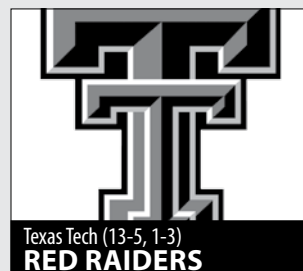

## Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 80-40 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round from 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

## SATURDAY'S GAME BASICS

Oklahoma (11-7 overall, 2-2 Big 12) plays its second of back-to-back road games when it takes on Texas Tech (13-5, 1-3) Saturday at 7:05 p.m. CST in Lubbock. The Sooners, who are coming off a 65-62 loss at Texas A&M on Tuesday, are 1-3 on the year in true road contests and 2-7 away from Norman. Texas Tech, which beat Iowa State 78-71 Wednesday in Lubbock, is 11-1 at home. Saturday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. It will be televised by the Sooner Sports Network with **Toby Rowland** and **Charlie Spoonhour** calling the action.

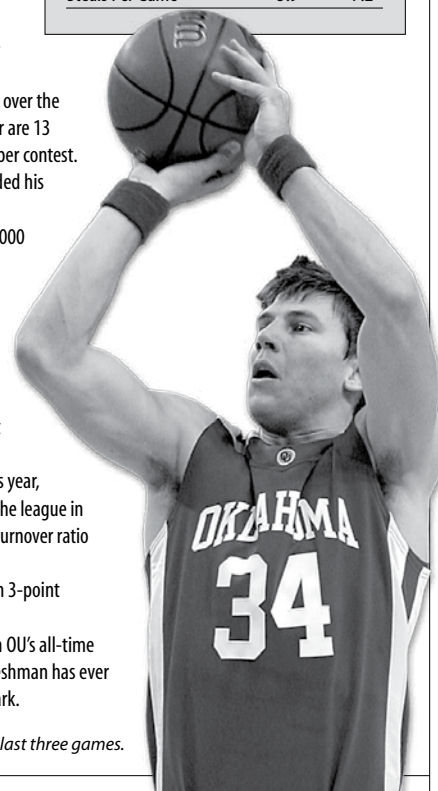
## NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ Oklahoma is 29-16 all-time against Texas Tech and 10-10 in Lubbock. OU has won five straight overall meetings and four of the last five at United Spirit Arena.
  - ▶ Big 12 teams are a combined 123-6 (.953) at home this year.
  - ▶ OU has held its foes to sub-.400 field goal shooting in five of the last six halves.
  - ▶ Oklahoma is averaging a Big 12-high 8.3 3-point makes per game. The school record for average treys per contest in a season is 8.5 (in 1998-99).
  - ▶ In its wins, Oklahoma is giving up 62.5 points a game and is holding opponents to .386 shooting from the field. In its losses, OU is surrendering 83.7 points and allowing foes to shoot .505 from the floor.
  - ▶ Oklahoma ranks second in the Big 12 with its .737 free throw mark. The Sooners have made 283 free throws while their opponents have attempted 287.
  - ▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** is averaging 11.0 points, 7.3 rebounds and 2.0 steals over the last three games and shot .500 from the field in each. Davis' 31 steals on the year are 13 more than his closest teammate. He ranks sixth in the Big 12 with his 1.7 steals per contest.
  - ▶ Senior guard **Tony Crocker**, who has started 84 consecutive games, has recorded his only five career double-doubles over the last 12 games.
  - ▶ Crocker needs 23 rebounds to become just the second Sooner to ever record 1,000 points, 500 boards and 150 3-pointers in a career (**Ryan Minor** is the other).
  - ▶ Sophomore guard **Willie Warren** is averaging a team-high 17.6 points (ranks fifth in Big 12) as well as 4.4 assists (ranks sixth) per game.
  - ▶ Over the last three games (all decided by five points or less), Warren is 8-for-8 from the foul line in the last two minutes of regulation and in overtime.
  - ▶ Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** ranks sixth in the Big 12 with his 8.9 rebounds per game. Gallon, who is shooting .547 from the field (.442 over the last five games, however), has six double-doubles to rank fourth in the conference.
  - ▶ **Tommy Mason-Griffin** has made at least one 3-pointer in 17 of 18 games this year, and at least two treys in 11 of the last 14 outings. The freshman ranks second in the league in 3-point field goal percentage (.442), fourth in assists (4.8 apg), 10th in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.1) and 13th in 3-pointers per game (1.9).
  - ▶ In OU's four conference games, Mason-Griffin is shooting .524 (11-for-21) from 3-point distance. The rest of the team is shooting .219 (14-for-64).
  - ▶ With 12 regular season games remaining, Mason-Griffin already ranks sixth on OU's all-time freshman list in assists (81) and seventh in 3-point makes (31). No Oklahoma freshman has ever shot better from 3-point range for a season than Mason-Griffin's current .442 mark.
- ▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** is averaging 11.0 points and 7.3 boards over the last three games.

- ▶ Oklahoma trailed 39-29 at halftime, battled back to take a 54-47 lead midway through the second half, and was outscored 9-2 in the last two minutes of a 65-62 loss at Texas A&M Tuesday. OU was 0-for-3 from the field and committed two turnovers in the final two minutes.
- ▶ Texas A&M shot .625 from the field in the first half and held the Sooners to a .348 mark. OU shot .444 in the second half and held the Aggies to a .375 figure. A&M shot .500 for the game while OU shot .400.
- ▶ **Tommy Mason-Griffin** scored a career-high 21 points and handed out five assists against two turnovers in 39 minutes of action. The freshman was 3-for-4 from 3-point range and 4-for-5 from the free throw line.
- ▶ **Willie Warren** scored 13 of his 14 points in the second half. He picked up two fouls in the game's first 3:45 and played 30 minutes. His two free throws with 46 seconds left gave the Sooners a 62-61 lead and were OU's final points.
- ▶ **Tiny Gallon** played just two minutes in the first half due to two early fouls, but still managed 10 points and seven boards in 22 minutes.
- ▶ One game after recording his first career double-double (15 points and 11 boards against Missouri), **Cade Davis** tallied nine points, seven rebounds (his second highest career total) and a game-high three steals. Davis played all 40 minutes and was 3-for-5 from 3-point range.
- ▶ After committing a season-high 20 turnovers the last game against Missouri, OU turned it over just nine times versus the Aggies.
- ▶ The Sooners were outrebounded 15-11 in the first half but held a 22-15 advantage in the second to win the board battle, 33-30.

**PREVIEWING TEXAS TECH**

Texas Tech, which is 11-1 at home (its only loss was to Missouri Jan. 13 in overtime), owns a 13-5 overall record and a 1-3 mark in Big 12 play. It started the year 9-0 (peaked at No. 16 in the Dec. 14 AP poll) but is 4-5 since. The Red Raiders are coming off a 78-71 home win over Iowa State on Wednesday, a game in which they went 10-for-20 from 3-point range. Tech is shooting .446 from the field (ranks ninth in Big 12), .356 from 3-point range (ranks seventh) and .716 from the free throw line (ranks fourth). It is holding opponents to .415 field goal shooting (ranks ninth) and to a .342 mark from behind the arc (also ranks ninth).

Three Red Raiders average double figures in scoring, while three more average more than 7.0 points a contest. Junior forward **Mike Singletary** leads the way with his 14.9 points per game, and ranks second on the team with his 6.7 rebounds an outing. Singletary, who scored 43 points against Texas A&M in last year's Big 12 Championship first round (including 29 straight for Tech), is shooting .475 from the field and .727 from the free throw line (team-high 7.3 attempts per game). Junior guard **John Roberson** averages 14.2 points and 5.3 assists (ranks second in Big 12). Roberson is shooting .393 from 3-point range (team-high 35 makes) and .802 from the free throw line. Another junior, guard **David Tairu** comes off the bench to supply 10.9 points and 3.0 rebounds per game. Tairu is shooting a team-high .469 from behind the arc (15-for-32). Guard **Nick Okorie** averages 8.9 points per game, forward **D'walyn Roberts** 7.7 and forward **Brad Reese** 7.3.

**Pat Knight** is in his third season as Texas Tech's head coach and owns a 31-31 (.500) record.

**OU-TEXAS TECH SERIES HISTORY**

Oklahoma owns a 29-16 series advantage against Texas Tech and has won the last five meetings. OU is 10-10 against the Red Raiders in Lubbock and has won the last two and four of the last five at United Spirit Arena. Since the start of the Big 12 in 1996-97, OU is 20-8 against Tech (9-4 in Lubbock). **Jeff Capel** is 5-1 against the Red Raiders as OU's head coach (2-1 in Lubbock).

**LAST YEAR AGAINST THE RED RAIDERS**

The Sooners swept the regular season series with Texas Tech last year, winning 95-74 in Norman and 78-63 in Lubbock (box scores on page 13 of these notes). **Blake Griffin** owned the Red Raiders, averaging 30.0 points and 20.5 rebounds over the two meetings. In the first matchup, the sophomore forward was 16-for-22 from the field and finished with 40 points, 23 rebounds, two assists, a block and two steals in 31 minutes. Griffin became the first player in Big 12 history and third in OU annals to register at least 40 points and 20 rebounds in a contest. His 40 points were the most by a Sooner in 15 years and his 23 boards marked OU's most in 20 seasons. He recorded double-doubles in each half. In the rematch, Griffin returned from a concussion to record 20 points and 18 rebounds, while his brother, **Taylor Griffin**, netted a career-high 22 points and plucked eight boards. **Nick Okorie** averaged 18.5 points in the two meetings for Texas Tech (scored 24 in Norman), while **John Roberson** averaged 13.0 points and 8.5 assists and **Mike Singletary** averaged 12.0 points.

**TURNING THE DEFENSIVE CORNER?**

After giving up 89 points to UTEP Dec. 22 (allowed .579 field goal shooting), 83 points to Gonzaga Dec. 31 (.509) and 91 points to Baylor Jan. 9 (.586), Oklahoma has made noticeable strides defensively over the last three games. In five-point wins over Oklahoma State and Missouri and a three-point loss at Texas A&M, OU held opponents to an average of 61.0 points and to .365 field goal and .254 3-point field goal shooting. In five of the last six halves, opponents shot under .400 from the field. In four of the last six halves, foes scored less than 30 points.

**THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WINS AND LOSSES**

- ▶ In their 11 wins, the Sooners are holding opponents to .386 field goal and .307 3-point shooting. In OU's six losses, foes have shot .505 from the field and .431 from behind the arc.
- ▶ The Sooners have outrebounded their opponents by 3.9 per game in wins but have been outboarded by an average of 4.3 in losses.
- ▶ **Cade Davis** is averaging 11.3 points (.368 from 3-point range) in wins compared to 4.4 points (.231 from behind the arc) in losses.
- ▶ **Tony Crocker** is averaging 14.8 points (.478 from 3-point range) and 8.0 boards in wins (not including the Missouri game when he played only five minutes due to injury) compared to 9.3 points (.280 from deep) and 5.0 boards in losses. All five of his double-doubles have come in victories.

**PICK YOUR POISON**

Five different Sooners have each made at least 24 treys through the team's first 18 games. Oklahoma State (four) is the only other Big 12 team that has more than three players with at least 20 3-point makes each heading into the weekend. **Tommy Mason-Griffin** leads OU with 34 makes (1.9 per game) and is followed by **Tony Crocker** with 29 (1.6 per game), **Steven Pledger** with 28 (1.6 per contest), **Cade Davis** with 27 (1.5 per outing) and **Willie Warren** with 24 (1.4 per contest). OU leads the Big 12 with its 8.3 treys per outing.

OU opponents in **bold****GUARDS SHOULDERING THE LOAD**

Five of OU's top six scorers, including its top two, are guards. The Sooners' backcourt has accounted for 1,015 of the team's 1,345 points, or 75 percent. Three guards average double figures in scoring while two more average at least 7.0 points. **Willie Warren** averages 17.6 points per outing and is followed by **Tony Crocker** (11.8), **Tommy Mason Griffin** (10.8), **Cade Davis** (8.6) and **Steven Pledger** (7.1). All five of those players have surpassed the 20-point mark at least once this year (Warren has done it seven times, Crocker, Mason-Griffin and Pledger have done it twice each and Davis has done it once). Last year, guards accounted for 52 percent of OU's points.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT**

The freshman trio of **Tiny Gallon** (11.2 ppg), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (10.8) and **Steven Pledger** (7.1) has combined to score 524 of the team's 1,345 points this year, or 39 percent. Gallon, who is shooting .547 from the field, ranks sixth in the Big 12 in rebounds per game (8.9) and fourth with six double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Mason-Griffin ranks fourth in the league with his 4.8 assists per game and second with his .442 3-point field goal percentage. Pledger has knocked down 28 treys and has two games of more than 20 points.

**CROCKER CLIMBING THE CHARTS**

Senior guard **Tony Crocker** entered the year ranked 34th in school history in points (1,008) and seventh in 3-point makes (158). With a strong start to the season, the 6-6 San Antonio, Texas, product has vaulted to the No. 22 spot in points (1,221) and the No. 4 spot in 3-pointers (187). Crocker, who has started OU's last 84 games, needs eight points to become one of the school's top 20 all-time scorers. At his current pace of 11.8 points per game, Crocker would finish the regular season ranked 14th on the Sooners' all-time scoring chart. Crocker's next target on the career 3-point makes list is **Tim Heskett** (1997-01). He needs 28 makes to tie Heskett for third on that list.

Crocker also has a chance to make a run at the top spot on OU's games played list. He entered the year with 102 career appearances and would finish the regular season with 132 if he plays in every game. Depending on the Sooners' postseason fortunes, Crocker could challenge the record of 137 career games played by **Darryl "Choo" Kennedy** (1984-87).

Also, Crocker is 23 rebounds shy of becoming just the second Sooner (and first of the Big 12 era) to register at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 150 3-pointers in a career. **Ryan Minor** (1993-96) racked up 1,946 points, 767 rebounds and 170 treys.

**OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS**

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

**CAPEL'S QUICK START**

When **Jeff Capel** was named OU head coach in May 2006, he inherited a thin roster and recruiting restrictions from the previous staff. After a 16-15 initial season, Capel directed seven-win improvements in both 2007-08 (23-12 record) and 2008-09 (30-6). His 69-33 mark as Sooners' boss entering this season ranked him No. 1 in school history in wins and winning percentage (.676) through the first three years of tenure. **Kelvin Sampson** ranks second in both categories (59 wins; .641) while **Billy Tubbs** ranks third (55 wins; .591).

**UP NEXT**

The Sooners return home to host Iowa State next Wednesday (Jan. 27) at 8 p.m. CST. The game will be televised by the Big 12 Network.

**QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION**

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,509-949 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).

- ▶ Owns team's best one-step vertical leap (39.5 inches).
- ▶ A transfer from UCLA (played 2 years there and competed in 2006 and 2007 Final Fours).
- ▶ Hails from Mississauga, Ontario, and is in graduate school.

## 2 STEVEN PLEDGER (6-4, 217, FRESHMAN, GUARD)

- ▶ Ranks 6th on team with his 7.1 points per game (averaged 13.7 through first 6 games).
- ▶ Ranks 3rd on team with 28 treys and is shooting .315 from behind the arc.
- ▶ Scored 10 points Saturday vs. Missouri (first double-digit scoring game since Nov. 28).
- ▶ Went 19-for-40 (.475) from 3-point range over first 6 games but is 9-for-49 (.184) since.
- ▶ Scored 21 points in opener vs. Mount St. Mary's and 23 vs. Houston (20 in first half).
- ▶ Rated by ESPN.com as the nation's No. 84 overall recruit last year.

## 3 T.J. FRANKLIN (5-11, 166, SOPHOMORE, GUARD)

## 4 ANDREW FITZGERALD (6-8, 258, FRESHMAN, FORWARD)

- ▶ Lone 3 starts have come over last 6 games (averaged 7.3 points and 3.3 rebounds in the 3).
- ▶ Averaging 3.7 points on .514 field goal shooting in an average of 11.6 minutes a game.
- ▶ Scored 14 points and grabbed 5 boards in season opener against Mount St. Mary's (5-for-7 from field) and 10 points Nov. 28 against Nicholls State (3-for-4).
- ▶ Has made 16 of his 24 free throw attempts (.667).

- ▶ Has started 113 of his 120 career games, including each of the last 84.
- ▶ Ranks 22nd in OU career scoring with 1,221 points (needs 8 to move into top 20).
