Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 71-36 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round in 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

SATURDAY'S GAME BASICS

Ranked No. 25 in the AP poll, Oklahoma (2-3) meets Nicholls State (0-7) in the fifth-place game of the Great Alaska Shootout Saturday at 5 p.m. CST. The contest, to be played at Sullivan Arena in Anchorage, will air on the Sooner Radio Network (KRXXO FM 107.7 in OKC; KTBZ AM 1430 in Tulsa) with **Ryan Ruocco** and **Mike Houck** announcing. The game will be televised on Fox College Sports and on MASN (DirecTV Ch. 640 and Dish Network Ch. 432).

NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ Oklahoma's three-game non-conference losing streak is its first since the 1995-96 season when it started the year 1-3.
- ▶ The Sooners are giving up 86.0 points per contest over the last three outings. Opponents are shooting .457 from the field and .392 from 3-point distance.
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is averaging 27.5 points and 5.0 assists this week in two Great Alaska Shootout games. He is 20-for-21 (.952) from the free throw line. On the season, Warren is averaging team highs of 20.4 points and 6.0 assists. He has scored 62 points from the field and 40 from the free throw line (averaging 8.8 free throw attempts).
- ▶ Warren is 40-for-44 from the free throw line for a sparkling .909 percentage. He has made and attempted 25 more free throws than the next closest Sooner.
- ▶ Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** is averaging a double-double (11.8 points and 10.2 rebounds). His 15 boards in the season opener were the most in an OU freshman debut since **Alvan Adams** grabbed 28 caroms in the 1972-73 opener.
- ▶ Freshman guard **Steven Pledger** is averaging 13.6 points in 23.6 minutes a contest. He is 15-for-35 from long distance (.429). The Chesapeake, Va., product has already surpassed the 20-point mark twice this season (21 vs. Mount St. Mary's and 23 vs. Houston).
- ▶ The Sooners have made 29 more free throws than their opponents. OU is 106-for-127 (.835) from the foul line while foes are 77-for-102 (.755).
- ▶ Guards have accounted for 286 of Oklahoma's 393 points (73 percent).
- ▶ The frosh foursome of Pledger (68), Gallon (59), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (43) and **Andrew Fitzgerald** (20) has scored 48 percent of OU's points (190 of 393).

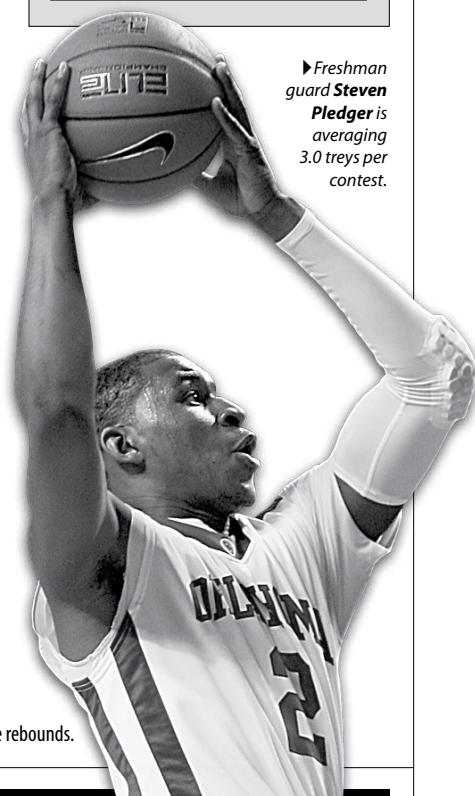
THURSDAY'S HOUSTON RECAP

Oklahoma got off to a blazing start against Houston Thursday in the second round of the Great Alaska Shootout and appeared as though it would snap its two-game losing streak. The Sooners built a 20-6 lead about six minutes into the contest behind five 3-pointers — three of them by **Steven Pledger** — and solid zone defense. The Cougars reduced their deficit to five by halftime (52-47) only to see OU go back up by 10 (63-53) with 15:46 left in the second half. Houston was relentless, though, immediately using an 11-0 run to take its first lead of the game. After the Sooners regained a two-point (69-67) advantage, the Cougars went on a 23-6 spurt to go ahead 90-75 and held off a late OU charge for the win. **Kelvin Lewis** (28) and **Aubrey Coleman** (27) combined for 55 points for a Houston team that shot .583 from the field and .600 (6-for-10) from 3-point range after halftime. Oklahoma committed 18 turnovers to Houston's seven and surrendered 17 offensive rebounds.

Willie Warren led the Sooners with 25 points and seven assists while Pledger, who finished 6-for-14 from long distance in his first career start, tallied 23.

MORE FROM THURSDAY'S LOSS

► **Steven Pledger** scored 20 of his 23 points in the first half. He was 5-for-9 from 3-point range in the opening 20 minutes.

► **Tony Crocker's** 10 rebounds marked a career high. The senior guard, who has pulled down nine boards four times in his career, also had eight points, three assists and two steals.

► Juniors **Orlando Allen** (four rebounds, three blocks) and **Cade Davis** (11 points, four boards) made their first starts of the year. For Allen, it was the first start of his career.

► Freshmen **Tiny Gallon** and **Tommy Mason-Griffin** came off the bench for the first time this season. Gallon recorded 15 points (on 6-for-8 shooting) and nine rebounds in 22 minutes, while Mason-Griffin finished with 11 points and five assists in 26 minutes.

► Houston scored 76 points over the game's final 26 minutes.

PREVIEWING NICHOLLS STATE

Southland Conference member Nicholls State enters Saturday's game with a 0-7 record. The Colonels, who finished 20-11 last year and were picked to finish second this year in the Southland's East Division by league coaches, are getting outscored by 20.7 points per contest. They're coming off a 78-69 loss to Washington State Friday, a game in which NSU led 31-29 at halftime.

Junior guard/forward **Anatoly Bose**, who's from Australia, leads the Colonels by averaging 16.7 points a contest. He has scored 20 or more points four times this season. Bose has made a team-high 18 treys and leads the squad with his 4.7 rebounds a contest. Sophomore guard **Fred Hunter** is averaging 12.4 points, 4.3 boards and 2.0 steals per contest. Last season's Southland Conference Freshman of the Year, Hunter scored 25 points Friday against Washington State. Junior guard **Maurice Foster** supplies 12.2 points a contest and is shooting .543 from the field. No other player averages more than 4.9 points a game.

Head coach **J.P. Piper**, a 1991 Southeastern Louisiana graduate, is 53-100 (.346) in his sixth year with the Colonels.

OU-NICHOLLS STATE SERIES HISTORY

Oklahoma owns a 4-0 record against Nicholls State. The Sooners posted wins over the Colonels in the 1983-84 (107-51), 1994-95 (89-80), 1995-96 (87-47) and 1998-99 (64-44) seasons. All four games were played in Norman.

OU'S GREAT ALASKA SHOOTOUT HISTORY

This marks OU's third appearance in the Great Alaska Shootout. The Sooners went 2-1 in both the 1983 and 2004 events, finishing in third place on each occasion. Under head coach **Billy Tubbs** in 1983, Oklahoma beat USC (92-91), lost to Arkansas (84-78) and beat Santa Clara (91-77). Under head coach **Kelvin Sampson** in 2004, OU downed High Point (93-65), lost to Washington (96-91) and defeated Minnesota (67-54). Both OU squads went on to win the regular season conference title (Big Eight in 1983-84 and Big 12 in 2004-05).

This year's event marks the second for current OU head coach **Jeff Capel**. As a player, Capel helped Duke to the 1995 Great Alaska Shootout title his junior season. The Blue Devils beat Iowa, 88-81, in the championship game and Capel was named to the all-tourney team. Duke's first-round matchup that year was against Old Dominion, a team coached by Capel's father (also Jeff Capel). The Blue Devils won 75-55.

NEXT UP

Oklahoma returns to Norman to host Arkansas on Wednesday at 7 p.m. CST. The Razorbacks, who beat the Sooners 96-88 in Fayetteville last year, enter weekend play with a 2-3 record.

TISDALE INDUCTED INTO COLLEGIATE HOOPS HALL

Wayman Tisdale, OU's all-time leading scorer and rebounder, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Sunday in Kansas City, Mo. Tisdale starred at Oklahoma for three seasons in the mid-1980s and was named a first-team consensus All-American and Big Eight Conference Player of the Year each year. Tisdale was the leading rebounder on the 1984 U.S. Olympic gold medal team and was the No. 2 overall pick of the 1985 NBA Draft. He passed away last May from cancer at the age of 44. His wife, **Regina Tisdale**, was on hand to accept the honor on Tisdale's behalf. Among the others in this year's eight-person class were **Larry Bird** and **Magic Johnson**.

TSN NAMES WARREN PRESEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Oklahoma sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is not only on The Sporting News' five-man preseason All-America team, he is the publication's choice as preseason national player of the year. If TSN's prediction holds true, Oklahoma would become the first program to record back-to-back national players of the year since Duke in 2000 (**Shane Battier**) and 2001 (**Jason Williams**). Sooner **Blake Griffin** was last year's consensus honoree. Joining Warren on the magazine's preseason All-America team are Kansas' **Sherron Collins**, West Virginia's **Devin Ebanks**, Notre Dame's **Luke Harangody** and Kentucky's **Patrick Patterson**.

OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while

Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

CAPEL'S QUICK START

When **Jeff Capel** was named OU head coach in May 2006, he inherited a thin roster and recruiting restrictions from the previous staff. After a 16-15 initial season, Capel directed seven-win improvements in both 2007-08 (23-12 record) and 2008-09 (30-6). His 69-33 mark as Sooners' boss entering this season ranked him No. 1 in school history in wins and winning percentage (.676) through the first three years of tenure. **Kelvin Sampson** ranks second in both categories (59 wins; .641) while **Billy Tubbs** ranks third (55 wins; .591).

SOONERS SIGN PAIR OF TOP-100 RECRUITS

Texas high school seniors **Cameron Clark** and **T.J. Taylor** signed national letters of intent last week and will be freshmen on OU's 2010-11 squad. Both players are ranked among the nation's top-100 seniors.

Clark is a 6-6, 185-pound wing from Sherman High School who is ranked No. 18 in the country by ESPN.com and No. 30 by both Rivals.com and Scout.com. A first-team all-state selection last year as a junior, Clark averaged 21.0 points, 7.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.6 steals per game for a 27-8 Bearcats' squad that advanced to the regional quarterfinals of the Class 4A state tournament.

"Cameron is an elite level athlete who has his best basketball in front of him," said OU head coach **Jeff Capel**. "I don't think he's begun to scratch the surface of who he can become. Because of his athleticism, he has the ability to make some 'wow' plays. He shoots the ball very well from mid-range and he can shoot it to 3. He also has the ability to do things off the bounce. I anticipate him being a big-time wing player for us, a guy who can be a tremendous defender and one who'll be flying around making plays all over the floor."

Taylor, a 6-3, 205-pound left-handed guard from Denison High School is rated by ESPN.com as the No. 71 overall player in the 2010 recruiting class and by Rivals.com as the No. 91 player. He averaged 27.1 points, 6.1 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 3.0 steals per game last year for a 21-11 Denison team that advanced to the area finals of the Class 4A state tournament. He was a first-team all-state pick and district offensive player of the year each of the last two seasons.

"T.J. is a strong left-handed guard who can play both guard positions," said Capel. "He's very physical and he can shoot it. One of my favorite things about him is that he loves to play, he loves to compete. I think his best strength is his strength. He's versatile and is just a good guard. He has a good feel for the game as far as passing the ball and seeing things. I also think he has the chance to be a really good defender for us."

QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,500-945 (.613) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
