**First Pitch...** Oklahoma baseball kicks off the 2015 campaign by hosting the Sooner Baseball Classic at L. Dale Mitchell Park; a six-game run of play featuring five games for the Sooners against Notre Dame and Southern Illinois-Edwardsville. Oklahoma officially opens its season on Friday, February 13 against the Fighting Irish at 5:00 pm.

**About the Sooners...** Coming off an even 29-29 season and missing the postseason for the first time since 2007, Oklahoma is determined to move forward under second-year head coach **Pete Hughes**. The Sooners return seven starters from a year ago, including sophomore **Sheldon Neuse**, who was the Big 12 Freshman of the Year in 2014 and frontrunner to start 2015 at shortstop for OU. In the preseason, Neuse has pulled in several All-American honors after hitting .304 and slugging .521 as a rookie. He led the Sooners with 17 doubles, seven triples and seven home runs along with 47 runs batted in. Junior center fielder and leadoff hitter **Craig Aikin** is the team's leading hitter among returners at .326. He enters the year on a 12-game hitting streak after leading the way for OU with 47 runs scored last season.

**On the Air...** Veteran OU broadcasters **Toby Rowland** (play-by-play) and **Chris Plank** (sideline) return to call the action on the Sooner Sports Network at KREF 1400 AM. Plank will anchor the coverage opening weekend from the broadcast booth along with **Ross Hubbard**. Video and audio for all five OU games will be streamed on SoonerSports.tv.

- Sheldon Neuse, a preseason All-American by Baseball America and Perfect Game, was named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List.
- Jake Elliott becomes the first right-hander to start on opening day for OU since Michael Rocha in 2011.
- OU coach Pete Hughes and ND coach Mik Aoki were teammates at Davidson College. Aoki served as Hughes' assistant at Boston College (2004-06) before becoming head coach.
- The Sooners were picked fifth in the Big 12 Pre-season Poll for the second straight season.
- Oklahoma totals 14 newcomers this season, including seven pitchers and seven fielders.
- The OU coaching staff is comprised of four coaches with head coaching experience and a combined 1,268 NCAA wins in 40 years.

## HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 553-414-2 (.572), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

**Scouting the Irish...** Notre Dame posted a 22-31 overall record and 9-21 league mark in its first season in the ACC. The Irish dominated on the mound with a 3.05 earned run average, but produced only a .245 collective batting average at the plate. ND lost right-hander and ace **Pat Connaughton**, who still plays for the Irish basketball team, to the fourth round of the MLB Draft by the Baltimore Orioles. Left-hander **Michael Hearne** returns a season high 86 innings with a 5-6 record and 2.51 ERA a year ago. Right-hander **Scott Kerrigan** led ND with a 1.87 ERA and figures to play a part in the rotation after posting a 3-1 record in 14 games, including nine starts. Outfielder **Blair Lezynski** is the top returning hitter at .296 with 32 RBI.

**All-Time vs. ND...** Oklahoma owns a 2-1 lead in the all-time series against Notre Dame. The Sooners won the first two meetings; 15-3 in 1982 and 5-3 in 2006.

**Last Time They Met...** Two years ago, the two teams met on a neutral field at UCLA on March 10, 2013. The No. 22 Irish claimed a back-and-forth, extra-innings win over the No. 10 Sooners, 6-5, in 11 innings. Notre Dame walked off on a pinch-hit single by **Kevin DeFillippis** and had tied the game in the ninth to force extras on a sac-fly by **Trey Mancini** to score **Conor Biggio**. On the mound, lefty **Adam Choplick** tossed five innings and struck out four in a no-decision. **Kolbey Carpenter** went 3-for-5 for OU.

**Scouting the Cougars...** Senior outfielders **Denton Reed** and **Nick Lombardo** anchor a SIUE squad that went 21-33 overall and 16-14 in the OVC last season. Reed hit .344, while Lombardo hit .321 and each stole 13 bases. On the mound, senior right-hander **Ryan Daniels** returns after registering a perfect 7-0 record in 14 starts with four complete games, a 3.53 ERA and 69 strikeouts in 97 innings of work.

**OU-ND Connection...** Hughes and Notre Dame head coach **Mik Aoki** were college teammates at Davidson; both graduating in 1990. The two hooked up again in 2004 when Aoki joined Hughes' staff as an assistant coach at Boston College. Following Hughes' departure for Virginia Tech, Aoki became BC's head coach before leaving for Notre Dame in 2011.

**Putting the Ball in Play...** The Sooners struck out at the lowest rate in the Big 12 at 4.86 per game; 0.49 better than the next closest team in the league.

**Fresh Records...** Neuse set an OU freshman record with seven triples and was second with 27 walks behind Aikin's 32 set in 2013. He also earned top-five finishes in home runs (7), hits (73), runs (43) and RBI (47) by a Sooner freshman.

### 40 Years of Head Coaching...

Hughes staff has totaled 40 years of head coaching experience and 1,268 wins. **Mike Anderson** won 337 games at Nebraska, **Jamie Pinzino** 212 at Assumption, Bryant and William & Mary and **Scott Loiseau** 176 at Southern New Hampshire.

**Season Openers...** Since 1962, Oklahoma is 35-18 on opening day and 23-2 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 22-1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 48-5 going back to 1962, including 32-1 at L. Dale Mitchell.

**Vs. The ACC/ND...** Hughes spent eight seasons in the ACC, including all seven at Virginia Tech (2007-13) and his final season at Boston College (2006). He won 87 league games with a high of 16 in 2010. As Big East foes, Hughes' BC teams went 2-7 against Notre Dame between 2003 and 2005.

**#YardWork...** Oklahoma hit 30 home runs in 58 games last season, including 22 in the friendly confines of L. Dale Mitchell Park. Neuse and Haley led the team with seven and six, while **Mac James** added five. **Each home run hit by Haley came in home games, while all three home runs hit by Carpenter were away from Norman.**

**Opening the Gates...** Oklahoma's 2014 season-opening series against Seton Hall was the second highest opening weekend attendance total in program history as 3,754 fans passed through the gates. The previous record was set in 2011 when 4,117 saw the Sooners face William & Mary, the season after reaching the 2010 College World Series. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

**Opening Day Starter...** Sophomore **Jake Elliott** becomes the first righty to start opening day for Oklahoma since **Michael Rocha** in 2011. He is also the third sophomore to earn the nod in the last four year after **Jacob Evans** (2014) and **Dillon Overton** (2012).

**Big 12 Openers...** The Sooners are 8-9 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after an 11-4 win over K-State (3/21/14). OU has won four of its last five conference openers. Oklahoma won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Kansas on March 15, 1997.

**First Time Foes...** SIUE is the first of four opponents on the schedule that Oklahoma has never played before. The Sooners will also take on Utah, Purdue and Alcorn State for the first time.

**Preseason Poll...** Oklahoma landed fifth in the 2015 Big 12 Preseason Poll as voted on by the league's coaches for the second straight season. The Sooners received 38 points in the poll. TCU (64) was the unanimous No. 1 pick followed by Texas (55), Oklahoma State (47) and Texas Tech (46).

**MLB Draft Picks...** Last June, Oklahoma had four players selected in the draft. **Mac James** was selected in the sixth round and signed by the Tampa Bay Rays. **Connor Buchmann** went to the New York Mets in the 11th round and **Hector Lorenzana** was taken by the Boston Red Sox in the 37th. Chopllick returned to OU after being drafted in the 32nd by the Chicago White Sox.

**On the Hill...** The OU pitching staff was tasked with replacing nearly 60% of its innings pitched from 2013 after losing five pitchers to the draft. **This season, the Sooners return 74% of innings pitched from a year ago.**

**Pack The Dale...** Oklahoma set a series record in attendance vs. Texas (4/11-13/14) with a three-game total of 7,269. The previous high was 6,689 against Texas in 2004. **On April 12, the Sooners hosted the second largest crowd in program history with 4,102 in attendance.** Oklahoma had 16 four-figure attendance home games and averaged 1,114 per game.

**Dialing it Up...** RHP **Alec Hansen** made one start and nine appearances, spanning 11 innings as a freshman. However, he has the ability to touch triple digits on the radar gun and his fastball consistently in the 95-97 range.

**Crooked Numbers...** On the scoreboard, **Oklahoma put up two or more runs in an inning 79 times** and three or more 39 times in 2014. The Sooners scored a season-high 10 runs in the seventh inning in game one of a doubleheader vs. CSU Bakersfield (4/5/14), highlighted by three-run homers by Neuse and **Austin O'Brien**.

### CONFERENCE NOTES

Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas and Texas Tech enter the 2015 season ranked in the top 25 of all six national polls. TCU ranks as high as No. 2 and is in the top 10 on all lists along with Texas.

All four teams closed out last year ranked in the top 10. It was the first time in league history four Big 12 teams finished the regular season ranked in the top 10 of all four national polls. Six of the league's nine squads appeared in the national rankings over the course of 2014.

Five of the league's nine teams have opening weekend series against ranked teams (highest opponent ranking in parentheses) - Baylor vs. Cal Poly (No. 13), Kansas at LSU (No. 2), Oklahoma State at Arizona State (No. 18), Texas at Rice (No. 13), and West Virginia at Clemson (No. 24).

The Big 12 finished with the second-best conference RPI in the nation in 2014. Six teams (67 percent) finished in the top 50 with four league teams in the top 20 for just the third time in conference history.

The Big 12 advanced 80 percent of its 2014 NCAA postseason teams to the Super Regional field and was represented in the CWS with one-third of its baseball-playing institutions. Sixty percent of its NCAA tournament teams advanced to Omaha (3-of-5).

All four Super Regional teams served as hosts with the Big 12 comprising one-fourth of the field of 16. Since the Super Regional format began in 1999, it marked just the second time that one conference has had four teams serve as hosts in the same year (ACC, 2013).

TCU was selected as the unanimous choice to win the 2015 regular season in the coaches preseason poll. A different league team has won the regular season crown in each of the past four years (2011-14).

TCU's 2.22 ERA in 2014 led the nation while Texas' mark of 2.25 ranked fourth. The Big 12 was the only conference with multiple teams in the nation's top 10. The Horned Frogs ranked third nationally in shutouts while Texas ranked fifth. TCU and UT were two of three schools to finish in the top five in both ERA and shutouts.

Of the Big 12's four Super Regional teams from 2014, OSU and TTU return over 20 letterwinners each, while TCU will welcome back eight returning pitchers and UT seven returning position players.
