Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 77-37 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round in 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

THURSDAY'S GAME BASICS

Playing its first game in 10 days, Oklahoma (8-4) travels to Spokane, Wash., to meet Gonzaga (9-3) Thursday at 9 p.m. CST inside the Spokane Veterans Memorial Arena. The Sooners haven't played since a Dec. 21 89-74 loss to UTEP in the All-College Classic in Oklahoma City. The Bulldogs are coming off a 94-52 home win over Eastern Washington on Monday. Thursday's contest, considered a neutral site game and labeled the Ronald McDonald House Charities Classic, will air on the Sooner Radio Network with **Chris Plank** and **Mike Houck** announcing. It will be televised by ESPN2 with **Brian Anderson** and **Stephen Bardo** calling the action.

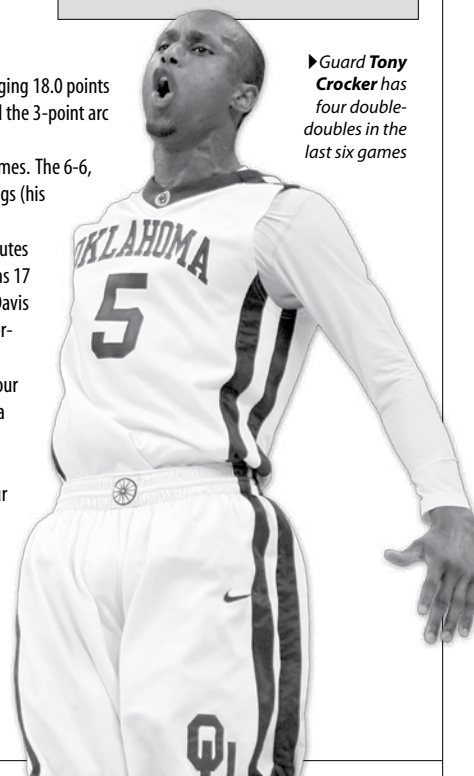
NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ Thursday's game will mark just the second meeting between Oklahoma and Gonzaga. The Sooners beat the Bulldogs 72-68 on Dec. 20, 2007, in Oklahoma City in the All-College Classic.
- ▶ The game will mark OU's first in the state of Washington since March 20, 1987, when the Sooners lost 93-91 in overtime to Iowa in the Sweet 16 in Seattle.
- ▶ In its wins, Oklahoma is shooting .469 from the field and .416 from 3-point distance. In its four losses, OU is shooting .423 and .294, respectively.
- ▶ Oklahoma is averaging 8.8 3-point makes per game. The school record for average treys per contest in a season is 8.5 in 1998-99.
- ▶ OU ranks second in the Big 12 and ninth nationally with its .772 free throw mark. It has made more foul shots (206) than its foes have attempted (187).
- ▶ Senior guard **Tony Crocker**, who has started 78 consecutive games, is averaging 18.0 points and 10.3 rebounds over the last six contests. He is 15-of-33 (.455) from behind the 3-point arc during the stretch.
- ▶ Crocker has recorded his only four career double-doubles over the last six games. The 6-6, 209-pounder has five double-digit rebounding games over the last eight outings (his career high in rebounds entering the year was nine).
- ▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** has started each of the last eight games (32.9 minutes per contest) and is averaging 10.6 points and 1.6 steals in those outings. He has 17 3-pointers and is 19-of-22 (.864) from the free throw line during the stretch. Davis averaged 3.8 points over the team's first four games coming off the bench (averaged 17.8 minutes).
- ▶ OU has had a player score at least 20 points in a half three times in the last four games. Crocker set a Big 12 record for points in a half with 29 in the first stanza against Centenary Dec. 9 (he made seven 3-pointers), Davis netted 20 in the opening 20 minutes against Northern Colorado Dec. 19 (canned six treys) and **Tommy Mason-Griffin** scored 20 in the second half against UTEP Dec. 21 (four 3-point makes).
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is averaging team highs of 18.7 points, 4.9 assists and 7.0 free throw attempts per game (ranks fourth in the Big 12 in each category). He ranks fifth in league free throw percentage (.831).
- ▶ Warren has scored at least 24 points in six of his 11 outings.
- ▶ Crocker and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** are tied for fourth in the Big 12 with four double-doubles. Gallon is shooting a team-high .578 from the field and is averaging 11.8 points and 8.9 rebounds (ranks fifth in league).

► Mason-Griffin is 18-for-37 (.486) from 3-point range over the last eight games. He's made at least two treys in all but one of those games.

DEC. 21 UTEP RECAP

► UTEP shot Oklahoma opponent season highs of .579 from the field and .625 (10-for-16) from 3-point range in an 89-74 win over the Sooners Dec. 21 in Oklahoma City. The Miners held OU to respective .426 and .281 shooting marks, and posted a 36-30 rebounding edge.

► With the score tied at 20 midway through the first half, UTEP finished the first period on a 27-10 run to take a 47-30 lead at the break. The Miners went 8-for-11 from 3-point range over the first half's final 10 minutes.

► The Sooners outscored UTEP 44-42 in the second half but never drew closer than 10 points after intermission.

► **Tommy Mason-Griffin** sank a career-high four 3-pointers on nine tries and finished with a career-high 20 points, all in the second half. The freshman became the fifth Sooner (all guards) to score at least 20 points in a game this year, and the third Sooner in the last four games to score at least 20 points in a half.

► **Willie Warren** led OU with 26 points and four assists. He made three 3-pointers on 10 attempts.

► **Tony Crocker** (10 points, eight rebounds) finished two boards shy of recording his fifth double-double in the last six games.

► All five UTEP starters scored in double figures. Guard **Randy Culpepper** led the way with a season-high 27 points.

► The loss for Oklahoma was just its second in its last 17 All-College Classic games. The Sooners fell to 52-13 in the event.

PREVIEWING GONZAGA

West Coast Conference member Gonzaga improved to 9-3 on the year after knocking off Eastern Washington on Monday by a 94-52 score. The game was the first for the Bulldogs since a 76-41 loss to Duke on Dec. 19 in New York City. Gonzaga is ranked No. 22 in this week's ESPN/USA Today coaches' poll and is 26th in the AP version. The Bulldogs' other two losses came by a combined six points at Michigan State (75-71) and at home to Wake Forest (77-75). Gonzaga beat Colorado, Wisconsin and Cincinnati to claim the EA Sports Maui Invitational title in November. GU is shooting .476 from the field and .371 from behind the arc while limiting opponents to respective .392 and .324 marks.

Senior guard **Matt Bouldin**, who was named to the John R. Wooden Award preseason watch list, leads four Bulldogs who average double figures in points. Bouldin provides 15.1 points, 4.5 rebounds and a team-high 3.5 assists per game while shooting .400 from 3-point range (22-for-55) and .852 from the free throw line. Over his last three games, he is averaging 6.3 points in 21.7 minutes per outing. Freshman forward **Elias Harris**, from Speyer, Germany, is averaging 13.3 points on .554 field goal shooting and leads the squad with his 6.8 boards a contest. He has scored at least 22 points three times in the last six games. Junior guard **Steven Gray** has made 21 3-pointers (shooting .382) and is averaging 12.9 points, 4.1 rebounds and 2.3 assists. **Robert Sacre**, a 7-0, 247-pound sophomore center, supplies 11.8 points, 5.3 boards and 1.3 blocks per contest. Sacre is shooting .533 from the floor.

Mark Few is in his 11th season as a collegiate head coach, all at Gonzaga. The 1987 Oregon graduate owns a 273-69 record (.798) and entered the season as one of just two active coaches with a career winning percentage above .800 (North Carolina's **Roy Williams** was the other). Few led the Bulldogs to a 28-6 record last year and an NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance (the program's fourth under him).

OU-GONZAGA SERIES HISTORY

In the only previous meeting between the two schools, Oklahoma dealt 18th-ranked Gonzaga a 72-68 loss two seasons ago (Dec. 20, 2007) in the All-College Classic in Oklahoma City (box score on page 13 of these game notes). The Sooners overcame .257 first-half field goal shooting by netting 48 points and shooting .654 after intermission to post the win. **Jeremy Pargo** scored 12 straight Gonzaga points to give his team a 66-63 lead with 2:41 left, but the guard missed his last three attempts, including a potential game-tying 3-pointer that was blocked by **Austin Johnson** with six seconds remaining. The frontcourt tandem of **Blake Griffin** (15 points and a game-high 14 rebounds) and **Longar Longar** (16 points) led the way for OU while guard **Tony Crocker** hit three treys and contributed 15 points and six boards. Pargo, who led all scorers with 28 points, was the only Bulldog in double figures. Current Gonzaga guard **Matt Bouldin** had five points and three assists.

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WINS AND LOSSES

► In their wins, the Sooners are holding opponents to .417 field goal and .333 3-point shooting. In OU's losses, foes have shot .485 from the field and .433 from behind the arc.

► Similarly, OU is shooting .469 from the field and .416 from 3-point territory in wins, but just .423 and .294, respectively, in defeats.

► The Sooners have outrebounded their opponents by 3.5 per game in wins but have been outboarded by an average of 3.3 in losses.

► **Tony Crocker** is averaging 16.1 points (.487 from 3-point range) and 8.0 boards in wins compared to 10.0 points (.286 from deep) and 6.8 boards in losses. All four of his double-doubles have come in victories.

► **Willie Warren** is averaging 22.3 points in losses and 16.7 points in victories. He is 27-for-29 (.931) from the foul line in defeats.

GUARDS SHOULDERING THE LOAD

Five of OU's top six scorers, including its top two, are guards. The Sooners' backcourt has accounted for 718 of the team's 938 points, or 77 percent. Three guards average double figures in scoring while two more average at least 8.3 points. **Willie Warren** averages 18.7 points per outing and is followed by **Tony Crocker** (14.1), **Tommy Mason Griffin** (10.9), **Steven Pledger** (8.4) and **Cade Davis** (8.3). All five of those guards have surpassed the 20-point mark at least once this year (Warren has done it six times, Crocker and Pledger have done it twice each and Davis and Mason-Griffin have done it once each).

YOUTH MOVEMENT

The freshman trio of **Tiny Gallon** (11.8 ppg), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (10.9) and **Steven Pledger** (8.4) has combined to score 373 of the team's 938 points this year, or 40 percent. Gallon, who is shooting .578 from the field, ranks fifth in the Big 12 in rebounds per game (8.9) and fourth with four double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Mason-Griffin ranks fifth in the league with his 4.6 assists per game and with his .438 3-point shooting percentage. Among the Big 12's leaders in 3-point makes, Pledger has knocked down a team-leading 23 treys on 61 attempts (.377) and has two games of more than 20 points. Another freshman, forward **Andrew Fitzgerald** is averaging 3.3 points in 10.2 minutes per game. He is shooting .455 from the field and is 10-for-13 from the free throw line (.769).

After shooting .286 from 3-point range and averaging 6.0 treys through its first four games, OU is shooting .404 and averaging 10.3 makes from behind the arc over the last eight outings. Senior **Tony Crocker** and freshman **Tommy Mason-Griffin** have been the main guns during the stretch, going 19-for-41 (.463) and 18-for-37 (.486), respectively. Junior **Cade Davis** is 18-for-49 (.367) and freshman **Steven Pledger** is 14-for-40 (.350) in those eight games.

CROCKER CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Senior guard Tony Crocker entered the year ranked 34th in school history in points (1,008) and seventh in 3-point makes (158). With a strong start to the season, the 6-6 San Antonio, Texas, product has vaulted to the No. 25 spot in points (1,177) and the No. 4 spot in 3-pointers (181). Crocker, who has started OU's last 78 games, needs three points to tie **Lester Lane** (1952-55) for 24th on OU's career scoring list, and 34 points to tie **Corey Brewer** (1997-98) for 23rd. At his current pace of 14.1 points per game, Crocker would finish the regular season ranked 13th on the Sooners' all-time scoring chart. Crocker's next target on the career 3-point makes list is **Tim Heskett** (1997-01). He needs 34 makes to tie Heskett for third on that list.

Crocker also has a chance to make a run at the top spot on OU's games played list. He entered the year with 102 career appearances and would finish the regular season with 132 if he plays in every regular season game this year. Depending on the Sooners' postseason fortunes, Crocker could challenge the record of 137 career games played by **Darryl "Choo" Kennedy** (1984-87).

TSN NAMES WARREN PRESEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Oklahoma sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is not only on The Sporting News' five-man preseason All-America team, he is the publication's choice as preseason national player of the year. If TSN's prediction holds true, Oklahoma would become the first program to record back-to-back national players of the year since Duke in 2000 (**Shane Battier**) and 2001 (**Jason Williams**). Sooner **Blake Griffin** was last year's consensus honoree. Joining Warren on the magazine's preseason All-America team are Kansas' **Sherron Collins**, West Virginia's **Devin Ebanks**, Notre Dame's **Luke Harangody** and Kentucky's **Patrick Patterson**.

OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

CAPEL'S QUICK START

When **Jeff Capel** was named OU head coach in May 2006, he inherited a thin roster and recruiting restrictions from the previous staff. After a 16-15 initial season, Capel directed seven-win improvements in both 2007-08 (23-12 record) and 2008-09 (30-6). His 69-33 mark as Sooners' boss entering this season ranked him No. 1 in school history in wins and winning percentage (.676) through the first three years of tenure. **Kelvin Sampson** ranks second in both categories (59 wins; .641) while **Billy Tubbs** ranks third (55 wins; .591).

TISDALE INDUCTED INTO COLLEGIATE HOOPS HALL

Wayman Tisdale, OU's all-time leading scorer and rebounder, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Nov. 22 in Kansas City, Mo. Tisdale starred at Oklahoma for three seasons in the mid-1980s and was named a first-team consensus All-American and Big Eight Conference Player of the Year each year. Tisdale was the leading rebounder on the 1984 U.S. Olympic gold medal team and was the No. 2 overall pick of the 1985 NBA Draft. He passed away last May from cancer at the age of 44.

QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,506-946 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
