First Pitch... Big 12 play resumes for the Oklahoma baseball team with a three-game set at Kansas. Game one of the weekend is set for 6:00 pm on Friday night.

About the Sooners... Oklahoma has dropped back-to-back games in shutout fashion to move its record to 18-8 overall and 2-1 in the Big 12. The Sooners totaled 33 hits in the first two games of last weekend's Kansas State series, both wins, by have just eight hits and no runs to show for it in the last two games. Junior **Mac James** continues to lead OU with a .429 batting average, while driving in 22 runs and scoring 20. Sophomore left fielder **Hunter Haley** is second at .320 and leads the team with 27 runs and 24 RBI. As a team, the Sooners are batting a collective .300 and have outscored opponents, 181-115. Sophomore RHP **Ralph Garza Jr.** is 3-0 with four saves and a 0.92 earned run average in a team-high 15 appearances.

On the Air... Veteran OU broadcaster **Toby Rowland** will provide the play-by-play this weekend on KREF Sports Talk 1400 AM and 98.5 FM. Video for all three games of the series will be available on ESPN3 and WatchESPN.

Midweek Recap... The Sooners fell to intrastate rival Oral Roberts on the road Tuesday night, 3-0. Redshirt-junior RHP **Robert Tasin** tossed 3.2 innings in his first career start. Oklahoma was held to just five hits, while the pitching staff held ORU to six. Redshirt-senior RHP **Drew Krittenbrink** pitched three-scoreless innings in relief.

Scouting the Jayhawks... Kansas, which received votes in this week's NCBWA poll, took two games at Texas in the opening Big 12 weekend and after a bye in league play is 17-8 overall with an 11-0 shutout at Creighton on Wednesday. Designated hitter **Dakota Smith** leads the Jayhawks with a .352 average and is one of five players hitting over .300. Right fielder **Connor McKay** is at .320 with a team-leading five home runs and 34 RBI. The KU pitching staff has held opponents to a .267 batting average. Right-hander **Drew Morovick** is 5-1 with a 3.38 ERA, while fellow righty **Frank Duncan** is 2-1 with a 1.79 ERA and 41 strikeouts in 45.1 innings of work.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 17 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 524-385-2 (.576), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Third Straight Big 12 Award... Lorenzana became the third Sooner in as many weeks to earn a Big 12 weekly award as he was named the Co-Player of the Week along with West Virginia's Billy Fleming. Lorenzana hit .474 (9-for-19) over a five-game week and scored five runs, while driving in three with three doubles for a .632 slugging percentage. **Over the last nine games, Lorenzana's batting average has risen from .203 to .275 as he is hitting .406 (13-for-32).**

All-Time vs. KU... Oklahoma has doubled up Kansas in the all-time series; leading 126-63-1. Prior to a Jayhawk win in Norman on March 30, 2013, the Sooners had won 12 straight in the series.

Last Time They Met... Oklahoma defeated Kansas, 7-2, in the Big 12 Championship game at Bricktown Ballpark on May 26, 2013. **Jacob Evans** pitched five innings of four-hit, one-run ball in relief to earn his seventh win of the season. The Sooners scored three in the first, all with two outs, and added a **Matt Oberste** homer in the third.

Big 12 Openers... The Sooners are 8-9 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after an 11-4 win over K-State (3/21/14). OU has won four of its last five conference openers. Oklahoma won its first Big 12 game in the league opener against Kansas on March 15, 1997.

Grand Finale... Fans were treated to some early fireworks during Friday night's game as Haley drilled a fifth-inning home run over the wall in right. The home run was the fifth of the season for Haley as well as his first career grand slam. It was the first grand slam by a Sooner since **Ricky Eisenberg** against Kansas on May 8, 2011. The next day, James went deep to left for the second OU grand slam of the weekend. James' home run was his third of the season.

Making Some Noise... Freshman third baseman **Sheldon Neuse** was named the Big 12 Rookie of the Week after batting .529 (9-for-17) in four games. He slugged 1.000 with a .600 on-base percentage. Neuse went 4-for-4 with two doubles against UTA at Globe Life Ballpark in Arlington on Tuesday. He tripled twice on Saturday against Belmont and scored three times.

MAC ATTACK... James was named the Big 12 Player of the Week, for the week ending March 9, after hitting .684 (13-for-19) in five games. He owned a 1.000 slugging percentage and .714 on-base percentage. James is riding a nine-game hitting streak and finished the weekend with a 4-for-4 day, his second of the season, to go with his second home run of the season. **James was also honored as the Louisville Slugger and NCBWA National Player of the Week.**

Get the Ladd a Win... Senior RHP **Kindle Ladd** pitched just 0.1 innings against Kansas State on Saturday, but was credited with the first win of his career. The win came in 49th appearance of his career. He is now 1-0 on the season and 1-2 in his career.

Double Switch... Senior **Hector Lorenzana** had started all 75 of his career games at second base before the Abilene Christian series. He has started each of the last nine at short-stop, while juniors **Keach Ballard** and **Joshua Ake** have taken over second. However, in double play situations with a runner on first and less than two outs, the two middle infielders have been trading positions.

Shave for the Brave... On April 3, Oklahoma will join the fight against childhood cancer by hold a "Shave for the Brave" event following practice. Shave for the Brave works in conjunction with the Vs. Cancer Foundation to raise money for cancer research. The event will also serve as an opportunity for the Sooners in their countdown to 19 Ways.

Winning Streaks... After an opening day loss to Seton Hall, the Sooners rattled off five consecutive wins for their first five-game win streak of the season. OU last won five or more in a row when it won eight, beginning with the 2013 regular season finale at Kansas State and finishing with a win in the NCAA Blacksburg Regional Final against Virginia Tech. Oklahoma had its second five-game win streak of the season snapped against Arkansas-Little Rock (3/19).

Backup Plan... The Sooner bullpen is 11-1 with a 2.62 ERA and has recorded 118 strikeouts in 117.0 innings. Oklahoma's bullpen put up a string of 15 straight scoreless innings that was snapped in the eighth inning against Citadel (2/21). For the season, **OU relievers have tossed 84 shutout innings in the 110 complete innings pitched.**

Crooked Numbers... On the scoreboard, **Oklahoma has put up two or more runs in an inning 42 times** and three or more 26 times. In back-to-back games against K-State, the Sooners scored eight runs in a single inning; setting a new season-high.

Up Next... Bedlam comes to Norman as Oklahoma hosts Oklahoma State at 6:00 pm on Tuesday, April 1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park.

Addition to the Schedule... The Sooners have added a home game against UTA on Tuesday, April 22 to replace the lost game in Surprise, Ariz. that was rained out. The game time is still to be determined.

Lords of the Flies... Oklahoma leads the country in sacrifice flies with 21; tied with Kansas State. Redshirt-junior right fielder **Taylor Alspaugh** is the team-leader at five, which is the seventh most in the nation.

Mac of All Trades... Against Abilene Christian (3/5), James made his first career start at first base. He has now started at four different positions this season; including catcher, left field and designated hitter.

On the Hunt for Home Runs... Haley leads the OU power attack with five home runs and 24 RBI. He is slugging .615, which ranks second on the team. Last season, Haley slugged .389 and hit two home runs in 48 games. **Haley has scored a league-leading 27 runs.**

Return of the Mac... James, a transfer from Brookhaven College, appeared in just nine games, earning nine at-bats and two hits in his first season in Norman. This season, he has started games at catcher (11), designated hitter (three), left field (four) and first base (six). James is hitting a league-high .432, slugging .648 and has driven in 22 runs.

Opening the Gates... Oklahoma's season-opening series against Seton Hall was the second highest opening weekend attendance total in program history as 3,754 fans passed through the gates. The previous record was set in 2011 when 4,117 saw the Sooners face William & Mary, the season after reaching the 2010 College World Series. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after

the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

Who's on First?... The Sooners have started four different first basemen. Freshman **Niko Buentello** made his debut anchoring first on opening day before seeing action at the DH spot in the next two games. He leads the team with seven starts at first. Sophomore catcher **Anthony Hermelyn** has started four games there, while James and junior **Keach Ballard** have each started one. Freshman **Austin O'Brien** has also appeared at first base off the bench in three games.

Lineup on Shuffle... Oklahoma did not repeat a lineup until the 14th game of the season. The Sooners have used 18 different starting lineups. Sophomore center fielder **Craig Aikin** is the only player to start all 26 games at the same position. Alspaugh has started in right field in 24 of 26 games.

Taking First Hacks... The Sooners are outscoring opponents 27-12 in the first inning. **Eight times, OU has allowed a first-inning run, but is 7-1 in such contests.** When scoring in the first inning, Oklahoma is 8-3 and is 9-4 when scoring first.

More Runs=More Wins... In each of Oklahoma's first seven wins, the Sooners scored at least eight runs. They are 12-0 when scoring eight or more, including a season-high 16 against UAPB (2/18). When scoring five runs or less, OU is 4-6.

Defending Big 12 Champs... The Sooners are fresh off a 43-21 campaign in 2013 as they claimed the program's first Big 12 Tournament Championship since 1997. Overall, Oklahoma returns 17 letterwinners,

including five position starters. Senior second baseman **Hector Lorenzana** is back after hitting .274 with 42 RBI and 33 runs in his first season in Norman.

Freshman All-America Trio... Oklahoma's core is built around a trifecta of Freshman All-Americans from 2013 in left-hander **Jacob Evans**, catcher **Anthony Hermelyn** and center fielder **Craig Aikin**. Evans took the hill primarily as the Sooner closer as a rookie and notched nine saves along with seven wins with a 2.06 earned run average. Hermelyn hit .275 with 26 RBI, while Aikin owns the highest returning average at .286 with 42 runs and a team-leading 16 stolen bases.

New Man on the Top Step... Hughes was named the ninth head coach in program history on June 27, 2013. He comes to Norman with 17 years of NCAA head coaching experience, most recently at Virginia Tech from 2007-13. Overall, Hughes owns a career record of 526-386-2. He coached the Hokies to two NCAA Regionals in 2010 and 2013, which they hosted in Blacksburg. Hughes previous coaching stops were at Boston College (1999-06) and Trinity (1997-98).

Season Openers... Since 1962, Oklahoma is 35-18 on opening day and 23-2 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 22-1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 48-5 going back to 1962, including 32-1 at L. Dale Mitchell.

Opening Day Starter... Sophomore lefty **Jacob Evans** made his first career start on opening day, marking the first time a Sooner pitcher made his first career start on opening day since **Zach Neal** in 2010. Evans is also the third straight lefty to start on opening day, following **Dillon Overton** in 2012 and 2013.

In the Polls... Oklahoma entered 2014 ranked No. 28 in the NCBWA preseason poll. The Sooners also received 66 votes in the *USA Today*/ESPN Coaches' Poll, landing three spots outside of the Top 25. OU finished 2013 ranked No. 17 by the coaches.

Super Regional... The Sooners last took the field for the NCAA Baton Rouge Super Regional against LSU. After losing a 2-0 pitcher's duel in game one, Oklahoma was eliminated by the Tigers, 11-1 in game two. Right-hander **Jonathan Gray** tossed 7.1 innings and allowed just two runs, while striking out nine as OU went down in the opener.

Preseason Poll... Oklahoma landed fifth in the 2014 Big 12 Preseason Poll as voted on by the league's coaches. The Sooners received 37 points in the poll. The top five spots were separated by only six points. Defending regular season champion Kansas State (56) took the top spot, followed by Oklahoma State (51), TCU (51) and Texas (50).

MLB Draft Picks... Six Sooners were taken in the 2013 MLB First Year Player Draft, led by right-hander **Jonathan Gray** being selected overall by the Colorado Rockies, matching the program's highest draft pick with **Bobby Witt** (Texas, 1985). Left-hander **Dillon Overton** was drafted 63rd overall in the second round by the Oakland Athletics and first baseman **Matt Oberste** went 206th to the New York Mets in the seventh round.

On the Hill... The OU pitching staff looks to replace nearly 60% of its innings pitched from 2013 after losing five pitchers to the draft. The eight pitchers that remain from over a year ago combined to post a 17-7 record and a 3.31 collective ERA.

New Faces in the Dugout... Coach Hughes brings to Norman a completely new coaching staff, which includes two assistants with Division I head coaching experience. Former Nebraska head coach, **Mike Anderson** brings Omaha-level experience as the hitting coach, while former Bryant and William & Mary skipper **Jamie Pinzino** takes over as the pitching coach after reaching a NCAA Regional final in 2013. **Ryan Connolly** joins the staff as the volunteer assistant after a one-year stint as an assistant at Radford. Coordinator of baseball operations **Ryan Gaines** is the lone holdover from last season's staff.

CONFERENCE NOTES

• Four conference series are on tap this weekend - Baylor at West Virginia, Oklahoma at Kansas, Texas at Texas Tech, and TCU at Oklahoma State.

• The UT-TTU series pits the league's top two pitching squads against each other with UT leading the conference with a 1.91 ERA. The Red Raiders rank second with a 2.96 mark. Meanwhile, the Big 12's top two offensive squads square off when Oklahoma visits Kansas.

• Texas is the only league team ranked in all four national polls. The Longhorns sit as high as No. 12 (*Baseball America*). Texas Tech and Oklahoma State are both ranked as high as No. 24 (*USA Today* and *NCBWA*, respectively).

• Baylor sits atop the Big 12 standings after winning its second straight conference series this past weekend (vs. OSU). BU has won three consecutive series over ranked opponents - No. 3 Cal State Fullerton, No. 23 Texas Tech and No. 20 Oklahoma State. The last, and only other time, the Bears took three straight series from ranked opponents was Feb. 18-March 20, 2005. BU has played 13 games against top 25 opponents this season, with a 7-6 mark.

• Texas Tech also claimed a conference series win last weekend, taking two of three from TCU in Fort Worth. It marked the first road series over a ranked opponent since 2011 (at No. 14 Baylor) for the Red Raiders with the Saturday win snapping a nine-game losing streak against TCU in Fort Worth dating back to 2005.

• Oklahoma was victorious in its first conference series under first-year head coach Pete Hughes, taking two of three from defending league champion K-State. The Sooners batted .340 during the series with 36 hits and 22 runs.

• Texas' Mark Payton has moved into second place on the Big 12 career triples chart. With 19, the senior is one shy of tying Nebraska's Jeff Leise, who totaled 20 from 2000-03, and has the most triples among active players nationally. Payton is one of four league players with an active reached base streak of 20+ games for the 2014 season. Dating back to last year, he has reached base in 64 consecutive games.

• With a pair of wins last Saturday, Texas head coach Augie Garrido matched Gordon Gillespie for the most wins (1,893) by any college baseball coach at any level.

• Individually, Brandon Finnegan (TCU) leads the nation with 65 strikeouts while Baylor's Josh Michalec is first in the saves category with nine. TTU's Adam Kirsh leads the country with 13 doubles, while the Sooners as a team are third in doubles.
