and Kaleb Herren added another homer in the non-conference game. It marked the first Bedlam game played on a campus site since 1996. OSU will return the trip to Norman in 2011.

TWO HOME GAMES ADDED TO SCHEDULE

OU added two games to the regular season schedule in order to make up for games lost in March against Baylor due to inclement weather. The two non-conference home games include Arkansas Little Rock on May 4 and Texas Southern on May 19. Both games will get underway at 7 p.m. at L. Dale Mitchell Park. The OU Athletics Department will celebrate Fan Appreciation Day at both games with free admission into the park.

ERBEN RETURNS TO ROTATION

Jeremy Erben, the Sooners' top reliever in 2010 with six wins and a save, made his first start on April 11 vs. Missouri since the 2008 NCAA Tempe Regional (June 1 vs. Arizona State). Erben made 10 starts two years ago, including opening day at then-No. 1 UCLA and the Big 12 opener at Nebraska. Nine of his 11 career starts have come in Big 12 play. He made all 14 of his appearances out of the bullpen in 2009. He is 1-4 as a starter but lasted at least five innings in six of his 11 career starts.

LATE-INNING PRODUCTION

OU has scored 107 of its 255 runs, or 42 percent, in the sixth inning and later. In addition, the Sooners have outscored the opposition, 47-15, in the eighth and ninth innings combined, which includes eight home runs.

SCORING FIRST

OU has scored first in 10 of the last 25 games and in 14 overall. OU has a 12-2 record in those contests. The opposition has tallied the game's first run in 19 games and OU is 13-6 with three of those losses coming against Texas and the other three against Nebraska (GM3), Missouri (GM3) and Oklahoma State.

ATHLETICS COMMUNICATIONS

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ONE-RUN GAMES

The Sooners have recorded one-run victories in five games this year. OU is 5-2 in those situations this year and the Sooners are 55-21-1 (.721) under head coach Sunny Golloway. The Sooners' skipper entered 2010 with the best winning percentage among Big 12 coaches over the last five years (.721).

THE BIG INNING

OU has hit through the batting order already 12 times this season, three times in game one of the UAPB series, twice in game two of the SDSU series, and once each against Richmond, Mississippi State, Texas A&M-CC, UMass (GM2), Nebraska (GM1), UAPB (GM2) and Missouri (GM3). OU accomplished the feat on 23 occasions last year.

That 2009 team also scored five or more runs in 22 different frames. In 2010, OU has scored five or more runs in 11 different frames, including a season-high 10 runs in game one of the UAPB series (second inning). OU had three five-plus run innings in that UAPB game and also accomplished the feat twice in game two of the SDSU series and once versus Valparaiso, Western Illinois, Mississippi State, Baylor, Nebraska and Missouri.

TIME FOR A RALLY

The Sooners have come from behind to win 13 of the 33 games this season. Of Sunny Golloway's 198 wins at OU, 99 (.500) have been in come-from-behind fashion, including 22 last year. Below is a breakdown of the 2010 comebacks:

WINNING STREAKS

The 10-game winning streak from Feb. 28-March 13 marked the fifth time under head coach Sunny Golloway that OU has won 10 or more consecutive games and the 26th in program history.

DOUBLE DIGITS

The Sooners have recorded 10 or more hits in 22 of the first 33 games of the season, including a season-high 19 vs. Mississippi State and UAPB (March 30). OU is averaging 10.55 hits per game despite losing five regular starters from last season's club. The Sooners are also averaging 7.73 runs per game with 11 games with 10 or more scores, including the 26 posted in game one of the UAPB series, the most since exploding for 29 runs on March 22, 2009 at Kansas State.

EXTRA INNINGS UNDER GOLLOWAY

OU is 0-1 in extra-inning games this season but 15-3-1 overall since Sunny Golloway took over the helm of the Sooner program at the end of the 2005 season. The other two losses included Arkansas (April 28, 2009) and Mizzou (April 19, 2009).

The Sooners tied Nebraska in 2008. OU was 3-1 in 2009 in games played in extra innings.

DUKE MOVING UP SAVES LIST

Ryan Duke recorded two saves on the opening weekend to move into sole possession of second place on OU's all-time saves list (below). Duke led the Big 12 in saves with 16 last year (ranked sixth in the nation), the second most in a single season by a Sooner (Jeff Bajenaru - 20, 2000). He currently leads the Big 12 with 10 saves and is the first Sooner in school history to have 10 or more in two seasons. He ranks second in the nation as of April 12 with 10 saves. DUKE ON PRESEASON LISTS

Junior closer Ryan Duke was named a 2010 preseason All-American by the NCBWA and was also selected to the Stopper of the Year watch list. Duke was named a third team All-American in 2009 and is the first Sooner since David Purcey in 2003, now with the Toronto Blue Jays, to appear on a preseason AA list.

ERBEN ON PITCHER WATCH LIST

Jeremy Erben is one of seven hurlers from the Big 12 named to the Pitcher of the Year watch list on March 23 as presented by the College Baseball Foundation. This is the second year for the award and it will be presented in Lubbock, Texas, on July 2 as part of the College Baseball Awards Show. He is second in the Big 12 in wins (5) and ERA (0.61) and was named the Big 12 Pitcher of the Week for games played through March 7.

OGLE ON JOHNNY BENCH WATCH LIST

Sophomore catcher/DH Tyler Ogle was named to the Johnny Bench watch list for 2010 on March 2. Ogle caught in 10 games last year, including eight starts behind J.T. Wise (2009 winner). Wise became the first Sooner to collect the award in program history and just the second in Big 12 history.

DRAFTED SOONERS

Nine current Sooners have been drafted in their careers (third most in Big 12 this season), including four newcomers on the 2010 squad that were selected in 2009 (Danny Black, Ryan Gibson, Chad Kettler and Bobby Shore). Last season, OU led all Big 12 programs with nine players selected off the 2009 roster. BACK-TO-BACK PRESEASON POLLS

STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

During the opening weekend, Golloway used all 33 players that traveled to San Diego, including 15 newcomers. OU used 30 in week two at the Jacksonville Invitational. Jordan John is the only player on the 2010 35-man roster that has not seen action.

BASEBALL ON KREF 1400 AM IN 2010

The 2010 season marks the first with KREF 1400 AM serving as the flagship station of OU baseball and the partnership provides expanded coverage for OU fans to listen to 50 regular season games over the air. Additionally, 22 of the Big 12 games are set to be carried on the Sooners Sports' Network starting April 1, enabling fans to listen to OU baseball on various stations across the state starting on April 1, nearly double the amount from previous seasons.

The entire 56-game regular season schedule will be broadcast live for free on SoonerSports.com.

SOONER SPORTS NETWORK TO TELEVISION 20 OU GAMES

The University of Oklahoma will locally televise 19 home baseball games for the 2010 season. The broadcasts will air via the Sooner Sports Network on Cox Channel 3 in Oklahoma City and Cox Channel 3 in Tulsa. The games will be simulcast with the OU radio broadcast on the Sooner Sports Network with Chuck Kelly calling the play-by-play and DeWayne Vaughn providing the color analysis.

HOME RUN NOTES

1 - Max White homered in his first official at-bat against Jacksonville on Feb. 27. It came during White's first start as a Sooner. He walked earlier in the year as a pinch hitter. He is third on the team with seven homers.

3 - OU has recorded multiple-homer outings in 13 of the 33 games this year, including a season-high three against SDSU (GM2), Nebraska (GM1), UAPB (GM 1 and 2), Missouri (GM3) and OSU (GM1). The Sooners had 18 multi-HR games in 2009.

4 - Tyler Ogle hit the Sooners' first grand slam of 2010 in game two at SDSU and added another in game one vs. UAPB. Garrett Buechele also had a grand slam against Valpo and Cameron Seitzer had OU's third vs. Western Illinois. OU has had at least one four-run homer in each of the last seven seasons, including three in 2009.

8 - Cameron Seitzer and Garrett Buechele are tied for fourth in the Big 12 with eight home runs. Max White (7) is tied for sixth. Both Buechele and Seitzer connected for four homers in 2009 while White is a true freshman.

13 - OU has cracked 13 homers that have put the Sooners ahead this season.

16 - The Sooners have cracked 16 of their 46 homers in the seventh inning or later this year.

17 - While OU has 17 solo shots, 15 of the last 17 home runs have come with runners on base.

26 - The Sooners have blasted 26 of their 46 home runs with two outs on the board, including 11 of the last 15.

33 - For the second consecutive season, No. 33 Cameron Seitzer homered on opening day. In his first at-bat as a freshman, Seitzer homered in the 2009 opener vs. Western Illinois.

46 - OU had 59 homers after the first 33 games a year ago, which included the school-record 11 at Kansas State. 14 different Sooners have combined to clear the fences 46 times in 2010.

91 - The Sooners blasted 91 home runs a year ago, the most since the 1998 OU club. Only 24 of those dingers return in 2010, including seven from Casey Johnson.
