Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 80-39 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round from 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

TUESDAY'S GAME BASICS

Oklahoma (11-6 overall, 2-1 Big 12) plays the first of two straight road games when it travels to take on Texas A&M (12-5, 1-2) Tuesday at 7:05 p.m. CST. The Sooners, who won home games against Oklahoma State and Missouri last week, are 1-2 on the year in true road contests. Texas A&M, which lost at Kansas State and Texas last week, are 9-0 at home. Tuesday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. It will be televised regionally by the Big 12 Network with **Doug Bell** and **Reid Gettys** calling the action.

NOTEWORTHY

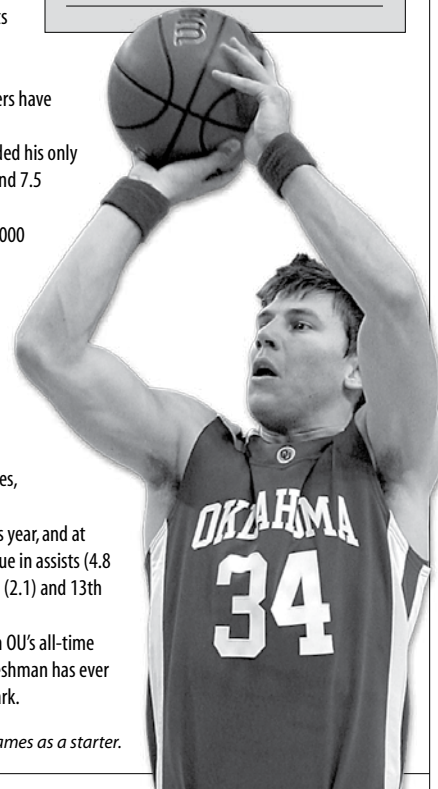
- ▶ Oklahoma owns a 28-4 all-time record against Texas A&M and is 11-3 in College Station. OU has won three straight meetings, but A&M won the previous three.
- ▶ Big 12 teams are a combined 118-6 (.952) at home this year (through Sunday). Five of the six home losses occurred last week (all in league play).
- ▶ OU is shooting .369 from the field and .263 from deep in its three road games.
- ▶ Oklahoma is averaging 8.5 3-point makes per game. The school record for average treys per contest in a season is also 8.5 (in 1998-99).
- ▶ OU is allowing 71.1 points per contest. The last time it gave up that many points per game for an entire season was in 1995-96 (73.1).
- ▶ In its wins, Oklahoma is giving up 62.5 points a game and is holding opponents to .386 shooting from the field. In its losses, OU is surrendering 86.8 points and allowing foes to shoot .506 from the floor.
- ▶ Oklahoma ranks second in the Big 12 with its .738 free throw mark. The Sooners have made 267 free throws while their opponents have attempted 270.
- ▶ Senior guard **Tony Crocker**, who has started 83 consecutive games, has recorded his only five career double-doubles over the last 11 games. He is averaging 13.5 points and 7.5 during the stretch (only played five minutes Saturday due to an ankle sprain).
- ▶ Crocker needs 28 rebounds to become just the second Sooner to ever record 1,000 points, 500 boards and 150 3-pointers in a career (**Ryan Minor** is the other).
- ▶ Sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is averaging a team-high 17.8 points (ranks sixth in Big 12) as well as 4.6 assists (ranks fifth) per game.
- ▶ Warren has recorded at least four assists in 13 of his 16 outings.
- ▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** has started each of the last 13 games and is averaging 10.1 points during the stretch. He averaged 3.8 points off the bench in OU's first four games. Davis' 28 steals are 11 more than his closest teammate.
- ▶ Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** ranks fifth in the Big 12 with his 9.1 rebounds per game. Gallon, who is shooting .545 from the field (.421 over the last four games, however), has six double-doubles to rank fourth in the conference.
- ▶ **Tommy Mason-Griffin** has made at least one 3-pointer in 16 of 17 games this year, and at least two treys in 10 of the last 13 outings. The freshman ranks fourth in the league in assists (4.8 apg), sixth in 3-point field goal percentage (.425), 11th in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.1) and 13th in 3-pointers per game (1.8).
- ▶ With 13 regular season games remaining, Mason-Griffin already ranks sixth on OU's all-time freshman list in assists (81) and seventh in 3-point makes (31). No Oklahoma freshman has ever shot better from 3-point range for a season than Mason-Griffin's current .425 mark.

▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** is averaging 10.1 points in 13 games as a starter.

- ▶ Despite not scoring for the game's first six minutes (it fell behind 10-0), Oklahoma posted a 66-61 home win over Missouri on Saturday.
- ▶ The Sooners used a 12-2 run to tie the game at 14-14, but trailed 32-27 at halftime. Still behind 44-38 midway through the second half, OU outscored Missouri 28-17 the rest of the game. A **Willie Warren** free throw on a 3-point play with 6:59 left put OU ahead for good.
- ▶ Despite receiving IV treatment before the game and at halftime due to being ill, junior guard **Cade Davis** recorded his first career double-double with 15 points and a career-high 11 rebounds. His previous rebounds high was five.
- ▶ **Ryan Wright** came off the bench to score a career-high 12 points and tie a career high with eight rebounds in 27 minutes (his second most action of the season). The senior forward's five field goal makes were also a career high (three of them were second-half dunks).
- ▶ Warren was 3-for-7 from 3-point range and 8-for-8 from the free throw line en route to 21 points (his most in five games).
- ▶ **Steven Pledger's** 10 points marked his first double-digit scoring game since netting 14 points Nov. 28 against Nicholls State.
- ▶ OU committed a season-high 20 turnovers compared to Missouri's 10, but the Sooners scored nine points off turnovers to MU's seven.
- ▶ After shooting .563 from the free throw line over the previous three games, the Sooners posted a .824 figure (14-for-17).
- ▶ The Sooners won despite the fact their second and third-leading scorers on the year (**Tony Crocker** and **Tiny Gallon**) were held scoreless. Crocker turned his ankle two-and-a-half minutes into the game and played just five minutes.

PREVIEWING TEXAS A&M

Texas A&M, which is 9-0 at home, owns a 12-5 overall record and a 1-2 mark in Big 12 play. It opened its league slate with a 64-53 home win over Nebraska before falling 88-65 at No. 13 Kansas State last Tuesday and 72-67 in overtime at No. 1 Texas on Saturday. A&M is shooting .436 from the field (ranks 11th in Big 12), .336 from 3-point range (ranks 11th) and .648 from the free throw line (ranks ninth). It is holding opponents to .396 field goal shooting (ranks fifth) and to a .310 mark from behind the arc (ranks fourth).

The Aggies suffered a significant blow Dec. 22 at Washington when senior guard **Derrick Roland**, the team's second-leading scorer and one of the Big 12's best perimeter defenders, sustained a season-ending leg injury. Roland was averaging 10.5 points, 3.0 rebounds and 1.7 assists in 25.1 minutes per game. He was shooting .489 from the field and .793 from the free throw line. That leaves A&M with one player who currently averages double figures in scoring. Senior guard **Donald Sloan**, a high school teammate of Roland, averages 17.6 points per contest to rank seventh in the Big 12. Sloan, who has made 23 treys on the year and is shooting .397 from behind the arc, also contributes 3.9 boards and 2.2 assists per game. Senior forward **Bryan Davis** and junior guard **B.J. Holmes** average just under double figures in scoring, with Davis producing 9.7 points and Holmes adding 9.4 an outing. Davis also averages 7.1 rebounds and 1.9 blocks per game (ranks fourth in Big 12), while Holmes, who has come off the bench in all 17 games, has hit a team-high 27 treys and is shooting .365 from long distance.

Mark Turgeon is in his third season at Texas A&M and owns a 61-26 (.701) record there. A former player and assistant coach at Kansas, Turgeon is in his 12th season as a collegiate head coach and possesses a 214-145 (.596) career mark.

OU-TEXAS A&M SERIES HISTORY

Oklahoma owns a 28-4 series advantage against Texas A&M and is 11-3 against the Aggies in College Station (A&M has won two of the last three there, however). Since the start of the Big 12 in 1996-97, OU is 23-4 against the Aggies (10-3 in College Station). The Sooners have won the last three overall meetings.

LAST YEAR AGAINST THE AGGIES

The Sooners swept the regular season series with Texas A&M last year, winning 69-63 in College Station and 77-71 in Norman (box scores on page 13 of these notes). **Austin Johnson** scored 19 points and handed out seven assists to lead OU in the first meeting, while **Blake Griffin** tallied 16 points and six rebounds amidst foul trouble. Griffin was one of four Sooners who scored in double figures in the rematch in Norman, totaling 16 points, 14 boards and four assists. OU shot .462 from the field and .407 from 3-point range (11-for-27) over the two games, while A&M shot a combined .414 from the floor and .378 (14-for-37) from behind the arc. **Josh Carter** averaged 16.0 points for the Aggies, **Chinemelu Elonu** averaged 10.0 points and 8.5 rebounds, and **Bryan Davis** averaged 10.5 points and 6.0 boards.

NOT PRETTY, BUT STILL W'S

After losing at Baylor Jan. 9 to open Big 12 play, the Sooners posted home wins last week over Oklahoma State (62-57 in overtime) and Missouri (66-61). Neither contest was visually appealing, as there were a combined 159 missed field goal attempts by the three teams. Fortunately for Oklahoma, the Cowboys and Tigers missed quite a few more shots than OU did. While the Sooners struggled to a .393 field goal mark and a .298 (14-for-47) performance from behind the arc, they held OSU and MU to combined .316 field goal and .217 (10-for-46) 3-point figures. The Cowboys' .275 field goal effort was the lowest by an OU opponent in 58 games.

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WINS AND LOSSES

- ▶ In their 11 wins, the Sooners are holding opponents to .386 field goal and .307 3-point shooting. In OU's six losses, foes have shot .506 from the field and .441 from behind the arc.
- ▶ The Sooners have outrebounded their opponents by 3.9 per game in wins but have been outboarded by an average of 5.5 in losses.
- ▶ **Cade Davis** is averaging 11.3 points (.368 from 3-point range) in wins compared to 3.7 points (.143 from behind the arc) in losses.
- ▶ **Tony Crocker** is averaging 14.8 points (.478 from 3-point range) and 8.0 boards in wins (not including the Missouri game when he played only five minutes due to injury) compared to 10.2 points (.304 from deep) and 5.0 boards in losses. All five of his double-doubles have come in victories.

PICK YOUR POISON

Five different Sooners have each made at least 24 treys through the team's first 17 games. Oklahoma State (four) is the only other Big 12 team that has more than three players with at least 20 3-point makes each heading into the week. **Tommy Mason-Griffin** leads OU with 31 makes (1.8 per game) and is followed by **Tony Crocker** with 29 makes (1.7 makes), **Steven Pledger** with 28 conversions (1.6 per game), **Willie Warren** with 24 makes (1.5 per contest) and **Cade Davis** with 24 (1.4 per game).

OU opponents in **bold****GUARDS SHOULDERING THE LOAD**

Five of OU's top six scorers, including its top two, are guards. The Sooners' backcourt has accounted for 967 of the team's 1,283 points, or 75 percent. Three guards average double figures in scoring while two more average at least 7.5 points. **Willie Warren** averages 17.8 points per outing and is followed by **Tony Crocker** (12.3), **Tommy Mason Griffin** (10.2), **Cade Davis** (8.6) and **Steven Pledger** (7.5). All five of those players have surpassed the 20-point mark at least once this year (Warren has done it seven times, Crocker and Pledger have done it twice each and Davis and Mason-Griffin have done it once apiece). Last year, guards accounted for 52 percent of OU's points.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

The freshman trio of **Tiny Gallon** (11.3 ppg), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (10.2) and **Steven Pledger** (7.5) has combined to score 493 of the team's 1,283 points this year, or 38 percent. Gallon, who is shooting .545 from the field, ranks fifth in the Big 12 in rebounds per game (9.1) and fourth with six double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Mason-Griffin ranks fourth in the league with his 4.8 assists per game and sixth with his .425 3-point shooting percentage. Pledger has knocked down 28 treys on 84 attempts (.333) and has two games of more than 20 points.

CROCKER CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Senior guard **Tony Crocker** entered the year ranked 34th in school history in points (1,008) and seventh in 3-point makes (158). With a strong start to the season, the 6-6 San Antonio, Texas, product has vaulted to the No. 23 spot in points (1,217) and the No. 4 spot in 3-pointers (187). Crocker, who has started OU's last 83 games, needs 12 points to become one of the school's top 20 all-time scorers. At his current pace of 12.3 points per game, Crocker would finish the regular season ranked 14th on the Sooners' all-time scoring chart. Crocker's next target on the career 3-point makes list is **Tim Heskett** (1997-01). He needs 28 makes to tie Heskett for third on that list.

Crocker also has a chance to make a run at the top spot on OU's games played list. He entered the year with 102 career appearances and would finish the regular season with 132 if he plays in every game. Depending on the Sooners' postseason fortunes, Crocker could challenge the record of 137 career games played by **Darryl "Choo" Kennedy** (1984-87).

Also, Crocker is 28 rebounds shy of becoming just the second Sooner (and first of the Big 12 era) to register at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 150 3-pointers in a career. **Ryan Minor** (1993-96) racked up 1,946 points, 767 rebounds and 170 treys.

OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

CAPEL'S QUICK START

When **Jeff Capel** was named OU head coach in May 2006, he inherited a thin roster and recruiting restrictions from the previous staff. After a 16-15 initial season, Capel directed seven-win improvements in both 2007-08 (23-12 record) and 2008-09 (30-6). His 69-33 mark as Sooners' boss entering this season ranked him No. 1 in school history in wins and winning percentage (.676) through the first three years of tenure. **Kelvin Sampson** ranks second in both categories (59 wins; .641) while **Billy Tubbs** ranks third (55 wins; .591).

UP NEXT

The Sooners play another road game Saturday at Texas Tech. The 7 p.m. CST game will be televised by the Sooner Sports Network.

QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,509-948 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
