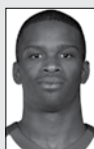

Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 72-36 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round in 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

WEDNESDAY'S GAME BASICS

Unranked for the first time this year, Oklahoma (3-3) plays at home for the first time in 18 days Wednesday when it hosts Arkansas (2-4) at 7 p.m. CST. The Sooners snapped a three-game losing streak Saturday, while the Razorbacks are coming off a third straight home loss on Sunday. Wednesday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network (KOKC AM 1520 in OKC; KMOD FM 97.5 in Tulsa; Sirius 125) with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. The game will be televised on the Sooner Sports Network (KWTV Ch. 9 in OKC; KOTV Ch. 6 in Tulsa; ESPN Full Court) with **Bob Carpenter** and **Charlie Spoonhour** calling the action.

NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ Oklahoma has won 72 of its last 74 home non-conference games and five of its last six overall meetings against Arkansas.
- ▶ The Sooners lead the Big 12 Conference with their .829 free throw percentage and have made more free throws (116) than their opponents have attempted (106). Only five Big 12 teams are shooting above .700 from the foul line.
- ▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** started the last two games and responded with 11 points and four rebounds against Houston and career highs of 18 points and four steals against Nicholls State. Davis, who averaged 3.8 points over the team's first four games coming off the bench, has made his last 14 free throw attempts and is 15-of-16 on the year (.938).
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, who did not play Saturday versus Nicholls State (coach's decision), is averaging team highs of 20.4 points and 6.0 assists in his five games. He has scored 62 points from the field and 40 from the free throw line (averaging 8.8 free throw attempts). Warren is 40-for-44 from the foul line for a sparkling .909 percentage.
- ▶ Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** is averaging a double-double (12.3 points and a Big 12-high 10.5 rebounds). His 15 boards in the season opener were the most in an OU freshman debut since **Alvan Adams** grabbed 28 caroms in 1972-73.
- ▶ Freshman guard **Steven Pledger** is averaging 13.7 points in 25.8 minutes a contest. He is 19-for-40 from long distance (.475) and has hit at least four treys in three games. He has already surpassed the 20-point mark twice this season (21 vs. Mount St. Mary's and 23 vs. Houston).
- ▶ Guards have accounted for 349 of Oklahoma's 474 points (74 percent).
- ▶ The freshman foursome of Pledger (82), Gallon (74), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (53) and **Andrew Fitzgerald** (30) has scored 50 percent of OU's points.

GREAT ALASKA SHOOTOUT RECAP

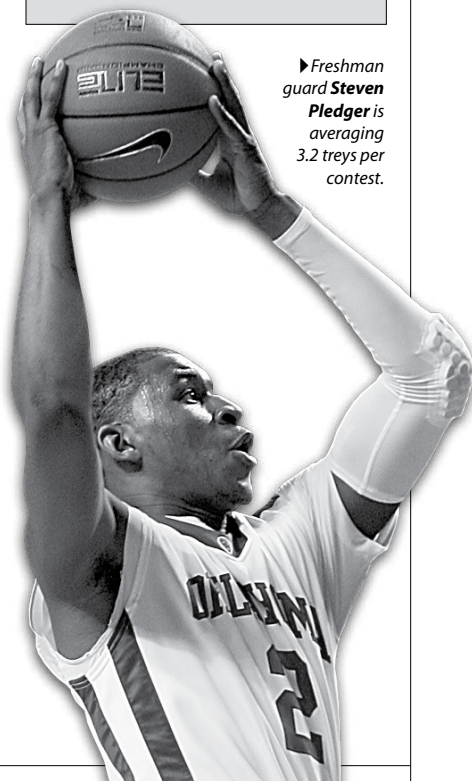
Oklahoma finished in fifth place at the six-team Great Alaska Shootout last week in Anchorage. The Sooners lost to San Diego (76-64) and Houston (100-93) in the first and second rounds, respectively, before rebounding to defeat Nicholls State (81-60). **Tiny Gallon** was OU's lone representative on the all-tournament team. Here are some quick notes on each of the Sooners' games:

- ▶ **VS. SAN DIEGO:** Oklahoma used a 17-2 run to go ahead 20-14 with 7:30 left in the first half, only to see the Toreros respond with a 14-0 run to go up 28-20. San

Diego extended its lead to as many as 23 (72-49) in the second half. The Sooners were outrebounded 42-31 and shot just .328 from the field and .280 (7-for-25) from 3-point range. **Willie Warren** was 12-for-12 from the free throw line and scored a game-high 30 points. He was the only Sooner in double figures.

► **VS. HOUSTON:** OU stormed to a 41-23 first-half lead before a Houston surge cut the margin to five (52-47) at halftime. Up 63-53 with 15 minutes left, the Sooners were outscored 47-30 the rest of the way. The Cougars shot .583 from the field in the second half and also hit six of their 10 3-point attempts. Oklahoma, which suffered a rare defeat when shooting above .500 from the field (.536), gave up 17 offensive rebounds and committed 18 turnovers to Houston's seven. **Willie Warren** had 25 points and seven assists while **Steven Pledger** scored a career-high 23 (20 in the first half) with the help of six treys.

► **VS. NICHOLLS STATE:** The Sooners bounced back from a 48-41 early second-half deficit to outscore the Colonels 40-12 over the final 17 minutes. OU shot .604 from the field (tied for its best mark in five years) and drained a season-high 13 treys on 23 attempts (.565) to overcome a 30-25 rebounding deficit. The Sooners also forced 11 second-half turnovers to spark their run. Cade Davis hit four 3-pointers and scored a career-high 18 points to lead six OU players in double figures. **Tiny Gallon** had 15 points and 12 boards, while **Steven Pledger** (four treys) and **Tony Crocker** (three treys) scored 14 each.

MORE FROM THE GREAT ALASKA SHOOTOUT

► The Sooners shot .481 from the field, .419 from 3-point range and .836 from the free throw line over their three games while opponents recorded respective figures of .432, .383 and .758. OU was outrebounded 106-91, however, and gave up 49 offensive rebounds. It also committed 45 turnovers to its foes' 37.

► **Willie Warren** averaged 27.5 points and 5.0 assists against San Diego and Houston (he did not play against Nicholls State). The sophomore was 20-for-21 from the free throw line in his two games.

► Juniors **Orlando Allen** (four rebounds, three blocks) and **Cade Davis** (11 points, four boards) made their first starts of the year against Houston. For Allen, it was the first start of his career. Davis also started against Nicholls State and scored a career-high 18 points.

► OU's .836 free throw performance was the eighth best in the 32-year history of the tournament.

PREVIEWING ARKANSAS

After starting the year with a 130-68 win over Alcorn State, Arkansas has lost four of five games, including its last three at home to Morgan State (97-94), East Tennessee State (94-85) and South Alabama (74-61). Its other two games were a 96-66 loss to Louisville (in St. Louis, Mo.) and an 81-72 overtime home win over Appalachian State. The Razorbacks, who have played shorthanded due to suspensions and injuries, are averaging 86.2 points a game while giving up 83.5. They're getting outrebounded by an average of 6.7 boards a contest.

Sophomore guard **Rotnei Clarke** leads four Razorbacks who average double figures in points. Clarke, from Verdigris, Okla., is averaging 26.7 points and 2.0 assists per game. He has made 35 3-pointers (5.8 per game) and is shooting .574 from behind the arc. Clarke hit an SEC-record 13 treys against Alcorn State and scored a school-record 51 points. Freshman forward **Marshawn Powell** has started all six contests and is averaging 14.3 points and a team-high 6.7 rebounds. He averaged 19.5 points and 8.0 rebounds over the team's first four games but is averaging 4.0 points and 4.0 boards over the last two. Senior forward **Michael Washington** is averaging 14.0 points, 5.6 rebounds and 1.6 blocks. Washington started the first five games but missed Sunday's contest against South Alabama with a back injury. Junior guard/forward **Jemal Farmer** contributes 13.0 points and 6.0 boards per outing. He scored 28 in the season opener. Freshman guard **Julysses Nobles** leads the team with his 6.7 assists per outing to go along with his 8.5 scoring average. He has replaced sophomore point guard **Courtney Fortson**, who has not played this year due to suspension, in the lineup. Fortson was an SEC All-Freshman Team member last year when he averaged 14.8 points and 5.9 assists.

John Pelphey is in his third season as Arkansas' head coach and owns a 39-32 (.549) record. In his eighth year overall, the 1992 Kentucky graduate is 119-99 (.546). He coached five seasons at South Alabama prior to taking the Arkansas job.

OU-ARKANSAS SERIES HISTORY

Wednesday's game will mark the 24th between Oklahoma and Arkansas, and the 11th meeting in Norman. Despite winning five of the last six overall meetings against the Razorbacks, OU trails the all-time series by a 13-10 count. The Sooners lead in Norman, however, 7-3. OU swept a four-game home-and-home series between the 1998-99 and 2001-02 seasons and posted an 83-72 home win two years ago before losing 96-88 in Fayetteville last season. Fourth-ranked Oklahoma took a 12-0 record to Fayetteville last December but came out on the losing end of a 96-88 decision to unranked Arkansas. The Razorbacks ambushed the Sooners, jumping out to a 25-8 lead just 6:45 into the contest. Arkansas shot .633 from the field and hit 5-of-9 (.556) 3-point attempts in the first half to take a 53-38 lead at halftime. The advantage ballooned to 25 points (72-47) midway through the second half before a 16-0 OU run cut the margin to nine. Still trailing 81-69, an 8-0 Sooners run made the score 81-77 with five minutes to play, but OU got no closer. **Willie Warren** scored a career-high 35 points with the help of 7-for-11 3-point shooting and added four rebounds and four assists to pace OU. **Blake Griffin** finished with 21 points and 13 rebounds, while Tony Crocker went 6-for-13 from behind the arc to finish with 18 points. Six Razorbacks scored in double figures, led by **Michael Washington's** 24 (he also had 11 rebounds). **Stefan Welsh** scored 19 and **Rotnei Clarke** 15. OU entered the game allowing opponents to shot just .379 from the

field but watched Arkansas post a .517 figure. OU shot .438 from the field, .394 (13-for-33) from 3-point distance and .500 (11-for-22) from the free throw line.

HOME NON-CONFERENCE DOMINATION

The Sooners have dominated home non-conference games over the last decade, winning 72 of their last 74 non-league contests inside Lloyd Noble Center going back to Jan. 3, 2000 (good for a .973 winning percentage). Included was a streak of 49 non-conference home victories that was snapped by Villanova on Dec. 6, 2006. The current string stands at 14 games.

FEARSOME FRESHMAN FOURSOME

The freshman foursome of **Steven Pledger** (13.7), **Tiny Gallon** (12.3), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (8.8) and **Andrew Fitzgerald** (6.0) has combined to score 239 of the team's 474 points this year, or 50 percent. One of the Big 12's best 3-point shooters, Pledger has knocked down 19 treys on 40 attempts (.475) and has two games of more than 20 points. Over the last two outings, Pledger is 10-for-19 from behind the arc (.526). Gallon, who is shooting .604 from the field, leads the Big 12 with his 10.5 rebounds per game and ranks second with his three double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Mason-Griffin ranks fourth in the league with his 5.2 assists per game and has had at least four handouts in each contest. Fitzgerald is shooting .526 from the field and is 10-for-13 from the free throw line (.769).

HEATING UP FROM OUTSIDE

After shooting .286 from 3-point range and averaging 6.0 treys through its first four games, OU is shooting .510 and averaging 12.5 makes from behind the arc over the last two outings. Freshman **Steven Pledger** has been the main gun, going 10-for-19 (.526) over the last two contests. Fellow freshman **Tommy Mason-Griffin** is 4-for-6 (.667) and senior **Tony Crocker** is 4-for-8 (.500) over the same two games. Junior **Cade Davis** made a season-high four 3-pointers Saturday against Nicholls State on nine attempts.

TISDALE INDUCTED INTO COLLEGIATE HOOPS HALL

Wayman Tisdale, OU's all-time leading scorer and rebounder, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Nov. 22 in Kansas City, Mo. Tisdale starred at Oklahoma for three seasons in the mid-1980s and was named a first-team consensus All-American and Big Eight Conference Player of the Year each year. Tisdale was the leading rebounder on the 1984 U.S. Olympic gold medal team and was the No. 2 overall pick of the 1985 NBA Draft. He passed away last May from cancer at the age of 44. His widow, **Regina Tisdale**, was on hand to accept the honor on Tisdale's behalf. Among the others in this year's eight-person class were **Larry Bird** and **Magic Johnson**.

TSN NAMES WARREN PRESEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Oklahoma sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is not only on The Sporting News' five-man preseason All-America team, he is the publication's choice as preseason national player of the year. If TSN's prediction holds true, Oklahoma would become the first program to record back-to-back national players of the year since Duke in 2000 (**Shane Battier**) and 2001 (**Jason Williams**). Sooner **Blake Griffin** was last year's consensus honoree. Joining Warren on the magazine's preseason All-America team are Kansas' **Sherron Collins**, West Virginia's **Devin Ebanks**, Notre Dame's **Luke Harangody** and Kentucky's **Patrick Patterson**.

OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

UP NEXT

OU hosts Arizona in a Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series game on Sunday at 6 p.m. CST (televised by ESPNU). The Sooners, who lead the series 4-1, will be facing a U of A team that is under the first-year direction of head coach **Sean Miller** (former Xavier head coach).

QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,501-945 (.613) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).

- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
