## Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 74-36 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round in 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

## WEDNESDAY'S GAME BASICS

Oklahoma (5-3) wraps up a three-game homestand Wednesday when it hosts Centenary (4-3) at 7 p.m. CST. The Sooners have won three straight games while the Gents have won four of their last six. Wednesday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. It will be televised by the Sooner Sports Network with **Bob Carpenter** and **Charlie Spoonhour** calling the action.

### NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ Oklahoma has won 74 of its last 76 home non-conference games, including each of its last 16.
- ▶ OU is 4-0 all-time against Centenary (3-0 in Norman). The Sooners have won the four games by an average of 34 points.
- ▶ The Sooners rank first in the Big 12 Conference and fifth nationally with their .795 free throw percentage. They have made more free throws (147) than their opponents have attempted (128).
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is averaging team highs of 20.0 points (ranks third in Big 12) and 5.4 assists (ranks second). He leads the league with his 8.3 free throw attempts (shooting .810 from the foul line).
- ▶ Over his last three games (against Houston, Arkansas and Arizona), Warren is averaging 21.0 points and is shooting .759 (22-for-29) from the field and .667 (4-for-6) from 3-point range.
- ▶ Senior guard **Tony Crocker** is averaging 12.8 points, 8.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists over the past three games. He's 7-of-15 (.467) from 3-point range during the stretch.
- ▶ Crocker has 1,098 career points to rank him 30th in school history. He needs just 10 points to move up three spots and tie **Kevin Bookout** for 27th.
- ▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** has started the last four games and is averaging 12.0 points, 3.0 rebounds and 2.5 steals in those contests. He is 10-of-25 (.400) from 3-point range and 12-of-12 from the free throw line during the stretch. Davis, who averaged 3.8 points over the team's first four games coming off the bench, has made his last 16 free throw attempts and is 17-of-18 on the year (.944).
- ▶ Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** is nearly averaging a double-double (11.8 points and 9.5 rebounds). His 9.5 boards per outing rank fourth in the Big 12 and his 15 caroms in the season opener were the most in an OU freshman debut since **Alvan Adams** grabbed 28 in 1972-73.
- ▶ Freshman point guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** is averaging 11.0 points and 5.0 assists over the last four contests. He's made at least two treys in each of those four games (9-for-17 combined for a .529 mark).
- ▶ Freshman guard **Steven Pledger** is averaging 11.3 points a game. He's made a team-high 20 treys (shooting .408) and has hit at least four 3-balls in three different outings.
- ▶ Guards have accounted for 464 of Oklahoma's 620 points (75 percent).
- ▶ The freshman foursome of Gallon (94), Pledger (88), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (76) and **Andrew Fitzgerald** (30) has scored 46 percent of OU's points.

### SUNDAY'S ARIZONA RECAP

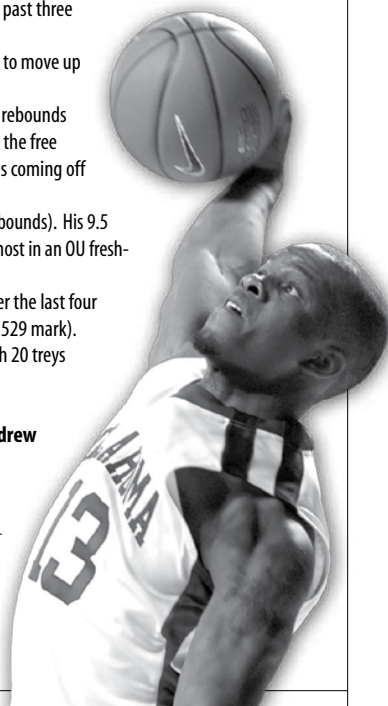

intermission. A 15-7 run to start the second half pushed the Sooners' lead to 26 points and they led by at least 15 points the entire second half. For the game, Oklahoma shot .481 from the field, .364 (8-for-22) from behind the arc and .826 (19-for-23) from the free throw line. It committed just seven turnovers and outscored Arizona 21-10 in points off turnovers. **Willie Warren** was 10-for-14 from the field and hit three of his four 3-point attempts en route to a game-high 25 points. **Tiny Gallon** (14), **Tony Crocker** (13) and **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (10) also scored in double figures for OU. Mason-Griffin added six assists without a turnover. The Wildcats shot .529 (9-for-17) from 3-point range and outboarded the Sooners 32-28.

## MORE FROM SUNDAY'S WIN

- ▶ The game was part of the Big 12/Pac-10 Hardwood Series. OU's win gave the Big 12 an 8-2 advantage so far this year.
- ▶ **Cade Davis** (three steals) registered his third straight game with at least three thefts. He has 10 over those three outings.
- ▶ **Tony Crocker's** second-half 3-pointer tied him with **Mookie Blaylock** for fifth place on OU's career list (169).
- ▶ Arizona's 17-point defeat was its worst regular season non-conference loss since the 2006-07 season.
- ▶ Oklahoma improved to 5-1 all-time against Arizona. The 17-point margin was the largest in the history of the series.

## PREVIEWING CENTENARY

Located in Shreveport, La., and with an enrollment of 973, high-scoring Centenary enters Wednesday's game with a 4-3 overall record and a 1-1 mark in Summit League play. The Gents, who are averaging 82.6 points per contest on the year, have scored at least 80 points in each of their last five games and are averaging 89.0 during the stretch. They are shooting .431 from the field, .310 from 3-point range (7.0 makes per game) and .792 from the free throw line, while opponents have combined to shoot .455 from the field and .257 from behind the arc (3.9 makes per game). Centenary is getting outrebounded by 7.6 boards per contest.

Sophomore guard **David Perez** is one of our Gents averaging at least 9.7 points per contest. The 6-3, 195-pounder is averaging 22.0 points, 3.1 rebounds and 2.6 assists, and has made a team-high 17 3-pointers (shooting .327). A .935 free throw shooter, Perez has scored at least 15 points in all seven games and has tallied at least 20 points five times. Junior **Roman Tubner** averages 16.9 points, 3.4 rebounds and a team-high 4.1 assists per outing. The point guard leads the squad with 60 free throw attempts (shooting .800) and two games ago scored a career-high 30 points against Southern Utah. Two more guards, freshman **Daman Starring** and sophomore **Maxx Nakwaasah**, contribute 9.7 points per contest apiece. Starring also averages 3.7 rebounds and 2.4 assists per game while Nakwaasah adds a team-high 5.7 rebounds a contest. All four players shoot better than .800 from the free throw line.

**Greg Gary** is in his second season as Centenary's head coach and owns a 12-26 (.316) record. A 1992 Tulane graduate, Gary directed the Gents to an 8-23 record last year.

## OU-CENTENARY SERIES HISTORY

Wednesday's game will mark the fifth between Oklahoma and Centenary, with all four previous meetings won by the Sooners. OU posted victories in 1967-68 (91-73 in Norman), 1968-69 (45-38 in Shreveport), 1987-88 (152-84 in Norman) and 1996-97 (89-45 in Norman).

## HOME NON-CONFERENCE DOMINATION

The Sooners have dominated home non-conference games over the last decade, winning 74 of their last 76 non-league contests inside Lloyd Noble Center going back to Jan. 3, 2000 (good for a .974 winning percentage). Included was a streak of 49 non-conference home victories that was snapped by Villanova on Dec. 6, 2006. The current string stands at 16 games.

## FEARSOME FRESHMAN FOURSOME

The freshman foursome of **Tiny Gallon** (11.8 ppg), **Steven Pledger** (11.3), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (9.5) and **Andrew Fitzgerald** (4.3) has combined to score 288 of the team's 620 points this year, or 46 percent. Gallon, who is shooting .600 from the field, ranks third in the Big 12 in rebounds per game and ranks second with his three double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Among the Big 12's leaders in 3-point makes, Pledger has knocked down 20 treys on 49 attempts (.407) and has two games of more than 20 points. Mason-Griffin ranks fifth in the league with his 5.0 assists per game and leads the team with his .429 3-point shooting percentage. Fitzgerald is shooting .500 from the field and is 10-for-13 from the free throw line (.769).

## HEATING UP FROM OUTSIDE

After shooting .286 from 3-point range and averaging 6.0 treys through its first four games, OU is shooting .446 and averaging 10.3 makes from behind the arc over the last four outings. Freshman **Steven Pledger** has been the main gun, going 11-for-28 (.393) over the last four contests. Fellow freshman **Tommy Mason-Griffin** is 9-for-17 (.529), senior **Tony Crocker** is 7-for-15 (.467) and junior **Cade Davis** is 10-for-25 (.400) over the same four games.

## TISDALE INDUCTED INTO COLLEGIATE HOOPS HALL

**Wayman Tisdale**, OU's all-time leading scorer and rebounder, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Nov. 22 in Kansas City, Mo. Tisdale starred at Oklahoma for three seasons in the mid-1980s and was named a first-team consensus All-American and Big Eight Conference Player of the Year each year. Tisdale was the leading rebounder on the 1984 U.S. Olympic gold medal team and was the No. 2 overall pick of the 1985 NBA Draft. He passed away last May from cancer at the age of 44. His widow, **Regina Tisdale**, was on hand to accept the honor on Tisdale's behalf. Among the others in this year's eight-person class were **Larry Bird** and **Magic Johnson**.

## TSN NAMES WARREN PRESEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Oklahoma sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is not only on The Sporting News' five-man preseason All-America team, he is the publication's choice as preseason national player of the year. If TSN's prediction holds true, Oklahoma would become the first program to record back-to-back national players of the year since Duke in 2000 (**Shane Battier**) and 2001 (**Jason Williams**). consensus honoree. Joining Warren on the magazine's preseason All-America team are Kansas' **Sherron Collins**, West Virginia's **Devin Ebanks**, Notre Dame's **Luke Harangody** and Kentucky's **Patrick Patterson**.

**OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS**

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

**CAPEL'S QUICK START**

When **Jeff Capel** was named OU head coach in May 2006, he inherited a thin roster and recruiting restrictions from the previous staff. After a 16-15 initial season, Capel directed seven-win improvements in both 2007-08 (23-12 record) and 2008-09 (30-6). His 69-33 mark as Sooners' boss entering this season ranked him No. 1 in school history in wins and winning percentage (.676) through the first three years of tenure. **Kelvin Sampson** ranks second in both categories (59 wins; .641) while **Billy Tubbs** ranks third (55 wins; .591).

**SOONERS SIGN PAIR OF TOP-100 RECRUITS**

Texas high school seniors **Cameron Clark** and **T.J. Taylor** signed national letters of intent last week and will be freshmen on OU's 2010-11 squad. Both players are ranked among the nation's top-100 seniors.

Clark is a 6-6, 185-pound wing from Sherman High School who is ranked No. 18 in the country by ESPN.com and No. 30 by both Rivals.com and Scout.com. A first-team all-state selection last year as a junior, Clark averaged 21.0 points, 7.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.6 steals per game for a 27-8 Bearcats' squad that advanced to the regional quarterfinals of the Class 4A state tournament.

"Cameron is an elite level athlete who has his best basketball in front of him," said OU head coach **Jeff Capel**. "I don't think he's begun to scratch the surface of who he can become. Because of his athleticism, he has the ability to make some 'wow' plays. He shoots the ball very well from mid-range and he can shoot it to 3. He also has the ability to do things off the bounce. I anticipate him being a big-time wing player for us, a guy who can be a tremendous defender and one who'll be flying around making plays all over the floor."

Taylor, a 6-3, 205-pound left-handed guard from Denison High School is rated by ESPN.com as the No. 71 overall player in the 2010 recruiting class and by Rivals.com as the No. 91 player. He averaged 27.1 points, 6.1 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 3.0 steals per game last year for a 21-11 Denison team that advanced to the area finals of the Class 4A state tournament. He was a first-team all-state pick and district offensive player of the year each of the last two seasons.

"T.J. is a strong left-handed guard who can play both guard positions," said Capel. "He's very physical and he can shoot it. One of my favorite things about him is that he loves to play, he loves to compete. I think his best strength is his strength. He's versatile and is just a good guard. He has a good feel for the game as far as passing the ball and seeing things. I also think he has the chance to be a really good defender for us."

**UP NEXT**

OU plays at Utah on Saturday at 3 p.m. CST (televised by Versus). The Sooners lead the series 2-1 and won last year in Norman 70-52.

**QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION**

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,503-945 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
