No. 1/1 Oklahoma (44-4, 12-2 Big 12) SOONERS

No. 1 Oklahoma takes part in its final series of the regular season when it takes on Oklahoma State in three games in three days in three different venues. Friday's game was originally to be played on April 17, but was postponed due to severe weather. Saturday's game will be Senior Day in Norman. Michelle Gascoigne, Keilani Ricketts, Jessica Shults and Brianna Turang will all be honored in a postgame ceremony.

Since the official start of The Bedlam Series (2001), the trophy hasn't left Norman. OU has won it outright 9 of 11 years and retained it after splits in 2003 and 2010. Since the start of Big 12 play, OU has done no worse than a split with Oklahoma State in the regular season series, while claiming the series in 14 of 17 years.

Last year OU swept the season series by a combined score of 22-2. In the opener, Keilani Ricketts fired a one-hitter with 10 strikeouts in a 4-0 win. An 11-1, five-inning win in Stillwater was highlighted by four Sooner home runs, including a pair from Javen Henson. The sweep was completed with a 7-1 in Norman as Lauren Chamberlain hit two home runs to set the program single-season record.

SOONERS SEEK 10TH BIG 12 TITLE

A series win over Texas, April 19-21, gave OU control of the Big 12 title race and now OU can capture its 10th conference title this weekend.

With three games left, OU is 12-2 in the Big 12, while Texas is 13-4 and has just one game remaining vs. Baylor. The Sooners need two wins in the series against the Cowgirls to claim their sixth regular season title, while one win would suffice if the Longhorns lose to the Bears Sunday.

OU has also won four Big 12 Tournament titles in its history.

CONSENSUS NO. 1

For the ninth straight week, Oklahoma sits atop both polls. The Sooners received 29 of 31 first-place votes in the USA Today/NFCA Division I Top 25 Poll and 19 of 20 votes in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25. Oklahoma has been ranked No. 1 by USA Softball for 13 straight weeks, while the NFCA has put the Sooners on top for nine weeks in a row.

The Sooners also maintained their spot as the No. 1 team in the fifth installment of the NCAA Division I RPI rankings on May 6. They have been No. 1 each week since the rankings first came out.

BEST BIG 12 RECORDS

Entering the final weekend of the regular season, the Sooners are 12-2 in conference play and could finish with a Big 12 winning percentage above .800 for the sixth time in program history. The Sooners could finish 15-2 (.882), 14-3 (.824), 13-4 (.765) or 12-5 (.706).

WALKING INTO THE HISTORY BOOKS

With three games left in the regular season, Oklahoma's 285 walks drawn have already shattered the Big 12 record of 247 set by Missouri in 2010.

In fact, OU already has the sixth-most walks in a season in NCAA history and, with a 5.9 walks per game average, is on pace to finish the regular season with 303, which would set the NCAA's all-time mark before postseason play even began.

THREE SOONERS AMONG 10 FINALISTS FOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The No. 1 Oklahoma softball team showcased how strong its season has been by placing a nation's best three players among the 10 finalists for the 2013 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year, the Amateur Softball Association (ASA) of America and USA Softball announced Wednesday.

Senior pitchers Keilani Ricketts and Michelle Gascoigne and sophomore infielder Lauren Chamberlain were all chosen for the award, which is considered the most prestigious honor in Division I women's softball. The honor is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country.

DOUBLEHEADER SPLIT AT KANSAS

The Sooners split a doubleheader at Kansas on May 5; weather reduced the series to just two games. In a 4-2 game one win, Keilani Ricketts struck out a season-high 17 batters, matching the second-highest total of her career. The first 12 outs of the game came via K from Ricketts.

OU suffered just its fourth loss of the year, and second shutout, in a 2-0 loss in game two. The Sooners left nine runners on base in the loss, which snapped OU's six-game winning streak. It was the Sooners' first to an unranked team since a 5-4 loss to Texas Tech on April 6, 2012 and the first setback to an unranked opponent on the road since a 1-0 defeat at Tulsa on March 23, 2011. Oklahoma is now 2-4 this year when scoring two runs or fewer, compared to a 42-0 mark when scoring at least three runs.

DOMINANT DUO

Oklahoma's 1-2 punch of Keilani Ricketts and Michelle Gascoigne has been dominant in 2013. Ricketts is 25-1 and Gascoigne is 16-3, while each has an ERA under 1.14 and is holding an opponents' batting average under .161. Ricketts has thrown 14 shutouts, Gascoigne has thrown eight and the pair combined on another.

Gascoigne is averaging 10.8 strikeouts per seven innings and has a 7.2 strikeout-to-walk ratio, while Ricketts' marks in those categories stand at 10.7 and 6.3, respectively.

Ricketts has tallied 12 10+ strikeout games this year and now has 75 for her career. Likewise, Gascoigne has 8 this season and 22 in her career.

SCORING MARKS FALL IN SWEEP OF IOWA STATE

Oklahoma swept a three-game series vs. Iowa State, April 26-28, in dominating fashion, winning by a combined score of 44-1. All three games ended in the 5th inning, marking the first time in history that OU won three games in a row within Big 12 play via run rule.

OU won the opener, 24-1, in five innings to set the school record for most runs in a game. It broke the mark of 23-1 vs. Central Arkansas on 3/26/08. The 24 runs also tied with Georgia Tech for the most against a D-1 team this year. The Sooners drew 15 walks, one off the school record of 16 vs. Southwestern on April 12, 1975, and hit three home runs, including grand slams from Shelby Pendley and Kelley Reeves. The 44 runs in a three-game span are the most in school history and mark just the sixth time OU has eclipsed 40 runs over three games.

NEARLY NO-NOS

RICKETTS' RECORD

Keilani Ricketts added to her stellar resume against Baylor on 4/7 by becoming the winningest pitcher in the history of Oklahoma softball.

Ricketts earned career win No. 116, passing former Sooner Jennifer Stewart, as No. 1 Oklahoma finished off a three-game sweep of No. 18 Baylor with an 8-0, six-inning win. Perfect through three innings against the Bears, Ricketts allowed only four hits in the game while striking out five and walking one.

SOONERS PASS TOUGH WEEK WITH FLYING COLORS

Oklahoma went 4-0 during the week of April 1, with all four wins coming against ranked teams.

After losing two games due to rain vs. Louisiana-Lafayette, OU was able to schedule a matchup at No. 20 Tulsa and come away with a 3-1 victory. Jessica Shults' two-run single proved to be the difference in the win.

That was followed by OU's Big 12-opening series vs. No. 18 Baylor, which Oklahoma took in a 3-0 sweep. A five-run fifth inning, highlighted by a three-run homer from Lauren Chamberlain, broke open a tie game and led the Sooners to an 8-3 win in game one of the series.

Trailing 3-0 after two innings in game two, OU rallied with a five-run third inning and added four more runs in the fifth to win 9-3. Brittany Williams matched a career high with five RBI to lead the Sooners.

Game three, featuring the record-setting performance by Ricketts, was an 8-0, six-inning win for Oklahoma. Shelby Pendley hit a solo home run, Lauren Chamberlain hit a two-run shot and a five-run sixth inning closed out the win via run-rule.

TRIO NAMED FINALISTS FOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Senior pitchers Keilani Ricketts and Michelle Gascoigne join sophomore infielder Lauren Chamberlain as three of the 25 finalists for the 2013 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year. With three honorees, Oklahoma is tied with Tennessee for the second-most finalists, trailing only Alabama, which has four.

On May 8 the list will be narrowed to the Top 10 Finalists. The Top 3 Finalists will be announced May 22, while the winner of the 2013 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award will be revealed on May 28 prior to the start of the NCAA Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City.

RICKETTS, SHULTS FINALISTS FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Oklahoma's Keilani Ricketts and Jessica Shults were named among the 10 finalists for the Senior CLASS Award, an honor that recognizes a student-athlete's contributions both on and off the field. Oklahoma is the only school to have more than one finalist.

To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as a NCAA Division I senior student-athlete and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.

In addition to her dominant play on the field, Ricketts has volunteered at area non-profit agencies including at Mission Norman, a local food pantry. She has also coordinated equipment drives for those in need, including athletes in American Samoa. In the classroom, Ricketts has been selected to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll three times and is a three-time Sooner Scholar.

In 2011, Shults was diagnosed with pan ulcerative colitis, forcing her to miss seven games before returning for the Women's College World Series. Since then, she has talked publicly about what she went through in hopes of shedding light on the rare genetic disease and to keep others from thinking they were suffering alone. With her major in communication, Shults has been named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll once and is a one-time Sooner Scholar.

SENIORS CHOSEN IN NPF DRAFT

All four Oklahoma seniors were selected in the 2013 National Pro Fastpitch College Draft. The selections of Keilani Ricketts, Jessica Shults, Michelle Gascoigne and Brianna Turang were a school record, topping the three Sooners that were chosen in 2008. No school had as many draftees as OU as Tennessee and Missouri were the only programs to have more than one player chosen.

DOUBLEHEADER SWEEP AT WICHITA STATE

No. 1 Oklahoma took two games at Wichita State on March 27. A 7-1 win in game one was No. 900 of head coach Patty Gasso's Sooners career.

Game two belonged to sophomore Jessica Vest. The shortstop hit two home runs and drove in seven as OU prevailed, 16-1, in five innings. It was the most runs scored by OU in 2013 and the margin of victory was its largest since a 19-3 win over Lehigh on May 18, 2012.

SOONERS SPLIT DOUBLEHEADER WITH NO. 11 LOUISVILLE

No. 1 Oklahoma saw its 10-game winning streak end with a 5-1 loss to Louisville in game one of a DH on March 23. A five-run fourth was the difference as the Cardinals handed the Sooners their second loss of the year and first since a 1-0 setback to then-No. 25 Nebraska on March 2.

The Sooners bounced back though to win game two of the doubleheader, 9-1, in five innings. OU scored six runs in the bottom of the fifth inning and took advantage of four Cardinals' errors to win via run rule for the 12th time this season. Oklahoma hasn't lost back-to-back regular season games since Feb. 24-25, 2012.

SHUTOUT STREAK ENDS AT SEVEN

Oklahoma tied a school record by throwing seven consecutive shutouts from March 9-13. The run matched a mark initially set March 8-15, 1997 and equaled Feb. 23-March 2, 2008.

PENDLEY'S HOT STRETCH

From Feb. 23 to March 15 (10 games), Shelby Pendley hit .727 (16-22) with a .818 on-base percentage and a 1.636 slugging percentage. She had 14 runs, 5 home runs, 5 doubles, 17 RBI, 11 walks and 0 strikeouts over that span and saw her season batting average climb from .262 to .422.

SOONERS RUN-RULE NORTHERN COLORADO, DRAKE

Hosting Northern Colorado and Drake for four games, the Sooners made quick work of both teams as they won each game by run-rule. After beating UNC, 14-0, in five innings on Friday, OU then beat Drake, 10-2, in six innings. It was more of the same on Saturday as Oklahoma beat the Bears, 10-0, in five innings and the Bulldogs, 13-0, in five innings.

The wins marked the first time since March 11-12, 2006, that the Sooners scored 10 or more runs in four straight games, and not since March 6-12, 2011, had they won four in a row via run-rule. OU has never scored 10+ runs in five straight games.

A Sooner had a multi-home run game in each of the four contests as Shelby Pendley did it on Friday against UNC, Lauren Chamberlain did it Friday night against Drake, Keilani Ricketts homered twice on Saturday against the Bears and Pendley did it again vs. DU.

SEASON-OPENING STREAK STOPPED

Before a 1-0 loss to No. 25 Nebraska on March 2, the Sooners enjoyed the second-longest unbeaten streak to start a season in school history at 17-0. Only a 23-0 run to open 2007 ranks better in school annals.

In its history, OU has started the season with a 10-0 mark or better six times, all of which have come under Patty Gasso.

SHULTS MAKES HISTORY

Locked in a pitchers' duel, senior Jessica Shults used a historic blast to propel Oklahoma to a 5-0 win over No. 19 Arizona on Feb. 21 at the Mary Nutter Collegiate Classic.

The solo blast in the fifth inning of a 1-0 game was her third of the year and the 57th of her career, setting a Big 12 and school record for career home runs. It broke a tie with Texas' Megan Gibson and former Sooner Amber Flores who both hit 56 homers.

CONNECT FOUR

Oklahoma opened the Campbell/Cartier Classic with four straight shutouts, defeating UC Riverside, 7-0, San Diego State, 4-0, Kentucky, 11-0, in five innings and Washington, 2-0.

It was the first time since March 9-13, 2011 that the Sooners threw four straight shutouts. Going back to the final 4 innings of the Northwestern contest on Feb. 10, the Sooners' run reached 35 innings without allowing a run before Notre Dame scored in the sixth inning on Feb. 17.

On the weekend, the Sooners gave up just three earned runs in 35.0 innings of work, good for a 0.60 earned run average.

CHAMBERLAIN DOMINATES ON OPENING WEEKEND

Putting sophomore slugger Lauren Chamberlain into the leadoff position paid immediate dividends for the Sooner offense.

At the Kajikawa Classic, Chamberlain was 7-11 (.636) with 12 runs, 4 home runs, 12 RBI, 6 walks and 3 hit by pitch. She had a .800 on-base percentage and 1.727 slugging percentage.

Chamberlain reached base in her first 10 plate appearances, going 5-5 with four walks and a hit by pitch before striking out in her third plate appearance against Oregon. Of her five hits, four were home runs.

Jessica Shults' first at-bat of the 2013 season resulted in a three-run home run against Stanford. That's nothing new for the senior, though. She has led off three of her four seasons as a Sooner with a home run:

Now in her 19th season at the University of Oklahoma, NFCA Hall of Fame head coach Patty Gasso has molded the OU softball program into a national power and permanently placed herself among the elite college softball coaches in the country.

The Sooners have reached the Women's College World Series seven times during her tenure, and in the process, advanced to the postseason in each of her previous 18 seasons. The WCWS run began in 2000 when her team won the NCAA National Championship in OU's first appearance.

Currently in her 23rd season as a head coach, Gasso has a career collegiate coaching record of 1076-342-3 (.758) and holds an overall record of 915-283-2 (.763) at the University of Oklahoma. She has won more Big 12 games (240-79) than any coach in the league's history and has twice as many wins as any other coach in OU history. Gasso's Sooner teams have finished second or higher 13 different times since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996. They have won over 75 percent of their Big 12 contests, and OU has claimed five Big 12 regular season and four championship titles under her direction.

Numerous Sooner players have prospered under Gasso's tutelage and garnered national, regional and conference recognition. She has directed 41 All-Americans, 87 All-Region honorees and 118 all-conference selections.

In the Big 12 era, seven Sooners have been named Big 12 Player of the Year a total of eight times, three have been selected as Big 12 Freshman of the Year, one as Big 12 Newcomer and Lauren Eckermann was named OU's first Big 12 Pitcher of the Year in 2007. In 2010, Amber Flores became the first player in league history to earn Player of the Year honors twice.

In addition, 2005 graduate Heather Scaglione was a two-time Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year. Savannah Long became the first infielder to earn the Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year honor in 2008. Lindsey Vandever also earned the award in 2010.

The OU softball success under Gasso has also spilled over into the classroom where the Sooners have been honored with 86 academic all-conference honors. Six of those have gone on to become Academic All-Americans, including Lana Moran, the 2000 Academic All-American of the Year.

Gasso and her staff have consistently been recognized for their efforts on and off the field. The staff was awarded three consecutive Speedline/NFCA Midwest Region Coaching Staff of the Year awards from 1999-2001 and received the national honor in 2000. Gasso and staff have claimed the Midwest honor in six of their 18 seasons with the most recent award coming in 2012. In addition, Gasso has been named the Big 12 Coach of the Year in 1996, 1999, 2000, 2009 and 2012.
