**At Home in Vegas...** A stretch of cold weather in Oklahoma sends the Sooner baseball team on the road for a four-game home series against BYU at Cashman Field, home of the New York Mets' Triple-A affiliate the Las Vegas 51s. The action gets underway Thursday at 3:00 pm CT.

**About the Sooners...** Oklahoma finished off a challenging stretch of 10 games in 10 days with a 6-4 record and is riding a three-game win streak coming out of the Big 12/Pac-12 Challenge. Junior **Kolbey Carpenter**, the National and Big 12 Player of the Week, has homered in three of the last four games and has totaled four on the year, while batting a team-leading .400 with a .829 slugging percentage. Junior center fielder **Craig Aikin** returned to the lead-off spot this past weekend. He is hitting .316 with a team-high 12 runs scored and three stolen bases. Sophomore right-handed pitcher **Jake Elliott** moved to 2-0 on the season with his second seven-inning start of the year on Friday. He holds a 0.64 earned run average and has held opponents to a .104 batting average. At the back-end of the OU bullpen, RHP **Sheldon Neuse** and LHP **Jacob Evans** each notched their first save over the weekend.

**On the Air...** All four games will be broadcast on the Sooner Sports Network at KREF 1400 AM. OU's communications director **Brendan Flynn** will handle all of the play-by-play duties. Radio broadcasts can also be streamed at SoonerSports.tv.

- Sheldon Neuse, a preseason All-American by Baseball America and Perfect Game, was named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List.
- Craig Aikin, Kolbey Carpenter and Anthony Hermelyn have all started on opening day in each of the last three seasons.
- The Sooners were picked fifth in the Big 12 Pre-season Poll for the second straight season.

## HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 553-414-2 (.572), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

**Scouting the Cougars...** BYU is 1-7 on the season, with its lone win coming this past weekend during a four-game set with Nebraska in Peoria, Ariz. Shortstop **Hayden Nielsen** leads the Cougars with a .364 batting average. Catcher **Colton Shaver** has scored a team-high five runs, while hitting .292. Righty **Kolton Mahoney** has struck out a team-best 11 hitters through two starts with a 4.91 ERA.

**All-Time vs. BYU...** Oklahoma leads the all-time series, 5-1. The two teams have never played on either's home campus. The Sooners won each of the first five meetings, including the first-ever in Riverside, Calif. in 1971. The next two wins came in 1975 in Honolulu. **OU then took two from BYU in Las Vegas in 1976 by scores of 4-2 and 8-3.** The Cougars registered a win in Tempe, Ariz. in 1997, 21-13.

**Kings of the K...** The Sooner pitching staff leads the Big 12 with 85 strikeouts; averaging 8.5 per game. Sophomore right-hander **Alec Hansen** struck out 12 vs. Oregon State on Saturday and leads the league with 16. Tied for second in the Big 12 is redshirt-senior RHP **Robert Tasin** with 13 in two starts and one relief appearance. Elliott ranks third on the team and tied for fifth in the league with 11.

**Player of the Week...** Carpenter earned Big 12 and national recognition following an 8-for-17 week with three home runs. He was named the Big 12 Player of the Week and the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball News*. **Carpenter is the second Sooner to earn the national award; first won by Mac James in 2014.**

**Fresh Records...** Neuse set an OU freshman record with seven triples and was second with 27 walks behind Aikin's 32 set in 2013. He also earned top-five finishes in home runs (7), hits (73), runs (43) and RBI (47) by a Sooner freshman.

**40+ Years of Head Coaching...** Pete Hughes' staff has totaled 41 years of head coaching experience and 1,274 wins. **Mike Anderson** won 337 games at Nebraska, **Jamie Pinzino** 212 at Assumption, Bryant and William & Mary and **Scott Loiseau** 176 at Southern New Hampshire.

**Season Openers...** Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-18 on opening day and 24-2 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-5 going back to 1962, including 33-1 at L. Dale Mitchell.

## Weekly Awards

### Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week

**#YardWork...** Oklahoma is well on its way to surpassing its 30-home run total from 2014. Through 10 games, the Sooners have gone yard eight times, including a team-leading four from Carpenter. Three of his home runs have come on the road after all three homers he hit in 2014 came away from L. Dale Mitchell Park. Sophomore first baseman **Austin O'Brien** is second on the team with two jacks; both coming at home.

**Opening the Gates...** Oklahoma's opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4,181. In 2014 vs. Seton Hall 3,754 fans passed through the gates; now ranked third all-time. The previous record was set in 2011 when 4,117 saw the Sooners face William & Mary, the season after reaching the 2010 College World Series. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

**Opening Day Starter...** Sophomore **Jake Elliott** became the first righty to start opening day for Oklahoma since **Michael Rocha** in 2011. He is also the third sophomore to earn the nod in the last four year after **Jacob Evans** (2014) and **Dillon Overton** (2012).

**On the Hill...** The OU pitching staff was tasked with replacing nearly 60% of its innings pitched from 2013 after losing five pitchers to the draft. **This season, the Sooners return 74% of innings pitched from a year ago.**

**Value in Utility...** Junior **Anthony Hermelyn** has seen a drastic change in his responsibilities from his freshman season when he started 48 games behind the dish. As a sophomore he split time between catcher and first base. This season he has added third base to his defensive duties as he earned starts at all three positions opening weekend.

**Utility Blue Print...** Junior **Kolbey Carpenter** has been a steady performer in two-plus seasons at OU. He has appeared in games at five different positions and has started every opening day since his freshman season at a different position; 1B, DH, 2B.

**Lords of the Sac-Flies...** Through 10 games played, Oklahoma its tied for first in the country in sacrifice-flies with Texas A&M at nine.

**Starting in Center Field...** Junior **Craig Aikin** has started all 10 games in center field; the only Sooner to start every game at the same position. He was the OU center fielder in 57 out of 58 games in 2014.

**Big 12 Openers...** The Sooners are 8-9 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after an 11-4 win over K-State (3/21/14). OU has won four of its last five conference openers. Oklahoma won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Kansas on March 15, 1997.

**First Time Foes...** SIUE was the first of four opponents on the schedule that Oklahoma has never played before. The Sooners will also take on Utah, Purdue and Alcorn State for the first time.

**Preseason Poll...** Oklahoma landed fifth in the 2015 Big 12 Preseason Poll as voted on by the league's coaches for the second straight season. The Sooners received 38 points in the poll. TCU (64) was the unanimous No. 1 pick followed by Texas (55), Oklahoma State (47) and Texas Tech (46).

**MLB Draft Picks...** Last June, Oklahoma had four players selected in the draft. **Mac James** was selected in the sixth round and signed by the Tampa Bay Rays. **Connor Buchmann** went to the New York Mets in the 11th round and **Hector Lorenzana** was taken by the Boston Red Sox in the 37th. Chopllick returned to OU after being drafted in the 32nd by the Chicago White Sox.

**Pack The Dale...** Oklahoma set a series record in attendance vs. Texas (4/11-13/14) with a three-game total of 7,269. The previous high was 6,689 against Texas in 2004. **On April 12, the Sooners hosted the second largest crowd in program history with 4,102 in attendance.** Oklahoma had 16 four-figure attendance home games and averaged 1,114 per game.

**Dialing it Up...** RHP **Alec Hansen** made one start and nine appearances, spanning 11 innings as a freshman. However, he has the ability to touch triple digits on the radar gun and his fastball consistently in the 95-97 range.

### CONFERENCE NOTES

Big 12 teams combined for a 25-13 mark in the second week of action. Kansas, K-State, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State posted a 10-6 record in the Big 12/Pac-12 Challenge as the league went 12-8 against the conference with TCU winning an away series at ASU over the weekend as well. The Sooners and Cowboys both went 3-1 in the tournament.

Due to inclement weather, K-State, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State have each had to shift scheduled weekend home series. The Sooners will still take on BYU, but will do so in Las Vegas, while the Wildcats have cancelled their home series with Eastern Illinois. K-State will now take on California in Berkeley. OSU will travel to Auburn, Ala., and still face Western Illinois for two contests with an added game against the Tigers.

Big 12 teams have a combined 45-25 mark through the first two weeks of play. Of the 25 losses, 19 have been by three runs or fewer, including 10 of those 19 by two runs or fewer. OSU's three losses have been by two runs or fewer, while four of Kansas' five losses have been by three runs.

For the second straight week, five league teams appear in the national rankings. TCU maintains its top spot on the *Collegiate Baseball* list while the Frogs along with OSU, UT and TTU are all ranked in the top 10 on the *Baseball America* chart for the third straight week. IU checks in at No. 25 on the *Collegiate Baseball* list.

Texas and Texas Tech each posted three shutouts over the weekend. UT's three straight shutouts marked the first time the Horns have accomplished the feat since 2002, and their four-game sweep over Minnesota was the first since 2010. UT's 7-2 start is also its best since 2010.

The two teams also lead the league, and nation, in extra-base hits as the Red Raiders have 37 on the year, while Texas has 35.

The Big 12 has claimed three national player of the week honors in the first two weeks of the year as TTU's Eric Gutierrez was named the NCBWA National Hitter of the Week last week, while OU's Kolbey Carpenter and TCU's Preston Morrison are *Collegiate Baseball*/Louisville Slugger National Players of the Week this week.

After his complete game shutout on Friday, Morrison is the Big 12 active leader in career shutouts with seven while a pitcher in the league. His four shutouts are tied for second-most on the career charts.
