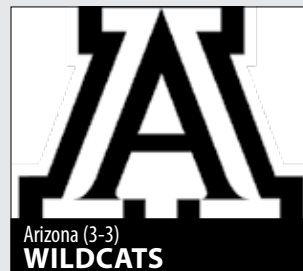

Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 73-36 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round from 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

SUNDAY'S GAME BASICS

Oklahoma (4-3) plays its second of three straight home games Sunday when it hosts Arizona (3-3) at 6 p.m. CST in a Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series matchup. The Sooners are coming off a pair of wins while the Wildcats have lost two straight. Sunday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network (KOKC AM 1520 in OKC; KMOD FM 97.5 in Tulsa; Sirius 91) with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. It will be televised by ESPN2 with **Doug Bell** and **Reid Gettys** calling the action.

NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ Oklahoma has won 73 of its last 75 home non-conference games, including its last 15. It is 4-1 all-time against Arizona (1-0 in Norman).
- ▶ OU is 1-1 in Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series games (both vs. USC).
- ▶ The Sooners rank second in the Big 12 Conference with their .790 free throw percentage and have made more free throws (128) than their opponents have attempted (115).
- ▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** has started the last three games and is averaging 13.3 points, 3.0 rebounds and 2.3 steals in those contests. He is 8-of-19 (.421) from 3-point range and 10-of-10 from the free throw line during the stretch. Davis, who averaged 3.8 points over the team's first four games coming off the bench, has made his last 14 free throw attempts and is 15-of-16 on the year (.938).
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is averaging team highs of 19.2 points (ranks third in Big 12) and 5.7 assists (ranks second) in his six games. He has scored 70 points from the field and 45 from the free throw line (averaging 9.2 free throw attempts).
- ▶ Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** is nearly averaging a double-double (11.4 points and 9.9 rebounds). His 9.9 rebounds per outing rank second in the Big 12 and his 15 boards in the season opener were the most in an OU freshman debut since **Alvan Adams** grabbed 28 caroms in 1972-73.
- ▶ Freshman guard **Steven Pledger** is averaging 12.3 points in 25.3 minutes a contest. He is 20-for-47 from long distance (.426) and has hit at least four treys in three games. He has already surpassed the 20-point mark twice this season (21 vs. Mount St. Mary's and 23 vs. Houston).
- ▶ Guards have accounted for 406 of Oklahoma's 541 points (75 percent).
- ▶ The freshman foursome of Pledger (86), Gallon (80), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (66) and **Andrew Fitzgerald** (30) has scored 48 percent of OU's points.

WEDNESDAY'S ARKANSAS RECAP

Trailing 25-17, Oklahoma used a 17-2 run over the final three minutes of the first half to take a 34-27 lead at the break and never looked back in a 67-47 home win over Arkansas Wednesday. The Sooners hit seven of their last eight field goal attempts in the first half — six of them 3-pointers — to double their output from the game's first 17 minutes. Arkansas, which scored just one field goal in the first 9:30 of the second half, went 2-for-14 from the field and committed six turnovers from the 3-minute mark of the first half to the 10:30 mark of the second as OU assembled a 31-5 run. **Tony Crocker** led four Sooners in double figures with 16 points and pulled down a career-high 16 rebounds (his previous high was 10) for his first career

▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** is averaging 13.3 points and 2.3 steals over the last three games.

double-double. Fellow starting guards **Willie Warren**, **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and **Cade Davis** scored 13, 13 and 11 points, respectively. Davis was the huge story defensively as he held Arkansas guard **Rotnei Clarke**, who was averaging 27.6 points and 5.8 3-point makes per game entering the contest, to just 11 points on 1-for-6 shooting from behind the arc. Clarke's lone 3-point conversion came with 2:35 remaining in the game.

MORE FROM WEDNESDAY'S WIN

► The Sooners shot .500 from the field and .429 (9-for-21) from 3-point range. They struggled at the free throw line, however, shooting a season-low .545 (12-for-22).

► **Willie Warren** entered the game 40-of-44 from the free throw line (.909) but was just 5-for-11 in the contest.

► Arkansas, which played without first-team preseason All-SEC selection **Michael Washington**, scored its fewest points in five seasons.

► **Tony Crocker** moved into a share of 30th place (with **Joe King**) on OU's all-time scoring list with 1,085 points. He also passed **Brent Price** on the school's career 3-point field goals chart and now stands sixth in the category (168).

PREVIEWING ARIZONA

Arizona enters Sunday's contest with a 3-3 record. The Wildcats opened with home wins over Northern Arizona (87-70) and Rice (66-49) before heading to the Maui Invitational where they went 1-2 (lost 65-61 to Wisconsin, beat Colorado 91-87 in overtime, lost 84-72 to Vanderbilt). They returned home Wednesday to face No. 24 UNLV and dropped a 74-72 double-overtime decision. Arizona is averaging 74.8 points and is shooting .439 from the field, .342 from 3-point range (6.5 makes per game) and .716 from the free throw line. Opponents are averaging 71.5 points and are shooting .404 from the field and .241 from behind the arc (4.7 makes per outing).

Senior guard **Nic Wise**, who was on the Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy preseason watch lists, leads the Wildcats with his 16.8 points and 5.0 assists per game. He is also averaging 3.8 rebounds and 1.5 steals per contest, has made a team-high 11 treys (.367) and is 26-for-27 (.963) from the free throw line. Wise scored 30 points in the win over Colorado. Freshman forward **Derrick Williams** is coming off a 28-point effort against UNLV, and is averaging 15.2 points and 6.0 boards per contest. Williams, who set a school record with 21 free throw attempts against Wisconsin, is shooting .580 from the field and .640 from the foul line (32-for-50). Junior forward **Jamelle Horne** is averaging 10.2 points and team highs of 9.2 rebounds and 2.7 blocks per game, while freshman forward **Solomon Hill** contributes 10.0 points and 5.5 points a contest. Horne ranks second on the team with nine 3-point makes and was 5-for-5 from deep versus Colorado.

Sean Miller is in his first season as Arizona's head coach. Miller, who compiled a 120-47 (.719) record as head coach at Xavier over the past five seasons, is a 1992 Pittsburgh graduate. Miller coached Xavier to four NCAA Tournament appearances and four 20-win campaigns.

OU-ARIZONA SERIES HISTORY

Sunday's game will mark the sixth between Oklahoma and Arizona, with the Sooners holding a 4-1 series lead. Both schools are 1-0 on their home court, but OU is 3-0 at neutral sites (all three in the NCAA Tournament). Below are the results of the previous five meetings.

HOME NON-CONFERENCE DOMINATION

The Sooners have dominated home non-conference games over the last decade, winning 73 of their last 75 non-league contests inside Lloyd Noble Center going back to Jan. 3, 2000 (good for a .973 winning percentage). Included was a streak of 49 non-conference home victories that was snapped by Villanova on Dec. 6, 2006. The current string stands at 15 games.

FEARSOME FRESHMAN FOURSOME

The freshman foursome of **Steven Pledger** (12.3 ppg), **Tiny Gallon** (11.4), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (9.4) and **Andrew Fitzgerald** (5.0) has combined to score 262 of the team's 541 points this year, or 48 percent. Among the Big 12's leaders in 3-point makes, Pledger has knocked down 20 treys on 47 attempts (.426) and has two games of more than 20 points. He has made 11 treys over the last three outings. Gallon, who is shooting .604 from the field, leads the Big 12 with his 9.9 rebounds per game and ranks second with his three double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Mason-Griffin ranks fourth in the league with his 4.9 assists per game. Fitzgerald is shooting .526 from the field and is 10-for-13 from the free throw line (.769).

HEATING UP FROM OUTSIDE

After shooting .286 from 3-point range and averaging 6.0 treys through its first four games, OU is shooting .471 and averaging 11.0 makes from behind the arc over the last three outings. Freshman **Steven Pledger** has been the main gun, going 11-for-26 (.423) over the last three contests. Fellow freshman **Tommy Mason-Griffin** is 7-for-10 (.700), senior **Tony Crocker** is 6-for-13 (.462) and junior **Cade Davis** is 8-for-19 (.421) over the same three games.

TISDALE INDUCTED INTO COLLEGIATE HOOPS HALL

Wayman Tisdale, OU's all-time leading scorer and rebounder, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Nov. 22 in Kansas City, Mo. Tisdale starred at Oklahoma for three seasons in the mid-1980s and was named a first-team consensus All-American and Big Eight Conference Player of the Year each year. Tisdale was the leading rebounder on the 1984 U.S. Olympic gold medal team and was the No. 2 overall pick of the 1985 NBA Draft. He passed away last May from cancer at the age of 44. His widow, **Regina Tisdale**, was on hand to accept the honor on Tisdale's behalf. Among the others in this year's eight-person class were **Larry Bird** and **Magic Johnson**.

Oklahoma sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is not only on The Sporting News' five-man preseason All-America team, he is the publication's choice as preseason national player of the year. If TSN's prediction holds true, Oklahoma would become the first program to record back-to-back national players of the year since Duke in 2000 (**Shane Battier**) and 2001 (**Jason Williams**). Sooner **Blake Griffin** was last year's consensus honoree. Joining Warren on the magazine's preseason All-America team are Kansas' **Sherron Collins**, West Virginia's **Devin Ebanks**, Notre Dame's **Luke Harangody** and Kentucky's **Patrick Patterson**.

OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

CAPEL'S QUICK START

When **Jeff Capel** was named OU head coach in May 2006, he inherited a thin roster and recruiting restrictions from the previous staff. After a 16-15 initial season, Capel directed seven-win improvements in both 2007-08 (23-12 record) and 2008-09 (30-6). His 69-33 mark as Sooners' boss entering this season ranked him No. 1 in school history in wins and winning percentage (.676) through the first three years of tenure. **Kelvin Sampson** ranks second in both categories (59 wins; .641) while **Billy Tubbs** ranks third (55 wins; .591).

SOONERS SIGN PAIR OF TOP-100 RECRUITS

Texas high school seniors **Cameron Clark** and **T.J. Taylor** signed national letters of intent last week and will be freshmen on OU's 2010-11 squad. Both players are ranked among the nation's top-100 seniors.

Clark is a 6-6, 185-pound wing from Sherman High School who is ranked No. 18 in the country by ESPN.com and No. 30 by both Rivals.com and Scout.com. A first-team all-state selection last year as a junior, Clark averaged 21.0 points, 7.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.6 steals per game for a 27-8 Bearcats' squad that advanced to the regional quarterfinals of the Class 4A state tournament.

"Cameron is an elite level athlete who has his best basketball in front of him," said OU head coach **Jeff Capel**. "I don't think he's begun to scratch the surface of who he can become. Because of his athleticism, he has the ability to make some 'wow' plays. He shoots the ball very well from mid-range and he can shoot it to 3. He also has the ability to do things off the bounce. I anticipate him being a big-time wing player for us, a guy who can be a tremendous defender and one who'll be flying around making plays all over the floor."

Taylor, a 6-3, 205-pound left-handed guard from Denison High School is rated by ESPN.com as the No. 71 overall player in the 2010 recruiting class and by Rivals.com as the No. 91 player. He averaged 27.1 points, 6.1 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 3.0 steals per game last year for a 21-11 Denison team that advanced to the area finals of the Class 4A state tournament. He was a first-team all-state pick and district offensive player of the year each of the last two seasons.

"T.J. is a strong left-handed guard who can play both guard positions," said Capel. "He's very physical and he can shoot it. One of my favorite things about him is that he loves to play, he loves to compete. I think his best strength is his strength. He's versatile and is just a good guard. He has a good feel for the game as far as passing the ball and seeing things. I also think he has the chance to be a really good defender for us."

QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,502-945 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
