Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 76-36 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round in 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Sheldon Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

SATURDAY'S GAME BASICS

Winner of five straight, Oklahoma (7-3) plays its last home game of 2009 when it takes on Northern Colorado (9-2) Saturday at noon CST inside Lloyd Noble Center. The Sooners are coming off an 78-73 overtime road win over Utah last Saturday, while the Bears posted a 95-84 home victory over Louisiana-Monroe Wednesday. Saturday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. It will be televised by the Sooner Sports Network with **Bob Carpenter** and **Charlie Spoonhour** calling the action.

NOTEWORTHY

- Oklahoma has won 75 of its last 77 home non-conference games, including each of its last 17.
- The Sooners rank first in the Big 12 Conference and fourth nationally with their .794 free throw percentage. They have made more free throws (181) than their opponents have attempted (160).
- OU gave up 78.0 points over its first five contests (2-3 record) and allowed opponents to shoot .452 from the field and .366 from 3-point range. In five games since (all wins), foes are shooting .394 from the floor and .322 from long distance.
- Sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is averaging team highs of 19.6 points (ranks third in Big 12) and 5.1 assists (ranks fourth). He leads the conference with his 7.9 free throw attempts per game (shooting .831 from the foul line).
- Warren has scored at least 24 points in five of his nine outings.
- Senior guard **Tony Crocker**, who has started 76 consecutive games, is averaging 17.6 points and 9.4 rebounds over the past five outings. He is 14-of-29 (.483) from behind the 3-point arc during the stretch.
- Crocker has recorded his only three career double-doubles over the last four games. In those three outings against Arkansas, Centenary and Utah, he is averaging 20.3 points and 13.0 boards while shooting .512 from the field.
- Junior guard **Cade Davis** has started the last six games and is averaging 9.5 points, 3.2 rebounds and 1.8 steals in those contests. He has 11 3-pointers and is 16-of-17 (.941) from the free throw line during the stretch. Davis averaged 3.8 points over the team's first four games coming off the bench.
- Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** is tied for second in the Big 12 with four double-doubles. He is shooting a team-high .597 from the field and is averaging 11.9 points and a team-high 9.4 rebounds (ranks fourth in league). The 6-9, 290-pounder has made three 3-pointers on four attempts over the last two games.
- Freshman point guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** is averaging 11.8 points (12-for-24 from 3-point distance) and 5.0 assists over the last six contests.
- After averaging 13.7 points over the season's first six games (19-for-40 3-point range), freshman guard **Steven Pledger** is averaging just 3.3 over the last four (2-for-13 from behind the arc).

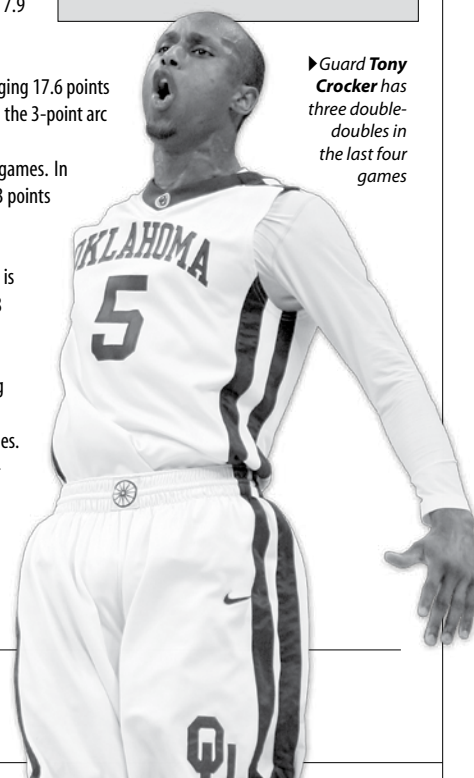

by four to start the extra period, but outscored the Utes 11-2 the rest of the way. The key basket was a Warren 26-footer with 1:58 remaining that took OU from a one-point deficit to a two-point lead it did not relinquish. With his team up 76-73 in overtime, freshman **Tommy Mason-Griffin** stole the ball from a driving **Carlton Brown** with 14 seconds left and hit two free throws to ice the game. The point guard finished with a career-high 18 points, six rebounds, three assists and two steals. The Sooners, who trailed 42-36 at halftime but rallied for a seven-point lead midway through the second half, got the victory despite shooting just .344 from the field. Crocker racked up 12 points and 10 rebounds in 39 minutes and did not commit a turnover.

MORE FROM SATURDAY'S WIN

- In addition to his 27 points, **Willie Warren**, who did not score until the 5:32 mark of the first half, had a career-high eight rebounds and four assists. He was 11-for-12 from the free throw line.
- OU jumped out to a 14-3 lead with the help of two 3-pointers by freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** in the game's first 1:18. Gallon, who played only 10 minutes on the day, fouled out with 3:32 left in regulation (finished with nine points and three rebounds).
- The Sooners posted a 47-45 rebound advantage using a four-guard lineup the majority of the game against a Utah team that featured a pair of 7-footers (**David Foster** and **Jason Washburn**) and a 6-11 forward (**Kim Tillie**).
- **Ryan Wright** played a career-high 34 minutes in place of Gallon and had three points, seven rebounds and three steals.
- **Cade Davis** made his first three free throw attempts of the game to run his streak of conversions to 19 before missing one with 54 seconds left in regulation. He finished 4-for-5 at the charity stripe.
- Utah's 13 blocked shots were the most by an OU opponent since Connecticut recorded 13 rejections Jan. 7, 2002 (a span of 262 games).
- Oklahoma improved to 4-0 in overtime games under head coach Jeff Capel.

PREVIEWING NORTHERN COLORADO

Big Sky Conference member Northern Colorado enters Saturday's game with a 9-2 record. The Bears started the year with seven wins and have gone 2-2 since. They are 4-1 in road games, with wins over Hawaii (81-75), Air Force (70-46), North Dakota (70-63) and Montana (59-48), and a loss at Montana State (87-63). UNC is shooting .454 from the field, .382 from 3-point range (7.2 makes per game) and .721 from the free throw line. Opponents are shooting .411 from the field and .309 from behind the arc (5.7 makes per game).

Senior guard **Will Figures** leads the team in scoring (15.6 ppg), assists (2.7 apg), free throw makes (62) and free throw percentage (.827). The 5-9, 155-pounder has made 18 treys and is shooting .391 from long range. He has scored at least 20 points three times this year but over the last three outings is averaging 10.0 points. Junior guard **Devon Beitzel** is averaging 13.4 points and a team-high 2.4 steals per contest. He leads the squad with his 21 treys (1.9 makes per game) and is shooting .356 from behind the arc. Junior forward **Taylor Montgomery** averages 8.5 points and 4.2 rebounds, junior forward **Chris Kaba** averages 7.7 points and 3.6 boards, sophomore forward/center **Mike Proctor** averages 7.6 points and a team-high 6.1 rebounds and senior guard **Yahosh Bonner** averages 7.5 points and 2.5 assists.

Tad Boyle is in his fourth season as a collegiate head coach, all at Northern Colorado. The 1985 Kansas graduate owns a 40-60 record (.400).

OU-NORTHERN COLORADO SERIES HISTORY

Oklahoma won its only previous meeting against Northern Colorado, an 80-44 outcome on Dec. 11, 2004, in Norman. Forward **Taj Gray** was 10-for-12 from the field and posted game highs of 22 points and 11 rebounds for the Sooners, while guards **Jaison Williams** (four 3-pointers) and **Terrell Everett** (seven assists) added 14 and 13 points, respectively. OU, which went on to share the Big 12 regular season title, shot .517 from the field while holding the Bears to a .408 mark. **Kirk Archibeque** paced Northern Colorado with 15 points.

HOME NON-CONFERENCE DOMINATION

The Sooners have dominated home non-conference games over the last decade, winning 75 of their last 77 non-league contests inside Lloyd Noble Center going back to Jan. 3, 2000 (good for a .974 winning percentage). Included was a streak of 49 non-conference home victories that was snapped by Villanova on Dec. 6, 2006. The current string stands at 17 wins.

GUARDS SHOULDERING THE LOAD

Five of OU's top six scorers, including its top two, are guards. The Sooners' backcourt has accounted for 592 of the team's 784 points, or 76 percent. Three guards average double figures in scoring while another averages 9.4 points (**Willie Warren** – 19.6 ppg; **Tony Crocker** – 13.5; **Tommy Mason Griffin** – 10.3; **Steven Pledger** – 9.5). Warren has surpassed 20 points five times this year, Pledger has done it twice and Crocker once.

FRESHMEN PLAYING LARGE ROLE

The freshman trio of **Tiny Gallon** (11.9 ppg), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (10.3) and **Steven Pledger** (9.5) has combined to score 317 of the team's 784 points this year, or 40 percent. Gallon, who is shooting .597 from the field, ranks fourth in the Big 12 in rebounds per game (9.4) and second with four double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Mason-Griffin ranks fifth in the league with his 5.0 assists per game and ranks second on the team with his .429 3-point shooting percentage. Among the Big 12's leaders in 3-point makes, Pledger has knocked down 21 treys on 53 attempts (.396) and has two games of more than 20 points. Another freshman, forward **Andrew Fitzgerald** is averaging 3.3 points in 10.2 minutes per game. He is shooting .455 from the field and is 10-for-13 from the free throw line (.769).

HEATING UP FROM OUTSIDE

After shooting .286 from 3-point range and averaging 6.0 treys through its first four games, OU is shooting .415 and averaging 9.8 makes from behind the arc over the last six outings. Senior **Tony Crocker** has been the main gun, going 15-for-31 (.484) over those last six contests. Freshman **Tommy Mason-Griffin** is 12-for-24 (.500), freshman **Steven Pledger** is 12-for-32 (.375), and junior **Cade Davis** is 11-for-34 (.324) over the same six games.

OU opponents in **bold****CROCKER CLIMBING THE CHARTS**

Senior guard Tony Crocker entered the year ranked 34th in school history in points (1,008) and seventh in 3-point makes (158). With a strong start to the season, the 6-6 San Antonio, Texas, product has vaulted to the No. 27 spot in points (1,143) and the No. 4 spot in 3-pointers (177). Crocker, who has started OU's last 76 games, needs 10 points to tie **Willie Rogers** (1966-68) for 26th on OU's career scoring list, and 30 points to tie **Brent Price** (1991-92) for 25th. At his current pace of 13.5 points per game, Crocker would finish the regular season ranked 13th on the Sooners' all-time scoring chart. Crocker's next target on the career 3-point makes list is **Tim Heskett** (1997-01). He needs 38 makes to tie Heskett for third on that list.

Crocker also has a chance to make a run at the top spot on OU's games played list. He entered the year with 102 career appearances and would finish the regular season with 132 if he plays in every regular season game this year. Depending on the Sooners' postseason fortunes, Crocker could challenge the record of 137 career games played by **Darryl "Choo" Kennedy** (1984-87).

TSN NAMES WARREN PRESEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Oklahoma sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is not only on The Sporting News' five-man preseason All-America team, he is the publication's choice as preseason national player of the year. If TSN's prediction holds true, Oklahoma would become the first program to record back-to-back national players of the year since Duke in 2000 (**Shane Battier**) and 2001 (**Jason Williams**). Sooner **Blake Griffin** was last year's consensus honoree. Joining Warren on the magazine's preseason All-America team are Kansas' **Sherron Collins**, West Virginia's **Devin Ebanks**, Notre Dame's **Luke Harangody** and Kentucky's **Patrick Patterson**.

OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

CAPEL'S QUICK START

When **Jeff Capel** was named OU head coach in May 2006, he inherited a thin roster and recruiting restrictions from the previous staff. After a 16-15 initial season, Capel directed seven-win improvements in both 2007-08 (23-12 record) and 2008-09 (30-6). His 69-33 mark as Sooners' boss entering this season ranked him No. 1 in school history in wins and winning percentage (.676) through the first three years of tenure. **Kelvin Sampson** ranks second in both categories (59 wins; .641) while **Billy Tubbs** ranks third (55 wins; .591).

TISDALE INDUCTED INTO COLLEGIATE HOOPS HALL

Wayman Tisdale, OU's all-time leading scorer and rebounder, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Nov. 22 in Kansas City, Mo. Tisdale starred at Oklahoma for three seasons in the mid-1980s and was named a first-team consensus All-American and Big Eight Conference Player of the Year each year. Tisdale was the leading rebounder on the 1984 U.S. Olympic gold medal team and was the No. 2 overall pick of the 1985 NBA Draft. He passed away last May from cancer at the age of 44. His widow, **Regina Tisdale**, was on hand to accept the honor on Tisdale's behalf. Among the others in this year's eight-person class were **Larry Bird** and **Magic Johnson**.

UP NEXT

OU has a quick turnaround in preparation for Monday's 5:30 p.m. CST game against UTEP in the All-College Classic. The game, which will be played at the Ford Center in downtown Oklahoma City, will be televised by ESPN2. The Sooners hold a 2-0 series lead against the Miners. Oklahoma State will play La Salle following the OU-UTEP matchup.

QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION

- This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- OU owns a 1,505-945 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
