First Pitch... Big 12 play has arrived as the Oklahoma baseball team is set to host a three-game series against No. 12 Texas Tech at L. Dale Mitchell Park. Game one of the series is scheduled for 6:00 pm Friday night.

About the Sooners... The Sooners enter the Big 12 portion of their schedule with a 15-8 record in non-conference play. Oklahoma is hitting a collective .282 and holds a team earned run average of 2.74. Four hitters are batting .300-or-better, including junior center fielder **Craig Aikin** (.368) at the top of the order. He has scored a league-leading 25 runs. Sophomore shortstop **Sheldon Neuse** (.318) is fourth in hitting for the Sooners with a league-leading 24 RBI, while slugging .545 with a team-high five home runs. Juniors **Kolbey Carpenter** (.338) and **Anthony Hermelyn** (.333) round out OU's group of .300-hitters. Carpenter is slugging a team-high .588 with four homers, while Hermelyn has driven in 18 runs. Oklahoma starting pitchers sport a 2.71 ERA and .231 batting average against. Sophomore RHP and Friday starter **Jake Elliott** (3-1) owns a 2.76 ERA.

On the Air... This weekend's series can be heard locally on KREF 1400 AM and KEBC 1560 AM with veteran OU broadcaster **Chris Plank** on the call. All three games will be televised by Sooner Sports TV across the FOX family of networks. **Chad McKee** (play-by-play) and Sooner baseball and MLB alum **George Frazier** (color) will call the action Friday and Sunday. **Dave Barnett** (pbp) and **Pat Combs** (color) will work Saturday's contest.

- Kolbey Carpenter was named the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week and the Big 12 Player of the Week (2/23).
- In March, Robert Tasin is hitting .353 (6-for-17) with a 0.00 ERA (5.1 IP), one win and one save.
- Aikin had a 17-game hit streak snapped at Arizona State (2/18) and a 12-game streak snapped vs. Oral Roberts (3/10).
- OU starting pitchers have lasted six or more innings in 10 out of 23 starts this season, including seven of seven or more innings.
- Oklahoma set an opening weekend attendance record with 4,181 at L. Dale Mitchell Park breaking the previous record of 4,117 set in 2011.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 553-414-2 (.572), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Red Raiders... Under third-year head coach **Tim Tadlock**, a former Sooner assistant, Texas tech is 15-6 and ranked as high as No. 10 in the national polls. The Red Raiders are coming off a trip to Omaha in 2014; a season in which they won 45 games. Designated hitter **Corey Raley**, brother of former Sooner **Russell Raley**, leads the 2015 squad with a .411 batting average and .548 slugging percentage. First baseman **Eric Gutierrez** is hitting .329 with a team-high 21 RBI on nine doubles and two home runs. At the back-end of the bullpen, RHP **Dominic Moreno** (1-2) holds a 2.59 ERA with three saves, while striking out 39 in 24.1 innings.

Walk-Off in OKC... Oklahoma eliminated No. 21 Texas Tech from the 2014 Big 12 Championship by rallying for a 9-8 win at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark on May 22. Neuse ripped the game-winning single to right to plate Carpenter and Aikin and provide a walk-off win for the Sooners. The Red Raiders put a four-spot on the board in the first and led by as many as five midway through the game.

All-Time vs. Texas Tech... Despite being swept in last season's regular season series, Oklahoma leads the all-time series with Texas Tech, 42-31-1. The series began in 1976 with a 3-0 win for the Sooners.

Big 12 Openers... The Sooners are 9-9 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after an 11-4 win over K-State (3/21/14). OU has won four of its last five conference openers. Oklahoma won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Iowa State on March 7, 1997; 7-4.

For the Record... Single to center, single down the left field line, F7, single up the middle, three-run home run to right, double to right-center, infield-single to second. That was Aikin's record-setting day with a school-record six hits as he went 6-for-7 with four runs and six RBI in a 22-0 win over Arkansas-Little Rock (3/3). Aikin's home run was the first of his career as he set career marks in both runs scored and driven in.

Kings of the K... The Sooner pitching staff leads the Big 12 with 210 strikeouts; averaging a league-best 9.13 per nine innings, which is 0.64 more per nine than the next closest team. Sophomore RHP **Alec Hansen** struck out 12 vs. Oregon State (2/22) and leads all Big 12 starters with 32. Fourth in the league is Elliott at 27. **OU pitchers have struck out 10 or more in 12 games this season.**

Up Next... Oklahoma faces a familiar Big 12 foe in a non-conference tilt when it visits TCU on Tuesday, March 24. Big 12 play resumes next weekend on the road at Baylor.

Neuse Statement Heard... Neuse claimed the Sooner's third weekly award from the Big 12 after being named the Player of the Week (3/9). He hit .688 (11-for-16) with a 1.375 slugging and .722 on-base percentage. Neuse homered three times, drove in 10 runs and scored with over a four-game stretch at home. He posted a perfect 4-for-4 day with a home run and a double against Purdue (3/7). As a freshman, Neuse was twice selected as the Big 12 Rookie of the Week in 2014.

Hits by Pitchers... Redshirt-senior Robert Tasin made 37 appearances on the mound, including five starts, in his first two seasons with OU. This year, he has pitched in eight games with two starts to a 3-1 record, 1.35 ERA and 20 strikeouts in 20 innings. To add depth to the Sooner bench and lineup from the left side of the plate, **Tasin picked up a bat this offseason and is currently hitting .310 (9-for-29) with two RBI and six starts at DH.** Junior Jacob Evans has also stepped to the plate for five at-bats this season and has two hits with two RBI.

Putting the Ball in Play... Oklahoma led the Big 12 in fewest strikeouts per game in 2014 at 4.86. Once again, the Sooners are at the top of the league; striking out at a rate of 5.09 per game. Kansas (5.40) is second and the only other team below six per game. On balls hit in play, Oklahoma is hitting .303, led by Aikin at .391.

Player of the Week... Carpenter earned Big 12 and national recognition following an 8-for-17 week with three home runs. He was named the Big 12 Player of the Week and the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball News*. **Carpenter is the second Sooner to earn the national award; first won by Mac James in 2014.**

Fresh Records... Neuse set an OU freshman record with seven triples and was second with 27 walks behind Aikin's 32 set in 2013. He also earned top-five finishes in home runs (7), hits (73), runs (43) and RBI (47) by a Sooner freshman.

40+ Years of Head Coaching... Pete Hughes' staff has totaled 41 years of head coaching experience and 1,284 wins. Mike Anderson won 337 games at Nebraska, Jamie Pinzino 212 at Assumption, Bryant and William & Mary and Scott Loiseau 176 at Southern New Hampshire.

Season Openers... Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-18 on opening day and 24-2 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-5 going back to 1962, including 33-1 at L. Dale Mitchell.

#YardWork... Oklahoma is well on its way to surpassing its 30-home run total from 2014. Through 23 games, the Sooners have gone yard 22 times, including a team-leading five from Neuse, who has homered in four of the last six games. **The Sooners rank first in the Big 12 with 22 home runs and second at 0.96 per game.** Only a sophomore, Neuse is the team's active career home run leader with 12. Junior left fielder Hunter Haley ranks second after notching his 11th at Hawai'i (3/14).

True North... Junior catcher Chris Shaw is the first Canadian to play for the Sooners since lefty J.R. Robinson (2009-10). He is the first Manitoban to ever play in the Big 12 and one of four D-I players from his home province. Eastern Michigan's roster features two, while one plays for North Dakota. **A two-time MLB pick, Shaw became the highest Manitoban selected as the 14th round pick of the Cardinals in 2014.** Shaw, whose other sport as a youth was curling, attended Okotoks Dawgs Baseball Academy in high school and was a member of Team Canada before heading to Midland College.

Slugging it Out... The Sooners are the only team in the Big 12 to hit four home runs in a game and the only team to hit four triples in a game. Oklahoma slugged four homers against BYU (2/28) in Las Vegas and tripled four times against Oregon State (2/22) in Surprise, Ariz. OU repeated its four-home run effort against Purdue (3/8).

Turning Two... The Sooners rank sixth in the country and second in the Big 12 with 24 double plays turned; averaging 1.04 per game. Oklahoma turned a season-high four vs. BYU (2/28). In 2014, OU turned just 28, averaging 0.48 per game.

Utility Blue Print... Junior Kolbey Carpenter has been a steady performer in two-plus seasons at OU. He has appeared in games at five different positions and has started every opening day since his freshman season at a different position; 1B, DH, 2B.

Value in Utility... Junior **Anthony Hermelyn** has seen a drastic change in his responsibilities from his freshman season when he started 48 games behind the dish. As a sophomore he split time between catcher and first base. This season he has added third base to his defensive duties as he earned starts at all three positions opening weekend.

Opening the Gates... Oklahoma's opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4,181. In 2014 vs. Seton Hall 3,754 fans passed through the gates; now ranked third all-time. The previous record was set in 2011 when 4,117 saw the Sooners face William & Mary, the season after reaching the 2010 College World Series. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

Opening Day Starter... Sophomore **Jake Eliott** became the first righty to start opening day for Oklahoma since **Michael Rocha** in 2011. He is also the third sophomore to earn the nod in the last four year after **Jacob Evans** (2014) and **Dillon Overton** (2012).

On the Hill... The OU pitching staff was tasked with replacing nearly 60% of its innings pitched from 2013 after losing five pitchers to the draft. **This season, the Sooners return 74% of innings pitched from a year ago.**

Starting in Center Field... Aikin has started all 23 games in center field; the only Sooner to start every game at the same position. He was the OU center fielder in 57 out of 58 games in 2014.

First Time Foes... SIUE was the first of four opponents on the schedule that Oklahoma has never played before. The Sooners has also taken on Utah and Purdue for the first time, amassing a record of 5-1 against first-time opponents. OU will also take on Alcorn State for the first time later this season.

Preseason Poll... Oklahoma landed fifth in the 2015 Big 12 Preseason Poll as voted on by the league's coaches for the second straight season. The Sooners received 38 points in the poll. TCU (64) was the unanimous No. 1 pick followed by Texas (55), Oklahoma State (47) and Texas Tech (46).

MLB Draft Picks... Last June, Oklahoma had four players selected in the draft. **Mac James** was selected in the sixth round and signed by the Tampa Bay Rays. **Connor Buchmann** went to the New York Mets in the 11th round and **Hector Lorenzana** was taken by the Boston Red Sox in the 37th. Choplick returned to OU after being drafted in the 32nd by the Chicago White Sox.

Pack The Dale... Oklahoma set a series record in attendance vs. Texas (4/11-13/14) with a three-game total of 7,269. The previous high was 6,689 against Texas in 2004. **On April 12, the Sooners hosted the second largest crowd in program history with 4,102 in attendance.** Oklahoma had 16 four-figure attendance home games and averaged 1,114 per game. **Crooked Numbers...** On the scoreboard, **Oklahoma put up two or more runs in an inning 39 times** and three-or-more 27 times in 2015. Opponents have posted a crooked number only 17 times and have scored three-or-more just nine times. The Sooners have scored a season-high five runs in an inning three times.

Lineup on Shuffle... In 2014, Oklahoma did not repeat a lineup until the 14th game of the season. The Sooners used 35 different starting lineups a year ago. **This season, OU has rolled out 17 different lineups in 23 games.**

Shave for the Brave... On April 3, 2014, OU held its "Shave for the Brave" event to join the fight against childhood cancer. **The Sooners, with a goal of \$20,000, raised over \$29,000 through the Vs. Cancer Foundation to raise money for cancer research.** Half of the money donated will be dedicated to the OU Children's Hospital. The event also served as an opportunity for the Sooners in their countdown to 19 Ways.

CONFERENCE NOTES

Oklahoma State, TCU, Texas and Texas Tech all remain ranked. Highest rankings for the four teams among the national polls for the week are: 1. TCU (Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA, USA Today), 10. Texas Tech (NCBWA), 14. Texas (Collegiate Baseball, NCBWA) and 19. Oklahoma State (NCBWA).

Big 12 teams went 19-8 against non-conference opponents in week five with a series win against every non-league foe over the weekend.

The Frogs are ranked in the top three nationally in all five polls and have been ranked in the top 10 all season on each list. TCU leads the nation with a 1.61 ERA.

The Frogs earned a sweep over Baylor to open conference play and have now won seven Big 12 series in a row dating back to last season. TCU hosts Oklahoma State this weekend with the Cowboys also holding a Big 12 series win streak of seven. OSU won each series from a season ago except its conference-opening series at Baylor. The series pits the league's top two pitching squads against each other while both teams are also in the top three in the league for batting.

Kansas head coach Ritch Price recorded his 400th victory with the program over the weekend. He is only the second coach in KU history to reach 400 wins. Price is the third coach in the Big 12 with 400 or more wins with their respective program - Baylor's Steve Smith and Texas' Augie Garrido.

Oklahoma State's Josh Holliday became the second-fastest OSU skipper to reach 100 wins. He is now one of six coaches in Cowboy history to reach the century mark in victories.

TCU's Riley Ferrell is two saves shy of entering the Big 12's career top 10 list for saves. He enters the week with 25.

Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas Tech are three of 14 teams nationally with four or more shutouts on the year.

Texas' Ben Johnson leads the Big 12 in hits, triples and total bases, ranking in the top 10 nationally in each of the three categories, including third in hits entering the week. He also leads the Big 12 in multi-hit games with 12 on the year.
