## Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 80-41 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round from 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

## WEDNESDAY'S GAME BASICS

Oklahoma (11-8 overall, 2-3 Big 12) plays its first home game in 11 days when it hosts Iowa State (12-7, 1-3) Wednesday at 8:05 p.m. CST. The Sooners, who are coming off a 75-65 loss at Texas Tech on Saturday, are 9-0 at home on the year. Iowa State, which lost 84-61 to Kansas Saturday in Ames, is 2-2 in true road games. Wednesday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. It will be televised by the Big 12 Network with **Dave Armstrong** and **Reid Gettys** calling the action.

### NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ Oklahoma is 108-77 all-time against Iowa State and 59-21 in Norman. OU has won the last three overall meetings and six straight at Lloyd Noble Center.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 10 consecutive games at home and 29 of their last 30.
- ▶ Big 12 teams are a combined 128-8 (.941) at home this year.
- ▶ OU has held its foes to sub-.400 field goal shooting in six of the last eight halves.
- ▶ Oklahoma is averaging a Big 12-high 8.2 3-point makes per game. The school record for average treys per contest in a season is 8.5 (in 1998-99).
- ▶ In its wins, Oklahoma is giving up 62.5 points a game and is holding opponents to .386 shooting from the field. In its losses, OU is surrendering 82.6 points and allowing foes to shoot .488 from the floor.
- ▶ Oklahoma ranks second in the Big 12 with its .740 free throw mark. The Sooners have made 301 free throws while their opponents have attempted 318.
- ▶ Six of the top-10 teams in the AP poll this time a year ago are not ranked currently (OU, North Carolina, Wake Forest, Louisville, Marquette and Xavier).
- ▶ **Tommy Mason-Griffin** has made at least one 3-pointer in 18 of 19 games this year, and at least two treys in 12 of the last 15 outings. He ranks third in the league in 3-point field goal percentage (.442), fourth in assists (4.6 apg), ninth in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.1) and ninth in 3-pointers per game (2.0).
- ▶ In Oklahoma's five conference games, Mason-Griffin is shooting .500 (15-for-30) from 3-point range. The rest of the team is shooting .195 (15-for-77).
- ▶ With 11 regular season games remaining, Mason-Griffin already ranks fifth on OU's all-time freshman list in 3-point makes (38) and sixth in assists (87). No Oklahoma freshman has ever shot better from 3-point range for a season than Mason-Griffin's current .442 mark.
- ▶ Senior guard **Tony Crocker**, who has started 85 consecutive games, has recorded his only six career double-doubles over the last 13 outings.
- ▶ Crocker needs 10 rebounds to become just the second Sooner to ever record 1,000 points, 500 boards and 150 3-pointers in a career (**Ryan Minor** is the other).
- ▶ Freshman forward **Tiny Gallon** ranks sixth in the Big 12 with his 8.7 rebounds per game. Gallon, who is shooting .550 from the field, is averaging just 19.0 minutes over the last two games due to foul trouble.

### SATURDAY'S TEXAS TECH RECAP

▶ It was a tale of two halves in Oklahoma's 75-65 loss at Texas Tech Saturday. OU held the Red Raiders to 23 points on .250 field goal shooting in the first half, but gave up 52 points on .516 shooting in the second. Tech was 0-for-4 from 3-point range before halftime and 7-for-11 after. The Sooners, who led 34-23

with 19 minutes left in the game, but were outscored 52-31 the rest of the way.

▶ Texas Tech went 8-for-35 (.229) from the field in the game's first 21:30, but responded to go 16-for-28 (.571) afterward.

▶ Down 65-64, the Sooners were outscored 10-1 over the game's final 2:53.

▶ OU committed five turnovers in the first half and 11 in the second. Texas Tech outscored the Sooners in points off turnovers, 24-7.

▶ OU's 25 fouls marked a season high, while Tech's 31 free throw attempts were the second most by an OU opponent on the year.

▶ **Tommy Mason-Griffin** scored a career-high 26 points and pulled down a career-high-tying seven rebounds. The freshman, who played the entire game, was 4-for-9 from 3-point range and scored all of his points in the game's final 29 minutes.▶ **Tony Crocker** recorded his sixth double-double in the last 13 games with 20 points and 13 rebounds. He had 12 points and nine boards by halftime. The senior went 7-for-8 from the free throw line.▶ **Willie Warren** did not play due to a sprained ankle.**PREVIEWING IOWA STATE**

Iowa State enters the week with 12-7 overall and 1-3 Big 12 records. Its only win in league play came Jan. 16 at Nebraska (56-53). It has lost at home to No. 1 Texas (90-83) and No. 3 Kansas (84-61), and at Texas Tech (78-71). The Cyclones, who average 75.0 points per game (rank eighth in Big 12), are shooting .466 from the field (fifth), .420 from 3-point range (first) and .624 from the free throw line (11th). They are 2-2 in true road games on the season (other contests were a 90-70 win at Drake on Nov. 17 and an 82-63 loss at California on Dec. 5).

ISU's frontcourt combo of junior forward **Craig Brackins** and senior forward **Marquis Gilstrap** is one of the most productive in the conference. Brackins, a preseason All-American, leads the team with his 16.0 points per contest and ranks second with his 7.8 boards per game. He has recorded six double-doubles on the year and has scored in double figures in all but two games. Brackins already ranks 15th in school history in scoring and 18th in rebounding. Gilstrap, a transfer from Gulf Coast (Fla.) Community College, averages 15.1 points and a team-high 9.3 boards an outing. In Big 12 play, he's averaging a double-double with his 18.0 points and a league-high 12.3 rebounds a game. A five-time Big 12 Rookie of the Week, Gilstrap has nine double-doubles on the year, including four in the team's four league contests. Junior point guard **Diante Garrett** is averaging 8.0 points and team highs of 5.4 assists and 1.4 steals a game. He has recorded at least seven assists six times on the year. The Cyclones lost guard **Lucca Staiger** last week when he opted to pursue a professional playing opportunity in his native Germany. A junior, Staiger started all 17 of his games this year and averaged 9.4 points. He made a team-high 48 3-pointers (2.8 per game) and shot .425 from long range.

**Greg McDermott** is in his fourth season as Iowa State's head coach and owns a 56-58 (.491) record. He's in his 16th year as a collegiate head coach and is 277-185 (.596).

**OU-IOWA STATE SERIES HISTORY**

Oklahoma owns a 108-77 series advantage against Iowa State and has won the last three meetings, seven of the last nine and 10 of the last 14. OU is 59-21 against the Cyclones in Norman and has won the last six at home. Since the start of the Big 12 in 1996-97, OU is 10-5 against ISU (6-0 in Norman). **Jeff Capel** is 3-1 against the Cyclones as OU's head coach (1-0 in Norman).

**LAST YEAR AGAINST THE CYCLONES** (BOX SCORE ON PAGE 13)

In the only meeting between the two teams last season, Oklahoma shot .654 from the field in the second half and outscored Iowa State 13-2 over the last 4:26 to post a 78-68 win in Ames. OU led by as many as 11 points in the first half, only to see the Cyclones knot the score at 33-33 by halftime. **Willie Warren** (29) and **Blake Griffin** (23) combined for 52 points for the Sooners, including 32 of the team's 45 second-half points. Warren was 9-for-18 from the field and 5-for-10 from behind the 3-point arc, and added four assists and a then-career-high six rebounds. Griffin was 10-for-13 from the floor and grabbed a game-high 15 boards. **Craig Brackins** and **Diante Garrett** paced Iowa State with 19 and 17 points, respectively, while Garrett also handed out 10 assists. Each team committed just seven turnovers. OU's win snapped a two-game losing streak in Ames.

**HOME IS WHERE THE "W" IS**

Oklahoma has won 10 straight games at Lloyd Noble Center and 29 of its last 30. The Sooners, who went 16-1 in Norman last year, are 9-0 this season and 449-73 (.860) since the building opened in 1975. They are 23-5 (.821) against Iowa State at Lloyd Noble Center.

**MASON-GRIFFIN ON A ROLL**

▶ Over the last four games, freshman point guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** has played 162 out of a 165 possible minutes and is averaging 17.3 points, 4.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists while shooting .500 from 3-point range (13-for-26).

▶ Mason-Griffin recorded career scoring highs in OU's two games last week (21 at Texas A&M and 26 at Texas Tech). He averaged 23.5 points, 5.0 boards and 3.0 assists in those two outings and was 7-for-13 (.538) from behind the arc and 8-for-10 (.800) from the foul line.

▶ The 5-11, 203-pounder ranks third in the Big 12 in 3-point percentage (.442), fourth in assists (4.6 apg), ninth in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.1) and ninth in 3-pointers per game (2.0). In Big 12 play, he ranks second in treys per contest (3.0).

▶ Mason-Griffin leads OU with his 15.0 scoring average in Big 12 play. The only league freshmen who average more points are Colorado's **Alec Burks** (18.8) and Texas' **Avery Bradley** (17.3).

▶ Only one freshman in school history averaged more minutes per game than Mason-Griffin's current 33.7 (**Wayman Tisdale** averaged 34.5 in 1982-83). No freshman in school history shot better from 3-point distance than his current .442 mark.

**THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WINS AND LOSSES**

▶ In their 11 wins, the Sooners are holding opponents to .386 field goal and .307 3-point shooting. In OU's eight losses, foes have shot .488 from the field and .440 from behind the arc.

▶ The Sooners have outrebounded their opponents by 3.9 per game in wins but have been outboarded by an average of 3.8 in losses.

▶ **Cade Davis** is averaging 11.3 points (.368 from 3-point range) in wins compared to 4.1 points (.200 from behind the arc) in losses.

▶ **Tony Crocker** is averaging 14.8 points (.478 from 3-point range) and 8.0 boards in wins (not including the Missouri game when he played only five minutes due to injury) compared to 10.6 points (.276 from deep) and 6.0 boards in losses. Five of his six double-doubles have come in victories.

Five different Sooners have each made at least 24 treys through the team's first 19 games. Oklahoma State and Texas (four each) are the only other Big 12 teams that have more than three players with at least 20 3-point makes each heading into the week. **Tommy Mason-Griffin** leads OU with 38 makes (2.0 per game) and is followed by **Tony Crocker** with 30 (1.6 per game), **Steven Pledger** with 28 (1.5 per contest), **Cade Davis** with 27 (1.4 per outing) and **Willie Warren** with 24 (1.4 per contest). OU leads the Big 12 with its 8.3 treys per outing.

**GUARDS SHOULDERING THE LOAD**

Five of OU's top six scorers, including its top two, are guards. The Sooners' backcourt has accounted for 1,068 of the team's 1,410 points, or 76 percent. Three guards average double figures in scoring while two more average at least 6.9 points. **Willie Warren** averages 17.6 points per outing and is followed by **Tony Crocker** (12.3), **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (11.6), **Cade Davis** (8.3) and **Steven Pledger** (6.9). All five of those players have surpassed the 20-point mark at least once this year (Warren has done it seven times, Crocker and Mason-Griffin three times each, Pledger twice and Davis once). Last year, guards accounted for 52 percent of OU's points.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT**

The freshman trio of **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (11.6), **Tiny Gallon** (10.9 ppg) and **Steven Pledger** (6.9) has combined to score 558 of the team's 1,410 points this year, or 40 percent. Mason-Griffin ranks fourth in the league with his 4.6 assists per game and third with his .442 3-point field goal percentage. Gallon, who is shooting .550 from the field, ranks sixth in the Big 12 in rebounds per game (8.7) and sixth with six double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Pledger has knocked down 28 treys and has two games of more than 20 points.

**CROCKER CLIMBING THE CHARTS**

Senior guard **Tony Crocker** entered the year ranked 34th in school history in points (1,008) and seventh in 3-point makes (158). With a strong start to the season, the 6-6 San Antonio, Texas, product has vaulted to the No. 19 spot in points (1,241) and the No. 4 spot in 3-pointers (188). Crocker, who has started OU's last 85 games, needs four points to tie **Al Beal** (1977-80) for 18th place in scoring. At his current pace of 12.3 points per game, Crocker would finish the regular season ranked 14th on the Sooners' all-time scoring chart. Crocker's next target on the career 3-point makes list is **Tim Heskett** (1997-01). He needs 27 makes to tie Heskett for third on that list.

Crocker also has a chance to make a run at the top spot on OU's games played list. He entered the year with 102 career appearances and would finish the regular season with 132 if he plays in every game. Depending on the Sooners' postseason fortunes, Crocker could challenge the record of 137 career games played by **Darryl "Choo" Kennedy** (1984-87).

Also, Crocker is 10 rebounds shy of becoming just the second Sooner (and first of the Big 12 era) to register at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 150 3-pointers in a career. **Ryan Minor** (1993-96) racked up 1,946 points, 767 rebounds and 170 treys.

**OU RANKS FOURTH NATIONALLY IN McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICANS**

Oklahoma boasts three McDonald's High School All-Americans on its 2009-10 roster, fourth most nationally and most ever at OU on one team. The trio consists of sophomore guard **Willie Warren**, freshman guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** and freshman forward **Tiny Gallon**. Only North Carolina (seven), Duke (six) and Villanova (five) have more. Georgetown, Georgia Tech and Kansas also claim three each, while Connecticut, Florida State, Kentucky, Louisville, Texas and UCLA claim two each.

Head coach **Jeff Capel** has signed four McDonald's All-Americans over his first three years at Oklahoma, as 2009 national player of the year **Blake Griffin** was also one in 2007. Prior to Capel's arrival, four Sooners were McDonald's All-Americans: **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982, **Jeff Webster** in 1989, **Ryan Humphrey** in 1997 and **Drew Lavender** in 2003.

**QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION**

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,509-950 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).

- ▶ Averaging 5.4 points (.700 FG%) and 4.0 boards in 17.0 minutes a game in Big 12 play.
- ▶ Shooting a team-best .585 from the field after posting a .341 mark last year.
- ▶ A transfer from UCLA (played 2 years there and competed in 2006 and 2007 Final Fours).
- ▶ Hails from Mississauga, Ontario, and is in graduate school.

## 2 STEVEN PLEDGER (6-4, 217, FRESHMAN, GUARD)

- ▶ Ranks 6th on team with his 6.9 points per game (averaged 13.7 through first 6 games).
- ▶ Ranks 3rd on team with 28 treys but is 3-for-22 (.136) from deep in Big 12 play.
- ▶ Scored 10 points Jan. 16 vs. Missouri (first double-digit scoring game since Nov. 28).
- ▶ Went 19-for-40 (.475) from 3-point range over first 6 games but is 9-for-52 (.173) since.
- ▶ Scored 21 points in opener vs. Mount St. Mary's and 23 vs. Houston (20 in first half).
- ▶ Rated by ESPN.com as the nation's No. 84 overall recruit last year.

## 3 T.J. FRANKLIN (5-11, 166, SOPHOMORE, GUARD)

## 4 ANDREW FITZGERALD (6-8, 258, FRESHMAN, FORWARD)

- ▶ Lone 4 starts have come over last 7 games (averaged 5.5 points and 2.5 rebounds in the 4).
- ▶ Averaging 3.5 points on .514 field goal shooting in an average of 11.2 minutes a game.
