2008-09 OKLAHOMA MEN'S BASKETBALL

HEAD COACH JEFF CAPEL

Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 33, is 44-27 in his third year at OU and led the Sooners to a 23-12 record and second-round NCAA Tournament appearance last year.



Capel compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His VCU squads posted a 50-22 (.694) record in Colonial Athletic Association play and a 47-11 overall home record for a staunch .811 winning percentage.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 10th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have a daughter, Cameron, who was born in April 2007.

PREVIEWING FRIDAY'S GAME

Playing for its first out-of-state regular season tournament title since the 2000-01 season, No. 11/13 Oklahoma (5-0) faces No. 10/9 Purdue in the Dick's Sporting Goods NIT Season Tip-Off championship game Friday at 3 p.m. CST at New York's Madison Square Garden. The OU-Purdue matchup will follow the 12:30 p.m. consolation game between Boston College and UAB. Both contests will be televised by ESPN2 with **Dave O'Brien**, **Steve Lavin** and **Allen Hopkins** announcing. OU's game will air on the Sooner Radio Network (flagship KOKC AM-1520 in Oklahoma City; KTBZ AM-1430 in Tulsa) with **Ryan Ruocco** and **Mike Houck** calling the action.

WEDNESDAY'S UAB RECAP

- ▶ Oklahoma used a .600 second-half field goal performance to outscore UAB 48-33 after intermission in a 77-67 win. OU posted season-high game marks of .540 from the field and .348 from 3-point range (8-for-23).
- ▶ The Sooners trailed by 11 (34-23) with 2:54 left in the first half before cutting the Blazers edge to five at the break (34-29).
- ▶ Down 62-60 with 5:15 left, OU finished the game on a 17-5 run.
- ▶ **Blake Griffin** recorded his fifth straight double-double with 32 points (second highest career total) and 15 rebounds (season low) while adding three assists. He scored six points in the final 2:37 of the first half and netted 19 after the break. Griffin was 11-for-14 from the field and was solid at the line with a 10-for-14 effort.
- ▶ Junior guard **Tony Crocker** scored a season-high 12 points on 4-for-9 3-point shooting while sophomore guard **Cade Davis** posted a career-high 12 points on a career-high four treys (all in the second half). Crocker was 3-for-19 from behind the arc entering the game. Davis added a career-high three assists and tied a career best with four rebounds.
- ▶ Three of Davis' four 3-pointers came between the 11:29 and 7:11 marks of the second half.
- ▶ Senior guard **Austin Johnson** contributed seven points, four rebounds and five assists without a turnover.
- ▶ Oklahoma won despite committing seven more turnovers than UAB (17-10). OU actually outscored the Blazers 18-12 in the points-off-turnovers category.
- ▶ **Paul Delaney** led UAB with 23 points while **Robert Vaden** added 18 points and a team-high nine rebounds.

WHO'S HOT

- ▶ Sophomore forward **Blake Griffin** is averaging 27.2 points and a nation-leading 18.8 rebounds per game while shooting .754 from the field (that's not including the combined 16-for-16 performance from the field in OU's exhibition games). Griffin adds 2.8 assists and 2.8 steals a contest. He has recorded at least 15 rebounds in each contest (18 versus American, 19 against Mississippi Valley State, 21 against Davidson, 21 against Gardner-Webb and 15 versus UAB).
- ▶ Griffin has been especially productive over the last three games, averaging 30.7 points, 19.0 boards and 3.7 assists while shooting .711 from the floor (32-for-45) and .711 from the foul line (27-for-38).
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Cade Davis** returned to the floor Wednesday after missing the Gardner-Webb game with an ankle injury to score a career-high 12 points on a career-high four treys. Davis is averaging 9.5 points per game on the season and is shooting .440 from 3-point distance (11-for-25). He has made at least three treys in three of his four games (made one in the other).
- ▶ After averaging 7.0 points and 4.5 rebounds over OU's first two games, senior forward **Taylor Griffin** is averaging 12.0 points and 6.7 boards over the last three. He is 13-for-19 (.684) from the field over those outings.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- ▶ Oklahoma's 5-0 start is its best since the 2003-04 season when it began 10-0.
- ▶ Despite a not-so-stellar .671 team free throw percentage, the Sooners have made 11 more charity throws than their opponents have attempted this season. OU is 98-for-146 while foes are 58-for-87. That's an average of 11.8 more attempts per game than its opposition. **Blake Griffin** has attempted 41 percent of the team's free throws (60 of its 146).
- ▶ Griffin has accounted for 33 percent of OU's points on the year, 48 percent of its rebounds and 56 percent of its defensive boards.
- ▶ OU has made at least six 3-pointers in each of its five games, but is shooting just .309 from long range on the season. Last year, it

"NOTE" WORTHY

- ▶ Sophomore forward **Blake Griffin** became the first player in OU history to record at least 18 rebounds in four consecutive games. No player had done it in more than two games in a row. Griffin's career high in rebounds entering the year was 17.
- ▶ Griffin (27.2 ppg and 18.8 rpg) is on pace to set a school records for scoring and rebounding averages in a season. The record of 27.0 points per contest was set by **Wayman Tisdale** in 1983-84 while the standard of 13.3 boards per game was set by **Alvan Adams** in 1974-75.
- ▶ Purdue's **Robbie Hummel** is the fifth preseason conference player-of-the-year the Sooners are facing in their first six games. The others were American's **Garrison Carr**, Davidson's **Stephen Curry**, Gardner-Webb's **Grayson Flittner** and UAB's **Robert Vaden**.
- ▶ OU is going for its first NIT Season Tip-Off championship. The Sooners hold a 6-3 all-time record in the event, but this year marks the first time they advanced to New York for the final two rounds.
- ▶ Out of its 31 regular season games this year, OU will play 21 against teams that made the 2008 postseason (15 against NCAA Tournament teams, four against NIT squads and two against CBI teams).
- ▶ OU's 34-member 1,000-point club could have two new inductees by season's end in junior **Tony Crocker** and sophomore **Blake Griffin**. Crocker needs 303 points to reach 1,000 while Griffin needs 380.

posted a .348 season mark from the shorter 3-point distance.

► Junior guard **Tony Crocker** is averaging 7.0 points per game on .289 (13-for-45) field goal and .250 (7-for-28) 3-point shooting. Last year, he averaged 11.3 points and shot .441 and .424, respectively.

► Opponents have had success on the offensive glass this season, with each of OU's foes pulling down double-digit offensive rebounds. American (12), Mississippi Valley State (14), Davidson (14), Gardner-Webb (15) and UAB have averaged 13.4 offensive caroms.

► Sophomore **Blake Griffin** and his brother, senior **Taylor Griffin**, are a combined 66-for-91 (.725) from the field this year and have paired for 23 of the team's 50 steals (12 by Blake and 11 by Taylor).

► Going back to last year, **Blake Griffin** has registered at least three assists in 14 out of 38 games (three times this year). He has at least two assists in 23 career contests (four times this season).

► Sophomore guard **Cade Davis** missed his first career free throw Nov. 18 against Davidson. He made all 23 of his attempts as a freshman and his first three this year.

► Registering 54 blocked shots over the past two seasons (the most ever during a two-year period by a Sooner standing under 6-foot-8), **Taylor Griffin** has a team-high eight rejections already this year.

PREVIEWING PURDUE

Purdue enters Friday's NIT Season Tip-Off championship game with a 5-0 record after notching home victories over Detroit Mercy (82-50), Eastern Michigan (87-58), Loyola Chicago (78-46) and Coppin State (66-46), and an NIT semifinals win over Boston College on Wednesday (71-64). The Boilermakers, picked to win the Big Ten Conference by a panel of league media, are ranked No. 10 in the AP poll and No. 9 in the ESPN/USA Today version. They are shooting .444 from the field, .333 from 3-point range and .757 from the free throw line. They are getting outrebounded by 2.2 boards per contest.

► Sophomore guard **E'Twaun Moore** averages team highs of 15.6 points and 3.8 assists to go along with 5.8 rebounds per contest. He is shooting .483 from the field and .813 (13-for-16) from the free throw line. Moore registered game highs of 19 points and six assists against Boston College Wednesday.

► Big Ten Conference Preseason Player of the Year **Robbie Hummel** averages 15.0 points, a team-high 6.0 rebounds and 2.8 assists in only 23.4 minutes a game. The sophomore forward is shooting .500 from the field and .500 from long range (12-for-24), and is perfect from the free throw line (17-for-17).

► Sophomore forward **JuJuan Johnson** provides 10.8 points, 3.4 rebounds and a team-high 2.0 blocks a game, while shooting .525 from the field. He averages 21.6 minutes a game.

► Senior forward **Nemanja Calasan** comes off the bench to supply 8.8 points and 4.2 rebounds in 17.4 minutes an outing while senior point guard **Keaton Grant** averages 8.6 points, 3.6 boards and 3.4 assists a game.

Matt Painter, who last year directed the Boilers to a 25-9 overall record and a 15-3 Big Ten mark, is 61-40 (.604) in his fourth year at Purdue. He's in his fifth year as a collegiate head coach and owns an 86-45 (.656) record.

OKLAHOMA-PURDUE SERIES HISTORY

Oklahoma holds a 5-4 advantage against Purdue in a series that dates back to Dec. 21, 1962. OU is 3-0 against the Boilermakers in Norman, 2-2 in West Lafayette and 0-2 in neutral site competition. Purdue won the last meeting, a 74-71 decision during the 2006-07 season in the EA Sports Maui Invitational. **David Godbold** led OU with 17 points and **Austin Johnson** added 16 with

OKLAHOMA AT THE GARDEN

With its 77-67 win over UAB on Wednesday, Oklahoma now owns a 6-13 record inside Madison Square Garden. Prior to this trip, the Sooners' three most recent appearances in the building came in the past six years. OU lost to Duke (78-67) on Dec. 18, 2004, in the Dreyfus Classic, fell to Alabama (68-62) in the 2002-03 season opener in the AT&T Wireless Classic and split games with Memphis (lost 63-53) and Gardner-Webb (won 69-55) last season in the 2K Sports College Hoops Classic.

The Sooners also played at the Garden in the 1992 postseason NIT when Billy Tubbs' squad knocked off Colorado in the semifinals before falling to Stanford in the title game. Tubbs' 1981-82 team lost to Bradley inside MSG in the 1982 NIT semifinals. Prior to that, all of OU's Garden appearances took place between the 1939-40 and 1950-51 seasons. The Sooners lost the 1947 NCAA championship game to Holy Cross there, 58-47.

GRIFFIN NAMED BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK, AGAIN

Sophomore forward **Blake Griffin** was named Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week on Monday after averaging 26.7 points, 20.3 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 3.3 steals in wins over Mississippi Valley State, 21st-ranked Davidson and Gardner-Webb. He also shot .725 from the field. The award was the second in two weeks for Griffin, who also picked up the league's initial honor of the year for his 24-point, 18-rebound effort against American in the season opener. Griffin earned the honor twice as a freshman last year.

WARREN SHARES BIG 12 ROOKIE-OF-THE-WEEK HONOR

Freshman guard **Willie Warren** picked up his first career Big 12 weekly award when he was named the league's co-rookie of the week with Baylor freshman Quincy Acy on Monday. Warren averaged 17.0 points and 2.7 assists in OU's three victories, and nailed six treys. The 6-4, 207-pounder from Fort Worth, Texas, scored 14 points against Mississippi Valley State, a career-high 20 against Davidson and 17 versus Gardner-Webb. He made three 3-pointers against both Davidson and Gardner-Webb.

SCORING SURGE

The Sooners have scored with frequency in each of their first five games. In fact, they surpassed the 80-point mark in each of the first four outings (giving them four consecutive games of 80-plus for the first time since the 2003-04 season) and netted 77 Wednesday against UAB. OU is averaging 83.2 points and is shooting .504 from the field after averaging 67.9 points and shooting .442 last year. It shot .538 against American, .523 versus Mississippi Valley State, .521 against Davidson and .540 versus UAB.

CAPEL SIGNS FIVE; GROUP RANKED FOURTH BY ESPN

Third-year Oklahoma men's basketball head coach Jeff Capel signed a five-man list of high school seniors this month, giving OU the fourth-rated class nationally by ESPN. Headlining the group are top-25 players **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (Houston, Texas/Madison HS) and **Keith "Tiny" Gallon** (Houston, Texas/Oak Hill [Va.] Academy). Scout.com lists Mason-Griffin as the third best point guard in the 2009 class while ESPN rates Gallon as the country's third best center. Joining them as Sooners next year will be forward **Andrew Fitzgerald** (Baltimore, Md./Brewster [N.H.] Academy), forward **Kyle Hardrick** (Oklahoma City, Okla./Putnam City HS) and guard **Steven Pledger** (Chesapeake, Va./Atlantic Shores Christian School).

GRIFFIN NAMED AP PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Sophomore **Blake Griffin** became the first Sooner in 13 years to be named an AP preseason first-team All-American (Nov. 3). The last OU player to receive the honor was forward **Ryan Minor** prior to the 1995-96 season. Griffin was joined on the five-man team by North Carolina forward **Tyler Hansbrough** (reigning national player of the year), Davidson guard **Stephen Curry**, Notre Dame forward **Luke Harangody** and UCLA guard **Darren Collison**.

SOONERS NO. 1 ACCORDING TO BIG 12 COACHES

For the first time in the 13-year history of the Big 12 Conference, the Sooners have been picked to win the league in a vote of head coaches. OU received three first-place votes and a total of 109 points in the conference's annual preseason poll to edge second-place Texas. The Longhorns captured four first-place votes and 107 total points. Baylor and Kansas tied for third place with 103 points.

UNANIMOUS PICKS

Blake Griffin and **Willie Warren** were unanimous selections as Big 12 Preseason Player and Freshman of the Year, respectively, the conference office announced Oct. 14. The players were selected by the league's head coaches, who were not permitted to vote for their own players. Griffin is OU's third Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year (**Hollis Price** in 2002-03 and **Taj Gray** in 2005-06 were the others), while Warren is the second OU player to be named Big 12 Preseason Freshman of the Year (**Drew Lavender** was recognized prior to the 2003-04 season).

COMBO NO. 1

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed McDonald's All-Americans in back-to-back years in sophomore forward **Blake Griffin** and freshman guard **Willie Warren**. This season marks the first in history that multiple McDonald's All-Americans appear on an Oklahoma roster. Last March, Warren became the seventh OU signee to play in the McDonald's All-American Game. Others were **Wayman Tisdale** (1982), **Jeff Webster** (1989), **Ryan Humphrey** (1997), **Drew Lavender** (2003), **Scottie Reynolds** (2006) and Griffin (2007).

PATTILLO TO REDSHIRT

Head coach **Jeff Capel** announced following OU's season opener against American that junior forward **Juan Pattillo** will redshirt this year. The junior college transfer from College of Southern Idaho averaged 17.4 points and 6.7 rebounds in 22.1 minutes a game last year as a sophomore. He was regarded as the No. 3 juco sophomore in the country last year by analyst Van Coleman.

AYE, AYE

In a September players vote, senior **Taylor Griffin**, junior **Tony Crocker** and sophomore **Blake Griffin** were named captains for the 2008-09 season. This marks the first year that Crocker or Blake Griffin have served as an OU team captain. Taylor Griffin served as one last year along with **David Godbold** and **Longar Longar**.

OU BASKETBALL TRADITION

- This is the 102nd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- OU owns a 1,473-936 (.611) all-time record, ranking it 30th in NCAA Division I in wins and 40th in winning percentage.
- Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- OU has made 25 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 21 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 26 years rank as the seventh most in the nation.
- No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 26 years than Oklahoma's 25.
- The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and entered this season with the 12th best winning percentage (.726) since 2000.
- Nineteen different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 29 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim eight times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 72 times.
- The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
