**First Pitch...** Oklahoma baseball finishes off a stretch of seven out of eight games on the road with a Big 12 series at West Virginia. Game times are set for 5:00 pm Friday, 3:00 pm Saturday and 11:00 am on Sunday. All times listed are central.

**About the Sooners...** The No. 23 Sooners hit the road with an overall record of 24-15 and are tied atop of the Big 12 standings with Oklahoma State at 8-4. Junior center fielder **Craig Aikin** leads Oklahoma with a .358 batting average, 32 runs scored and 10 doubles. Junior second baseman **Kolbey Carpenter** is second at .336 with a team-high six home runs and .530 slugging percentage to go with 27 RBI. Redshirt-senior right fielder **Taylor Alspaugh** has reached base in 14 straight games and sports a .321 average. Junior first baseman **Anthony Hermelyn** (.312) and sophomore short-stop **Sheldon Neuse** (.302) round out a group of five Sooners hitting .300-or-better. Sophomore right-handers **Jake Elliott** (3-3) and **Alec Hansen** (4-4) will start the Friday and Saturday games for OU. Elliott owns a 2.68 earned run average to go with 50 strikeouts and a .222 batting average against. Hansen has struck out a team-high 69 with a 3.40 ERA, while opponents are hitting just .224 off him.

**On the Air...** The "Voice of the Sooners" **Toby Rowland** will call all of the play-by-play action on the Sooner Sports Network from Morgantown this weekend. The game can be heard locally in the Norman area on KREF Sportstalk 1400 AM and KEBC 1560 AM The Franchise 2.

### Leading Off

• Craig Aikin set an OU single-game record with six hits vs. UALR (3/3). Sooners had recorded five hits in a game 26 times.

• Kolbey Carpenter was named the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week (2/23) and the Big 12 Player of the Week (2/23, 3/23).

• OU starting pitchers have lasted six or more innings in 20 out of 39 starts this season, including 10 of seven or more innings.

• The Sooners are 4-6 against ranked opponents this season and 2-2 against top-10 teams.

• Oklahoma's junior class became the first-ever to win two series against the Longhorns in Austin. Before 2013, OU last won a series at Texas in 1997.

• The Sooners won on two extra-inning walk-offs vs. Kansas. They are 4-1 in extras this year and 9-2 under second-year head coach Pete Hughes.

## HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 553-414-2 (.572), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

**Scouting the Mountaineers...** In its third year in the Big 12 under head coach **Randy Mazey**, West Virginia is 21-13 this season and 4-5 in league play. **Kyle Davis** leads the squad with a .378 batting average on 54 hits with 30 runs. Tied for 11th in the NCAA with 35 homeruns this season, the Mountaineers are led by shortstop **Taylor Munden's** eight homers and 22 RBI. On the mound for the game one of the series, RHP **BJ Myers** gets the ball. He has 33 strikeouts 39 innings.

**Last Time They Met...** Coming into the last game of the series tied 1-1, OU took an early four-run lead with a two-run home run by **Mac James** in the first. The Sooners got two more runs before surrendering nine-unanswered to West Virginia that started with a three-run homerun by **Cameron O'Brien**. West Virginia won the game 9-5.

**All-Time vs. West Virginia...** Since joining the Big 12 in 2013, the Mountaineers lead the Sooners 4-2 with the all-time series at 4-3 dating back to 2012. In their first meeting, on March 10, 2012 in Eugene, Ore. at the NIKE Showcase, No. 16 Oklahoma beat West Virginia, 5-2. **Dillon Overton** pitched a complete game, while striking out six and walking none.

**Shave for the Brave...** On April 1, the Sooners shaved their heads to support Vs. Cancer and fight childhood cancer. The team has surpassed its goal of \$20,000 for the second straight season by raising \$26,791. Half the proceeds go to the Vs. Cancer Foundation and half to OU Children's Hospital. **In 2014, the Sooners raised over \$29,000 towards childhood cancer research.**

**Reaching the Charts...** Oklahoma is ranked for the first time in 2015 as it reached No. 23 in the *Collegiate Baseball News* Top-30. The Sooners, who are 4-5 against ranked opponents this season, were last ranked on April 7, 2014 when they were No. 26 by *CBN* and No. 28 by *NCBWA*. The ranking marks the highest for OU under second-year head coach **Pete Hughes**.

**Up Next...** The Sooners return to L. Dale Mitchell Park for a five-game home swing next week. A week of non-conference action starts with two against Alcorn State (4/21-22) before Sam Houston on the weekend.

**Walk-Off AND a Win...** On April 2, junior **Jacob Evans** ignited a four-run rally with a pinch-hit single to start the ninth. After the Sooners tied the game, he went to the mound and pitched a 1-2-3 top of the 10th. Evans led off the bottom half of the inning with a solo, walk-off home run to right-center on a 3-2 pitch in just his seventh career at-bat. **Evans' homer was the first by an OU player that pitched in the same game since Ryan Mottern vs. Baylor (3/25/06).**

**Working Deep...** Oklahoma pitchers have combined to pitch through the sixth 20 times this season, including 10 starts through the seventh. Elliott leads the team with seven six-plus inning starts and Hansen has five. **Last season, OU starters pitched through the sixth 15 times in 58 games.**

**Kings of the K...** The Sooner pitching staff leads the Big 12 with 347 strikeouts; averaging a league-best 8.86 per nine innings. Sophomore RHP **Alec Hansen** struck out 10 vs. Texas Tech (3/22) and leads all Big 12 pitchers with 69. Fellow sophomore righty **Jake Elliott** is fourth in the league at 50. **OU pitchers have combined to strike out 10-plus 20 times this season.**

**Player of the Week...** Hermelyn earned Big 12 Player of the Week on April 6 after hitting .529 (9-for-17) in a 4-0 week for the Sooners. He notched a multi-hit game in each, including three hits in the Saturday finale against Kansas (4/4). **Oklahoma has claimed the Big 12 Player of the Week award four times for the first time ever.**

**Opening Day Roster...** Former Sooner, **Chase Anderson** is the only OU alum to earn a roster spot for Major League Baseball opening day. A right-handed pitcher, Anderson was named to the Arizona Diamondbacks rotation.

**Raking in the Awards...** Carpenter earned Big 12 and national recognition following an 8-for-17 week with three home runs. He was named the Big 12 Player of the Week and the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball News* on February 23. **Carpenter is the second Sooner to earn the national award; first won by Mac James in 2014.** Carpenter added a second Big 12 award on March 23 after going 5-for-11 in the Texas Tech series with a 4-for-4 day and decisive, three-run home run in game two.

**Complete Effort...** Hansen tossed the first complete game of his career, at any level, against No. 10 Texas Tech (3/21). He struck out 10 and surrendered only three hits, while working through a choppy fifth after four, no-hit innings to start the day. **Hansen flashed a fastball at 101 MPH in the third and sustained a 97 MPH heater through the ninth.** His complete game was the first by a Sooner since **Jonathan Gray** vs. Coastal Carolina (5/31/13) in the NCAA Blacksburg Regional.

**For the Record...** Single to center, single down the left field line, F7, single up the middle, three-run home run to right, double to right-center, infield-single to second. That was Aikin's record-setting day with a school-record six hits as he went 6-for-7 with four runs and six RBI in a 22-0 win over Arkansas-Little Rock (3/3). Aikin's home run was the first of his career as he set career marks in both runs scored and driven in.

**200 Hits and Counting...** In the series opener at Texas (4/10), Aikin collected the 200th hit of his career with a single in the second and later came around to score. He is the 17th player on record at OU to reach the 200-hit mark and the first since **Max White**, who finished his career with 269, in 2013. Aikin's career total is up to 207.

**Neuse Statement Heard...** Neuse claimed the Sooner's third weekly award from the Big 12 after being named the Player of the Week (3/9). He hit .688 (11-for-16) with a 1.375 slugging and .722 on-base percentage. Neuse homered three times and drove in 10 runs over a four-game stretch at home. He posted a perfect 4-for-4 day with a home run and a double against Purdue (3/7). As a freshman, Neuse was twice selected as the Big 12 Rookie of the Week in 2014.

**Hits by Pitchers...** Redshirt-senior **Robert Tasin** made 37 appearances on the mound, including five starts, in his first two seasons with OU. This year, he has pitched in 10 games with three starts across 31.1 innings. To add depth to the Sooner bench and lineup from the left side of the plate, Tasin picked up a bat this offseason and is currently hitting .255 (14-for-55) with six RBI. Junior **Jacob Evans** has also stepped to the plate for 12 at-bats this season and has five hits, including a walk-off home run.

**Big 12 Openers...** The Sooners are 9-10 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after a 6-1 loss to Texas Tech (3/20/14). OU has won four of its last six conference openers. Oklahoma won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Iowa State (3/7/97), 7-4.

**Turning Two...** The Sooners rank seventh in the country and second in the Big 12 with 41 double plays turned; averaging 1.05 per game. Oklahoma turned a season-high four vs. BYU (2/28). In 2014, OU turned just 28, averaging 0.48 per game.

**True North!...** Junior catcher **Chris Shaw** is the first Canadian to play for the Sooners since lefty **J.R. Robinson** (2009-10). He is the first Manitoban to ever play in the Big 12 and one of four D-I players from his home province. **A two-time MLB pick, Shaw became the highest Manitoban selected as the 14th round pick of the Cardinals in 2014.** Shaw, whose other sport as a youth was curling, attended Okotoks Dawgs Baseball Academy in high school and was also a member of Team Canada before heading to Midland College.

**#YardWork...** Oklahoma is well on its way to surpassing its 30-home run total from 2014. Through 38 games, the Sooners have gone yard 27 times, including a team-leading five from Neuse and Carpenter. **The Sooners rank second in the Big 12 with 27 home runs and 0.69 per game.** Neuse is the team's active career home run leader with 12. Junior left fielder **Hunter Haley** and Carpenter rank second at 11.

**Starting in Center Field...** Aikin has started all 39 games in center field; the only Sooner to start every game at the same position. He was the OU center fielder in 57 out of 58 games in 2014.

**Fresh Records...** Neuse set an OU freshman record with seven triples and was second with 27 walks behind Aikin's 32 set in 2013. He also earned top-five finishes in home runs (7), hits (73), runs (43) and RBI (47) by a Sooner freshman.

**Putting the Ball in Play...** Oklahoma led the Big 12 in fewest strikeouts per game in 2014 at 4.86. Once again, the Sooners are at the top of the league; striking out at a rate of 5.15 per game. Kansas (5.80) is second. On balls hit in play, Oklahoma is hitting .317, led by Aikin and Carpenter at .400. Hermelyn (.331) is the third toughest to strikeout in the Big 12 with one strikeout for every 11.0 at-bats.

**Season Openers...** Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-18 on opening day and 24-2 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-5 going back to 1962, including 33-1 at L. Dale Mitchell.

**Slugging it Out...** The Sooners are the only team in the Big 12 to hit four home runs in a game and the only team to hit four triples in a game. Oklahoma slugged four homers against BYU (2/28) in Las Vegas and tripled four times against Oregon State (2/22) in Surprise, Ariz. OU repeated its four-home run effort against Purdue (3/8).

**On the Hill...** The OU pitching staff was tasked with replacing nearly 60% of its innings pitched from 2013 after losing five pitchers to the draft. **This season, the Sooners return 74% of innings pitched from a year ago.**

**Utility Blue Print...** Junior **Kolbey Carpenter** has been a steady performer in two-plus seasons at OU. He has appeared in games at five different positions and has started every opening day since his freshman season at a different position; 1B, DH, 2B.

**40+ Years of Head Coaching...** **Pete Hughes'** staff has totaled 41 years of head coaching experience and 1,302 wins. **Mike Anderson** won 337 games at Nebraska, **Jamie Pinzino** 212 at Assumption, Bryant and William & Mary and **Scott Loiseau** 176 at S. New Hampshire.

**Value in Utility...** Junior **Anthony Hermelyn** has seen a drastic change in his responsibilities from his freshman season when he started 48 games behind the dish. As a sophomore he split time between catcher and first base. This season he has added third base to his defensive duties as he earned starts at all three positions opening weekend.

**Crooked Numbers...** On the scoreboard, **Oklahoma has put up two or more runs in an inning 58 times** and three-or-more 37 times in 2015. Opponents have posted a crooked number only 37 times and have scored three-or-more just 21 times. The Sooners scored a season-high eight runs in an inning at Baylor (3/29).

**Lineup on Shuffle...** In 2014, Oklahoma did not repeat a lineup until the 14th game of the season. The Sooners used 35 different starting lineups a year ago. **This season, OU has rolled out 25 different lineups in 39 games.**

### CONFERENCE NOTES

- ✚ Oklahoma joins Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas Tech as league teams ranked entering this week's play. The Sooners check in at No. 23 on the *Collegiate Baseball* list and are also receiving votes in the USA Today Coaches' poll. TCU remains ranked in the top 10 in all five polls.
- ✚ The Sooners moved into a tie with Oklahoma State for first place in the league standings with a 2-1 series win at Texas.
- ✚ The league's two top-ranked teams, Oklahoma State and TCU, suffered conference series losses on the road over the weekend as Kansas snapped OSU's conference series win streak of 10 and K-State ended its Big 12 series losing streak of seven with a 2-1 series win over the Frogs.
- ✚ Each league team has four remaining conference series left in the regular season, except for KU and WVU, which have five. Four of WVU's remaining Big 12 series will be in Morgantown. Texas and Texas Tech will play three of its four remaining league series on the road.
- ✚ TCU's Preston Morrison, this week's Big 12 Pitcher of the Week, threw his fifth complete game shutout while competing in the Conference last weekend. The five shutouts rank second on the Big 12 career list. Morrison became one of 10 hurlers to win the Big 12 Pitcher of the Week honor four or more times in their career.
- ✚ Four Oklahoma players rank in the top 10 in the league in hits, while the Sooners have five players with 12 or more multi-hit games this season - the most of any team in the conference.
- ✚ The league's top two hitters are both freshman as TCU's Connor Wanhnen and WVU's Kyle Davis sit first and second for batting average. The last time a freshman led the conference in hitting was 2008 (Oklahoma State's Thomas Belza, .386).
- ✚ West Virginia opened its new Monongalia County Ballpark over the weekend totaling a three-game attendance of 6,968 - the most to ever attend a weekend series in Morgantown.
- ✚ The Big 12 is one of two conferences with multiple teams (5. TCU and 6. Oklahoma State) ranked in the top 10 nationally in ERA (Big West). The Big 12 has five teams ranked in the top 50 (55 percent is the most of all leagues).
- ✚ With its next win, OSU will become the 17th program in Division I history to reach 2,500 victories.
