**First Pitch...** A brief, five-game homestand continues for Oklahoma baseball as it hosts Purdue for a three-game set this weekend. The series opens Friday night at 6:00 pm and continues Saturday at 5:00 pm and Sunday at 12:00 pm.

**About the Sooners...** Overall, Oklahoma is 10-5 on the season and winners of seven out of its last eight. Junior center fielder is coming off a record-setting day and leads the Sooners with a .387 batting average and 18 runs scored. Four players are hitting .300-or-better, including junior **Kolbey Carpenter** (.333), redshirt-senior right fielder **Taylor Alspaugh** (.316) and junior **Anthony Hermelyn** (.304). Sophomore shortstop **Sheldon Neuse** has lifted his average to .278, while leading the team with 17 RBI to go with three home runs. Carpenter is the team-leader in long balls at four. On the mound, sophomore right-hander **Jake Elliott** (2-0) gets the start on Friday night. He owns a 1.45 earned run average, best among OU starters, and has struck out 17 across a team-high 18.2 innings of work.

**On the Air...** Veteran OU broadcasters **Toby Rowland** (play-by-play) and **Chris Plank** (sideline) return to call the action on the Sooner Sports Network. The games can be heard locally on Sportstalk 1400 AM and 98.5 FM as well as The Franchise 2 at 1560 AM. The series is scheduled to be broadcast by Sooner Sports TV on FSSW+/FCSP (Friday), FSSW/FSOK+ (Saturday), FSSW/FCSC (Sunday).

### Leading Off

- Craig Aikin set an OU single-game record with six hits vs. UALR (3/3). Sooners had recorded five hits in a game 26 times.
- Kolbey Carpenter was named the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week and the Big 12 Player of the Week (2/23).
- Sheldon Neuse, a preseason All-American by Baseball America and Perfect Game, was named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List.
- Aikin had a 17-game hit streak snapped at Arizona State (2/18) and has come back to hit successfully in each of the last nine games.
- OU starting pitchers have lasted six or more innings in six out of 15 starts this season, including five of seven or more innings.
- Oklahoma set an opening weekend attendance record with 4,181 at L. Dale Mitchell Park breaking the previous record of 4,117 set in 2011.

## HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 553-414-2 (.572), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

**Scouting the Boilermakers...** Coming off a three-game skid in Arizona, the Boilermakers are 4-7 going into the three-game series against Oklahoma. Purdue is led by **Michael Vilardo** with a .348 average and **Brandon Krieg** who leads the team with nine runs scored. On the mound, **Matt Frawley** has a 1.93 ERA through 14 innings pitched and is slated to start on Sunday. Purdue, which hosted a regional in 2012, finished just 13-37 in the Big Ten last season.

**For the Record...** Single to center, single down the left field line, F7, single up the middle, three-run home run to right, double to right-center, infield-single to second. That was Aikin's record-setting day with a school-record six hits as he went 6-for-7 with four runs and six RBI in a 22-0 win over Arkansas-Little Rock (3/3). Aikin's home run was the first of his career as he set career marks in both runs scored and driven in.

**Kings of the K...** The Sooner pitching staff leads the Big 12 with 131 strikeouts; averaging a league-best 8.86 per nine innings. Sophomore right-hander **Alec Hansen** struck out 12 vs. Oregon State (2/22) and leads the league with 24. Tied for sixth in the Big 12 are Elliott and junior RHP **Corey Copping** at 17. Redshirt-junior lefty **Adam Choplick** ranks ninth in the league with 15. Elliott, Copping and Choplick have all set a season-high at seven strikeouts.

**Player of the Week...** Carpenter earned Big 12 and national recognition following an 8-for-17 week with three home runs. He was named the Big 12 Player of the Week and the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball News*. **Carpenter is the second Sooner to earn the national award; first won by Mac James in 2014.**

**Fresh Records...** Neuse set an OU freshman record with seven triples and was second with 27 walks behind Aikin's 32 set in 2013. He also earned top-five finishes in home runs (7), hits (73), runs (43) and RBI (47) by a Sooner freshman.

**40+ Years of Head Coaching...** Pete Hughes' staff has totaled 41 years of head coaching experience and 1,278 wins. **Mike Anderson** won 337 games at Nebraska, **Jamie Pinzino** 212 at Assumption, Bryant and William & Mary and **Scott Loiseau** 176 at Southern New Hampshire.

**Season Openers...** Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-18 on opening day and 24-2 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-5 going back to 1962, including 33-1 at L. Dale Mitchell.

**#YardWork...** Oklahoma is well on its way to surpassing its 30-home run total from 2014. Through 15 games, the Sooners have gone yard 15 times, including a team-leading four from Carpenter. Three of his home runs have come on the road after all three homers he hit in 2014 came away from L. Dale Mitchell Park. Neuse, who is second on the team with three home runs, and junior catcher **Chris Shaw** have homered in back-to-back games. **The Sooners rank first in the Big 12 with 15 home runs and 1.00 per game.**

**Slugging it Out...** The Sooners are the only team in the Big 12 to hit four home runs in a game and the only team to hit four triples in a game. Oklahoma slugged four homers against BYU (2/28) in Las Vegas and tripled four times against Oregon State (2/22) in Surprise, Ariz.

**Opening the Gates...** Oklahoma's opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4,181. In 2014 vs. Seton Hall 3,754 fans passed through the gates; now ranked third all-time. The previous record was set in 2011 when 4,117 saw the Sooners face William & Mary, the season after reaching the 2010 College World Series. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

**Turning Two...** The Sooners rank second in the country and first in the NCAA with 16 double plays turned; averaging 1.07 per game. Oklahoma turned a season-high four vs. BYU (2/28). In 2014, OU turned just 28, averaging 0.48 per game.

**Opening Day Starter...** Sophomore **Jake Elliott** became the first righty to start opening day for Oklahoma since **Michael Rocha** in 2011. He is also the third sophomore to earn the nod in the last four year after **Jacob Evans** (2014) and **Dillon Overton** (2012).

**Value in Utility...** Junior **Anthony Hermelyn** has seen a drastic change in his responsibilities from his freshman season when he started 48 games behind the dish. As a sophomore he split time between catcher and first base. This season he has added third base to his defensive duties as he earned starts at all three positions opening weekend.

**On the Hill...** The OU pitching staff was tasked with replacing nearly 60% of its innings pitched from 2013 after losing five pitchers to the draft. **This season, the Sooners return 74% of innings pitched from a year ago.**

**Utility Blue Print...** Junior **Kolbey Carpenter** has been a steady performer in two-plus seasons at OU. He has appeared in games at five different positions and has started every opening day since his freshman season at a different position; 1B, DH, 2B.

**Starting in Center Field...** Aikin has started all 15 games in center field; the only Sooner to start every game at the same position. Je was the OU center fielder in 57 out of 58 games in 2014.

**Big 12 Openers...** The Sooners are 8-9 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after an 11-4 win over K-State (3/21/14). OU has won four of its last five conference openers. Oklahoma won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Kansas on March 15, 1997.

**First Time Foes...** SIUE was the first of four opponents on the schedule that Oklahoma has never played before. The Sooners will also take on Utah, Purdue and Alcorn State for the first time.

**Preseason Poll...** Oklahoma landed fifth in the 2015 Big 12 Preseason Poll as voted on by the league's coaches for the second straight season. The Sooners received 38 points in the poll. TCU (64) was the unanimous No. 1 pick followed by Texas (55), Oklahoma State (47) and Texas Tech (46).

**MLB Draft Picks...** Last June, Oklahoma had four players selected in the draft. **Mac James** was selected in the sixth round and signed by the Tampa Bay Rays. **Connor Buchmann** went to the New York Mets in the 11th round and **Hector Lorenzana** was taken by the Boston Red Sox in the 37th. Choplick returned to OU after being drafted in the 32nd by the Chicago White Sox.

**Pack The Dale...** Oklahoma set a series record in attendance vs. Texas (4/11-13/14) with a three-game total of 7,269. The previous high was 6,689 against Texas in 2004. **On April 12, the Sooners hosted the second largest crowd in program history with 4,102 in attendance.** Oklahoma had 16 four-figure attendance home games and averaged 1,114 per game.

### CONFERENCE NOTES

Big 12 teams enter week four with a 58-40 combined record. This marks the last week before conference play begins on March 13 with a pair of Big 12 series - Baylor at TCU and West Virginia at Texas.

Due to inclement weather, a combined 13 games were cancelled over the course of the past week, while Kansas State, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State all had to relocate home series last weekend. TCU and Texas Tech both cancelled three games over the weekend.

Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas and Texas Tech remain ranked among the top 25 of all four national polls. TCU maintains its top spot on the *Collegiate Baseball* list and will face four ranked opponents this weekend, including three against teams in the top 10. TTU sits as high as No. 5, while the Cowboys rank as high as 10th and Texas as high as No. 12.

Baylor and TCU will both play in competitive tournaments this weekend with the Bears participating in the Houston College Classic against Hawai'i, No. 2 LSU and No. 11 Texas A&M. TCU will travel to Southern California to play No. 20 USC and No. 4 UCLA on the road before a contest vs. reigning national champion Vanderbilt at Dodger Stadium on Sunday.

Along with TCU's weekend games in California, Texas and Texas Tech will also be in the The Golden State over the weekend as the Longhorns face Stanford for a four-game set and TTU visits Cal State Fullerton. The Cardinal and Titans are both receiving votes in this week's polls along with Oklahoma State's opponent Illinois.

TCU enters the week third in the nation in ERA (1.27) and is tied with four other teams for the national lead in shutouts with four.

Texas Tech and Oklahoma lead the Big 12 in the majority of offensive categories. The Red Raiders rank first in batting average, on-base and slugging percentage, doubles and RBI, while OU tops the league in runs, hits, triples and home runs.

Kansas, K-State and Oklahoma State all host the first home weekend series on the year this week.

The Big 12 has claimed four national player of the week honors on the year.
