First Pitch... Oklahoma heads to Arizona for a taste of spring training beginning with a road game at Arizona State on Wednesday at 7:30 pm CT. The Sooners stick around Phoenix for the Big 12/Pac-12 Challenge spread out around various Cactus League sites for games against Washington State, Washington, Oregon State and Utah.

About the Sooners... Oklahoma went 3-2 at its home Sooner Baseball Classic with a pair of wins over SIU Edwardsville and a 6-1 decision over Notre Dame on opening day. At the top of the order, newcomer **Alex Wise** took over the leadoff spot and hit .381 (8-for-21) with eight runs scored and a three-run homer; contributing to his five RBI. Junior center fielder **Craig Aikin**, the Sooner leadoff hitter the past two seasons, hit .400 (8-for-20) from the two-hole with eight runs, two doubles and two stolen bases. Junior **Anthony Hermelyn** drove in a team-best seven runs, including a career-high four against SIUE on Saturday, as he hit .333 (6-for-18) with two doubles. Oklahoma's pitching staff held opponents to a .211 batting average and held a 2.20 earned run average. Senior lefty **Jeffrey Curran** (0-0) is scheduled to start vs. ASU. He pitched three scoreless in his one outing.

On the Air... All five games this week will be broadcast on the Sooner Sports Network at 1400 and 1560 AM. Local play-by-play announcer **Derek Diesner** and OU's communications director **Brendan Flynn** will have the call from Arizona. Sooner Sports TV will stream each OU game of the Big 12/Pac-12 Challenge on SoonerSports.tv.

- Sheldon Neuse, a preseason All-American by Baseball America and Perfect Game, was named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List.
- Jake Elliott became the first RHP to start opening day for OU since Michael Rocha in 2011 and is OU's first Big 12 Pitcher of the Week since Dillon Overton in 2013.
- Craig Aikin, Kolbey Carpenter and Anthony Hermelyn have all started on opening day in each of the last three seasons.
- The Sooners were picked fifth in the Big 12 Pre-season Poll for the second straight season.
- The OU coaching staff is comprised of four coaches with head coaching experience and a combined 1,271 NCAA wins in 41 years.
- Oklahoma set an opening weekend attendance record with 4,181 at L. Dale Mitchell Park breaking the previous record of 4,117 set in 2011.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 553-414-2 (.572), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Sun Devils... No. 9 Arizona State opened with a 2-1 series win over Oklahoma State at home, including a 4-3 win in 10 innings on opening night. The Sun Devils returned to the postseason in 2014 as the two-seed in the San Luis Obispo Regional; finishing with a 33-24 record. First baseman **Christopher Beall**, the Sun Devils' top returning hitter at .305 a year ago, went 2-for-7 with just one start against OSU. RHP **Seth Martinez** will get the start on Wednesday. He has thrown two-shutout innings of relief. Last year he went 5-0 with a 4.32 ERA in 50 innings of work, including seven starts.

All-Time vs. ASU... Arizona State holds a commanding 48-19 lead in the all-time series that dates back to 1963. The last Oklahoma win came in Tempe in 2006; 15-8. Twice the two teams have played in a NCAA Regional' most recently in 2006 and have met in three College World Series. **The Sooners bested the Sun Devils twice in 1994, by scores of 4-3 and 6-1, en route to claiming their second National Championship.**

Last Time They Met... No. 8 Arizona State put together a three-run sixth to defeat No. 2 Oklahoma, 6-4, in Tempe on March 16, 2011. **Jake Barrett** struck out 11 in six innings to earn the win for the Sun Devils. Sooner third baseman **Garrett Buechele** went 2-for-4 with a double and a run scored.

Scouting the Cougars... Through four games, Washington State is 2-2, but hitting a lowly .167 as a team. Last season, the Cougars went 24-30 with a 14-16 Pac-12 record. **Ben Roberts** is the top returning hitter from a year ago as he hit .289. On the mound, **Joe Pistorese** went 4-3 with a team-leading 3.31 ERA among starts, but lasted just 1.1 innings in his first start of 2015.

All-Time vs. WSU... Washington State leads the all-time series with Oklahoma, 8-5. The teams met for a four-game set in Norman in 2008 and again for four in Pullman in 2009. The Cougars took the 2008 series, 3-1, and the two split in 2009. **The first-ever meeting was a 6-1 WSU win at the 1976 CWS.**

Last Time They Met... The Sooners defeated the Cougars, 7-2, at the 2009 Norman Regional in an elimination game. **Garrett Richards** pitched a complete game; striking out 10 and scattering five hits. **Aaron Baker** hit a grand slam in the seventh inning to add to OU's narrow 3-2 lead. **Bryant Hernandez** started the scoring in the contest with a two-run homer in the first.

Putting the Ball in Play... The Sooners struck out at the lowest rate in the Big 12 at 4.86 per game; 0.49 better than the next closest team in the league. On opening weekend, OU struck out just 3.6 times per game and owned a 2:1 strikeout-walk-ratio.

Scouting the Huskies... At 4-0, Washington is off to its best start since 1999. The Huskies hit .308 with a 1.25 ERA on opening weekend as they swept Pacific on the road. Washington went 41-17-1 in 2014 and was the two-seed at the Oxford Regional; where it lost to Mississippi in the final, 3-2. Catcher **Austin Rei** is off to a .462 (6-for-13) start at the plate following an All-Pac-12 season in which he hit .314 last season.

All-Time vs. UW... The only meeting between Washington and Oklahoma was in El Paso, Texas in 1992; a 19-10 win for the Sooners.

Fresh Records... Neuse set an OU freshman record with seven triples and was second with 27 walks behind Aikin's 32 set in 2013. He also earned top-five finishes in home runs (7), hits (73), runs (43) and RBI (47) by a Sooner freshman.

40+ Years of Head Coaching... Hughes' staff has totaled 41 years of head coaching experience and 1,271 wins. **Mike Anderson** won 337 games at Nebraska, **Jamie Pinzino** 212 at Assumption, Bryant and William & Mary and **Scott Loiseau** 176 at Southern New Hampshire.

Season Openers... Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-18 on opening day and 24-2 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-5 going back to 1962, including 33-1 at L. Dale Mitchell.

#YardWork... Oklahoma hit 30 home runs in 58 games last season, including 22 in the friendly confines of L. Dale Mitchell Park. Neuse and Haley led the team with seven and six. **Each home run hit by Haley came in home games, while all three home runs hit by Carpenter were away from Norman.**

Opening the Gates... Oklahoma's opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4,181. In 2014 vs. Seton Hall 3,754 fans passed through the gates; now ranked third all-time. The previous record was set in 2011 when 4,117 saw the Sooners face William & Mary, the season after reaching the 2010 College World Series. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

Opening Day Starter... Sophomore **Jake Elliott** became the first righty to start opening day for Oklahoma since **Michael Rocha** in 2011. He is also the third sophomore to earn the nod in the last four year after **Jacob Evans** (2014) and **Dillon Overton** (2012).

On the Hill... The OU pitching staff was tasked with replacing nearly 60% of its innings pitched from 2013 after losing five pitchers to the draft. **This season, the Sooners return 74% of innings pitched from a year ago.**

Value in Utility... Junior **Anthony Hermelyn** has seen a drastic change in his responsibilities from his freshman season when he started 48 games behind the dish. As a sophomore he split time between catcher and first base. This season he has added third base to his defensive duties as he earned starts at all three positions opening weekend.

Utility Blue Print... Junior **Kolbey Carpenter** has been a steady performer in two-plus seasons at OU. He has appeared in games at five different positions and has started every opening day since his freshman season at a different position; 1B, DH, 2B.

Steady Up the Middle... Sophomore **Sheldon Neuse** won the shortstop job for opening day and is one of two Sooners to start every game at the same position along with junior center fielder **Craig Aikin**. Last year, Neuse made 11 starts at short, while primarily playing third. Aikin was the OU center fielder in 57 out of 58 games.

Big 12 Openers... The Sooners are 8-9 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after an 11-4 win over K-State (3/21/14). OU has won four of its last five conference openers. Oklahoma won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Kansas on March 15, 1997.

CONFERENCE NOTES

Big 12 teams opened the 2015 campaign with a 20-12 record, including eight wins over ranked opponents. Baylor (3-0), TCU (3-0) and Texas Tech (4-0) have started the season undefeated. The three teams also rank in the top 20 in the first national attendance report of the season with Texas Tech at No. 10 and TCU at No. 11.

Five league teams appear in this week's national rankings as Baylor has entered the *Collegiate Baseball* top 25 list at No. 21. Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas and Texas Tech all remain ranked heading into the second week of play. The Horned Frogs have claimed the top spot in the *Collegiate Baseball* poll and are ranked in the top 10 across all lists. All four teams are in the top 10 on the *Baseball America* poll.

This week's action is highlighted by five teams playing in Arizona as Kansas, K-State, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State will face Oregon State, Utah, Washington and Washington State in the Big 12/Pac-12 Challenge, Feb. 19-22, at various spring training facilities throughout Phoenix, while TCU will face ninth-ranked Arizona State for a weekend series. In all, the Big 12 has 20 games against the Pac-12 this week (and 32 games over the course of the season) as Oklahoma will also play the Sun Devils in a midweek game on Wednesday.

The Bears earned their first home series sweep over a ranked opponent since April 2012 by sweeping No. 13 Cal Poly in Waco over the weekend.

West Virginia also picked up a series win over a ranked opponent, taking two of three from No. 24 Clemson on the road. It marked the first season-opening home series lost by Clemson since the 1996. The Mountaineers start the season with 17 games on the road with their home opener not until March 17.

With a 4-0 start against San Francisco at home, Tech has swept five consecutive series dating back to last season. The Red Raiders have won 20 consecutive home games – the longest active home win streak in the country.

The TCU pitching staff picked up where it left off from a season ago, posting two shutouts and allowing just one earned run in 27 innings pitched for a collective 0.33 ERA over its first three contests.

The Big 12 finished with the second-best conference RPI in the nation in 2014. Six teams (67 percent) finished in the top 50 with four league teams in the top 20 for just the third time in conference history.
