Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 78-39 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round in 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

MONDAY'S GAME BASICS

Oklahoma (9-6 overall, 0-1 Big 12) plays its first conference home game of the season when it hosts Oklahoma State (13-2, 1-0) Monday at 8 p.m. CST. The Sooners, who are 9-4 in Big 12 home openers, are coming off a 91-60 loss at Baylor on Saturday. OSU, meanwhile, posted an 81-52 home win over No. 22 Texas Tech the same day. Monday's contest, part of the Bedlam Series and sponsored by Oklahoma Farm Bureau and The Oklahoman, will air on the Sooner Radio Network with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. It will be televised nationally by ESPN with **Brent Musburger**, **Bob Knight** and **Holly Rowe** calling the action.

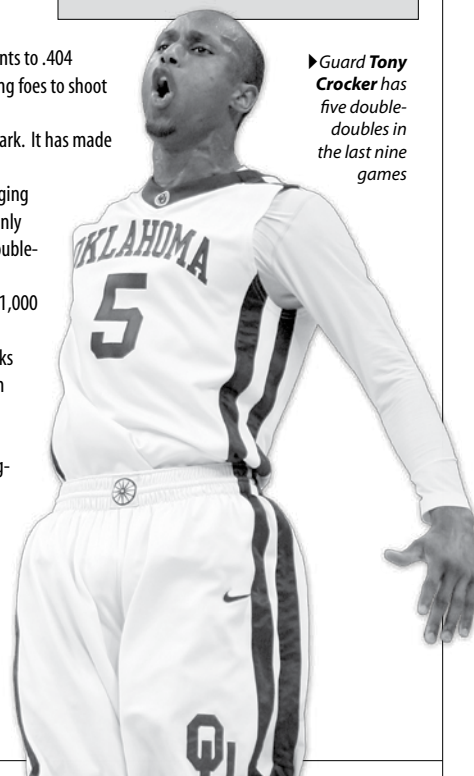
NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ Oklahoma owns a 125-90 all-time record against Oklahoma State and has won five of the last six meetings and eight of the last 11. The Sooners have swept the regular season series three out of the last four years.
- ▶ OU is 29-6 against OSU at Lloyd Noble Center and has won five straight meetings in the building. It is 10-3 in Norman since the Big 12 was formed.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 27 of their last 28 home games (.964).
- ▶ Oklahoma is averaging 8.7 3-point makes per game. The school record for average treys per contest in a season is 8.5 in 1998-99.
- ▶ OU is allowing 72.7 points per contest. The last time it gave up that many points per game for an entire season was in 1995-96 (73.1).
- ▶ In its wins, Oklahoma is giving up 63.2 points a game and is holding opponents to .404 shooting from the field. In its losses, OU is surrendering 86.8 points and allowing foes to shoot .506 from the floor.
- ▶ OU ranks second in the Big 12 and 21st nationally with its .748 free throw mark. It has made more foul shots (241) than its foes have attempted (233).
- ▶ Senior guard **Tony Crocker**, who has started 81 consecutive games, is averaging 15.9 points and 8.6 rebounds over the last nine contests. He has recorded his only five career double-doubles during the stretch. The 6-6, 209-pounder has six double-digit rebounding games this year, the only ones of his career.
- ▶ Crocker needs 34 rebounds to become just the second Sooner to ever record 1,000 points, 500 boards and 150 3-pointers in a career (**Ryan Minor** is the other).
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is averaging a team-high 17.8 points (ranks sixth in Big 12) and 4.4 assists (ranks fifth) per game, and is shooting .833 from the free throw line (ranks fourth).
- ▶ Warren has scored at least 24 points in six of his 14 outings.
- ▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** has started each of the last 11 games and is averaging 9.7 points during the stretch. He averaged 3.8 points off the bench in OU's first four games. Davis' 25 steals are 10 more than his closest teammate.
- ▶ Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** ranks fifth in the Big 12 with his 8.6 rebounds per game. Gallon, who is shooting a team-high .568 from the field, has five double-doubles to rank fourth in the conference.
- ▶ **Tommy Mason-Griffin** has 18 assists and just two turnovers over the last three games. The freshman handed out 10 assists against one turnover against Gonzaga Dec. 31 and had seven assists without a miscue against Maryland Eastern Shore Jan. 4.

- ▶ Oklahoma dropped a 90-61 decision at Baylor to open Big 12 play on Saturday. The loss broke OU's 30-game winning streak against the bears and snapped its 16-game victory streak in Waco. Baylor had not beaten OU since Dec. 6, 1977.
- ▶ OU went 7-for-10 from the field and held a 20-11 lead after the game's first eight minutes, but shot just .118 (2-for-17) the rest of the half as Baylor went on a 30-6 run over the final 12 minutes to go up 41-26 at the break. OU never got closer than 12 points in the second half.
- ▶ Baylor shot an OU opponent season high of .586 from the field and knocked down 10 of its 20 3-point attempts. The Sooners shot .357 from the field and .250 from behind the arc (5-for-20) for their second worst marks of the season.
- ▶ **Tiny Gallon** led OU with 17 points and grabbed a team-high-tying five rebounds in 30 minutes of play.
- ▶ **Tony Crocker** was 3-for-6 from 3-point range and finished with 16 points and a season-high five assists.
- ▶ **LaceDarius Dunn** went 6-for-8 from behind the arc and scored a game-high 28 points for Baylor.

PREVIEWING OKLAHOMA STATE

Oklahoma State enters Monday's contest with a 13-2 record and is coming off an 81-52 home win over No. 22 Texas Tech Saturday. The Cowboys' only losses came at Tulsa (86-65 on Dec. 2) and versus Rhode Island (63-59 on Jan. 2). They are 1-1 in true road games (loss at Tulsa and a 71-70 win at Stanford). OSU is averaging 75.1 points a game (ranks 10th in the Big 12) and is surrendering 61.9 points a contest (ranks fourth). It is shooting .450 from the field (ranks 10th), .328 from 3-point range (ranks 12th) and .704 from the free throw line (ranks fifth).

Junior guard **James Anderson** leads four Cowboys who average double figures in points. Anderson is scoring a Big 12-high 21.9 points per contest and adds 5.9 rebounds, 2.1 assists and a team-high 1.4 steals an outing. The 6-6, 210-pounder scored 28 points Saturday against Texas Tech and 37 in Norman last year against the Sooners. Senior guard **Obi Muonelo** is averaging 12.0 points and 5.3 rebounds per game and is shooting a team-high .419 (26-for-62) from 3-point range. Junior forward **Marshall Moses** averages 10.5 points and a team-high 9.5 boards while sophomore guard **Keiton Page** supplies 10.3 points a contest with the help of .368 3-point shooting (2.1 makes per game).

Travis Ford is 36-14 (.720) in his second year as OSU's head coach. He's in his 13th year as a college head coach and is 226-188 (.546).

OU-OKLAHOMA STATE SERIES HISTORY

Oklahoma owns a 125-90 series advantage against Oklahoma State and has won eight of the last 11 meetings. The Sooners possess a 77-26 series lead in games played in Norman (29-6 at Lloyd Noble Center) and have won five straight at home. Since the start of the Big 12 in 1996-97, OU is 15-13 against the Cowboys and is 10-3 in Norman. The Sooners have swept the regular season series three of the last four years. **Jeff Capel** is 5-2 against Oklahoma State as OU's head coach.

LAST YEAR AGAINST THE COWBOYS

The Sooners went 2-1 against Oklahoma State last year, posting an 89-81 win in Stillwater and an 82-78 victory in Norman before losing 71-70 in the Big 12 Championship quarterfinals (in Oklahoma City). Oklahoma shot .544 from the field but just .288 from 3-point range over the three games, while OSU combined to shoot .436 from the field and .373 from behind the arc. OU also held a 38.3-25.3 rebounding advantage. **Blake Griffin** averaged 25.3 points and 17.3 rebounds to lead the Sooners in the three meetings, while **Austin Johnson** averaged 15.3 points and **Willie Warren** 11.7. **James Anderson** averaged 21.0 points for Oklahoma State.

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WINS AND LOSSES

- ▶ In their nine wins, the Sooners are holding opponents to .404 field goal and .328 3-point shooting. In OU's six losses, foes have shot .506 from the field and .441 from behind the arc.
- ▶ Similarly, OU is shooting .464 from the field and .401 from 3-point territory in wins, but just .424 and .302, respectively, in defeats.
- ▶ The Sooners have outboarded their opponents by 4.2 per game in wins but have been outboarded by an average of 5.5 in losses.
- ▶ **Tony Crocker** is averaging 15.9 points (.500 from 3-point range) and 8.4 boards in wins compared to 10.2 points (.304 from deep) and 5.0 boards in losses. All five of his double-doubles have come in victories.

HOME IS WHERE THE "W" IS

Oklahoma has won eight straight games at Lloyd Noble Center and 27 of its last 28. The Sooners, who went 16-1 in Norman last year, are 7-0 this season and 447-73 (.860) since the building opened in 1975. OU is 29-6 (.829) against Oklahoma State at Lloyd Noble Center.

PICK YOUR POISON

Five different Sooners have each made at least 20 3-pointers through the team's first 15 games. Oklahoma State (three) is the only other Big 12 team that has more than two players with at least 20 makes each heading into the week. **Tony Crocker** leads OU with 28 treys (1.9 per game) and is followed by **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and **Steven Pledger** with 25 makes each (1.7 per game), **Cade Davis** with 23 conversions (1.5 per game) and **Willie Warren** with 21 makes (1.5 per contest).

GUARDS SHOULDERING THE LOAD

Five of OU's top six scorers, including its top two, are guards. The Sooners' backcourt has accounted for 867 of the team's 1,155 points, or 75 percent. Three guards average double figures in scoring while two more average at least 7.7 points. **Willie Warren** averages 17.8 points per outing and is followed by **Tony Crocker** (13.6), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (10.1), **Cade Davis** (8.1) and **Steven Pledger** (7.7). All five of those players have surpassed the 20-point mark at least once this year (Warren has done it six times, Crocker and Pledger have done it twice each and Davis and Mason-Griffin have done it once each).

YOUTH MOVEMENT

The freshman foursome of **Tiny Gallon** (11.9 ppg), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (10.1), **Steven Pledger** (7.7) and **Andrew Fitzgerald** (4.3) has combined to score 497 of the team's 1,155 points this year, or 43 percent. Gallon, who is shooting .570 from the field, ranks fifth in the Big 12

in rebounds per game (8.6) and fourth with five double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Mason-Griffin ranks third in the league with his 4.9 assists per game and ninth with his .417 3-point shooting percentage. Pledger has knocked down 25 treys on 73 attempts (.342) and has two games of more than 20 points. Fitzgerald is averaging 4.3 points in 13.0 minutes per game. He is shooting .529 from the field and is 16-for-24 from the free throw line (.667).

CROCKER CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Senior guard **Tony Crocker** entered the year ranked 34th in school history in points (1,008) and seventh in 3-point makes (158). With a strong start to the season, the 6-6 San Antonio, Texas, product has vaulted to the No. 23 spot in points (1,212) and the No. 4 spot in 3-pointers (186). Crocker, who has started OU's last 81 games, needs 17 points to become one of the school's top 20 all-time scorers. At his current pace of 13.6 points per game, Crocker would finish the regular season ranked 13th on the Sooners' all-time scoring chart. Crocker's next target on the career 3-point makes list is **Tim Heskett** (1997-01). He needs 29 makes to tie Heskett for third on that list.

Crocker also has a chance to make a run at the top spot on OU's games played list. He entered the year with 102 career appearances and would finish the regular season with 132 if he plays in every game. Depending on the Sooners' postseason fortunes, Crocker could challenge the record of 137 career games played by **Darryl "Choo" Kennedy** (1984-87).

Also, Crocker is 34 rebounds shy of becoming just the second Sooner (and first of the Big 12 era) to register at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 150 3-pointers in a career. **Ryan Minor** (1993-96) racked up 1,946 points, 767 rebounds and 170 treys.

TSN NAMES WARREN PRESEASON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Oklahoma sophomore guard **Willie Warren** was not only on The Sporting News' five-man preseason All-America team, he was the publication's choice as preseason national player of the year. Sooner **Blake Griffin** was last year's consensus choice as national player of the year. Joining Warren on the magazine's preseason All-America team were Kansas' **Sherron Collins**, West Virginia's **Devin Ebanks**, Notre Dame's **Luke Harangody** and Kentucky's **Patrick Patterson**.

OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

CAPEL'S QUICK START

When **Jeff Capel** was named OU head coach in May 2006, he inherited a thin roster and recruiting restrictions from the previous staff. After a 16-15 initial season, Capel directed seven-win improvements in both 2007-08 (23-12 record) and 2008-09 (30-6). His 69-33 mark as Sooners' boss entering this season ranked him No. 1 in school history in wins and winning percentage (.676) through the first three years of tenure. **Kelvin Sampson** ranks second in both categories (59 wins; .641) while **Billy Tubbs** ranks third (55 wins; .591).

TISDALE INDUCTED INTO COLLEGIATE HOOPS HALL

Wayman Tisdale, OU's all-time leading scorer and rebounder, was inducted into the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame Nov. 22 in Kansas City, Mo. Tisdale starred at Oklahoma for three seasons in the mid-1980s and was named a first-team consensus All-American and Big Eight Conference Player of the Year each year. Tisdale was the leading rebounder on the 1984 U.S. Olympic gold medal team and was the No. 2 overall pick of the 1985 NBA Draft. He passed away last May from cancer at the age of 44. His widow, **Regina Tisdale**, was on hand to accept the honor on Tisdale's behalf. Among the others in this year's eight-person class were **Larry Bird** and **Magic Johnson**.

QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,507-948 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).

1 RYAN WRIGHT (6-9, 241, SENIOR, FORWARD)

- ▶ Averaging 3.0 points and 3.5 rebounds in 16.1 minutes a game (has started 5 games).
- ▶ Played a career-high 34 minutes at Utah Dec. 12 (3 points, 7 rebounds, 3 steals).
- ▶ Shooting .548 from the field after posting a .341 mark last year.
- ▶ Owns team's best one-step vertical leap (39.5 inches).
- ▶ A transfer from UCLA (played 2 years there and competed in 2006 and 2007 Final Fours).
- ▶ Hails from Mississauga, Ontario, and was ranked No. 56 by Scout.com in 2005 recruiting class.

2 STEVEN PLEDGER (6-4, 217, FRESHMAN, GUARD)

- ▶ Ranks 6th on team with his 7.7 points per game (averaged 13.7 through first 6 games).
- ▶ Ranks 2nd on team with 25 treys and is shooting .342 from behind the arc.
- ▶ Lone starts came vs. Houston and Nicholls State (averaged 18.5 points and 5.0 treys).
- ▶ Scored 21 points in opener vs. Mount St. Mary's and 23 vs. Houston (20 in first half).
- ▶ Has made at least 1 trey in all but 4 games, at least 2 in 6 outings and at least 4 in 3 games.
- ▶ Rated by ESPN.com as the nation's No. 84 overall recruit last year.

3 T.J. FRANKLIN (5-11, 166, SOPHOMORE, GUARD)

- ▶ A walk-on who has played a total of 12 minutes in 8 games (has 2 points and 3 assists).
- ▶ Played in 12 games last year (27 total minutes) and recorded 3 points and 6 assists.
- ▶ Teamed with Willie Warren at North Crowley High School in Fort Worth, Texas, to go 38-1 two years ago and win the Class 5A state title.
- ▶ A Texas Association of Basketball Coaches Academic All-State selection as a senior.
- ▶ An electrical engineering major at OU who graduated No. 7 in his high school class.

4 ANDREW FITZGERALD (6-8, 258, FRESHMAN, FORWARD)

- ▶ Lone career starts came in last 3 games (averaged 7.3 points and 3.3 rebounds in those 3).
- ▶ Averaging 4.3 points on .529 field goal shooting in an average of 13.0 minutes a game.
- ▶ Scored 14 points and grabbed 5 boards in season opener against Mount St. Mary's (5-for-7 from field) and 10 points Nov. 28 against Nicholls State (3-for-4).
- ▶ Has made 16 of his 24 free throw attempts (.667).
- ▶ Ranked No. 68 last year by ESPN.com, No. 70 by Rivals.com and No. 85 by Scout.com.

5 TONY CROCKER (6-6, 209, SENIOR, GUARD)

- ▶ Averaging 13.6 points, 7.1 rebounds and 1.8 assists in 32.8 minutes a contest.
- ▶ Shooting .476 from the field and team-high .431 (28-for-65) from 3-point distance.
- ▶ Over last 9 games is averaging 15.9 points and 8.6 boards (.444 3-point shooting).
- ▶ Ranks 5th in Big 12 in 3-point FG percentage and 10th in rebounding.
- ▶ His only 5 career double-doubles have come over the last 9 games.
- ▶ Recorded a career-high 33-point game (also had 13 rebounds) Dec. 9 vs. Centenary in which he set a Big 12 record for points in a half (29 in first) and tied the record for treys in a half (7).
- ▶ Has started 110 of his 117 career games, including each of the last 81.
- ▶ Ranks 23rd in OU career scoring with 1,212 points (needs 17 to move into top 20).
- ▶ Ranks 4th on OU's career 3-point makes list with 186 (needs 29 to tie Tim Heskett for third).

11 TOMMY MASON-GRIFFIN (5-11, 203, FRESHMAN, GUARD)

- ▶ Projected to 40 minutes, his scoring and rebounding averages are 19.7 and 14.2.
