Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 75-36 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round from 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

SATURDAY'S GAME BASICS

Winner of four straight, Oklahoma (6-3) travels to Salt Lake City to take on Utah (5-4) Saturday at 3 p.m. CST. The Sooners are coming off an 86-62 win over Centenary on Wednesday, while the Utes, who have won two in a row, defeated Michigan at home the same night, 68-52. Saturday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. It will be televised by Versus with **Ted Robinson** and **Roland Williams** calling the action.

NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ Oklahoma, which went 8-3 in true road games last year, lost its only such contest this year (82-69 at VCU on Nov. 21).
- ▶ OU improved to 2-1 against Utah after last year's 70-52 win in Norman.
- ▶ The Sooners rank first in the Big 12 Conference and fourth nationally with their .799 free throw percentage. They have made more free throws (155) than their opponents have attempted (138).
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is averaging team highs of 18.6 points (ranks fourth in Big 12) and 5.3 assists (ranks third). He also ranks second in the league with his 7.4 free throw attempts per game (shooting .814 from the foul line).
- ▶ Warren has scored at least 24 points in four of his eight outings.
- ▶ Senior guard **Tony Crocker** is averaging 19.0 points and 9.3 rebounds over the past four games. He's 13-of-25 (.520) from 3-point range during the stretch.
- ▶ Crocker is coming off a career-high 33-point game against Centenary in which he set a Big 12 record for points in a half (29 in first) and tied the league mark for 3-pointers in a half (seven). He also grabbed 13 rebounds for his second double-double in the last three games (the only double-doubles of his career). He had 16 points and 16 boards Dec. 2 vs. Arkansas.
- ▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** has started the last five games and is averaging 9.6 points, 3.0 rebounds and 2.0 steals in those contests. He has 10 3-pointers and is 12-of-12 from the free throw line during the stretch. Davis, who averaged 3.8 points over the team's first four games coming off the bench, has made his last 16 free throw attempts and is 17-of-18 on the year (.944).
- ▶ Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** is one of three Big 12 players averaging a double-double (12.2 points and 10.1 rebounds). His 10.1 boards per outing rank second in the Big 12. He has grabbed 15 rebounds twice.
- ▶ Freshman point guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** is averaging 10.6 points (10-for-20 from 3-point distance) and 5.4 assists over the last five contests.
- ▶ Freshman guard **Steven Pledger** is averaging 10.6 points a game. He's made a team-high 21 treys (shooting .404) and has hit at least four 3-pointers in three different outings.
- ▶ Guards have accounted for 526 of Oklahoma's 706 points (75 percent).
- ▶ The freshman trio of Gallon (110), Pledger (95) and Mason-Griffin (85) has scored 41 percent of OU's points.

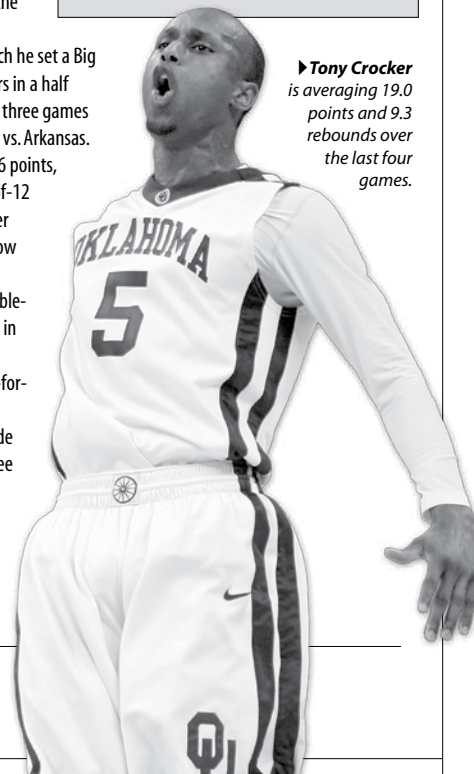
WEDNESDAY'S CENTENARY RECAP

minutes — both Big 12 Conference records for a half — as well as 10 rebounds to give OU a 47-25 lead at intermission. The senior guard, who scored 13 points before Centenary scored one, netted Oklahoma's first 16 points. He made seven treys and reached the 25-point mark in the game's first 11 minutes. Crocker finished the contest with a career-high 33 points, 13 rebounds (second highest career total), a career-high three blocked shots and two steals. He was 11-for-19 from the field, 7-for-12 from 3-point range and 4-for-4 from the free throw line. Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** also notched a double-double with 16 points and a game-high 15 rebounds. Like Crocker, he blocked a career-high three shots. The Sooners outrebounded the Gents, 49-33, and held them to .371 field goal shooting.

MORE FROM WEDNESDAY'S WIN

- ▶ **Tony Crocker** scored more points in the first half (29) than Centenary did (25).
- ▶ Crocker went 5-for-5 from the field in the game's first 3:40, including 3-for-3 from 3-point range.
- ▶ When he had 25 points 11 minutes into the game, Crocker was on pace for a 91-point night.
- ▶ Crocker's 33 points were the most by a Big 12 player this season.
- ▶ **Tommy Mason-Griffin** handed out a career-high seven assists, all in the first half.

PREVIEWING UTAH

Mountain West Conference member Utah has won two games in a row to improve to 5-4 on the season. It is coming off a 68-52 home win over Michigan on Wednesday, a game in which the Utes outshot (.509-.340) and outrebounded (41-25) the Wolverines. Utah's other wins have come at home over Utah State (68-67), Southern (88-48) and Idaho State (68-56), and against Illinois in Las Vegas, Nev. (60-58). Its losses have come to Idaho (94-87 at home), Seattle (77-74 at home), Oklahoma State (77-55 in Las Vegas) and Weber State (83-76 on the road). The Utes lost their top four scorers from last year's 24-10 squad that won the MWC regular season and tournament titles and was an NCAA Tournament No. 5 seed (the foursome accounted for 69 percent of the team's points).

Junior guard **Carlton Brown** leads Utah with his 12.7 scoring average and also pulls down 5.7 rebounds a game. He has two 22-point games to his credit. Freshman guard **Marshall Henderson** is averaging 10.7 points a game with the help of his 2.2 treys per contest. He has 20 3-point makes on the year (twice as many as the closest teammate) and is shooting .339 from behind the arc. Henderson scored a team-high 22 points against Michigan (4-for-11 from deep). Senior forward **Kim Tillie** supplies 9.6 points and a team-leading 6.6 rebounds a game, while junior forward **Jay Watkins** provides 9.4 points (.556 field goal shooting) and 5.0 boards per outing. Senior point guard **Luka Drca** is averaging 9.1 points and a team-high 4.3 assists.

Jim Boylen is in his third season as Utah's head coach and owns a 47-29 (.618) record. A 1987 Maine graduate, Boylen twice served as a Michigan State assistant coach (1989-92 and 2005-07). In between, he was a 13-year NBA assistant coach with the Houston Rockets, Golden State Warriors and Milwaukee Bucks.

OU-UTAH SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's game will mark the fourth meeting between OU and Utah, with the Sooners holding a 2-1 series edge. OU won the first matchup, 69-68, on Dec. 14, 1979, in the Golden Gate Classic in San Francisco, Calif. **Aaron Curry** paced Oklahoma with 18 points while Utah was led by **Karl Bankowski** and **Tom Chambers** (20 points each). The Utes won the second meeting, a 67-58 second-round NCAA Tournament game on March 19, 2006, in Tucson, Ariz. **Taj Gray** registered 19 points and 15 rebounds for the Sooners while **Justin Hawkins** finished with 20 points and 14 boards to lead Utah. The Utes shot .595 from the field while OU shot .318.

Last year in Norman (box score on page 13 of these game notes), eventual national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was held without a field goal, but still managed a double-double (11 points and 11 rebounds) to help the Sooners to a 70-52 home win on Dec. 13. All five OU starters scored in double figures for the first time in four seasons and the Sooners overcame .388 field goal shooting by holding the Utes to a .340 figure. Oklahoma also made twice as many free throws (26-for-30 compared to 13-for-17). Griffin, who battled foul trouble, was 0-for-3 from the field in his 23 minutes. **Ryan Wright** spelled him off the bench and provided six points and six boards in 18 minutes of action. OU held Utah center **Luke Nevill** to 10 points and four rebounds (he entered the game averaging 18.1 and 8.5).

FRESHMEN PLAYING LARGE ROLE

The freshman trio of **Tiny Gallon** (12.2 ppg), **Steven Pledger** (10.6) and **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (9.4) has combined to score 290 of the team's 706 points this year, or 41 percent. Gallon, who is shooting .606 from the field, ranks second in the Big 12 in rebounds per game and with four double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Among the Big 12's leaders in 3-point makes, Pledger has knocked down 21 treys on 52 attempts (.404) and has two games of more than 20 points. Mason-Griffin ranks fourth in the league with his 5.2 assists per game and ranks second the team with his .419 3-point shooting percentage. Another freshman, forward **Andrew Fitzgerald**, is averaging 3.8 points in 11.1 minutes per game. He is shooting .500 from the field and is 10-for-13 from the free throw line (.769).

GUARDS SHOULDERING THE LOAD

Five of OU's top six scorers, including its top two, are guards. The Sooners' backcourt has accounted for 526 of the team's 706 points, or 75 percent. Three guards average double figures in scoring while another averages 9.4 points (**Willie Warren** — 18.6 ppg; **Tony Crocker** — 13.7; **Steven Pledger** — 10.6; **Tommy Mason-Griffin** — 9.4). Warren has surpassed 20 points four times this year, Pledger has done it twice and Crocker once.

HEATING UP FROM OUTSIDE

After shooting .286 from 3-point range and averaging 6.0 treys through its first four games, OU is shooting .418 and averaging 10.2 makes from behind the arc over the last five outings. Senior **Tony Crocker** has been the main gun, going 14-for-27 (.519) over those last five contests. Freshman **Steven Pledger** is 12-for-31 (.387), freshman **Tommy Mason-Griffin** is 10-for-20 (.500) and junior **Cade Davis** is 10-for-30 (.333) over the same five games.

OU opponents in **bold****CROCKER CLIMBING THE CHARTS**

Senior guard Tony Crocker entered the year ranked 34th in school history in points (1,008) and seventh in 3-point makes (158). With a strong start to the season, the 6-6 San Antonio, Texas, product has vaulted to the No. 27 spot in points (1,031) and the No. 4 spot in 3-pointers (176). Crocker, who has started OU's last 75 games, needs 22 points to tie **Willie Rogers** (1966-68) for 26th on OU's career scoring list, and 42 points to tie **Brent Price** (1991-92) for 25th. At his current pace of 13.7 points per game, Crocker would finish the regular season ranked 13th on the Sooners' all-time scoring chart. Crocker's next target on the career 3-point makes list is **Tim Heskett** (1997-01). He needs 39 makes to tie Heskett for third on that list.

Crocker also has a chance to make a run at the top spot on OU's games played list. He entered the year with 102 career appearances and would finish the regular season with 132 if he plays in every regular season game this year. Depending on the Sooners' postseason fortunes, Crocker could challenge the record of 137 career games played by **Darryl "Choo" Kennedy** (1984-87).

TISDALE INDUCTED INTO COLLEGIATE HOOPS HALL

Wayman Tisdale, OU's all-time leading scorer and rebounder, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Nov. 22 in Kansas City, Mo. Tisdale starred at Oklahoma for three seasons in the mid-1980s and was named a first-team consensus All-American and Big Eight Conference Player of the Year each year. Tisdale was the leading rebounder on the 1984 U.S. Olympic gold medal team and was the No. 2 overall pick of the 1985 NBA Draft. He passed away last May from cancer at the age of 44. His widow, **Regina Tisdale**, was on hand to accept the honor on Tisdale's behalf. Among the others in this year's eight-person class were **Larry Bird** and **Magic Johnson**.

TSN NAMES WARREN PRESEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Oklahoma sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is not only on The Sporting News' five-man preseason All-America team, he is the publication's choice as preseason national player of the year. If TSN's prediction holds true, Oklahoma would become the first program to record back-to-back national players of the year since Duke in 2000 (**Shane Battier**) and 2001 (**Jason Williams**). Sooner **Blake Griffin** was last year's consensus honoree. Joining Warren on the magazine's preseason All-America team are Kansas' **Sherron Collins**, West Virginia's **Devin Ebanks**, Notre Dame's **Luke Harangody** and Kentucky's **Patrick Patterson**.

OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

CAPEL'S QUICK START

When **Jeff Capel** was named OU head coach in May 2006, he inherited a thin roster and recruiting restrictions from the previous staff. After a 16-15 initial season, Capel directed seven-win improvements in both 2007-08 (23-12 record) and 2008-09 (30-6). His 69-33 mark as Sooners' boss entering this season ranked him No. 1 in school history in wins and winning percentage (.676) through the first three years of tenure. **Kelvin Sampson** ranks second in both categories (59 wins; .641) while **Billy Tubbs** ranks third (55 wins; .591).

UP NEXT

OU has a week off before returning home to play Northern Colorado on Saturday, Dec. 19, at noon CST (televised by the Sooner Sports Network). The Sooners won the only previous meeting, 80-44, on Dec. 11, 2004, in Norman.

QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,504-945 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
