Head Coach Jeff Capel



Jeff Capel was named Oklahoma's 13th men's basketball head coach on April 11, 2006. Capel, 34, is 81-41 in his fourth year at OU and led the Sooners to a 30-6 record and an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance in 2008-09.

Capel, who coached OU to a 23-12 mark and to the NCAA Tournament second round from 2007-08, compiled a 79-41 (.658) record over four years as head coach at Virginia Commonwealth prior to arriving in Norman. His squads went 50-22 (.694) in Colonial Athletic Association play.

In 2003-04, VCU's CAA Tournament championship game victory over George Mason catapulted the Rams to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1996. VCU lost in the first round to Wake Forest, but not before putting a major scare into the fourth-seeded Demon Deacons, 79-78. Capel's 2004-05 squad, which finished 19-13, competed in the National Invitation Tournament, marking just the third time in program history that VCU made consecutive postseason appearances.

The Rams won at least 18 games each of Capel's four seasons in Richmond, with the 2003-04 squad registering a Capel-era-best 23-8 record. His first team finished 18-10 in 2002-03. In 2005-06, VCU finished 19-10 overall.

In the summer of 2005, Capel served as an assistant coach on the gold-medal-winning USA Men's World University Games Team that finished 8-0 in Turkey in August. Villanova's Jay Wright was the head coach while Seton Hall's Bobby Gonzalez served as the other assistant. The squad featured, among others, Midwest City (Okla.) High School and Duke University standout Shelden Williams.

Capel began his coaching career as an assistant at Old Dominion in 2000 before moving to VCU as an assistant for the 2001-02 season. In 2002, he became the youngest NCAA Division I head coach at age 27.

A four-year starter for Hall-of-Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski at Duke from the 1993-94 through 1996-97 campaigns, Capel earned Atlantic Coast Conference honors each of his seasons in Durham. The guard, who wore No. 5, averaged 12.4 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.7 3-pointers during his career and started in the 1994 national title game against Arkansas.

He ranks 22nd in career scoring at Duke (1,601 points), 16th in minutes played (3,774), sixth in 3-pointers (220), seventh in 3-point attempts (553), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.398) and 11th in assists (433).

Capel, who graduated from Duke with a bachelor of arts degree in history, and his wife, Kanika, wed in 2003. They have two daughters, Cameron and Sydney.

SATURDAY'S GAME BASICS

Oklahoma (12-8 overall, 3-3 Big 12) goes for its first league road win when it plays at Nebraska (12-8, 0-5) Saturday at 12:30 p.m. CST. The Sooners, who posted an 89-84 home win over Iowa State on Wednesday, are 0-3 in conference road games despite holding leads of at least seven points in all three. Nebraska, which last won on Jan. 5 against Southeastern Louisiana, is 10-2 at home. Saturday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network with **Bob Barry Sr.** and **Mike Houck** announcing. It will be televised by the Big 12 Network with **Mitch Holthus** and **Bryndon Manzer** calling the action.

NOTEWORTHY

- ▶ Oklahoma is 104-81 all-time against Nebraska and 37-46 in Lincoln. OU has won nine of the last 12 overall meetings but has lost the last two in Lincoln.
- ▶ Big 12 teams are a combined 132-9 (.936) at home this year.
- ▶ In its five true road games (1-4 record), OU is averaging 66.8 points and is shooting .373 from the field and .274 (29-for-106) from 3-point range. In its 12 home games (10-2 record), Nebraska is holding opponents to an average of 55.9 points and to .400 field goal and .344 3-point shooting.
- ▶ Oklahoma is averaging a Big 12-high 8.3 3-point makes per game. The school record for average treys per contest in a season is 8.5 (in 1998-99).
- ▶ OU ranks second in the Big 12 with its .743 free throw mark. The Sooners have made 315 free throws while their opponents have attempted 332.
- ▶ Over the last three games, **Tommy Mason-Griffin** is averaging 28.3 points and 4.0 assists. He is 12-for-23 (.522) from behind the arc and 15-for-17 (.882) from the foul line.
- ▶ Mason-Griffin has made at least one 3-pointer in 19 of 20 games, and at least two treys in 13 of the last 16 outings. He ranks second in the Big 12 in 3-point field goal percentage (.448), fourth in assists (4.7 apg) and seventh in 3-pointers per game (2.2).
- ▶ In OU's six conference games, Mason-Griffin is shooting .500 (20-for-40) from 3-point range. The rest of the team is shooting .226 (21-for-93).
- ▶ Mason-Griffin is the first OU guard to score at least 20 points in three consecutive games since first-team All-American **Hollis Price** did it in 2002-03 as a senior. **Tim McCalister** in 1983-84 was the last OU freshman to pull off the feat.
- ▶ Senior guard **Tony Crocker**, who has started his last 85 games, has recorded his only six career double-doubles over his last 13 outings.
- ▶ Crocker needs 10 rebounds to become just the second Sooner to ever record 1,000 points, 500 boards and 150 3-pointers in a career (**Ryan Minor** is the other).
- ▶ Junior guard **Cade Davis** is has scored at least 15 points three times in the last seven games and is averaging 11.6 points over the stretch (he averaged 7.7 points in the team's first 13 games). A .390 field goal shooter on the year, Davis has shot .500 or better in five of the last seven outings. Over the last four games, he is averaging 12.5 points and 5.8 rebounds in an average of 38.2 minutes.

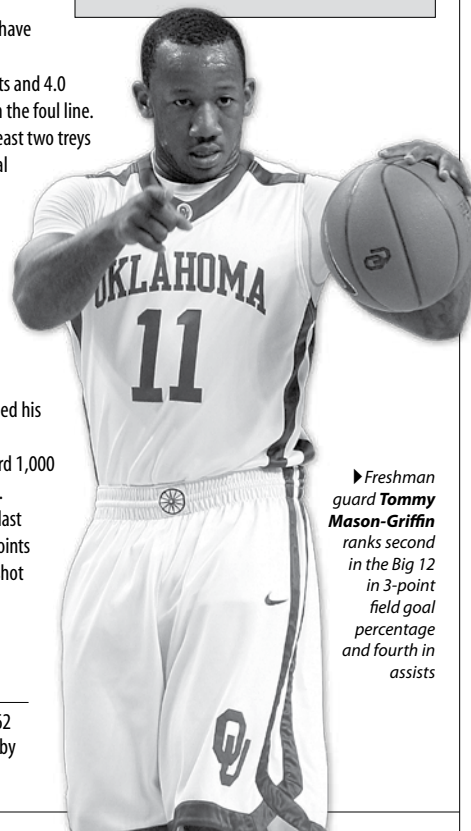
WEDNESDAY'S IOWA STATE RECAP

- Mason-Griffin was 13-for-21 from the field, 5-for-10 from 3-point range and 7-for-7 from the free throw line while adding six assists and two steals. He played all 40 minutes for the second straight game.
- Davis was 4-for-9 from 3-point range en route to his second highest career scoring total. He played 39 minutes and had three steals.
- OU made eight of its first 11 3-point attempts in the first half and led by as many as 21 before settling for a 48-32 halftime advantage.
- Oklahoma committed three first-half turnovers while Iowa State had 14. The result was a 19-3 OU advantage in points off turnovers.
- The Cyclones shot .625 from the field in the second half and made four 3-pointers in the last three minutes to draw as close as three points.
- Sophomore guard **Ray Willis** made his first career start and responded with six points, a team- and career-high seven rebounds, and a career-high three assists (he had three assists in his career entering the game). He was 2-for-4 from long range in a career-high 32 minutes.
- OU's two leading scorers on the year entering the night, **Willie Warren** (17.6 ppg) and **Tony Crocker** (12.3 ppg) did not play (both had sprained ankles). Despite that fact, the Sooners never trailed.

MORE ON MASON-GRIFFIN'S STELLAR NIGHT

Tommy Mason-Griffin's 38 points against Iowa State on Wednesday were....

- The most scored by a Big 12 player this year.
- The most scored by an OU freshman since **Wayman Tisdale** in 1982-83.
- The most scored by a freshman guard in school history.
- Tied for the most scored by a point guard in school history (**Mookie Blaylock** also scored 38 against Iowa State in 1988-89).
- Tied for the fifth most by a freshman in Big 12 history (only Kansas State's **Michael Beasley** scored more).
- The second most scored by a Sooner since the 1993-94 season (**Blake Griffin** scored 40 last year).

PREVIEWING NEBRASKA

Nebraska enters Saturday's game winless in Big 12 play, losing three road games (64-53 at Texas A&M, 70-53 at Missouri and 72-60 at Colorado) and two at home (84-72 to Kansas and 56-53 to Iowa State). The Huskers are shooting .393 from the field in league action and are getting outrebounded by 6.0 a game. They've made their mark on the defensive end of the floor, however, as they surrender just 61.0 points a contest on the year (fewest of any Big 12 team). In 12 home games (they're 10-2), the Huskers have held foes to an average of 55.9 points.

Senior guard **Ryan Anderson**, who scored a team-high 19 points against OU in Norman last year, leads the Huskers in scoring and rebounding with his respective 10.7 and 5.1 averages in 26.4 minutes a game. Anderson, who adds 2.2 assists and a Big 12-high 2.2 steals per contest, is shooting .362 from 3-point range (25-for-69) and .764 from the free throw line (42-for-55). In Big 12 play, he's averaging 8.4 points and 5.6 boards. Five other Huskers average between 7.2 and 9.3 points a game. Freshman forward **Christian Standhardinger**, from Germany, sat out the season's first 15 games but is averaging 9.3 points and 3.8 rebounds in an average of 16.0 minutes in his four outings. He came off the bench to score a team-high 14 points in 12 minutes of action at Colorado on Wednesday. Sophomore guard **Brandon Richardson** is averaging 8.5 points, freshman center **Jorge Brian Diaz** is averaging 8.3 points and 4.0 rebounds, senior guard **Sek Henry** is averaging 7.9 points and freshman guard **Eshaunte Jones** is averaging 7.2 points with the help of .444 3-point shooting (team-high 32 makes). Junior guard **Lance Jeter** leads the team with his 4.0 assists per game and adds 6.8 points.

Doc Sadler is in his fourth year as Nebraska's head coach and owns a 67-48 (.583) record. The 1982 Arkansas graduate is in his sixth season as a collegiate head coach (he was at UTEP for two years) and owns a 115-66 (.635) career mark.

OU-NEBRASKA SERIES HISTORY

Oklahoma owns a 104-81 series advantage against Nebraska and has won nine of the last 12 meetings. OU is 37-46 against the Huskers in Lincoln and has lost two in a row at the Devaney Center. Since the start of the Big 12 in 1996-97, OU is 10-5 against NU (3-3 in Lincoln). **Jeff Capel** is 2-1 against the Huskers as OU's head coach (0-1 in Lincoln).

LAST YEAR AGAINST THE HUSKERS (BOX SCORE ON PAGE 13)

In the only meeting between the two teams last season, Oklahoma overcame a 38-32 halftime deficit and posted a 72-61 home win over Nebraska on Jan. 21. **Blake Griffin** finished with 27 points and 18 rebounds for the Sooners, and added two assists, three blocks and two steals. **Austin Johnson** recorded 15 points (3-for-6 from 3-point range) and five assists, and **Tony Crocker** contributed 12 points (3-for-7 3-point shooting), four boards and five assists. Nebraska shot .500 from the field and .545 (6-for-11) from 3-point range in the first half, but just .310 and .167 (2-for-12) in the second. The Huskers entered the game forcing 18.7 turnovers per game, but OU committed just seven. The Sooners' 72 points were an NU opponent season high at the time.

MASON-GRIFFIN ON A ROLL

- Over the last five games, freshman point guard **Tommy Mason-Griffin** has played 202 out of a 205 possible minutes and is averaging 21.5 points, 4.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists while shooting .500 from 3-point range (18-for-36).
- Mason-Griffin has recorded career scoring highs in each of the last three games (21 at Texas A&M, 26 at Texas Tech and 38 vs. Iowa State). He is averaging 28.3 points over the three outings and is 12-for-23 (.522) from behind the arc and 15-for-17 (.882) from the foul line.
- The 5-11, 203-pounder ranks second in the Big 12 in 3-point percentage (.448), fourth in assists (4.7 apg), 10th in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.1) and seventh in 3-pointers per game (2.2). In Big 12 play, he ranks second in treys per contest (3.3).
- Mason-Griffin leads OU with his 18.8 scoring average in Big 12 play. The only league freshman who averages more points is Colorado's **Alec Burks** (19.2).
- With 10 regular season games remaining, Mason-Griffin already ranks fifth on OU's all-time freshman list in 3-point makes (43) and sixth in assists (93). No Oklahoma freshman has ever shot better from 3-point range for a season than Mason-Griffin's current .448 mark.
- Only one freshman in school history averaged more minutes per game than Mason-Griffin's current 34.0. That was **Wayman Tisdale** (averaged 34.5) in 1982-83.

- ▶ In their 12 wins, the Sooners are holding opponents to .402 field goal and .323 3-point shooting. In OU's eight losses, foes have shot .488 from the field and .440 from behind the arc.
- ▶ The Sooners have outrebounded their opponents by 3.1 per game in wins but have been outboarded by an average of 3.8 in losses.
- ▶ **Cade Davis** is averaging 12.3 points (.379 from 3-point range) in wins compared to 4.1 points (.200 from behind the arc) in losses.
- ▶ **Tony Crocker** is averaging 14.8 points (.478 from 3-point range) and 8.0 boards in wins (not including the Missouri game when he played only five minutes due to injury) compared to 10.6 points (.276 from deep) and 6.0 boards in losses. Five of his six double-doubles have come in victories.

PICK YOUR POISON

Five different Sooners have each made at least 24 treys through the team's first 20 games. Oklahoma State and Texas (four each) are the only other Big 12 teams that have more than three players with at least 20 3-point makes each heading into the weekend. **Tommy Mason-Griffin** leads OU with 43 makes (2.2 per game) and is followed by **Cade Davis** with 31 (1.6 per outing), **Tony Crocker** with 30 (1.6 per game), **Steven Pledger** with 28 (1.4 per contest) and **Willie Warren** with 24 (1.4 per game). OU leads the Big 12 with its 8.3 treys per outing.

GUARDS SHOULDERING THE LOAD

Five of OU's top six scorers, including its top three, are guards. The Sooners' backcourt has accounted for 1,137 of the team's 1,499 points, or 76 percent. Three guards average double figures in scoring while two more average at least 6.6 points. **Willie Warren** averages 17.6 points per outing and is followed by **Tommy Mason Griffin** (12.9), **Tony Crocker** (12.3), **Cade Davis** (9.1) and **Steven Pledger** (6.6). All five of those players have surpassed the 20-point mark at least twice this year (Warren has done it seven times, Mason-Griffin four times, Crocker three times and Davis and Pledger twice each). Last year, guards accounted for 52 percent of OU's points.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

The freshman foursome of **Tommy Mason-Griffin** (12.9), **Tiny Gallon** (10.8 ppg), **Steven Pledger** (6.6) and **Andrew Fitzgerald** has combined to score 642 of the team's 1,499 points this year, or 43 percent. Mason-Griffin ranks second in the league with his .448 3-point field goal percentage and fourth with his 4.7 assists per game. Gallon, who is shooting .544 from the field, ranks sixth in the Big 12 in rebounds per game (8.6) and sixth with six double-doubles (he missed out on another by one rebound). Pledger has knocked down 28 treys and has two games of more than 20 points. Fitzgerald has made four starts and is averaging 3.7 points on .500 field goal shooting. OU is one of just nine Division I schools with at least two freshmen averaging double figures in points.

CROCKER CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Senior guard **Tony Crocker** entered the year ranked 34th in school history in points (1,008) and seventh in 3-point makes (158). With a strong start to the season, the 6-6 San Antonio, Texas, product has vaulted to the No. 19 spot in points (1,241) and the No. 4 spot in 3-pointers (188). Crocker, who has started his last 85 games, needs four points to tie **Al Beal** (1977-80) for 18th place in scoring. At his current pace of 12.3 points per game, Crocker would finish the regular season ranked 14th on the Sooners' all-time scoring chart. Crocker's next target on the career 3-point makes list is **Tim Heskett** (1997-01). He needs 27 makes to tie Heskett for third on that list.

Crocker also has a chance to make a run at the top spot on OU's games played list. He entered the year with 102 career appearances and would finish the regular season with 131 if he plays in every remaining game. Depending on the Sooners' postseason fortunes, Crocker could challenge the record of 137 career games played by **Darryl "Choo" Kennedy** (1984-87).

Also, Crocker is 10 rebounds shy of becoming just the second Sooner (and first of the Big 12 era) to register at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 150 3-pointers in a career. **Ryan Minor** (1993-96) racked up 1,946 points, 767 rebounds and 170 treys.

QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION

- ▶ This is the 103rd season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ OU owns a 1,510-950 (.614) all-time record, ranking it 29th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 38th in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 27 years rank as the sixth most in the nation.
- ▶ No team in the country has made more postseason appearances over the last 28 years than Oklahoma's 27.
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the ninth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ Wayman Tisdale was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ▶ The Sooners own a winning record against 10 of the other 11 members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
