First Pitch... Oklahoma baseball is back on the road for a crucial Big 12 series at Texas this week-end. Game one of the series is scheduled for 7:00 pm Friday, April 10.

About the Sooners... The Sooners are 22-13 overall and 6-3 in Big 12 play. Five players are hitting .300-or-better, led by junior second baseman **Kolbey Carpenter** at .354. The two-time Big 12 Player of the Week leads OU with six home runs and a .577 slugging percentage. Junior center fielder **Craig Aikin** (.345) is second on the team, while scoring a team-high 29 runs. Redshirt-senior right fielder **Taylor Alspaugh** (.325), junior first baseman **Anthony Hermelyn** (.319) and sophomore shortstop **Sheldon Neuse** (.304) round out the group. Hermelyn has notched a team-leading 16 multi-hit games, while Neuse leads the way with 31 RBI. Sophomore right-handers **Jake Elliott** (3-3) and **Alec Hansen** (4-3) are at the top of the Oklahoma rotation. Elliott owns a 2.88 earned run average with 47 strikeouts and will start on Friday night. Hansen, who goes on Saturday, leads the league with 64 strikeouts and holds a 3.04 ERA.

On the Air... **Toby Rowland** (play-by-play) will call the action Friday and Sunday, while **Brendan Flynn** fills in for Saturday's game. Former Sooner **Ross Hubbard** (color commentary) will join the broadcast on Saturday and Sunday. The game can be heard locally on KREF 1400 or KEBC 1560 AM. The Longhorn Network will broadcast all three games with **Kevin Dunn** (pbp) on the call with **Greg Swindell** (color) and **Keith Moreland** (color).

- Craig Aikin set an OU single-game record with six hits vs. UALR (3/3). Sooners had recorded five hits in a game 26 times.
- Kolbey Carpenter was named the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week (2/23) and the Big 12 Player of the Week (2/23, 3/23).
- OU starting pitchers have lasted six or more innings in 18 out of 34 starts this season, including nine of seven or more innings.
- The Sooners are 2-3 against ranked opponents this season and 2-2 against top-10 teams. Both wins came against No. 10 Texas Tech (3/20-22).
- Oklahoma swept Kansas for its first Big 12 sweep since March 2013 vs. TCU at home.
- The Sooners won on two extra-inning walk-offs last weekend. They are 3-1 in extras this year and 8-2 under second-year head coach Pete Hughes.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 553-414-2 (.572), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Longhorns...Coming off an appearance at the College World Series in 2014, where it lost to eventual-champion Vanderbilt, Texas is 18-15 overall and 5-4 in the league. After ending a seven-game losing streak Tuesday, Texas looks to outfielder **Ben Johnson**, who has 24 runs scored and 22 driven in. Catcher **Tres Barrera** is a .290 hitter with a team-high five home runs. Starting the series on the mound for Texas, RHP **Parker French** (2-2) has gone 46.2 innings with a 2.31 ERA.

Last Time They Met... In a record-breaking weekend for attendance at L. Dale Mitchell Park, the No. 26 Sooners fell to the nation's No. 7 team last April in a three-game sweep. LHP **Jacob Evans** pitched five innings; surrendering four runs, three earned on eight hits and a walk, while striking out five. The Longhorns went on to plate for three runs in the fourth, a single run in the sixth, two runs in the eighth and a single run in the ninth to defeat the Sooners 8-1.

All-Time vs Texas... Currently, the Longhorns lead the Sooners in the series 125-47-2. Last year, Oklahoma was swept by Texas in a three-game series at home. In 2013, Oklahoma saw its first series victory in 15 years when they went 2-1 in Austin. Previously the Sooners had swept the Longhorns in a 3-0 series at home in 1998. **In four career appearances against UT, Evans holds a 3.45 ERA with two saves and eight strikeouts in 8.1 innings of work.**

2-for-1 Special in Stillwater... The second Bedlam game of 2014 lasted the length of two games in one sitting as the Sooners left Stillwater with a 12-9 win in 18 innings on April 15. The No. 13 Cowboys erased a five run deficit after the seventh to force extras and the two sides played eight innings of scoreless ball beginning in the 10th. Carpenter, who has homered in the seventh, picked up the game-winning RBI in the 18th with a double to left 10 minutes after minute to score **Austin O'Brien** with two away. Neuse moved to the mound to lock down the save and earn **Kindle Ladd** the win in six innings of brilliant relief. **The game lasted 5:52 with 640 pitches thrown between the two teams.**

Shave for the Brave... On April 1, the Sooners shaved their heads to support Vs. Cancer and fight childhood cancer. The team has surpassed its goal of \$20,000 for the second straight season by raising \$26,791. Half the proceeds go to the Vs. Cancer Foundation and half to OU Children's Hospital. **In 2014, the Sooners raised over \$29,000 towards childhood cancer research.**

Up Next... The Sooners return home briefly next week for a Tuesday game against Dallas Baptist before heading east for a three-game set at West Virginia.

Walk-Off AND a Win... On Thursday, Evans ignited a four-run rally with a pinch-hit single to start the ninth. After the Sooners tied the game, he went to the mound and pitched a 1-2-3 top of the 10th. Evans led off the bottom half of the inning with a solo, walk-off home run to right-center on a 3-2 pitch in just his seventh career at-bat. **Evans' homer was the first by an OU player that pitched in the same game since Ryan Mottern vs. Baylor (3/25/06).**

Working Deep... Oklahoma pitchers have combined to pitch through the sixth 18 times this season, including nine starts through the seventh. Elliott leads the team with six six-plus inning starts and Hansen has five. **Last season, OU starters pitched through the sixth 15 times in 58 games.**

Kings of the K... The Sooner pitching staff leads the Big 12 with 315 strikeouts; averaging a league-best 9.02 per nine innings. Sophomore RHP **Alec Hansen** struck out 10 vs. Texas Tech (3/22) and leads all Big 12 pitchers with 64. Fellow sophomore righty **Jake Elliott** is third in the league at 47 after not striking out a single batter Friday. **OU pitchers have combined to strike out 10-plus 19 times this season.**

Player of the Week... Hermelyn earned Big 12 Player of the Week on April 6 after hitting .529 (9-for-17) in a 4-0 week for the Sooners. He notched a multi-hit game in each, including three hits in the Saturday finale against Kansas (4/4). **Oklahoma has claimed the Big 12 Player of the Week award four times for the first time ever.**

Opening Day Roster... Former Sooner, **Chase Anderson** is the only OU alum to earn a roster spot for Major League Baseball opening day. A right-handed pitcher, Anderson was named to the Arizona Diamondbacks rotation.

Raking in the Awards... Carpenter earned Big 12 and national recognition following an 8-for-17 week with three home runs. He was named the Big 12 Player of the Week and the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball News* on February 23. **Carpenter is the second Sooner to earn the national award; first won by Mac James in 2014.** Carpenter added a second Big 12 award on March 23 after going 5-for-11 in the Texas Tech series with a 4-for-4 day and decisive, three-run home run in game two.

Complete Effort... Hansen tossed the first complete game of his career, at any level, against No. 10 Texas Tech (3/21). He struck out 10 and surrendered only three hits, while working through a choppy fifth after four, no-hit innings to start the day. **Hansen flashed a fastball at 101 MPH in the third and sustained a 97 MPH heater through the ninth.** His complete game was the first by a Sooner since **Jonathan Gray** vs. Coastal Carolina (5/31/13) in the NCAA Blacksburg Regional.

For the Record... Single to center, single down the left field line, F7, single up the middle, three-run home run to right, double to right-center, infield-single to second. That was Aikin's record-setting day with a school-record six hits as he went 6-for-7 with four runs and six RBI in a 22-0 win over Arkansas-Little Rock (3/3). Aikin's home run was the first of his career as he set career marks in both runs scored and driven in.

Neuse Statement Heard... Neuse claimed the Sooner's third weekly award from the Big 12 after being named the Player of the Week (3/9). He hit .688 (11-for-16) with a 1.375 slugging and .722 on-base percentage. Neuse homered three times and drove in 10 runs over a four-game stretch at home. He posted a perfect 4-for-4 day with a home run and a double against Purdue (3/7). As a freshman, Neuse was twice selected as the Big 12 Rookie of the Week in 2014.

Hits by Pitchers... Redshirt-senior **Robert Tasin** made 37 appearances on the mound, including five starts, in his first two seasons with OU. This year, he has pitched in 10 games with three starts across 31.1 innings. To add depth to the Sooner bench and lineup from the left side of the plate, Tasin picked up a bat this offseason and is currently hitting .225 (9-for-40) with two RBI and nine starts at DH. Junior **Jacob Evans** has also stepped to the plate for five at-bats this season and has two hits with two RBI.

Big 12 Openers... The Sooners are 9-10 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after a 6-1 loss to Texas Tech (3/20/14). OU has won four of its last six conference openers. Oklahoma won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Iowa State (3/7/97), 7-4.

True North!... Junior catcher **Chris Shaw** is the first Canadian to play for the Sooners since lefty **J.R. Robinson** (2009-10). He is the first Manitoban to ever play in the Big 12 and one of four D-I players from his home province. **A two-time MLB pick, Shaw became the highest Manitoban selected as the 14th round pick of the Cardinals in 2014.** Shaw, whose other sport as a youth was curling, attended Okotoks Dawgs Baseball Academy in high school and was also a member of Team Canada before heading to Midland College.

Turning Two... The Sooners rank sixth in the country and second in the Big 12 with 35 double plays turned; averaging 1.00 per game. Oklahoma turned a season-high four vs. BYU (2/28). In 2014, OU turned just 28, averaging 0.48 per game.

#YardWork... Oklahoma is well on its way to surpassing its 30-home run total from 2014. Through 35 games, the Sooners have gone yard 27 times, including a team-leading five from Neuse and Carpenter. **The Sooners rank second in the Big 12 with 27 home runs and 0.77 per game.** Neuse is the team's active career home run leader with 12. Junior left fielder **Hunter Haley** and Carpenter rank second at 11.

Starting in Center Field... Aikin has started all 35 games in center field; the only Sooner to start every game at the same position. He was the OU center fielder in 57 out of 58 games in 2014.

Putting the Ball in Play... Oklahoma led the Big 12 in fewest strikeouts per game in 2014 at 4.86. Once again, the Sooners are at the top of the league; striking out at a rate of 5.17 per game. Kansas (5.91) is second. On balls hit in play, Oklahoma is hitting .313, led by Aikin and Carpenter at .381. Hermelyn (.339) is the third toughest to strikeout in the Big 12 with one strikeout for every 11.0 at-bats.

Fresh Records... Neuse set an OU freshman record with seven triples and was second with 27 walks behind Aikin's 32 set in 2013. He also earned top-five finishes in home runs (7), hits (73), runs (43) and RBI (47) by a Sooner freshman.

Season Openers... Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-18 on opening day and 24-2 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-5 going back to 1962, including 33-1 at L. Dale Mitchell.

Slugging it Out... The Sooners are the only team in the Big 12 to hit four home runs in a game and the only team to hit four triples in a game. Oklahoma slugged four homers against BYU (2/28) in Las Vegas and tripled four times against Oregon State (2/22) in Surprise, Ariz. OU repeated its four-home run effort against Purdue (3/8).

On the Hill... The OU pitching staff was tasked with replacing nearly 60% of its innings pitched from 2013 after losing five pitchers to the draft. **This season, the Sooners return 74% of innings pitched from a year ago.**

Utility Blue Print... Junior **Kolbey Carpenter** has been a steady performer in two-plus seasons at OU. He has appeared in games at five different positions and has started every opening day since his freshman season at a different position; 1B, DH, 2B.

40+ Years of Head Coaching... **Pete Hughes'** staff has totaled 41 years of head coaching experience and 1,291 wins. **Mike Anderson** won 337 games at Nebraska, **Jamie Pinzino** 212 at Assumption, Bryant and William & Mary and **Scott Loiseau** 176 at Southern New Hampshire.

Value in Utility... Junior **Anthony Hermelyn** has seen a drastic change in his responsibilities from his freshman season when he started 48 games behind the dish. As a sophomore he split time between catcher and first base. This season he has added third base to his defensive duties as he earned starts at all three positions opening weekend.

CONFERENCE NOTES

- TCU remains ranked in the top 10 of all four national polls, including as high as No. 3, while Oklahoma State is also ranked on all four lists, with its highest spot at No. 9. Texas Tech (No. 23) and Texas (No. 25) are also ranked this week while Oklahoma is receiving votes in two polls.
- With a series sweep of Texas last weekend, Oklahoma State extended its program-record Big 12 series win streak to 10. It marked the third time the Cowboys have swept Texas (2008, 1999).
- OSU sits alone atop the league standings, while TCU and Oklahoma are tied for second. All three teams are on the road in Big 12 play this weekend as six weekends remain in the conference season.
- The Big 12 had two nights in a row in which a player who got the win in relief then hit the game-winning walk-off home run as Jacob Evans did it for Oklahoma in 11 innings over KU last Thursday, while OSU's Corey Hassel accomplished the feat in the Cowboys' 18-inning victory vs. Texas on Friday.
- TCU's Riley Ferrell has entered the Big 12's top 10 list for career saves. Ferrell's 27 career saves is tied for 10th all-time on the league chart. The record is 41 by Texas' Huston Street.
- West Virginia will play its first true home games of the season this weekend as the Mountaineers host Butler at Monongalia County Ballpark. WVU has played 22 road games, three neutral games and moved four contests originally scheduled for play in Morgantown.
- Despite a seven-game losing streak, 10 of Texas' 15 losses have been by two runs or less. The Sooners have had the most one-run contests of all league teams this season with 11 on the year (6-5).
- TCU is one of four teams nationally with six or more shutouts on the season. The Frogs continue to lead the nation in ERA while three additional Big 12 squads also rank in the top 30 - 8. Oklahoma State, 26. Oklahoma, 30. Texas.
- Baylor and TCU rank in the top 15 of the NCAA stat's "toughest schedules" thus far in the season as both teams' past opposition have combined for records of .600 or better.
- The Oklahoma baseball team leads over 60 teams nationally raising funds for the Vs Cancer Foundation as the Sooners have raised over \$25,000 with proceeds benefit research for childhood cancer.
