Back at Home... Oklahoma baseball began 2015 at home opening weekend before heading west for the last nine games in Arizona and Nevada. The Sooners are back in the friendly confines of L. Dale Mitchell Park to face Arkansas-Little Rock at 6:00 pm on Tuesday evening.

About the Sooners... Overall, Oklahoma is 9-5 on the season and winners of six out of its last seven. Junior **Kolbey Carpenter**, the National and Big 12 Player of the Week a week ago, leads the Sooners with a .340 batting average to go with four home runs and 11 RBI. Four players are hitting .300-or-better, including junior center fielder **Craig Aikin** (.327), redshirt-senior right fielder **Taylor Alspaugh** (.306) and junior **Anthony Hermelyn** (.302). Aikin leads the team with 14 runs scored and four stolen bases. Hermelyn is second on the team with 11 RBI. Sophomore shortstop **Sheldon Neuse** is first on OU with 12 RBI, while scoring eight runs and hitting two homers. Junior right-hander **Corey Copping** (1-0) gets the nod for his third start of the year. He owns a 3.60 earned run average and has struck out 10 batters in 10 innings of work. Oklahoma is outscoring opponents in runs per game; 6.14-3.71.

On the Air... Veteran OU broadcasters **Toby Rowland** (play-by-play) and **Chris Plank** (sideline) return to call the action on the Sooners Sports Network. The game can be heard on Sportstalk 1400 AM and 98.5 FM as well as The Franchise 2 at 1560.

- Kolbey Carpenter was named the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week and the Big 12 Player of the Week (2/23).
- Sheldon Neuse, a preseason All-American by Baseball America and Perfect Game, was named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List.
- OU starting pitchers have lasted six or more innings in six out of 14 starts this season, including five or more of seven innings.
- Craig Aikin had a 17-game hit streak snapped at Arizona State (2/18) and has come back to hit successfully in each of the last eight games.
- The Sooners were picked fifth in the Big 12 Pre-season Poll for the second straight season.
- Oklahoma set an opening weekend attendance record with 4,181 at L. Dale Mitchell Park breaking the previous record of 4,117 set in 2011.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 553-414-2 (.572), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Trojans... UALR is 3-4 this season, with all their wins at home with a recent series sweep against SIUE. Short-stop **Scott Ryan** leads the Trojans with a .450 batting average, while also leading the team with six runs and one homerun. UALR will throw RHP **Cameron Allen** (1-0). On the season, he holds a 2.70 ERA in three appearances and one start across 10 innings.

All-Time vs. UALR... Oklahoma leads the all-time series, 21-6. The Sooners have fallen to UALR in the last four meetings. Last year, the Sooners were outscored 11-2 at home. Oklahoma's last win was in 2011, outscoring the Trojans 11-4 and winning three of the four matchups that season. **Oklahoma longest win streak against UALR is 13, which started with the first game played in Norman in 1986.** OU's largest winning margin was in 1987 when the Sooners outscored the Trojans 21-5.

Last Time They Met... The Trojans were led by 6.2 innings of work from **Chad Bradford**, who got the start against **Alec Hansen**. UALR totaled 13 hits, the only extra-base hit being a double by **Joseph Paulino**, to Oklahoma's five. **Ben Crumpton** and **Sam Vogel** each drove in three runs for the Trojans.

Kings of the K... The Sooner pitching staff leads the Big 12 with 121 strikeouts; averaging a league-best 8.78 per nine innings. The next closes is Oklahoma State at 88 and 8.16. Sophomore right-hander **Alec Hansen** struck out 12 vs. Oregon State (2/22) and leads the league with 24. Tied for fourth in the Big 12 is sophomore RHP **Jake Elliott** at 17. Redshirt-junior lefty **Adam Choplick** ranks eighth in the league with 15. Elliott and Choplick have each set a season-high at seven strikeouts.

Player of the Week... Carpenter earned Big 12 and national recognition following an 8-for-17 week with three home runs. He was named the Big 12 Player of the Week and the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball News*. **Carpenter is the second Sooner to earn the national award; first won by Mac James in 2014.**

Fresh Records... Neuse set an OU freshman record with seven triples and was second with 27 walks behind Aikin's 32 set in 2013. He also earned top-five finishes in home runs (7), hits (73), runs (43) and RBI (47) by a Sooner freshman.

40+ Years of Head Coaching... Pete Hughes' staff has totaled 41 years of head coaching experience and 1,277 wins. **Mike Anderson** won 337 games at Nebraska, **Jamie Pinzino** 212 at Assumption, Bryant and William & Mary and **Scott Loiseau** 176 at Southern New Hampshire.

Season Openers... Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-18 on opening day and 24-2 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-5 going back to 1962, including 33-1 at L. Dale Mitchell.

#YardWork... Oklahoma is well on its way to surpassing its 30-home run total from 2014. Through 14 games, the Sooners have gone yard 12 times, including a team-leading four from Carpenter. Three of his home runs have come on the road after all three homers he hit in 2014 came away from L. Dale Mitchell Park. Sophomores **Austin O'Brien** Neuse are second on the team with two jacks.

Slugging it Out... The Sooners are the only team in the Big 12 to hit four home runs in a game and the only team to hit four triples in a game. Oklahoma slugged four homers against BYU (2/28) in Las Vegas and tripled four times against Oregon State (2/22) in Surprise, Ariz.

Opening the Gates... Oklahoma's opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4,181. In 2014 vs. Seton Hall 3,754 fans passed through the gates; now ranked third all-time. The previous record was set in 2011 when 4,117 saw the Sooners face William & Mary, the season after reaching the 2010 College World Series. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

Opening Day Starter... Sophomore **Jake Elliott** became the first righty to start opening day for Oklahoma since **Michael Rocha** in 2011. He is also the third sophomore to earn the nod in the last four year after **Jacob Evans** (2014) and **Dillon Overton** (2012).

On the Hill... The OU pitching staff was tasked with replacing nearly 60% of its innings pitched from 2013 after losing five pitchers to the draft. **This season, the Sooners return 74% of innings pitched from a year ago.**

Turning Two... The Sooners ranks second in the country and first in the NCAA with 16 double plays turned; averaging 1.14 per game. Oklahoma turned a season-high four vs. BYU (2/28). In 2014, OU turned just 28, averaging 0.48 per game.

Value in Utility... Junior **Anthony Hermelyn** has seen a drastic change in his responsibilities from his freshman season when he started 48 games behind the dish. As a sophomore he split time between catcher and first base. This season he has added third base to his defensive duties as he earned starts at all three positions opening weekend.

Utility Blue Print... Junior **Kolbey Carpenter** has been a steady performer in two-plus seasons at OU. He has appeared in games at five different positions and has started every opening day since his freshman season at a different position; 1B, DH, 2B.

Starting in Center Field... Junior center fielder **Craig Aikin** has started all 14 games in center field; the only Sooner to start every game at the same position. Aikin was the OU center fielder in 57 out of 58 games in 2014.

Big 12 Openers... The Sooners are 8-9 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after an 11-4 win over K-State (3/21/14). OU has won four of its last five conference openers. Oklahoma won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Kansas on March 15, 1997.

Lords of the Sac-Flies... Through 14 games played, Oklahoma is second in the country in sacrifice-flies with 11. Five difference players have recorded two.

First Time Foes... SIUE was the first of four opponents on the schedule that Oklahoma has never played before. The Sooners will also take on Utah, Purdue and Alcorn State for the first time.

Preseason Poll... Oklahoma landed fifth in the 2015 Big 12 Preseason Poll as voted on by the league's coaches for the second straight season. The Sooners received 38 points in the poll. TCU (64) was the unanimous No. 1 pick followed by Texas (55), Oklahoma State (47) and Texas Tech (46).

MLB Draft Picks... Last June, Oklahoma had four players selected in the draft. **Mac James** was selected in the sixth round and signed by the Tampa Bay Rays. **Connor Buchmann** went to the New York Mets in the 11th round and **Hector Lorenzana** was taken by the Boston Red Sox in the 37th. Chopllick returned to OU after being drafted in the 32nd by the Chicago White Sox.

Pack The Dale... Oklahoma set a series record in attendance vs. Texas (4/11-13/14) with a three-game total of 7,269. The previous high was 6,689 against Texas in 2004. **On April 12, the Sooners hosted the second largest crowd in program history with 4,102 in attendance.** Oklahoma had 16 four-figure attendance home games and averaged 1,114 per game.

Dialing it Up... RHP **Alec Hansen** made one start and nine appearances, spanning 11 innings as a freshman. However, he has the ability to touch triple digits on the radar gun and his fastball consistently in the 95-97 range.

Crooked Numbers... On the scoreboard, **Oklahoma put up two or more runs in an inning 79 times** and three or more 39 times in 2014. The Sooners scored a season-high 10 runs in the seventh inning in game one of a doubleheader vs. CSU Bakersfield (4/5/14), highlighted by three-run homers by Neuse and **Austin O'Brien**.

Lineup on Shuffle... In 2014, Oklahoma did not repeat a lineup until the 14th game of the season. The Sooners used 35 different starting lineups a year ago. **This season, OU has rolled out nine different lineups in 10 games.**

Shave for the Brave... On April 3, OU held its "Shave for the Brave" event to join the fight against childhood cancer. **The Sooners, with a**

goal of \$20,000, raised over \$29,000 through the Vs. Cancer Foundation to raise money for cancer research. Half of the money donated will be dedicated to the OU Children's Hospital. The event also served as an opportunity for the Sooners in their countdown to 19 Ways.
