**First Pitch...** It's off to Hawai'i for the Oklahoma baseball team; playing in its fourth time zone in as many weeks after stints in Arizona and Las Vegas preceding a home series last week. Game one between the Sooners and University of Hawai'i is scheduled for 11:35 pm CT on Thursday night to start a four-game series.

**About the Sooners...** Oklahoma takes a 12-7 record to Hawai'i this week after a series win over Purdue at home this past weekend. Junior center fielder **Craig Aikin** leads the Sooners with a .377 batting average and is first in the Big 12 with 22 runs scored. Sophomore shortstop **Sheldon Neuse**, who ranks second in the league at 16 runs, is hitting .343 with a team-high five home runs and league-leading 22 RBI, while slugging .614. Overall, four players are hitting .300-or-better, including juniors **Anthony Hermelyn** (.315) and **Kolbey Carpenter** (.313). Hermelyn is second on OU with 16 RBI and Carpenter is second with four long balls and a .563 slugging percentage. On the mound, the Sooners own a collective 2.93 earned run average. Sophomore right-handers **Jake Elliott** (2-1) and **Alec Hansen** (2-1) have been at the top of the Sooner rotation all season. Elliott sports a 3.28 ERA to Hansen's 3.68.

**On the Air...** The first three games of the series will be televised by Oceanic Time Warner Cable. Hawai'i broadcasters **Jim Leahy** and former MLB scout **Pal Eldredge**, who played collegiately at BYU, will have the call. All three televised games can also be streamed online at BigWest.tv.

- Craig Aikin set an OU single-game record with six hits vs. UALR (3/3). Sooners had recorded five hits in a game 26 times.
- Kolbey Carpenter was named the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week and the Big 12 Player of the Week (2/23).
- Sheldon Neuse has hit a home run in four of the last six games and became the second Sooner to earn Big 12 Player of the Week (3/9).
- Aikin had a 17-game hit streak snapped at Arizona State (2/18) and a 12-game streak snapped vs. Oral Roberts (3/10).
- OU starting pitchers have lasted six or more innings in eight out of 19 starts this season, including six of seven or more innings.
- Oklahoma set an opening weekend attendance record with 4,181 at L. Dale Mitchell Park breaking the previous record of 4,117 set in 2011.

## HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 553-414-2 (.572), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

**Scouting the Warriors...** Hawai'i is 6-10 on the season with a 4-5 record at home. First Baseman **Eric Ramirez** leads the Warrior bats with a .309 average and 11 RBI. Outfielder **Kaao Aliviado** provides some pop to the lineup with three home runs and 10 RBI to go with a .267 average. Thursday starter, RHP **LJ Brewster** (3-1) holds a 1.75 ERA with a team-leading 21 strikeouts.

**All-Time vs. Hawai'i...** The Rainbow Warriors hold a narrow edge in the all-time series with the Sooners; 15-13. The team last met in 1982 for a five game-set as Oklahoma took three games. In 1979, Hawai'i bested the Sooners, 12-8, in a NCAA Regional game in Tuscon, Ariz. The first meeting was an 11-4 win for Oklahoma in Honolulu in 1975.

**For the Record...** Single to center, single down the left field line, F7, single up the middle, three-run home run to right, double to right-center, infield-single to second. That was Aikin's record-setting day with a school-record six hits as he went 6-for-7 with four runs and six RBI in a 22-0 win over Arkansas-Little Rock (3/3). Aikin's home run was the first of his career as he set career marks in both runs scored and driven in.

**Kings of the K...** The Sooner pitching staff leads the Big 12 with 178 strikeouts; averaging a league-best 9.48 per nine innings, which is 1.15 more per nine than the next closest team. Hansen struck out 12 vs. Oregon State (2/22) and leads the league with 32. Tied for third in the league is Elliott at 27. Redshirt-junior left-hander **Adam Choplick** is tied for sixth in the league with 25.

**Neuse Statement Heard...** Neuse claimed the Sooner's third weekly award from the Big 12 after being name the Player of the Week (3/9). He hit .688 (11-for-16) with a 1.375 slugging and .722 on-base percentage. Neuse homered three times, drove in 10 runs and scored with over a four-game stretch at home. He posted a perfect 4-for-4 day with a home run and a double against Purdue (3/7). As a freshman, Neuse was twice selected as the Big 12 Rookie of the Week in 2014.

**Player of the Week...** Carpenter earned Big 12 and national recognition following an 8-for-17 week with three home runs. He was named the Big 12 Player of the Week and the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball News*. **Carpenter is the second Sooner to earn the national award; first won by Mac James in 2014.**

**Fresh Records...** Neuse set an OU freshman record with seven triples and was second with 27 walks behind Aikin's 32 set in 2013. He also earned top-five finishes in home runs (7), hits (73), runs (43) and RBI (47) by a Sooner freshman.

**40+ Years of Head Coaching...** Pete Hughes' staff has totaled 41 years of head coaching experience and 1,281 wins. **Mike Anderson** won 337 games at Nebraska, **Jamie Pinzino** 212 at Assumption, Bryant and William & Mary and **Scott Loiseau** 176 at Southern New Hampshire.

**Season Openers...** Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-18 on opening day and 24-2 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-5 going back to 1962, including 33-1 at L. Dale Mitchell.

**#YardWork...** Oklahoma is well on its way to surpassing its 30-home run total from 2014. Through 19 games, the Sooners have gone yard 21 times, including a team-leading five from Neuse, who has homered in four of the last six games. **The Sooners rank first in the Big 12 with 21 home runs and second at 1.11 per game.** Only a sophomore, Neuse is the team's active career home run leader with 12. Junior left fielder **Hunter Haley** ranks second after notching his 10th against Purdue (3/8).

**True North...** Junior catcher **Chris Shaw** is the first Canadian to play for the Sooners since lefty **J.R. Robinson** (2009-10). He is the first Manitoban to ever play in the Big 12 and one of four D-I players from his home province. Eastern Michigan's roster features two, while one plays for North Dakota. **A two-time MLB pick, Shaw became the highest Manitoban selected as the 14th round pick of the Cardinals in 2014.** Shaw, whose other sport as a youth was curling, attended Okotoks Dawgs Baseball Academy in high school and was a member of Team Canada before heading to Midland College.

**Slugging it Out...** The Sooners are the only team in the Big 12 to hit four home runs in a game and the only team to hit four triples in a game. Oklahoma slugged four homers against BYU (2/28) in Las Vegas and tripled four times against Oregon State (2/22) in Surprise, Ariz. OU repeated its four-home run effort against Purdue (3/8).

**Turning Two...** The Sooners rank third in the country and first in the Big 12 with 20 double plays turned; averaging 1.05 per game. Oklahoma turned a season-high four vs. BYU (2/28). In 2014, OU turned just 28, averaging 0.48 per game.

**Opening the Gates...** Oklahoma's opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4,181. In 2014 vs. Seton Hall 3,754 fans passed through the gates; now ranked third all-time. The previous record was set in 2011 when 4,117 saw the Sooners face William & Mary, the season after reaching the 2010 College World Series. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

**Opening Day Starter...** Sophomore **Jake Elliott** became the first righty to start opening day for Oklahoma since **Michael Rocha** in 2011. He is also the third sophomore to earn the nod in the last four year after **Jacob Evans** (2014) and **Dillon Overton** (2012).

**Value in Utility...** Junior **Anthony Hermelyn** has seen a drastic change in his responsibilities from his freshman season when he started 48 games behind the dish. As a sophomore he split time between catcher and first base. This season he has added third base to his defensive duties as he earned starts at all three positions opening weekend.

**On the Hill...** The OU pitching staff was tasked with replacing nearly 60% of its innings pitched from 2013 after losing five pitchers to the draft. **This season, the Sooners return 74% of innings pitched from a year ago.**

**Utility Blue Print...** Junior **Kolbey Carpenter** has been a steady performer in two-plus seasons at OU. He has appeared in games at five different positions and has started every opening day since his freshman season at a different position; 1B, DH, 2B.

**Starting in Center Field...** Aikin has started all 19 games in center field; the only Sooner to start every game at the same position. He was the OU center fielder in 57 out of 58 games in 2014.

**Big 12 Openers...** The Sooners are 8-9 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after an 11-4 win over K-State (3/21/14). OU has won four of its last five conference openers. Oklahoma won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Kansas on March 15, 1997.

### CONFERENCE NOTES

Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas and Texas Tech all remain ranked heading into the fifth week of the season. TCU sits atop the Collegiate Baseball poll and second on three other lists. The four teams have been ranked all season while the Frogs have been ranked in the top 10 on all four lists throughout the year.

Conference play begins this weekend with a pair of series as Baylor travels to TCU and Texas hosts West Virginia. The Frogs enter the 2015 conference season having won six straight series against league opponents and are coming off a week in which they went 3-1 against four ranked teams.

K-State, Oklahoma and West Virginia all set season-highs in runs scored over the past weekend. All three teams batted over .300 last week and combined to score 115 runs. Through 18 games, the Sooners lead the league in five offensive statistical categories, including runs, hits and RBI. The Sooner pitching staff also leads the league in strikeouts.

Oklahoma's Sheldon Neuse was named the Big 12 Player of the Week after leading the league in home runs, RBI, total bases and slugging percentage last week. The sophomore totaled three home runs and 10 RBI. Big 12 Pitcher of the Week honors went to TCU's Alex Young who picked up two wins over ranked opponents on the week, while K-State's Tyler Moore was named the Newcomer of the Week.

TCU's Riley Ferrell recorded three saves last week and now has 23 in his career. With four more, he enters the Big 12's top 10 career list where two closers hold down the No. 9 spot with 27 saves.

Oklahoma State is just 17 wins shy of becoming only the 15th program in Division I history to reach 2,500 victories while head coach Josh Holliday needs just three more wins to reach 100 victories as OSU's head coach (third season).

K-State opened its 2015 home slate with a sweep of Santa Clara. The Wildcats have won 23 of their last 24 home contests against nonconference opponents, a stretch that dates back to March 20, 2013.

The Big 12 has claimed four national player of the week awards this season.

Big 12 teams are a combined 76-56 in non-conference action.
