### Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 71-34 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round in 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

### WEDNESDAY'S GAME BASICS

Ranked No. 25 in the AP poll, Oklahoma (2-1) is in Anchorage, Alaska, this week for the six-team Great Alaska Shootout. The Sooners, who will play three games, open Wednesday against San Diego (2-1) at 9:45 p.m. AST (12:45 a.m. CST). The contest, to be played at Sullivan Arena, will air on the Sooner Radio Network (KOKC AM 1520 in OKC; KTBS AM 1430 in Tulsa) with **Ryan Ruocco** and **Mike Houck** announcing. The game will be televised in Oklahoma City on Cox Cable 7 and in Tulsa on Cox Cable 3. It will also be shown on DirecTV (Ch. 640) and Dish Network (Ch. 432).

### NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ This marks Oklahoma's third trip to the Great Alaska Shootout. It owns a 4-2 record with third-place finishes in 1983-84 and 2004-05. OU also won the Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska, in 1999-00 (went 3-0).
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is averaging team highs of 15.7 points and 6.7 assists through three games. He has scored 27 points from the field and 20 from the free throw line (averaging 7.7 free throw attempts).
- ▶ Warren, who set an OU freshman record last year with 67 3-point makes and shot .372 from behind the arc, has started the season 1-for-15 from long range. Last year, he missed his first 10 attempts.
- ▶ Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** is averaging a double-double (12.0 points and 12.0 rebounds). His 15 boards in the season opener were the most in an OU freshman debut since **Alvan Adams** grabbed 28 caroms in the 1972-73 opener. Gallon has pulled down double-digit rebounds in all three contests and has two double-doubles.
- ▶ Freshman guard **Steven Pledger** has come off the bench to average 13.3 points in 20.7 minutes a contest. He is 8-for-20 from long distance (.400). The Chesapeake, Va., product netted 21 points in 19 minutes in OU's opener against Mount St. Mary's (he was 4-for-5 from long range).
- ▶ The Sooners have made 32 more free throws than their opponents on the young season. OU is 65-for-79 (.823) from the foul line while foes are 33-for-44 (.750).
- ▶ Guards have accounted for 170 of Oklahoma's 236 points (72 percent).
- ▶ The freshman foursome of Pledger (40), Gallon (36), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (30) and **Andrew Fitzgerald** (16) have scored 52 percent of OU's points (122 of 236).
- ▶ After draining 13-of-23 (.565) 3-point attempts in its exhibition game against British Columbia Nov. 3, OU has gone just 17-for-59 (.288) from long distance in its three regular season contests.

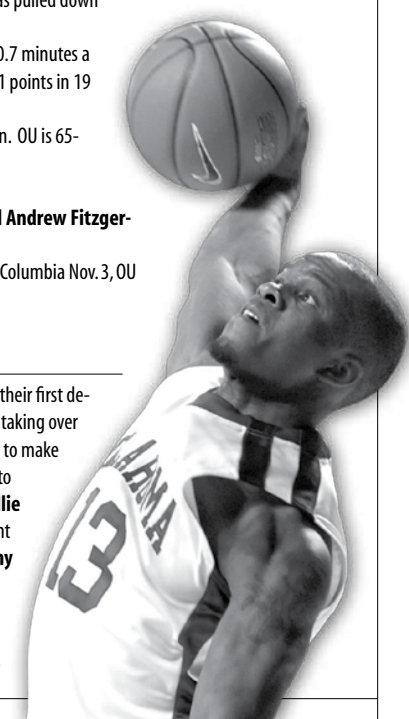
### SATURDAY'S VCU RECAP

**Jeff Capel's** return to Richmond, Va., was not a pleasant one as VCU handed the Sooners their first defeat of the season Saturday, 82-69. Capel, who coached the Rams for four seasons before taking over at OU, watched VCU go crazy from 3-point range in the first half while his team struggled to make shots. The Rams made seven first-half treys, including six in a row during a span of 6:20, to lead 44-34 at halftime (their largest lead was 17 points). OU preseason All-American **Willie Warren** had a poor shooting night, going 3-for-14 from the field and 0-for-8 from 3-point distance. The sophomore was held to eight points, though he did rack up five assists. **Tony Crocker** paced the Sooners with 19 points and added six rebounds, while **Tiny Gallon** recorded his second double-double in three games with 15 points and a game-high

11 boards. **Tommy Mason-Griffin** scored 10 points and registered career highs of seven points and six assists. VCU guard **Jay Gavin** hit four of his eight 3-point attempts and finished with a game-high 20 points, while forward **Larry Sanders** finished with 17 points, four assists and three blocks on his 21st birthday.

### MORE FROM SATURDAY'S LOSS

- ▶ Oklahoma never led in the contest. VCU led by at least 10 points the entire second half.
- ▶ Playing in his home state, freshman **Steven Pledger** came off the bench to register 11 points and the first three assists of his career. He also added three steals without committing a turnover.
- ▶ OU outrebounded VCU 38-35 but committed four more turnovers (15-11).
- ▶ The Sooners finished the game 5-for-26 (.192) from 3-point range.
- ▶ Oklahoma was the first ranked opponent (No. 17) that VCU hosted in 17 seasons.

### PREVIEWING SAN DIEGO

West Coast Conference member San Diego, which finished 16-16 overall last year and went 6-8 in league play, is off to a 2-1 start this season. The Toreros beat Stanford (77-64) and Point Loma (84-65) at home and lost to Pacific (56-55) on the road. The team's top four scorers are seniors.

Guards **De'Jon Jackson** and **Brandon Johnson** both average double figures in scoring. Jackson is averaging 17.7 points a contest thanks to .515 field goal and .538 (7-for-13) 3-point field goal shooting. He also contributes 5.0 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.0 steals per contest. Johnson, a fifth-year senior who was granted a medical hardship following last year's ruptured Achilles' tendon, is averaging 14.0 points over his two games (he did not play against Point Loma Nov. 18). Senior forward **Chris Lewis** (.632 FG%) is averaging 9.7 points and a team-high 5.7 boards while center **Roberto Mafra** (.579 FG%) supplies 9.0 points and 5.0 rebounds an outing.

USD is coached by **Bill Grier**, a 1990 Oregon graduate who is 40-31 (.563) in his third year with the Toreros. The former top assistant at Gonzaga led San Diego to a 22-14 record and a first-round NCAA Tournament victory over Connecticut two years ago.

### OU-SAN DIEGO SERIES HISTORY

Oklahoma won its only previous meeting with San Diego, a 68-61 outcome in OU's fourth outing of the 1999-00 season. The game was a Sooner Invitational first-round matchup played in Norman.

### OU'S GREAT ALASKA SHOOTOUT HISTORY

This marks OU's third appearance in the Great Alaska Shootout. The Sooners went 2-1 in both the 1983 and 2004 events, finishing in third place on each occasion. Under head coach **Billy Tubbs** in 1983, Oklahoma beat USC (92-91), lost to Arkansas (84-78) and beat Santa Clara (91-77). Under head coach **Kelvin Sampson** in 2004, OU downed High Point (93-65), lost to Washington (96-91) and defeated Minnesota (67-54). Both OU squads went on to win the regular season conference title (Big Eight in 1983-84 and Big 12 in 2004-05).

This year's event marks the second for current OU head coach **Jeff Capel**. As a player, Capel helped Duke to the 1995 Great Alaska Shootout title his junior season. The Blue Devils beat Iowa, 88-81, in the championship game and Capel was named to the all-tourney team. Duke's first-round matchup that year was against Old Dominion, a team coached by Capel's father (also Jeff Capel). The Blue Devils won 75-55.

### REST OF THE FIELD

Joining Oklahoma and San Diego in Pool B this week are the Houston Cougars, OU's Thursday opponent at 7:30 p.m. AST (10:30 p.m. CST). Houston enters the tournament with a 1-1 record (it beat Nicholls State 92-60 at home before losing to Nevada 112-99 on the road). Comprising Pool A are Alaska Anchorage (1-1), Nicholls State (0-5) and Washington State (3-0). OU will play a team from Pool A on Saturday at a to-be-determined time.

### TISDALE INDUCTED INTO COLLEGIATE HOOPS HALL

**Wayman Tisdale**, OU's all-time leading scorer and rebounder, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Sunday in Kansas City, Mo. Tisdale starred at Oklahoma for three seasons in the mid-1980s and was named a first-team consensus All-American and Big Eight Conference Player of the Year each year. Tisdale was the leading rebounder on the 1984 U.S. Olympic gold medal team and was the No. 2 overall pick of the 1985 NBA Draft. He passed away last May from cancer at the age of 44. His wife, **Regina Tisdale**, was on hand to accept the honor on Tisdale's behalf. Among the others in this year's eight-person class were **Larry Bird** and **Magic Johnson**.

### TSN NAMES WARREN PRESEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Oklahoma sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is not only on The Sporting News' five-man preseason All-America team, he is the publication's choice as preseason national player of the year. If TSN's prediction holds true, Oklahoma would become the first program to record back-to-back national players of the year since Duke in 2000 (**Shane Battier**) and 2001 (**Jason Williams**). Sooner **Blake Griffin** was last year's consensus honoree. OU opponents in **bold****OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS**

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

**CAPEL'S QUICK START**

When **Jeff Capel** was named OU head coach in May 2006, he inherited a thin roster and recruiting restrictions from the previous staff. After a 16-15 initial season, Capel directed seven-win improvements in both 2007-08 (23-12 record) and 2008-09 (30-6). His 69-33 mark as Sooners' boss entering this season ranked him No. 1 in school history in wins and winning percentage (.676) through the first three years of tenure. **Kelvin Sampson** ranks second in both categories (59 wins; .641) while **Billy Tubbs** ranks third (55 wins; .591).

**SOONERS SIGN PAIR OF TOP-100 RECRUITS**

Texas high school seniors **Cameron Clark** and **T.J. Taylor** signed national letters of intent last week and will be freshmen on OU's 2010-11 squad. Both players are ranked among the nation's top-100 seniors.

Clark is a 6-6, 185-pound wing from Sherman High School who is ranked No. 18 in the country by ESPN.com and No. 30 by both Rivals.com and Scout.com. A first-team all-state selection last year as a junior, Clark averaged 21.0 points, 7.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.6 steals per game for a 27-8 Bearcats' squad that advanced to the regional quarterfinals of the Class 4A state tournament.

"Cameron is an elite level athlete who has his best basketball in front of him," said OU head coach **Jeff Capel**. "I don't think he's begun to scratch the surface of who he can become. Because of his athleticism, he has the ability to make some 'wow' plays. He shoots the ball very well from mid-range and he can shoot it to 3. He also has the ability to do things off the bounce. I anticipate him being a big-time wing player for us, a guy who can be a tremendous defender and one who'll be flying around making plays all over the floor."

Taylor, a 6-3, 205-pound left-handed guard from Denison High School is rated by ESPN.com as the No. 71 overall player in the 2010 recruiting class and by Rivals.com as the No. 91 player. He averaged 27.1 points, 6.1 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 3.0 steals per game last year for a 21-11 Denison team that advanced to the area finals of the Class 4A state tournament. He was a first-team all-state pick and district offensive player of the year each of the last two seasons.

"T.J. is a strong left-handed guard who can play both guard positions," said Capel. "He's very physical and he can shoot it. One of my favorite things about him is that he loves to play, he loves to compete. I think his best strength is his strength. He's versatile and is just a good guard. He has a good feel for the game as far as passing the ball and seeing things. I also think he has the chance to be a really good defender for us."

**QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION**

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,500-942 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
