Head Coach Lon Kruger

- ► Lon Kruger was named Oklahoma's 14th head men's basketball coach on April 1, 2011.
- ▶ Owns a 484-305 (.613) collegiate record over 25 years.
- ► Has coached at Texas-Pan American (52-59 record from 1982-86), Kansas State (81-46 from 1986-90), Florida (104-80 from 1990-96), Illinois (81-48 from 1996-00) and UNLV (161-71 from 2004-10).
- ▶ Served as head coach of NBA's Atlanta Hawks from 2000-03 (69-122 record) and was an assistant for New York Knicks (2003-04 season).
- Averaged 25.4 wins at UNLV over the last five years (four NCAA appearances and one NIT trip) and won at least 21 games each of those five seasons.
- ▶ Coached UNLV to a 55-25 (.688) Mountain West Conference record the last five seasons.
- ▶ Has taken teams to 13 NCAA Tournaments (14-13 record) and four NITs (4-5 record).
- ▶ Coached Florida to the 1994 Final Four, Kansas State to the 1988 Elite Eight and UNLV to the 2007 Sweet 16.
- ▶ Has led all five of the college programs he has coached to 20-win seasons.
- ▶ Is one of five coaches in Division I college basketball history to take four different schools to the NCAA Tournament and is one of three coaches to win an NCAA Tournament game at four schools.
- ▶ Is one of just two head coaches in Division I history to lead at least four different schools to multiple NCAA Tournament wins.
- ▶ Is one of four coaches to lead three different schools to NCAA Sweet 16 appearances.

THURSDAY'S GAME BASICS

Oklahoma (5-1) plays the second of three straight home games when Oral Roberts (6-2) visits Lloyd Noble Center on Thursday at 7 p.m. CT. The Sooners are coming off their largest victory margin of the season in an 82-53 win over Sacramento State on Friday. The Golden Eagles have won their last six games after a 0-2 start. Thursday's contest will air on the Sooner Radio Network (KOKC AM 1520 in Oklahoma City; KTBZ AM 1430 in Tulsa; Sirius 113, XM 191) with **Toby Rowland** and **Mike Houck** announcing. The game will be televised by the Sooner Sports Network (KAUT Ch. 43 in OKC; KOCO Ch. 6 in Tulsa; ESPN Full Court) with **Bob Carpenter** and **Billy Tubbs** calling the action.

SOONER UPDATE

- ▶ Oklahoma is averaging 79.0 points per game after averaging 66.0 last season. OU has scored at least 80 points three times in its six outings. Last year, it scored 80 or more four times in 32 games. The 79.0 points-per-game figure ranks 37th nationally out of 338 Division I teams.
- ▶ The Sooners' pressure defense under new head coach **Lon Kruger** has boosted the team's offense through six games. Opponents have averaged 16.5 turnovers, resulting in an average of 18.5 points per contest for 0U on the other end of the floor. Foes are averaging 12.8 points off the Sooners' 12.7 turnovers per game.

▶ Rebounding was mentioned by Kruger several times in the preseason as a concern of his for 2011-12. However, OU has outboarded five of its six opponents and ranks seventh nationally with its +9.8 margin per contest despite not starting anyone taller than 6-8. Included was a +34 effort against Coppin State (61-27) and a +16 margin against Santa Clara (49-33). The Sooners own a 98-59 offensive rebounding advantage on the year and have scored 87 second-chance points to their opponents' 48.

- ▶ OU's rebounding success has been the result of a group effort. More Sooners (eight) average at least 3.0 rebounds per game than any other Big 12 team.
- ▶ Junior college transfer **Sam Grooms** ranks third in the Big 12 with his 5.0 assists per game and ranks second with his 3.0 assist-to-turnover ratio (30 assists and 10 turnovers).
- After averaging 3.0 points on .167 (3-for-18) field goal shooting in OU's first two games, sophomore guard **Cameron Clark** is averaging 13.5 points on .500 (22-for-44) shooting over the last four contests. He scored 11 points against both Washington State and Santa Clara two weeks ago in Anaheim, netted 14 in the 76 Classic championship game against Saint Louis and scored a season-high 18 last Friday against Sacramento State.
- ▶ Junior guard **Steven Pledger** has scored in double figures in all five of his games and has two outings of at least 20 points (14, 11 and 15 in the others). In 32 games last year, Pledger scored 20 or more just three times. He is shooting a team-high .545 from the field and .483 from 3-point range this year after shooting .386 and .345, respectively, over his first two seasons combined.
- ▶ Junior forward **Romero Osby** has grabbed 10 rebounds in three of his first six games and ranks fifth in the Big 12 with his 7.7 boards per contest. He also ranks second with his 3.5 offensive boards per outing.

► Friday's OU win over Sacramento State leaves Kruger just 16 victories shy of 500 for his career. He ranks second among current Big 12 head coaches with 484 career wins (Texas' **Rick Barnes** has 530 victories).

FRIDAY'S SACRAMENTO STATE RECAP

▶ Oklahoma shot season highs of .574 from the field and .550 (11-for-20) from 3-point range in an 82-53 home win over Sacramento State on Friday, good for the team's largest victory margin of the season.

▶ Each of OU's five starters shot better than .500 from the field and they combined to shoot .686 (24-for-39) from the field and .800 (8-for-10) from 3-point range. The starters also combined for 16 of the team's 22 assists and 12 of its 16 steals.

The Sooners' 22 assists were their most in 81 games and their 16 steals were their most in 131 outings. Their .550 3-point field goal percentage marked the program's highest in 63 games.

▶ **Cameron Clark** scored a season-high 18 points to lead three Sooners in double figures. The sophomore was 7-for-12 from the field and 3-for-5 from 3-point range while adding three assists, a career-high three blocks and two steals without a turnover.

▶ Junior guard **Steven Pledger** was very efficient in his 21 minutes, finishing with 15 points, five assists, three steals and no turnovers. He was 4-for-5 from the floor, 3-for-3 from long distance and 4-for-4 at the free throw line.

▶ Junior forward **Andrew Fitzgerald** turned in his best shooting game of the year (6-for-8 from field) en route to a 13-point night.

▶ OU forced a Sacramento State team that entered the game averaging 12.0 turnovers into 22 miscues. The Sooners outscored the Hornets 30-7 off turnovers.

PREVIEWING ORAL ROBERTS

After losing its first two games of the season at West Virginia (78-71) and versus Texas-San Antonio (78-77), Oral Roberts has reeled off six straight victories. The Golden Eagles used a 16-2 run over the final 4:28 to win 61-55 this past Saturday at home against Southern Utah in their Summit League opener. Their five starters each average at least 29.5 minutes per game.

▶ A heavy favorite to win the Summit League (it received 27 of 32 first-place votes in the conference's preseason poll), ORU is outscoring its opponents by 8.1 a game (70.4-62.2) and is outrebounding them by an average of 6.9 boards.

▶ Oral Roberts had five players named to the first or second All-Summit League preseason teams. Senior forwards **Dominique**Morrison and Michael Craion were first-team picks. Morrison is averaging a team-high 16.4 points per game to go along with 3.8 rebounds. He scored 30 points in a six-point win over SMU and has already attempted 53 free throws on the year (shooting .774). Craion averages 12.9 points and team highs of 7.8 rebounds and 3.0 steals per contest. He is shooting .565 from the field.

Sophomore forward **Steven Roundtree**, junior guard **Warren Niles** and junior forward/center **Damen Bell-Holter** were second-team preseason all-conference selections. Last year's Summit League Newcomer of the Year, Roundtree averages 12.8 points and 7.6 points while shooting a team-best .578 from the floor. Niles contributes 11.8 points, 4.1 boards and 3.0 assists per outing and has made a team-high 13 treys (shooting .265 from deep). Bell-Holter played eight minutes in the opener at West Virginia then missed the next five games due to a back injury. He is averaging 28.0 minutes the last two outings and is coming off an 11-point, 11-rebound performance against Southern Utah.

▶ Head coach **Scott Sutton** is 229-157 (.593) in his 13th year as a collegiate head coach, all at ORU. He is the school's career wins leader.

OU-ORAL ROBERTS SERIES HISTORY

Thursday's game will mark the 13th between Oklahoma and Oral Roberts, with the Sooners owning a 10-2 series advantage and winning each of the last 10 meetings. Nine of OU's 10 wins in the series have come by double digits. ORU's two victories against the Sooners came in the 1976-77 (64-58 in Norman) and 1976-77 (68-50 in Tulsa) seasons. LAST YEAR VS. THE GOLDEN EAGLES (BOX SCORE ON PAGE 11 OF THESE NOTES)

▶ Oklahoma overcame three different 13-point first-half deficits to post a 73-60 home win over the Golden Eagles on Dec. 11, 2010. Trailing 24-12, OU closed the first half with a 22-2 run over the last 9:55 to lead 34-26 at the break. ORU went 0-for-12 from the field the last 10 minutes of the half after it started 8-for-11. It went a span of 9:19 without scoring a point.

Five Sooners scored in double figures. **Steven Pledger** was 4-for-6 from 3-point range and finished with a team-high 19 points. He hit three treys in the span of two and a half minutes during 0U's 22-2 first-half run.

▶ Cameron Clark registered 17 points and three steals. He played all 40 minutes and was 8-for-11 from the field. Andrew Fitzgerald finished with 14 points and a team-high eight rebounds, Carl Blair tallied 12 points and a game-high nine assists, and Cade Davis added 10 points and six rebounds.

▶ OU outscored ORU 13-3 in fast break points, and the Sooners' 13-rebound advantage (39-26) wound up as its largest of the season.

▶ Warren Niles came off the bench to score a game-high 22 points for the Golden Eagles. He hit six 3-pointers on 11 attempts. Dominique Morrison and Steven Roundtree added 11 points each, while Damen Bell-Holter scored 10.

CRUTCHFIELD FACES FORMER TEAM

First-year Oklahoma assistant coach **Chris Crutchfield** spent the previous four seasons as an assistant coach for **Scott Sutton** at Oral Roberts. Crutchfield helped the Golden Eagles to an average of 20 wins per year and postseason appearances in 2008 (NCAA Tournament) and 2011 (CollegeInsider.com Tournament).

BUNCH OF HOMERS

Oklahoma has dominated home non-conference games over the last decade, winning 88 of its last 90 non-league contests inside Lloyd Noble Center going back to Jan. 3, 2000 (good for a .978 winning percentage). Included was a streak of 49 non-conference home victories that was snapped by Villanova, 67-51, on Dec. 6, 2006. The only other home non-conference loss during the last 90 games was a 66-62 defeat at the hands of Stephen F. Austin in the 2007-08 season. The current win string stands at 30 games.

THE OSBY SHOW

Junior forward **Romero Osby** has begun his OU career with a bang following a two-year stint at Mississippi State where he averaged 4.2 points and 2.6 rebounds. The 6-8, 232-pounder, who sat out last season for the Sooners after transferring and was labeled the team's best player in practice by former head coach **Jeff Capel**, is averaging 11.3 points and a team-high 7.7 rebounds (ranks fourth in Big 12) in 26.3 minutes per contest through six outings. He is shooting .500 from the floor and .762 (16-for-21) from the free throw line while making two of his five 3-point attempts. He recorded double-doubles in each of OU's first two games, registering career highs of 17 points, 10 rebounds and four assists in 31 minutes versus Idaho State and 11 points and 10 boards against Coppin State in only 22 minutes. He ranks second in the Big 12 with his 3.8 offensive rebounds per game.

PLEDGER A MODEL OF EFFICIENCY

Junior guard **Steven Pledger** has been extremely productive in his five appearances and has almost doubled his points per minute from last year. Pledger is averaging 17.2 points in only 26.4 minutes per outing for a 26.1 40-minute scoring average. Last year, he averaged 10.9 points in 30.0 minutes a contest, good for a 13.6 40-minute average. Pledger is shooting .545 from the field to rank sixth in the Big 12 and .483 (14-for-29) from 3-point range to rank fourth in the league after posting respective marks of .393 and .350 last season. He also ranks fourth in the Big 12 in 3-pointers per game (2.8) and 12th in steals per outing (1.4).

Pledger entered this season with 106 career 3-pointers (**Terry Evans** and **Lawrence McKenzie** are the only Sooners to make more treys through their sophomore year).

NEWELL TO TRANSFER

Oklahoma head coach **Lon Kruger** announced last Thursday that sophomore guard **Calvin Newell** has decided to transfer. Newell, from Philadelphia, Pa., was OU's second-leading scorer this season at 13.0 points per game. He averaged 19.6 minutes a contest and shot .490 from the field, .385 from 3-point range (10-for-26) and .714 from the free throw line (5-for-7). Newell led the Sooners in scoring with a career-high 19 points against Idaho State in the Nov. 11 season opener and 18 points versus Washington State on Nov. 24. As a freshman last year, Newell averaged 3.5 points and 1.5 assists in 12.5 minutes a game.

SOONER TIP INS

- ▶ Oklahoma entered the week ranked No. 7 nationally (out of 338 Division I teams) in rebounding margin (+9.8), No. 34 in 3-point field goal percentage (.407), No. 37 in scoring (79.0 ppg) and No. 42 in turnover margin (+3.8).
- ▶ Oklahoma has recorded 23 dunks in its six games and junior forward **Romero Osby** has 12 of them.
- ▶ Osby and fellow junior forward **Andrew Fitzgerald** have each taken three charges. The Sooners have totaled 11 charges taken.
- ▶ Fitzgerald is averaging more rebounds per game this year than last year (5.8 to 5.0), despite averaging 7.3 fewer minutes per contest.
- ▶ In three home games, **Steven Pledger** (6-for-11), **Carl Blair** (6-for-12) and **Tyler Neal** (5-for-11) are shooting a combined .500 from 3-point range (17-for-34). Pledger is shooting .632 (12-for-19) from the field at Lloyd Noble Center this season.
- Last year, Pledger averaged 15.4 points in 0U's wins and 7.4 points in its losses. This year, the junior guard is averaging 18.3 points in wins (he missed the season-opening victory) and was held to 11 points in the loss to Saint Louis.
- Senior **C.J. Washington's** three assists against Coppin State on Nov. 18 were more than he had all of last season (two).

QUANTIFYING OU'S BASKETBALL TRADITION

- ▶ This is the 105th season of Oklahoma varsity basketball (the program's first game was Nov. 26, 1907).
- ▶ 0U owns a 1,530-979 (.610) all-time record, ranking it 30th in NCAA Division I history in wins and 41st in winning percentage.
- ▶ Oklahoma has participated in four NCAA Final Fours (1939, 1947, 1988 and 2002) and in two NCAA championship games (it lost to Holy Cross in 1947 and to Kansas in 1988).
- ▶ OU has made 26 NCAA Tournament appearances and seven postseason NIT showings. Its has made 22 NCAA Tournament appearances over the last 29 years.
- ▶ Oklahoma has made 27 postseason appearances over the last 30 years (22 NCAA Tournaments and five NITs).
- ▶ The Sooners have won 14 regular season conference championships (most recently in 2005) and seven conference tournament titles (including the 2001, 2002 and 2003 Big 12 crowns).
- ▶ The Sooners posted the eighth best NCAA Division I winning percentage (.731) in the 1980s and the eighth best (.738) in the 2000s.
- ▶ Twenty different Sooners have earned All-America honors a total of 30 times. They have earned consensus first-team All-America acclaim nine times and consensus second-team honors on four occasions.
- ▶ **Wayman Tisdale** was a three-time consensus first-team All-American during his three seasons at OU (1983-85).
- ▶ Oklahoma players have earned first-team all-conference accolades a total of 73 times.
- ► The Sooners own a winning record against eight of the other nine members of the Big 12 Conference (Kansas is the only league program with a series lead against OU).
- ▶ OU has played its home games in four different venues: the OU Gymnasium (1907-1919), the R.O.T.C. Armory (1919-1928), the OU Field House (1928-75) and Lloyd Noble Center (1975-present).
