HEAD COACH JEFF CAPEL

Jeff Capel was named the 13th men's basketball head coach at Oklahoma on April 11, 2006. Capel, 33, is 39-27 in his third year at OU and led the Sooners to a 23-12 record and second-round NCAA Tournament appearance last year.



Capel compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His VCU squads posted a 50-22 (.694) record in Colonial Athletic Association play and a 47-11 overall home record for a staunch .811 winning percentage.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03 as Capel tied a school record for wins by a first-year head coach. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 10th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have a daughter, Cameron, who was born in April 2007.

GAME PREVIEW

Ranked No. 12 in the preseason AP top-25 poll and No. 14 in the ESPN/USA Today version, Oklahoma begins its 102nd season of varsity basketball when it hosts the American Eagles Friday at 7 p.m. at Lloyd Noble Center. The contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network (flagship KOKC AM-1520 in Oklahoma City; KTBZ AM-1430 in Tulsa) with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. The game will be televised by the Sooner Sports Network (Cox Channel 7 in OKC; Cox Channel 3 in Tulsa; ESPN Full Court) with **Bob Carpenter** and **Charlie Spoonhour** calling the action. A live webcast of the game will be available for viewing on the "All-Access" portion of OU's official athletics site, SoonerSports.com.

TICKET INFORMATION

► Upper-level reserved seats are available for \$10 (north and south) and \$20 (east and west) at the OU Athletics Ticket Office. Lloyd Noble Center ticket windows will open at 5 p.m. on Friday.

SATURDAY'S EXHIBITION RECAP

Oklahoma scored early and often in its second and final exhibition game, a 94-39 home win over Division II Cameron on Saturday. The Sooners scored the game's first nine points, jumped to a 21-2 lead and took a 51-13 advantage to halftime behind .528 field goal shooting and a 30-11 rebounding margin.

The second half featured more of the same as OU outscored the Aggies 43-26 after the break. Freshman guard **Willie Warren** netted 12 of his 15 points (on 5-for-7 field goal and 2-for-4 3-point shooting) and dished four assists after intermission. Sophomore forward **Blake Griffin** registered game highs of 17 points and 11 rebounds, and added five assists, two blocks and two steals in 23 minutes of action. He was 6-for-6 from the floor.

Sophomore guard **Cade Davis** came off the bench to go 4-for-7 from 3-point range for the second straight game. He finished with 14 points. Making his OU exhibition debut was sophomore forward **Kyle Cannon**. After missing the team's first exhibition game due to a team rules violation, Cannon had five points and four rebounds in 12 minutes against Cameron.

EXHIBITION SEASON LEFTOVERS

- Oklahoma's two exhibition opponents (Oklahoma Panhandle State and Cameron) are NCAA Division II members.
- The Sooners shot a combined .522 from the field, .327 (17-for-52) from 3-point distance and .675 (27-for-40) from the field in their exhibition games. They held their foes to .313 field goal and .207 3-point (6-for-29) performances.
- OU registered 18 combined blocked shots last week while their opponents totaled one.
- The Sooners improved to 41-2 (.953) in exhibition play over the past 21 seasons.

WHO'S HOT

- Sophomore forward **Blake Griffin** went 16-for-16 from the field over OU's two exhibition games and averaged 19.5 points, 11.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 2.5 blocks in 25.5 minutes per outing.
- **Willie Warren**, a McDonald's All-American last year, scored 15 points in each of the Sooners' two exhibition contests. He was 10-for-22 from the field (.455) and 7-for-8 from the free throw line (.875) while adding 3.0 boards, 3.5 assists and 2.5 steals a game.
- Sophomore guard **Cade Davis** came off the bench to go a combined 8-for-14 from 3-point range (4-for-7 in each outing for a .571 mark). He averaged 13.0 points in 19.0 minutes a game.

PREVIEWING AMERICAN

American University, located in Washington, D.C., is the 2008-09 Patriot League favorite after receiving 14 of 16 first-place votes in the conference's preseason poll. It registered a 21-12 overall record last year and advanced to the NCAA Tournament where it lost to No. 2 seed Tennessee, 72-57, in the first round. The Eagles went 10-4 in conference play to win the regular season league crown

"NOTE" WORTHY

- Oklahoma is 21-2 (.913) in season-opening games over the past 23 years and has won 28 of its last 29 home openers (.966).
- Half of Oklahoma's 14 players did not play for the Sooners last year. Six players are in their first year at OU while **Ryan Wright** (a transfer from UCLA) practiced with the team last season but did not play in games.
- Out of its 31 regular season games this year, OU will play at least 19 against teams that made the 2008 postseason (13 against NCAA Tournament teams, four against NIT squads and two against CBI teams). It could play three more NCAA Tournament teams beyond the first round of the NIT Season Tip-Off (Davidson, Arizona and Purdue).
- Oklahoma has recorded 27 consecutive winning seasons, second nationally to Syracuse (38). Big 12 programs Kansas (25) and Oklahoma State (20) also boast lengthy streaks.
- OU's 34-member 1,000-point club could have two new inductees by season's end in junior **Tony Crocker** and sophomore **Blake Griffin**. Crocker needs 338 points to reach 1,000 (he scored 394 last year) while Griffin needs 516 (he totaled 484 last season while missing two games and all but five minutes of another).
- The Sooners' Nov. 22 game against Gardner-Webb will mark their 500th at Lloyd Noble Center (they are 424-72 for a .855 mark).

and rattled off three more wins to claim the Patriot League tournament title. They averaged 64.8 points per game and shot .440 from the field, .408 from 3-point range and .739 from the free throw line. Opponents averaged 62.1 points and shot .415, .350 and .737, respectively.

The Eagles welcome back their top four scorers from last season...

► Senior **Garrison Carr**, the Patriot League Preseason Player of the Year, averaged 18.4 points, 3.4 rebounds and 1.7 assists per contest last year as a junior. The 5-11 guard shot team highs of .452 from 3-point range and .892 from the free throw line, and drained 135 treys for an average of 4.1 per game.

► Senior guard **Derrick Mercer** ranked second on the squad with his 12.4 scoring average and added 3.2 boards and 4.0 assists per outing. He shot .434 from 3-point range (36-for-83).

► American's third-leading scorer last season, senior forward **Brian Gilmore** averaged 8.9 points and 3.9 rebounds while shooting .475 from the field in 22.5 minutes per contest.

► Senior **Bryce Simon**, a 6-6 forward, started 31 of his 32 games last year and averaged 7.0 points, 4.0 rebounds and 2.1 assists. He ranked second on the squad with his 43 3-pointers and shot .374 from deep.

Head coach **Jeff Jones** is starting his ninth year at American and owns a 125-113 (.525) record there. The 1982 Virginia graduate is in his 17th year as a collegiate head coach and holds a 271-217 (.555) career mark.

OU-AMERICAN SERIES HISTORY

Friday's game will mark the first meeting between Oklahoma and American in men's basketball.

OPENING STATEMENT

The Sooners have won 21 of their last 23 season-opening games, with the only losses during the span coming to Alabama (68-62 in New York City) in 2002-03 and Massachusetts (84-83 in Norman) in 1993-94. OU has won 28 of its last 29 home openers.

SOONERS NO. 1 ACCORDING TO BIG 12 COACHES

For the first time in the 13-year history of the Big 12 Conference, the Sooners have been picked to win the league in a vote of head coaches. OU received three first-place votes and a total of 109 points in the conference's annual preseason poll to edge second-place Texas. The Longhorns captured four first-place votes and 107 total points. Baylor and Kansas tied for third place with 103 points. The complete poll can be found on page 4 of these game notes.

GRIFFIN NAMED AP PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Sophomore **Blake Griffin**, became the first Sooner in 13 years to be named an AP preseason first-team All-American on Nov. 3. The last OU player to receive the honor was forward **Ryan Minor** prior to the 1995-96 season. Griffin was joined on the five-man team by North Carolina forward **Tyler Hansbrough** (reigning national player of the year), Davidson guard **Stephen Curry**, Notre Dame forward **Luke Harangody** and UCLA guard **Darren Collison**. Griffin and Curry could meet in a second-round NIT Season Tip-Off contest next Tuesday in Norman.

UNANIMOUS PICKS

Blake Griffin and **Willie Warren** were unanimous selections as Big 12 Preseason Player and Freshman of the Year, respectively, the conference office announced Oct. 14. The players were selected by the league's head coaches, who were not permitted to vote for members of their own teams. Griffin is OU's third Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year (**Hollis Price** in 2002-03 and **Taj Gray** in 2005-06 were the others), while Warren is the second OU player to be named Big 12 Preseason Freshman of the Year (**Drew Lavender** was recognized prior to the 2003-04 season).

COMBO NO. 1

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed McDonald's All-Americans in back-to-back years in sophomore forward **Blake Griffin** and freshman guard **Willie Warren**. This season marks the first in history that multiple McDonald's All-Americans appear on an Oklahoma roster. Last March, Warren became the seventh OU signee to play in the McDonald's All-American Game. Others were **Wayman Tisdale** (1982), **Jeff Webster** (1989), **Ryan Humphrey** (1997), **Drew Lavender** (2003), **Scottie Reynolds** (2006) and Griffin (2007).

CAPTAINS NAMED

In a September players vote, senior **Taylor Griffin**, junior **Tony Crocker** and sophomore **Blake Griffin** were named captains for the 2008-09 season. This marks the first year that Crocker or Blake Griffin have served as an OU team captain. Taylor Griffin served as a captain last year along with David Godbold and Longar Longar.

NIT SEASON TIP-OFF UP NEXT

OU is the No. 2 seed in the 16-team 2008 Dick's Sporting Goods NIT Season Tip-Off and will host the four-team South Regional next Monday and Tuesday (Nov. 17 and 18). The Sooners will play No. 16 seed Mississippi Valley State in first-round action Monday at 8 p.m. CST on ESPNU. An NCAA Tournament team last year, Mississippi Valley State finished 17-16 and went 12-6 in the Southwestern Athletic Conference.

If OU beats the Delta Devils, it will play the winner of the Nov. 17 game between No. 5 seed Davidson and No. 12 seed James Madison on Tuesday on ESPN2. Davidson, which lost to eventual national champion Kansas by two points in last year's NCAA Elite Eight, posted a 29-7 overall record in 2007-08 and went 20-0 in Southern Conference play. The Wildcats return preseason first-team All-American Stephen Curry. James Madison finished with a 13-17 record last season.

If the Sooners win the South Regional, they'll advance to New York City for games during the week of Thanksgiving (Wednesday, Nov. 26, and Friday, Nov. 28) on ESPN2. Those contests will be played at Madison Square Garden.

Other NIT Season Tip-Off regional hosts are No. 1 seed Purdue, No. 3 seed Arizona and No. 4 seed Boston College.
