▶ **QUICKLY**

Has started 95 of his 102 career games, including 66 in a row entering 2009-10 season ... Already ranks 34th at OU in career scoring (1,008 points) and seventh in 3-point makes (158) ... Is on pace to finish in top three in 3-pointers ... Led team in 3-point field goal percentage each of his first two seasons ... Vertical leap of 43.5 inches (no limit on steps) is best on team.

▶ **2008-09 (JUNIOR)**

Started all 36 games ... Averaged 9.6 points, 3.2 rebounds, 1.4 assists and 1.0 steal in 28.9 minutes a contest ... Ranked second on team in 3-pointers made (59) and shot .349 ... Drained at least five treys in a game five times (all in last 26 outings) ... Made at least two 3-pointers in 13 outings ... Shot .772 from the free throw line (61-for-79) ... Registered four games of at least 20 points ... Scored a career-high 28 points against Syracuse in NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 (March 27) with help of 6-for-11 3-point effort ... Netted 26 points versus VCU in All-College Classic (Dec. 20) when he was 5-for-6 from long range ... Made a career-high 7 treys on 11 attempts and finished with 24 points against Colorado (Feb. 7) ... Drained 11 treys over two-game stretch against Arkansas (18 points on Dec. 30) and Coppin State (20 points on Jan. 3) ... Tied a career high with nine rebounds against No. 11 Texas (Jan. 12) ... Logged a career-high four steals against No. 10 Purdue (Nov. 28) and Kansas State (Jan. 10).

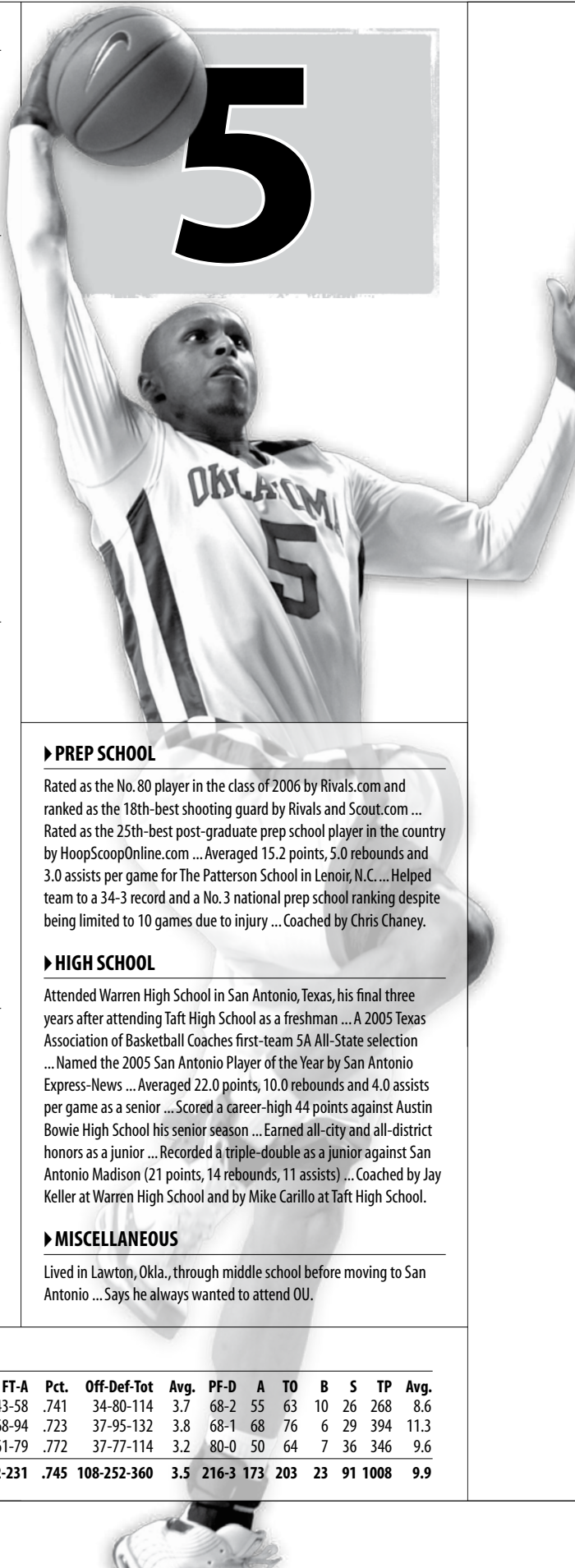
Made a team-high 34 starts out of 35 games (including the last 30) ... Ranked third on squad with his 11.3 scoring average in 30.6 minutes per outing ... Also averaged 3.8 rebounds and 1.9 assists ... Shot a team-high .424 from 3-point range and led squad with 64 treys ... Made at least three 3-pointers in 11 different games (shot .646 from long range in those 11 contests) ... Shot .532 (50-for-94) from 3-point territory in team's 23 wins but just .246 (14-for-57) in its 12 losses ... Scored at least 20 points on five occasions (team was 5-0 in those games) ... Went 5-for-5 from 3-point range and finished with a then-career-high 25 points in win at Oklahoma State (March 5) ... Converted a four-point play with 7.3 seconds left in a 92-91 home overtime win against Baylor on Feb. 19 (scored OU's final seven points in game's last 21 seconds) ... Scored 24 points at TCU on Dec. 2 (had 20 at halftime on 6-for-7 3-point shooting) ... Twice finished one rebound shy of a double-double (24 points at TCU and 22 points versus Iowa State).

▶ **2006-07 (FRESHMAN)**

Led team with his 25 starts (started the first 22 games of the year) ... Averaged 8.6 points, 3.7 rebounds and 1.8 assists in 23.3 minutes per game ... Scored at least 14 points on nine occasions ... Scored in double figures eight times in the first 14 games but just three times in last 17 (did it twice in the last three outings) ... Went 3-for-4 from 3-point range in each of back-to-back games (14 points in regular season finale at Kansas State and 15 points versus Iowa State in Big 12 Championship first round) ... Netted a then-career-high 19 points against Villanova (Dec. 6) on 8-for-12 field goal shooting ... Scored 18 points against Liberty (Nov. 16) and 18 against UT Arlington (Dec. 16) ... Registered 15 points and eight rebounds at No. 8 Alabama (Jan. 1) ... Thirteen of his 43 season free throw makes (30 percent) came in one game (he was 13-for-15 vs. Colorado Jan. 10).
