The Olathe, Kan., native became the first freshman in Big 12 history to win multiple event titles at the conference championship.

A winner on bars and beam, Ferguson is only the second Sooner gymnast to claim a Big 12 crown in her freshman campaign, joining Ashley Cooney who won the vault title in 2004. The OU pair account for three of the seven event wins by a Big 12 freshman at the conference championships.

OU WOMEN'S GYMNASTICS SEEKS PROGRAM'S FIRST SUPER SIX APPEARANCE

LINCOLN, Neb. - Competing in the afternoon preliminary session, the eighth-seeded Oklahoma women's gymnastics squad seeks its first Super Six appearance in program history. The Sooners are making their sixth consecutive NCAA Championships appearance after placing second at the NCAA Northeast Regional in Tuscaloosa, Ala., on April 4. OU's regional score of 196.600 was its highest team tally at a regional since winning the 2004 NCAA West Regional in Corvallis, Ore., with a team result of 197.100.

OU's session features four teams that advanced to the Super Six at the 2008 NCAA Championships in Athens, Ga., including the University of Georgia – winner of the last four national titles. Florida, Stanford and UCLA also advanced to the team finals last season, while Penn State rounds out the session. The Sooners have been the 10th seed at the last two NCAA Championships where they have placed a program-best eighth in 2007 and 2008.

The Sooners are one of just six teams to advance to the NCAA Championships every year since 2004, joining Alabama, Florida, Georgia, LSU and Utah.

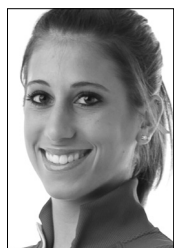

DOMINATING THE BIG 12

Oklahoma has reeled off a 17-2 mark against conference opponents since the start of the 2007 schedule. Winner of the last two Big 12 titles, the Sooners are the only conference squad to advance to the NCAA Championships each of the last two seasons.

While Oklahoma has been in the NCAA Championships field every year since 2004, the other Big 12 squads have a combined six appearances during that timespan.

SCOUTING THE FIRST SESSION

OU's session features four teams that advanced to the Super Six at the 2008 NCAA Championships in Athens, Ga., including the University of Georgia – winner of the last four national titles. Florida, Stanford and UCLA also advanced to the team finals last season, while Penn State rounds out the session.

SOLID REGIONAL PERFORMANCE

OU's regional score of 196.600 was its highest team tally at a regional since winning the 2004 NCAA West Regional in Corvallis, Ore., with a team result of 197.100.

Oklahoma won the regional event title on vault (49.175), spurred on by Melanie Root's event-title sharing 9.9, while the Sooners shared floor honors with Alabama after a season-best-tying 49.325.

JUST SHY OF THE SUPER SIX

OU has posted program-best eighth place finishes at the last two NCAA Championships, standing fourth in each of the preliminary sessions, just one spot away from a berth in the Super Six Team Finals.

Oklahoma's eight NCAA Championships appearances without a spot in the Super Six is tied with BYU for the second-most spots in the final event without advancing past preliminary competition. Arizona has made 10 NCAA Championships appearances without advancing.

FINDING SUCCESS IN COLEMAN COLISEUM

Sara Stone posted a career-high 9.85 on floor in Alabama's Northeast Regional just three weeks after scoring a 9.825 on the event in OU's regular season meet in Tuscaloosa against the Crimson Tide. Teammate Melanie Root also found success in Coleman Coliseum for the second straight meet, posting an event-winning 9.9 on vault at the Northeast Regional (including a 9.95 from one judge), tying her career high from OU's regular season meeting at Alabama.

Stone has not scored lower than a 9.8 on vault all season, including a season-high 9.9 against TWU and Illinois State. The freshman closed out the season with a No. 3 Big 12 RQS of 9.86 on vault – the highest tally of any conference newcomer and tied with Root.

NOT ACTING LIKE NEWCOMERS

Of the 87 routines that have been competed by gymnasts making their first collegiate appearance on the respective apparatus in 2009, a remarkable 52 (.598) have gone for a 9.8 or better. Freshmen Megan Ferguson and Sara Stone had four of the group's five routines of 9.8 or greater at the NCAA Northeast Regional.

Ferguson has tallied 21 routines at 9.8 or higher, while fellow frosh Sara Stone leads the respective group with an average of .737 at 9.8 or higher (14-of-19).

ON TOP OF THEIR GAME

The Sooners have three gymnasts that have posted at least 12 routines of 9.85 or higher in 2009, led by Ashley Jackson's 17. Freshman Megan Ferguson has burst onto the collegiate scene with 16 at a 9.85 or better clip, while Hollie Vise has posted 13 routines at 9.85 or better, despite only specializing on bars and beam. Ferguson pushed her tally to 16 with a pair of 9.85s at the NCAA Northeast Regional, while Jackson hit the mark on vault and floor in Tuscaloosa.

Haley DeProspero is not far behind with 10 scores of 9.85 or better, including a share of the beam title at the 2009 Big 12 Championships (9.85), successfully defending her 2008 crown on the apparatus.

ROAD SWEET ROAD

Posting a then-NCAA-best 197.175 in Denton, Texas, on Jan. 17, and a 196.800 at Iowa State on Feb. 27, the road has been kind to the Sooners again this season. Five of OU's top seven scores have been away from Norman in 2009, a year after five of Oklahoma's top seven scores (including three of the top four and a season-best-tying 196.750 at Arkansas) come on the road. Oklahoma is the only squad in the top 10 to have both of its top two season scores come in road competition.

FLOOR SENSATION

Kristin Smith posted her latest 9.9 on floor at the Big 12 Championships, marking the fourth time this season (third consecutive) that the Oklahoma City, Okla., junior has tied her career high on the apparatus. Entering the year with a personal best of 9.85 on the event, Smith has won three event crowns on the apparatus this season (@ Denver, @ ISU, TWU/ISU).

OU's eight spots on the regular season All-Big 12 Team was the most of any conference squad. Nebraska had six gymnasts on the team, while Missouri (four) and Iowa State (one) rounded out the pack.

SITTING AT THE TOP

Oklahoma won the vault title despite entering the contest ranked six spots lower than top-seeded Alabama in the RQS rankings on the apparatus, while the OU floor lineup in the Northeast Regional did not post a score lower than 9.8 (no counted routine lower than 9.85) en route to a season-best-tying 49.325.

The Sooners closed with three straight 9.875s from Jackie Flanery, Ashley Jackson and Kristin Smith for a share of the event title with No. 3 Alabama, who entered the night ranked fourth in the NCAA on the apparatus (OU was ranked seventh).

FINDING HER GROOVE

Ashley Jackson shared fourth in the all-around at the Northeast Regional, posting a score of 39.350 – her highest tally since a 39.375 at Nebraska on Feb. 8.

FRESHMEN PHENOMS

OU's Megan Ferguson and Sara Stone have either led the Sooners outright or tied for the team event high on 10 occasions this season. Ferguson paced the Sooners on bars against Florida (9.85), tied for the beam crown against TWU (9.925), shared top beam honors for the Sooners against Minnesota (9.875), led the Sooners on bars (9.85) in the quad meet and at Alabama (9.9) and earned a share of a pair of titles at the Big 12 Championships. Stone's 9.85 on vault at Denver shared the event title. Stone also posted a team-high 9.875 against Arkansas, a week after sharing vault honors with Ashley Jackson at TWU.

Ferguson, the Big 12 bars co-champion, posted a 9.85 on bars at the Northeast Regional marking the fifth time in six routines that the freshman has scored at least a 9.85 on the apparatus. The Olathe, Kan., native has tallied a 9.8 or higher in 12 of 13 bars routines this season.

The duo's career highs on vault (Stone - 9.9), bars (Ferguson - 9.9) and beam (Ferguson - 9.925) lead all other Big 12 freshmen.

A BANNER YEAR FOR VISE

Hollie Vise tied for second on bars at the Northeast regional, posting a career-high-tying 9.9 that included a 9.95 from one member of the judging panel. It marked Vise's 13th routine of the season of 9.85 or higher, third-best on the team, despite specializing only on bars and beam.

ANOTHER SPECTACULAR SEASON

OU (18-5) needs two wins to reach the 20-win plateau for the third consecutive season, every year of K.J. Kindler's tenure. Oklahoma's victory over North Carolina in its tri-meet at Alabama on March 13, was the 400th in program history. The Sooners now hold an all-time record of 408-200-1.

SHARING THE WEALTH

Oklahoma has seven gymnasts with at least four individual event titles in 2009, as Ashley Jackson leads the way with 10. The Sooners are the only squad ranked in the latest top-15 GymInfo poll without a gymnast in the top-25 all-around rankings.

BUST OUT THE BROOMS

The Sooners swept all four event titles and a share of every individual event honor on March 6 for the second consecutive meet and third time this season (@ TWU, @Iowa State). The Sooners swept all four team event titles seven times a year ago.

NATASHA KELLEY TO REDSHIRT

OU freshman Natasha Kelley will redshirt the 2009 season after an achilles injury sustained during the fall training period. The Katy, Texas, native is Oklahoma's most heralded recruit since NCAA Champion Kelly Garrison after spending 2004-2008 as a member of the US Elite National Team. The '05 USA Elite Junior National champion (all-around, beam, floor) was also the silver medalist at the 2006 World Championships and '07 American Cup.

OKLAHOMA INKS THREE TO 2009 CLASS

Head Coach K.J. Kindler and the Oklahoma women's gymnastics squad announced the signing of three gymnasts to National Letters of Intent on Nov. 12, the first day of the early signing period. Oklahoma native Bethany Neubauer (Edmond, Okla.), Kayla Nowak (Algonquin, Ill.) and Brie Olson (St. Cloud, Minn.) will join the Sooners next fall.

ALABAMA RECAP

The No. 10 Oklahoma women's gymnastics squad posted a 196.525 team tally en route to a second-place finish at No. 4 Alabama (196.725) on Friday night inside Coleman Coliseum in Tuscaloosa, Ala. The Sooners (10-4) put a scare to the 8,746 hometown fans in the Crimson Tide's Senior Night festivities, as Alabama needed to average a 9.9 from its last two gymnasts on floor for a Tide victory.

Alabama's Ashley Priess (9.925) and Morgan Dennis (9.975) came through with the needed routines, as the Tide closed the regular season at 8-5.

No. 26 UNC (16-10) finished third with a team tally of (193.225).

Ultimately, two stumbles on beam for the Sooners proved the difference maker in their regular season finale, as OU won event titles on bars and beam and a share of the individual event title on bars (Megan Ferguson - 9.9).

BIG 12 RECAP

The Big 12 title is coming back to Norman for the second straight year. The No. 8 OU women's gymnastics squad (13-4) posted a team tally of 196.125 in defending their 2008 victory, marking the first time Oklahoma has won back-to-back conference titles since reeling off three-straight Big Eight crowns from 1984-1986.

Nebraska placed second (196.075), Missouri third (195.925), as host squad Iowa State rounded out the team scoring in fourth (195.775).

Haley DeProspero (beam), Megan Ferguson (bars and beam) and Ashley Jackson (bars) became OU's latest conference event champions, as Oklahoma clinched event titles on beam and floor.

The victory marked OU's eighth conference title (2009,'08,'04,'93,'91,'86,'85,'84) and first ever in Ames. Oklahoma has now won a conference title in every Big 12 venue.

SENIOR NIGHT RECAP

The seventh-ranked Oklahoma women's gymnastics squad improved to 9-3 on the year with a tri-meet victory over Illinois State and Texas Woman's University on Senior Night at the Lloyd Noble Center on Friday. The Sooners swept all four event titles and a share of every individual event honor for the second consecutive meet and third time this season. Oklahoma senior Ashley Jackson capped off her home campaign in stellar fashion, winning her third all-around crown of the season (39.200). Illinois State placed second (191.750), while TWU rounded out the meet with a score of 191.300.

Oklahoma was on season-high pace at the halfway mark (98.650), but counted its first fall on beam this year and had its worst floor score since its season opener at Florida to close the meet.

ISU RECAP

The No. 10 Oklahoma women's gymnastics team (7-1) proved why it is the highest ranked Big 12 squad in 2009, sweeping all four event titles and a share of every event honor, en route to a 196.800-195.525 victory over No. 22 Iowa State in Ames, Iowa on Friday.

It was OU's second highest score of the season, as it reeled off its sixth-straight victory (fifth outright) in the series, dating back to a 196.250-194.425 win on Feb. 16, 2007. Under third-year head coach K.J. Kindler, OU hasn't lost to her former squad (5-0-1).

"We finally ended a meet the way we know we can compete," said Kindler. "My hats off to Megan Ferguson, who went three-for-three on the night and to Hollie (Vise) with her career high on beam."

QUAD MEET RECAP

The 11th-ranked Oklahoma women's gymnastics squad (6-3) won event titles on vault (49.250), beam (49.075) and floor (49.300) en route to a team tally of 196.375 in a victory over No. 13 Missouri, No. 18 West Virginia and No. 45 Brown at the Lloyd Noble Center on Friday night.

The Sooners led all the way in front of a hometown crowd of 1,261, outpacing second-place Mizzou (196.225), WVU (195.250) and Brown (185.950) in OU's Flip for a Cause quad meet, promoting Heart Health Awareness and the Go Red for Women campaign.

"I thought we started really well on vault, but have to get much better on our landings across the board on all events," said OU head coach K.J. Kindler. "Aside from all the technical jargon, it comes down to sticking landings and we aren't doing that consistently enough and as a result, are giving up precious tenths here and there."

"At the same time, I was very proud of the way we ended on floor," added Kindler. "Closing the meet with three-straight 9.875s, when we knew we were in a dogfight, shows a lot about the character of this team."

Oklahoma senior Ashley Jackson shared second in the all-around (39.300) with MU's Adrienne Perry. The pair fell right behind reigning Big 12 Gymnast of the Week Sarah Shire's 39.400 for the Tigers.

DENVER RECAP

The No. 8 OU women's gymnastics squad swept all four individual event titles (three outright), while snagging three team event honors, en route to a 196.025-194.825 victory at 22nd-ranked Denver on Saturday night in front 1,337 fans inside Hamilton Gymnasium. Kristin Smith won the beam title (9.9), while sharing top honors on floor (9.85) with teammate Jackie Flanery and Denver's Amanda Johanson. Flanery made sure Smith wasn't the only one to walk away with a pair of honors for the Sooners (3-3), sharing the vault title with freshman Sara Stone (9.85). Hollie Vise capped off the Sooner sweep with the bars title after a career-best-tying 9.9.

"I thought we were kind of in survival mode all night," said OU head coach K.J. Kindler. "We had some perform their best routines of the season, while some had a few of their weakest and in the end it balanced out to a 196. We definitely had a few bright spots, while the errors we did make are easily correctable and changing those can get us from a hot-and-cold night to the next level."

NEBRASKA RECAP

The seventh-ranked Oklahoma women's gymnastics squad dropped a 196.175-196.000 decision at No. 12 Nebraska on Sunday afternoon in Lincoln, Neb. The Sooners put a scare in the hometown crowd at the Bob Devaney Center, posting a 49.325 on beam in their final event to narrow the gap, but it wasn't quite enough as OU dropped to 2-3 on the year.

Oklahoma picked up event wins on vault and beam, while also notching individual titles on vault (Ashley Jackson - 9.925) and bars (Jessica Kinder - 9.85). Jackson and Haley DeProspero finished one-two in the all-around with scores of 39.375 and 39.150, respectively.

OU had won its last seven regular season meetings against Big 12 opponents before today's defeat, dating back to a 196.100-196.00 victory at Missouri on Feb. 17, 2006. Oklahoma's last previous loss to a conference opponent during the regular season was at the hands of a K.J. Kindler-led Iowa State squad on Feb. 10, 2006, by a score of 196.275-196.050.

MINNESOTA RECAP

The No. 7 Oklahoma women's gymnastics squad defeated 21st-ranked Minnesota 196.500-195.675 on Jan. 30, in front of 1,540 fans at the Lloyd Noble Center in OU's "Beauty and the Beast" spectacular. The Sooners shared the floor with the Oklahoma wrestling squad, who rolled over N.C. State by a final score of 38-6.

OU won three events on the night, as Oklahoma gymnasts also took home individual titles on vault (Melanie Root - 9.875), bars (Hollie Vise - 9.875) and floor (Jackie Flanery, Haley DeProspero and Ashley Jackson - 9.85 for all three).

"We were much more consistent with our landings throughout the night and beam was much better for the most part than our last time out," said OU head coach K.J. Kindler. "I thought we also brought a lot more energy into the event and sustained that throughout the night. It was a great atmosphere, with support from both the wrestling and gymnastics fans, as the event was a big success for both Oklahoma squads."

OU burst out of the gates with a season-high 49.200 on vault as the final five Oklahoma gymnasts posted scores of 9.8 or greater.

ARKANSAS RECAP

The seventh-ranked Oklahoma women's gymnastics squad (1-2) dropped a 195.625-196.900 decision in its home opener to No. 8 Arkansas (4-1) at the Lloyd Noble Center on Monday night. The Sooners were in it through two rotations, but beam proved the difference maker as the Sooners scored a 48.325 on the apparatus, while the Razorbacks posted a 49.275 en route to a program-best team tally.

It was OU's first regular season dual loss in Norman since Feb. 10, 2006, against Iowa State - a span of 12 consecutive match ups. The defeat was the first to the Razorbacks in program history, as the Sooners entered tonight's dual meet with a 4-0 record against Arkansas - including two wins in 2008.

"We were right in it until we went to beam," said OU head coach K.J. Kindler. "Unfortunately, beam was a polar opposite from our last time out against TWU. We counted far too many wobbles and it ended up being the difference tonight. Give credit to Arkansas, they performed very well tonight."

TWU RECAP

The ninth-ranked Oklahoma women's gymnastics squad (1-1) posted the highest score in the NCAA this season en route to a 197.175-189.600 victory against Texas Woman's University (0-1) on Jan. 17. The Sooners claimed every team and individual event title of the dual meet in front of a capacity crowd of 1,107 inside Kitty Magee Arena on the TWU campus.

Posting their best team score since Jan. 24, 2004 (197.300), the Sooners claimed the highest score in the NCAA in 2009. Entering the competition with the top score in the NCAA was Georgia (winner of the last four national titles) with a mark of 196.85.

With the victory, Oklahoma has won 32 of its last 34 regular-season matchups dating back to Jan. 19, 2007.

"It's a real confidence builder as we continue our season," said head coach K.J. Kindler. "In all honesty, I saw ten times as much energy, confidence and enthusiasm as we showed at Florida. It started out with a bang with a great bars set. I thought we did a much better job with our dismounts and stuck landings and it's always nice to end with one of those beam nights that you'll never forget."

Oklahoma was without the services of Haley DeProspero on vault and floor and senior all-arounder Jessica Kinder on all four events, yet still posted all four event scores of 49.125 or better.

FLORIDA RECAP

The No. 10 University of Oklahoma women's gymnastics squad dropped a season-opening dual meet to the third-ranked Florida Gators by a score of 196.500-195.075 in front of a Stephen O'Connell Center crowd of 4,856 in Gainesville, Fla., on Jan. 9.

"I thought we came out a little flat overall," said head coach K.J. Kindler. "In front of a great Florida crowd, I was very proud of some of our newcomers including our bars lineup which included three girls making their career debuts and all hit. We had some uncharacteristic falls from some of our veterans including Hollie Vise and Jackie Flanery, but I'm sure we can learn from this experience and improve as the season progresses."

"We also had a couple of late fill-in's including Sara Stone on floor for Haley (DeProspero), who I thought performed well considering the last-second switch. Also, Jessica Kinder went four-for-four in her first all-around performance and must be commended."

As a whole, Oklahoma couldn't match its regular-season success against squads from the Southeastern Conference from a year ago, when the Sooners posted season highs in wins against both SEC squad's they faced before the postseason (196.75 against Auburn - March 7 and Arkansas - March 15).

OU senior Ashley Jackson finished third in the all-around (39.125), behind Florida All-American's Melanie Sinclair (39.425) and Corey Hartung (39.375).

Other Sooner bright spots included runner-up finishes on three of the four events - (Jackson - 9.825 on vault, Megan Ferguson - 9.85 on bars and Haley DeProspero - 9.875 on beam).

VAULT

While Oklahoma led the NCAA South Central Region last season with a vault regional qualifying score (RQS) of 49.180, Kindler and the Sooners expect that average to rise in 2009. Depth will prove the biggest factor for improved scores on the apparatus this season as OU lost only one vaulter to graduation (Kiara Redmond). The combination of several veteran vaulters and a talented crop of newcomers pushes the Sooner tally to a minimum of 12 vaulters competing with a 10.0 start value.

The boost in numbers gives the staff an opportunity to choose the most dynamic vaults for scoring and consistency purposes, allowing Kindler the ability to test fresh faces on the apparatus as well as challenge potential all-arounders to earn their starting spot.

Top returners on vault include Ashley Jackson, Haley DeProspero, Jessica Kinder, Jackie Flanery, and Mary Mantle, while the group of newcomers includes Sara Stone. Other veterans on the scene include Melanie Root and Kristin Smith, who are both competing yurchenko fulls. Root saw action on vault in five meets last season and is looking for a more consistent position in the lineup this spring. Hailey Wagner, Julie Kramer and Natalie Ratcliff have shown great improvements in the gym and will have the opportunity to contribute when called upon. Kramer, a transfer from Baylor University, was a power tumbler and trampolinist and has made the transition to collegiate gymnastics.

“Our goals on vault are to improve both our scoring potential and ‘sticking’ of our vaults,” said Kindler. “We expect our ranking to rise on this event due to a combination of increased potential and added depth over last season.”

BARS

New faces will be seen on this event after the graduation of three strong contributors last season. The Sooners will need to replace Caitlin Hinkis, Stephanie LoPiccolo and Kiara Redmond, who all completed their eligibility in 2008.

The trio will be replaced by sophomore Melanie Root and freshman Megan Ferguson.

Root has redesigned her routine to highlight a sky-high tkatchev and a textbook double-front dismount.

Ferguson, a surprise on this event, has learned numerous skills (jaeger and full-in dismount) and combinations (giant full to overshoot handstand) and has solidified her position in the lineup.

Veterans to watch for include World Champion and 2008 Big 12 event champion Hollie Vise, Haley DeProspero, Jackie Flanery, Ashley Jackson, Jessica Kinder and Mary Mantle.

“Our goal on bars is simple...hit, hit, hit,” said Kindler. “In preseason workouts, we saw a huge increase in our hit percentage. The athletes are also performing more difficult dismounts which was one of our training goals.”

BEAM

Coach Kindler preached consistency on beam heading into the offseason and the veterans listened, as the group proved to be very seasoned on this event throughout the training period.

Last season, Haley DeProspero sealed a “perfect” record on balance beam, sticking 14-of-14 routines. Teammate Hollie Vise was not far behind, missing just one routine the entire season.

Jessica Kinder also proved to be a key member of the Sooner beam lineup last year, stepping in to replace the injured Ashley Jackson at Missouri and hitting every routine the remainder of the season.

These three athletes provide a solid foundation on the apparatus.

Expect freshmen Megan Ferguson to be slotted in as an immediate contributor in 2009. Ferguson, crowned the Junior Olympic National Champion on beam in 2006 and 2007, will truly mesmerize with her unique routine and difficult tumbling.

Jackson has increased her difficulty and ends her routine with an impressive double tuck salto while Smith added a three-part flight series to her routine, while continuing to make an impact with her exceptional dance.

Depth will also be provided by returnees Candace Cindell, Jackie Flanery, Natalie Ratcliff, Melanie Root, and freshman Sara Stone.

“I felt that last season a slight misstep here and there kept us from being a really good beam squad,” said Kindler. “During our training, we have preached a high hitting percentage while working on increased difficulty in our routines.”

FLOOR

One of the strongest events for the Sooners a year ago, floor exercise appears to be another key asset for Oklahoma in 2009 after losing only Kiara Redmond to graduation from last season’s lineup.

Returning crowd favorites include senior Ashley Jackson and junior Jackie Flanery, who will once again thrill the crowd with their showboating choreography and quick and powerful tumbling. Flanery, ranked second among all returning Big 12 gymnasts on the apparatus with a season RQS of 9.875, has upgraded her passes from last season in search of a Big 12 title on this event.

Other returners include Jessica Kinder, Haley DeProspero and Kristin Smith. All three are expected to be staples in the lineup for OU.

Smith, noted for her long lines and unique dancing abilities, will be solid, while DeProspero and Kinder plan to end their routines with double salto dismounts - tucked and piked, respectively, which will set them apart from the competition.

Other contributors will include Sara Stone, Megan Ferguson, Mary Mantle and Melanie Root.

“We have worked tirelessly on increasing our skill level on this event over the training period,” said Kindler. “Heading into the season, we feel as though we can be a top-five team in the country on floor.”

K.J. KINDLER

HEAD COACH | THIRD SEASON
2008 BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR



Just two seasons in at the reins of the Oklahoma women's gymnastics squad, 2008 Big 12 Coach of the Year K.J. Kindler has already stamped an indelible mark on the Sooner program. For the second straight year, Kindler guided OU to its *highest ever finish*, posting the *most wins* in program history and recording the *best winning percentage* of any Sooner squad along the way.

Named head coach of the Sooners in the summer of 2006, Kindler has quickly positioned the OU squad among the nation's elite, as the Sooners have finished eighth at the NCAA Championships the last two years.

Last season proved to be a storybook year for the Sooners under Kindler, as OU won its first 21 meetings of the season (the only squad in the country to win all of its regular season contests) en route to the program's first Big 12 title since 2004.

Under the direction of Kindler, OU made its fifth straight NCAA Championships appearance in 2008, adding to its program-record streak. Prior to the current five consecutive showings, the Sooners hadn't been in the field in back-to-back seasons in the 27-year history of the program.

Kindler's last four collegiate squads have qualified for the NCAA Championships, while every squad of her head coaching tenure has advanced to NCAA regional competition.

Oklahoma gymnasts have flourished under the 2005 National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches/Women (NACGCW) Coach of the Year, as Oklahoma produced a conference-leading nine spots on the 2008 regular season All-Big 12 Team.

OU recorded only two scores lower than 9.8 in the final three events of the '08 conference championship as the Sooners clinched at least a share of all four individual event titles - marking just the third time in Big 12 history that a school clinched at least a share of all four apparatus wins.

Hollie Vise and Haley DeProspero won titles on bars and beam, respectively, as the pair both recorded scores of 9.9 in their event wins. Kiara Redmond won the other two titles, taking home the vault win with her 9.95 and the floor exercise title after a score of 9.9.

Following OU's come-from-behind heroics in the conference championship, Kindler was named Big 12 Coach of the Year for a fourth time, while Redmond garnered Big 12 Gymnast of the Year honors.

The Sooners have produced at least one All-American in each season under Kindler's tutelage, as Redmond capped off her illustrious career with four additional All-America honors in 2008, moving her career total to nine - the highest tally of any gymnast in program history.

Kindler serves as the primary coach for the balance beam and also choreographs the beam and floor exercise routines. The Sooners ended the 2008 season with an regional qualifying score (RQS) of 49.195 on beam, tops in the Big 12 and sixth best in the NCAA. OU had three of the top four individual RQS in the conference on the apparatus, including DeProspero's Big 12-leading RQS of 9.9, which ranked fifth in the country. Oklahoma gymnasts took home 12 individual event titles on beam in 2008, led by DeProspero's nine event wins.

Always emphasizing academics, Kindler's squads have regularly placed its gymnasts on the Big 12 All-Academic teams and the NACGC All-Academic squads.

For the second consecutive season, five members of the Oklahoma women's gymnastics team earned NACGC All-Academic honors, led by Caitlin Hinkis and Jessica Kinder, both of whom posted perfect 4.0 GPAs.

The pair were the only gymnasts in the Big 12 to notch 4.0 GPAs during both semesters. Six OU gymnasts were named to the 2008 Academic All-Big 12 Gymnastics Team, including four first-team members.

Prior to her hiring at OU, Kindler spent six seasons as the head coach at Iowa State.

"We are dedicated to filling our staff with the best and brightest minds in coaching," said OU Athletics Director Joe Castiglione, upon Kindler's hiring. "K.J. Kindler brings a reputation of great achievement in all aspects of leading a program."

"She impressed us not only with her accomplishment to this point, but with her lofty goals for the future and her plan for reaching those goals. We are thrilled to work with K.J. and her staff as we pursue championships."

Kindler's 2006 season culminated with Iowa State's third trip to the NCAA National Championships and its first appearance among the Super Six (teams that qualify from the preliminaries to compete for the national title).

The 24-10 Cyclones produced three All-Americans for a second consecutive season, while posting an undefeated mark at home, a 10-1 dual record and an 8-1 standard in duals against ranked opponents. The team also snapped Nebraska's 60-meet home winning streak.

The 2006 squad won its first Big 12 Championship since 2000, and three Cyclone gymnasts earned either an outright or a share of individual titles at the meet.

Since she took over head coaching duties at ISU in 2001, Kindler coached eight regional event champions, 11 NCAA individual championship qualifiers and 18 Big 12 champions (three all-arounders).

Kindler, an Iowa State graduate, joined the Cyclone staff as an assistant coach in 1992.

As an ISU gymnast, she was a three-time MVP for the Cyclones and runner-up in the all-around at the 1992 Big Eight Conference Championship. She was the school's first individual NCAA Regional qualifier, competing three times in the postseason meet.

Kindler hails from Lake Elmo, Minn., and trained under Mary Jane Olsen at Hamline University in St. Paul. In high school, she moved to Connecticut and trained under Frank and Laurie DeFrancesco at Arena Academy in Stamford and Walter Hawkes at Wilton High School. In Connecticut, she won many conference and state titles.

The eldest of five siblings, Kindler hails from a gymnastics family. One sister, Lori, competed at the University of Minnesota. She and her husband own and operate Flips Gymnastics in the Twin Cities area. Kindler's nieces, Emma and Lucy Kindler, enjoy recreational gymnastics.

Kindler is married to OU assistant coach Lou Ball. The couple has two daughters, Maggie (2), and Adelaide born in September of 2008.
