## Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 77-38 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round from 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

## MONDAY'S GAME BASICS

Oklahoma (8-5) looks to snap a two-game losing streak when it hosts Maryland Eastern Shore (3-9) Monday at 7 p.m. CST. The Sooners, who will play at Lloyd Noble Center for the first time since Dec. 19, are coming off an 83-69 loss to Gonzaga on Thursday in Spokane, Wash. The Hawks have lost four in a row and are coming off a 74-60 road loss to Nebraska on Saturday. Monday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. It will be televised by the Sooner Sports Network with **Bob Carpenter** and **Charlie Spoonhour** calling the action.

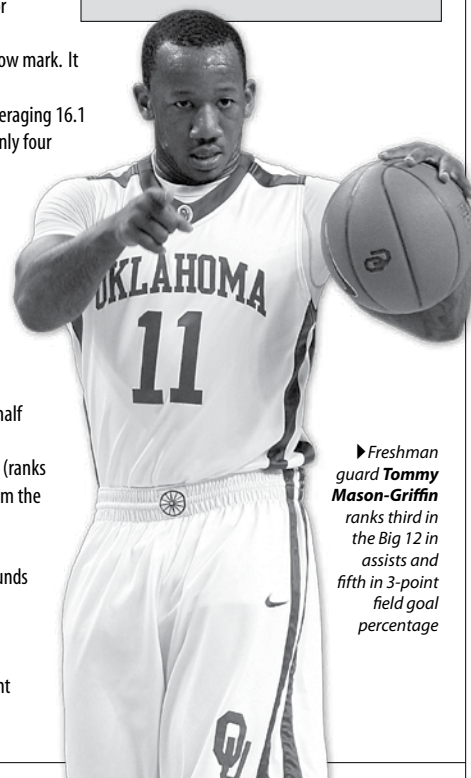
## NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ Monday's game will mark just the second meeting between Oklahoma and Maryland Eastern Shore. OU beat the Hawks 100-64 last season in Norman.
- ▶ The Sooners are allowing 72.7 points per contest. The last time they gave up that many points per game for an entire season was in 1995-96 (73.1).
- ▶ In its wins, Oklahoma is giving up 64.4 points a game and is holding opponents to .417 shooting from the field. In its losses, OU is surrendering 86.0 points and allowing foes to shoot .490 from the floor. Over the last two games, opponents have shot .544 from the field and .500 (21-for-42) from long distance.
- ▶ Oklahoma is averaging 8.8 3-point makes per game. The school record for average treys per contest in a season is 8.5 in 1998-99.
- ▶ OU ranks second in the Big 12 and fourth nationally with its .772 free throw mark. It has made more foul shots (217) than its foes have attempted (204).
- ▶ Senior guard **Tony Crocker**, who has started 79 consecutive games, is averaging 16.1 points and 9.0 rebounds over the last seven contests. He has recorded his only four career double-doubles during the stretch. The 6-6, 209-pounder has five double-digit rebounding games this year, the only ones of his career.
- ▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis**, who has started each of the last nine games (31.1 minutes), scored a career-high 25 points Dec. 19 against Northern Colorado but has totaled three points over the last two outings.
- ▶ OU has had a player score at least 20 points in a half three times in the last five games. Crocker set a Big 12 record for points in a half with 29 in the first stanza against Centenary Dec. 9 (he made seven 3-pointers), Davis netted 20 in the opening 20 minutes against Northern Colorado Dec. 19 (canned six treys) and **Tommy Mason-Griffin** scored 20 in the second half against UTEP Dec. 21 (four 3-point makes).
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is averaging team highs of 18.8 points (ranks fourth in Big 12) and 4.5 assists (also ranks fourth), and is shooting .833 from the free throw line (ranks third).
- ▶ Warren has scored at least 24 points in six of his 12 outings.
- ▶ Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** ranks sixth in the Big 12 with his 8.6 rebounds per game. Gallon, who is shooting a team-high .596 from the field, has four double-doubles to rank sixth in the conference.
- ▶ Mason-Griffin is 19-for-40 (.475) from 3-point range over the last nine games. He's made at least two treys in all but two of those outings. The point guard is averaging 13.8 points over the last four contests.

- ▶ Ranked No. 22 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll, Gonzaga shot .667 from the field and .692 from 3-point range (9-for-13) in the first half to take a 52-34 halftime lead and coasted to an 83-69 victory over the Sooners Thursday in Spokane, Wash.
- ▶ The Sooners lost by 14 despite shooting .500 from the field, .400 from behind the arc (8-for-20) and .786 from the free throw line (11-for-14). Gonzaga finished the game with respective marks of .509, .423 (11-for-26) and .824 (14-for-17).
- ▶ OU trailed 37-30 before the Bulldogs closed the first half on a 15-4 run to take their 18-point intermission lead.
- ▶ **Tommy Mason-Griffin** came off the bench for the second time this season but still recorded a career-high 10 assists against just one turnover. The freshman scored nine points in 32 minutes of action.
- ▶ **Willie Warren** scored a game-high 19 points with the help of 4-for-5 3-point shooting. He entered the game with a .259 3-point mark.
- ▶ **Andrew Fitzgerald** made his first career start and contributed 13 points and a team-high-tying five rebounds in 21 minutes. The freshman forward, who hadn't played in OU's two most recent games, was 5-for-8 from the field.
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Ray Willis** played in just his fifth game of the year (and first since Jan. 9) and scored eight points (all in the first half) in 17 minutes of play. He was 2-for-3 from 3-point range and made both of his free throw attempts.
- ▶ OU committed 13 turnovers to Gonzaga's 10, but the Bulldogs posted a 20-7 advantage in the points-off-turnovers category.
- ▶ The game was delayed for approximately 50 minutes after **Tiny Gallon** shattered the backboard with 15:34 left in the second half.

**PREVIEWING MARYLAND EASTERN SHORE**

Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference member Maryland Eastern Shore enters Monday's game with a 3-9 record. It has lost four straight contests after a three-game winning streak (home victories over American, Delaware State and Navy) that started in late November. The Hawks, who are 0-6 in true road games, are shooting .376 from the field, .270 from 3-point range (4.4 makes per game) and .645 from the free throw line (13.0 makes) on the year. They are allowing foes to shoot .474 from the field and .359 from behind the arc (6.7 makes per game).

Sophomore guard **Hillary Haley**, a transfer from St. Bonaventure, is one of just two Hawks averaging double figures in points. Haley scores a team-high 11.8 points a contest and shares the squad lead with 20 makes from 3-point range (shooting .286). Junior guard **Kevin White** is averaging 10.0 points, 3.3 rebounds and team highs of 5.2 assists and 1.2 steals per contest. Junior guard **Tim Burns** supplies 9.5 points and 1.4 assists per outing, and has made a team-high 30 free throws (shooting .833 from the line).

**Frankie Allen** is in his second year at Maryland Eastern Shore and owns a 10-32 (.238) record. He's in his 20th year as a collegiate head coach and is 233-326 (.417). Allen has also served as head coach at Virginia Tech, Tennessee State and Howard. A 1971 graduate of Roanoke College, he remains the all-time leading scorer (2,780) and rebounder (1,758) at any collegiate level in the state of Virginia.

**OU-MARYLAND EASTERN SHORE SERIES HISTORY**

In the only previous meeting between the two schools, Oklahoma dealt Maryland Eastern Shore a 100-64 defeat last season (Jan. 5, 2009) in Norman. OU head coach Jeff Capel missed the game due to a stomach virus that resulted in his hospitalization, and assistant coach **Mark Cline** led the team in his absence. The Sooners shot .500 from the field while holding the Hawks to a .311 figure, and posted a 52-43 rebounding advantage. OU's 52 boards were a season high, as were its 11 blocked shots. **Blake Griffin** racked up 20 points and 16 rebounds in just 22 minutes of action while **Tony Crocker** and **Willie Warren** finished with 15 points each (Crocker was 10-for-10 from the free throw line). Center **Orlando Allen** came off the bench to record 10 points, five rebounds and five blocked shots (all career highs at the time) in 14 minutes of court time. The Sooners' 100 points were their most in four seasons. **Neal Pitt** led the Hawks with 18 points while **Chris Conner** scored 12 off the bench.

**THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WINS AND LOSSES**

- ▶ In their eight wins, the Sooners are holding opponents to .417 field goal and .333 3-point shooting. In OU's five losses, foes have shot .490 from the field and .431 from behind the arc.
- ▶ Similarly, OU is shooting .469 from the field and .416 from 3-point territory in wins, but just .437 and .310, respectively, in defeats.
- ▶ The Sooners have outrebounded their opponents by 3.5 per game in wins but have been outboarded by an average of 4.2 in losses.
- ▶ **Tony Crocker** is averaging 16.1 points (.487 from 3-point range) and 8.0 boards in wins compared to 9.0 points (.235 from deep) and 5.6 boards in losses. All four of his double-doubles have come in victories.
- ▶ **Willie Warren** is averaging 21.6 points in losses and 16.7 points in victories. He is 28-for-30 (.933) from the foul line in defeats.

**GUARDS SHOULDERING THE LOAD**

Five of OU's top six scorers, including its top two, are guards. The Sooners' backcourt has accounted for 764 of the team's 1,007 points, or 76 percent. Three guards average double figures in scoring while two more average at least 7.7 points. **Willie Warren** averages 18.8 points per outing and is followed by **Tony Crocker** (13.4), **Tommy Mason Griffin** (10.8), **Steven Pledger** (8.2) and **Cade Davis** (7.7). All five of those players have surpassed the 20-point mark at least once this year (Warren has done it six times, Crocker and Pledger have done it twice each and Davis and Mason-Griffin have done it once each).

**YOUTH MOVEMENT**

The freshman foursome of **Tiny Gallon** (11.8 ppg), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (10.9), **Steven Pledger** (8.4) and **Andrew Fitzgerald** (4.3) has combined to score 438 of the team's 1,007 points this year, or 43 percent. Gallon, who is shooting .596 from the field, ranks sixth in the Big 12 in rebounds per game (8.6) and sixth with four double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Mason-Griffin ranks third in the league with his 5.0 assists per game and fifth with his .431 3-point shooting percentage. Among the Big 12's leaders in 3-point makes, Pledger has knocked down a team-leading 24 treys on 64 attempts (.375) and has two games of more than 20 points. Fitzgerald is averaging 4.3 points in 11.3 minutes per game. He is shooting .500 from the field and is 13-for-18 from the free throw line (.722).

After shooting .286 from 3-point range and averaging 6.0 treys through its first four games, OU is shooting .404 and averaging 10.0 makes from behind the arc over the last nine outings. Freshman **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and senior **Tony Crocker** have been the main guns during the stretch, going 19-for-40 (.475) and 19-for-44 (.432), respectively.

**CROCKER CLIMBING THE CHARTS**

Senior guard **Tony Crocker** entered the year ranked 34th in school history in points (1,008) and seventh in 3-point makes (158). With a strong start to the season, the 6-6 San Antonio, Texas, product has vaulted to the No. 24 spot in points (1,182) and the No. 4 spot in 3-pointers (181). Crocker, who has started OU's last 79 games, needs 29 points to tie **Corey Brewer** (1997-98) for 23rd. At his current pace of 13.4 points per game, Crocker would finish the regular season ranked 13th on the Sooners' all-time scoring chart. Crocker's next target on the career 3-point makes list is **Tim Heskett** (1997-01). He needs 34 makes to tie Heskett for third on that list.

Crocker also has a chance to make a run at the top spot on OU's games played list. He entered the year with 102 career appearances and would finish the regular season with 132 if he plays in every game. Depending on the Sooners' postseason fortunes, Crocker could challenge the record of 137 career games played by **Darryl "Choo" Kennedy** (1984-87).

**TSN NAMES WARREN PRESEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

Oklahoma sophomore guard **Willie Warren** was not only on The Sporting News' five-man preseason All-America team, he was the publication's choice as preseason national player of the year. If TSN's prediction holds true, Oklahoma would become the first program to record back-to-back national players of the year since Duke in 2000 (**Shane Battier**) and 2001 (**Jason Williams**). Sooner **Blake Griffin** was last year's consensus honoree. Joining Warren on the magazine's preseason All-America team were Kansas' **Sherron Collins**, West Virginia's **Devin Ebanks**, Notre Dame's **Luke Harangody** and Kentucky's **Patrick Patterson**.

**OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS**

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

**CAPEL'S QUICK START**

When **Jeff Capel** was named OU head coach in May 2006, he inherited a thin roster and recruiting restrictions from the previous staff. After a 16-15 initial season, Capel directed seven-win improvements in both 2007-08 (23-12 record) and 2008-09 (30-6). His 69-33 mark as Sooners' boss entering this season ranked him No. 1 in school history in wins and winning percentage (.676) through the first three years of tenure. **Kelvin Sampson** ranks second in both categories (59 wins; .641) while **Billy Tubbs** ranks third (55 wins; .591).

**TISDALE INDUCTED INTO COLLEGIATE HOOPS HALL**

**Wayman Tisdale**, OU's all-time leading scorer and rebounder, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Nov. 22 in Kansas City, Mo. Tisdale starred at Oklahoma for three seasons in the mid-1980s and was named a first-team consensus All-American and Big Eight Conference Player of the Year each year. Tisdale was the leading rebounder on the 1984 U.S. Olympic gold medal team and was the No. 2 overall pick of the 1985 NBA Draft. He passed away last May from cancer at the age of 44. His widow, **Regina Tisdale**, was on hand to accept the honor on Tisdale's behalf. Among the others in this year's eight-person class were **Larry Bird** and **Magic Johnson**.

**QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION**

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,506-947 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).

- ▶ Leads team with 24 treys and is shooting .375 from behind the arc.
- ▶ Lone starts came vs. Houston and Nicholls State (averaged 18.5 points and 5.0 treys).
- ▶ Scored 21 points in opener vs. Mount St. Mary's and 23 vs. Houston (20 in first half).
- ▶ Has made at least 1 trey in all but 3 games, at least 2 in 6 outings and at least 4 in 3 games.
- ▶ Rated by ESPN.com as the nation's No. 84 overall recruit last year.

## 3 T.J. FRANKLIN (5-11, 166, SOPHOMORE, GUARD)

- ▶ A walk-on who has played a total of 8 minutes in 6 games (has 2 points and 3 assists).

- ▶ An electrical engineering major at OU who graduated No. 7 in his high school class.

## 4 ANDREW FITZGERALD (6-8, 258, FRESHMAN, FORWARD)

- ▶ Made first career start vs. Thursday vs. Gonzaga and had 13 points and 5 boards in 21 minutes.
- ▶ Averaging 4.3 points on .500 field goal shooting in an average of 11.3 minutes a game.
- ▶ Scored 14 points and grabbed 5 boards in season opener against Mount St. Mary's (5-for-7 from field) and 10 points Nov. 28 against Nicholls State (3-for-4).
