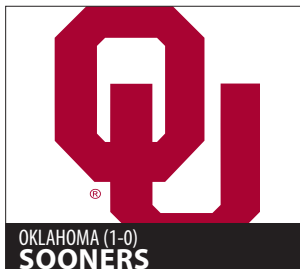

Head Coach Lon Kruger

► Lon Kruger was named Oklahoma's 14th head men's basketball coach on April 1, 2011.

► Owns a 479-304 (.612) collegiate record over 25 years.

► Has coached at Texas-Pan American (52-59 record from 1982-86), Kansas State (81-46 from 1986-90), Florida (104-80 from 1990-96), Illinois (81-48 from 1996-00) and UNLV (161-71 from 2004-10).

► Served as head coach of NBA's Atlanta Hawks from 2000-03 (69-122 record) and was an assistant for New York Knicks (2003-04 season).

► Averaged 25.4 wins at UNLV over the last five years (four NCAA appearances and one NIT trip) and won at least 21 games each of those five seasons.

► Coached UNLV to a 55-25 (.688) Mountain West Conference record the last five seasons.

► Has taken teams to 13 NCAA Tournaments (14-13 record) and four NITs (4-5 record).

► Coached Florida to the 1994 Final Four, Kansas State to the 1988 Elite Eight and UNLV to the 2007 Sweet 16.

► Has led all five of the college programs he has coached to 20-win seasons.

► Is one of five coaches in Division I college basketball history to take four different schools to the NCAA Tournament and is one of three coaches to win an NCAA Tournament game at four schools.

► Is one of just two head coaches in Division I history to lead at least four different schools to multiple NCAA Tournament wins.

► Is one of four coaches to lead three different schools to NCAA Sweet 16 appearances.

FRIDAY'S GAME BASICS

Oklahoma plays its second of two straight home games to open the season when it hosts Coppin State on Friday at 7 p.m. CT at Lloyd Noble Center. The Sooners are coming off a 78-74 win over Idaho State last Friday while the Eagles have split their first two games of the year against Cheyney University (won 80-65 last Friday) and Loyola Maryland (lost 78-68 Monday). Friday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network (KOKC AM 1520 in Oklahoma City; KTBZ AM 1430 in Tulsa) with **Toby Rowland** and **Mike Houck** announcing. The game will be televised by the Sooner Sports Network (KAUT Ch. 43 in OKC; FS Oklahoma outside of OKC market) with **Bob Carpenter** and **Billy Tubbs** calling the action.

SOONER UPDATE

► The Sooners' pressure defense under new head coach **Lon Kruger** has boosted the team's offense through two exhibitions and one regular season game. Opponents have committed at least 18 turnovers in each of the three outings, resulting in an average of 21.0 points per contest for the Sooners on the other end of the floor.

► OU has shown balanced scoring in its two exhibition games and one regular season contest. In those three outings, seven different Sooners have scored in double figures (a total of 15 times).

► Rebounding was mentioned by Kruger several times in the preseason as a concern of his for 2011-12. However, OU outrebounded its two exhibition opponents by an average of 13.0 per game and outboarded Idaho State in Friday's regular season opener by four.

► Junior guard **Steven Pledger** was suspended for Friday's season opener against Idaho State due to impermissible participation in a pro-am game this past summer, but will be back in action against Coppin State.

► OU's win over Idaho State leaves Kruger just 20 victories shy of 500 for his career. He ranks second among current Big 12 head coaches with 480 career wins (Texas' **Rick Barnes** has 526 victories).

IDAHO STATE RECAP

Oklahoma received a strong fight from Idaho State in Lon Kruger's debut as OU head coach last Friday, but it was another Sooner's first game at Lloyd Noble Center that helped seal a 78-74 victory. Junior forward **Romero Osby**, a transfer from Mississippi State, recorded career highs of 17 points and 10 rebounds while adding four assists, two blocks and a steal as OU rallied from a 10-point first-half deficit to notch the win.

The Sooners struggled in the opening 20 minutes against Idaho State's 2-3 zone, shooting .241 from the field. They trailed 27-17 with 5:30 left in the

half before rallying to within three at intermission, 34-31. OU didn't take the lead for good until **Carl Blair's** 3-pointer with 9:50 left in the game gave it a 56-54 advantage. The lead grew to as many as 10 with 1:30 remaining before Idaho State closed to within four at the final buzzer. Joining Osby in double figures for OU were **Calvin Newell** (career-high 19 points with the help of four 3-pointers), Blair (12 points to go along with six rebounds and five assists) and **Sam Grooms** (11 points to add to his six rebounds and eight assists).

MORE ON THE SEASON OPENER

► After shooting just .241 in the first half, the Sooners recorded a .471 mark after halftime to finish the game at .365. Idaho State shot .467 on the night.

► Starters **Andrew Fitzgerald** (seven) and **Cameron Clark** (two) combined for just nine points on 3-for-17 (.176) shooting. In OU's two exhibition games, the pair combined to average 26.5 points per contest on 16-for-32 (.500) shooting.

► Eighteen of the Sooners' 41 rebounds were offensive and OU outscored the Bengals 12-2 on second-chance points.

► Oklahoma's six blocked shots were just one shy of last year's season high.

► OU's win marked its 32nd in its last 33 home openers.

► The Sooners played without suspended junior guard **Steven Pledger**.

PREVIEWING COPPIN STATE

Located in Baltimore, Md., Coppin State is a member of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference and finished 16-14 last year with an 11-5 league record (tied for second place). The Eagles return 10 letterwinners and four starters from that squad, and are picked third out of 13 teams in the preseason MEAC poll.

Leading the way for Coppin State through two games (an 80-65 home win over Cheyney University and a 78-68 road loss to Loyola Maryland) is senior guard **Tony Gallo**. One of four returning players who averaged double figures in scoring last year, Gallo is averaging 20.0 points and 2.5 assists this season. He has already made seven 3-pointers (.389) and is coming off a 23-point effort at Loyola Maryland. Senior guard **Akeem Ellis** is averaging 14.5 points, 8.0 rebounds and 5.5 assists per game and turned in a 13-point, 6-rebound, 9-assist performance at Loyola Maryland. **Michael Harper**, another senior guard, is contributing 12.5 points per contest off the bench on .692 field goal shooting (9-for-13). Harper was a second-team all-conference selection last year when he averaged a team-high 15.2 points per game and led the league in 3-point (.438) and free throw (.881) percentage.

The Eagles are under the direction of head coach **Ron "Fang" Mitchell**, who is 396-358 (.525) over his 25 years, all at Coppin State.

OU-COPPIN STATE SERIES HISTORY

Oklahoma is 14-0 in its series with Coppin State, with 13 of those games played in Norman (the other was played in Oklahoma City in 1997-98 as part of the All-College Tournament). **Ron "Fang" Mitchell** has served as the Eagles' head coach in all 14 meetings. This will mark the third time in the last four years Coppin State has visited Norman. All previous 14 contests have taken place in the last 20 years. Mitchell has faced Oklahoma during his 25-year tenure at Coppin State more times than any other non-conference opponent (UMBC is next highest at 11, followed by Missouri at eight).

LAST YEAR VS. THE EAGLES (BOX SCORE ON PAGE 9 OF THESE NOTES)

The Sooners opened the 2010-11 season with a 77-57 home win over Coppin State behind **Andrew Fitzgerald's** 22 points and six rebounds. Fitzgerald was 8-for-13 from the field and 6-for-8 from the foul line. **Steven Pledger** and **Calvin Newell** scored 13 points each for OU while **Cameron Clark** added 11 points and 11 boards. Clark was 3-for-4 from 3-point range. Coppin State's **Michael Harper** netted 18 points and pulled down five rebounds while **Mike Simpson** contributed 11 points. The Sooners shot .510 from the field and held the Eagles to a .345 mark. The teams combined for just 18 turnovers (10 by OU and eight by Coppin State).

BUNCH OF HOMERS

Oklahoma has dominated home non-conference games over the last decade, winning 86 of its last 88 non-league contests inside Lloyd Noble Center going back to Jan. 3, 2000 (good for a .977 winning percentage). Included was a streak of 49 non-conference home victories that was snapped by Villanova, 67-51, on Dec. 6, 2006. The only other home non-conference loss during the last 88 games was a 66-62 defeat at the hands of Stephen F. Austin in the 2007-08 season. The current win string stands at 28 games.

CASTIGLIONE NAMED TO DIVISION I MEN'S BASKETBALL COMMITTEE

OU Vice President of Intercollegiate Athletics Programs and Director of Athletics **Joe Castiglione** has been appointed to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Committee, the NCAA announced Wednesday. Castiglione is replacing former Big 12 Conference Commissioner **Dan Beebe**, and will serve out the remainder of Beebe's term through the 2012-13 season.

"It is an honor to serve with this prestigious committee; a committee that has provided outstanding leadership through the years," Castiglione said. "The NCAA basketball tournament has emerged as one of this country's greatest sporting events. I recognize and embrace the high expectations that come with this role and look forward to working with my colleagues in presenting the best of college basketball. I fully understand that this assignment requires a great deal of preparation and I'm excited to get started."

Lon Kruger announced Wednesday that high school seniors **Buddy Hield** and **Jelon Hornbeak**, both ranked in the top 100 nationally by Rivals.com, have signed national letters of intent and will be freshmen at OU in 2012-13.

Hield is a 6-4, 190-pound guard originally from The Bahamas who attends Sunrise Christian Academy in Bel Aire, Kan., just outside of Wichita. He averaged 17.4 points, 4.6 rebounds and 2.2 assists per game last season, his first year in the United States, while shooting .446 from 3-point range (82-for-184). Hield led Sunrise to a 24-4 record and a National Association of Christian Athletes national championship, and was named tournament MVP. Rivals.com ranks him as the nation's No. 94 senior and the 17th-best shooting guard.

"Buddy is an athletic wing with a refreshing attitude, in terms of his great personality on the floor," said Kruger. "He loves to play, he loves to compete. He runs the floor very well. He's a scorer who has a passion for the game and will be a great addition to our program.

"He's a good perimeter shooter, but also a slasher who gets into the paint and finishes opportunities. He's more of a scorer at this point than a shooter or anything else. He just knows how to get the ball in the hole."

Hornbeak is a 6-4, 185-pounder who attends Grace Preparatory Academy in Arlington, Texas, one of the country's top high school teams. He is ranked No. 89 nationally by Rivals.com and is regarded as the 16th-best shooting guard in the country. Last year, he helped his team to a 30-6 record and to the Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools Class 4A state title. Hornbeak averaged 10.7 points, 8.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game according to his high school coach, Ray Forsett.

Said Kruger, "Jelon's a versatile combo guard who plays point and off (the ball) for his high school team, a very highly regarded Grace Prep squad. He has the ability to score, is a good defender and is used to winning all of his life. We're very excited to have him and, like Buddy, will be a great addition."

SOONERS TO COMPETE IN 76 CLASSIC

Oklahoma will travel to Anaheim, Calif., next week for the 76 Classic. The eight-team tournament will be spread over four days (Nov. 24-27), with each squad playing three games at the Anaheim Convention Center. It will be OU's first appearance in the event.

The Sooners open Thursday, Nov. 24 (Thanksgiving Day), against Washington State (22-13 record last year; NIT semifinals) at 10:30 p.m. CT in a game televised by ESPN2. The next day, OU will face New Mexico (22-13 last year) or Santa Clara (24-14) at either 8:30 p.m. or 11 p.m. CT on ESPN2 or ESPNU. After a day off, Sunday's third-round game will pit the Sooners versus Boston College, Saint Louis, UC Riverside or Villanova.

QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION

- This is the 105th season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- OU owns a 1,526-978 (.609) all-time record, ranking it 30th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 41st in winning percentage.
- Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its has made 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 29 years.
- Oklahoma has made 27 postseason appearances over the last 30 years (22 NCAA Tournaments and five NITs).
- The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 Big 12 crowns).
- The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the eighth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- **Wayman Tisdale** was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- The Sooners own a winning record against eight of the other nine members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
