**The Bedlam Series...** In 2014, the Bedlam Series stretched into the Big 12 Tournament and spanned seven games throughout the season. The No. 25 Oklahoma baseball team hosts No. 11 Oklahoma State in this year's series beginning Friday at 7:00 pm in Tulsa; seeking to avenge a non-conference defeat earlier in April.

**About the Sooners...** The No. 25 Sooners are looking to end a short, three-game slide and push their 29-19 overall record to the 30-win mark and jostle for position at the top of the Big 12 with a 10-5 conference record. Junior second baseman **Kolbey Carpenter**, a three-time Big 12 Player of the Week honoree, leads Oklahoma with a .372 batting average and .574 slugging percentage on eight home runs. Junior center fielder **Craig Aikin** is second on the team at .348 with 38 runs scored and a team-leading 12 doubles. Junior first baseman/catcher **Anthony Hermelyn** is hitting .305 with 32 RBI on 10 doubles and two home runs after going deep on Tuesday at Wichita State. The OU rotation is anchored by Friday starter and sophomore right-hander **Jake Elliott**. He is 4-3 with a 2.15 earned run average.

**On the Air...** Veteran OU broadcasters **Toby Rowland** (play-by-play) and **Chris Plank** (sideline) will call all of the action on The Sooner Sports Network. Sooner Sports TV will broadcast Friday night's game from Tulsa on FOX College Sports-Central with **Chad McKee** (pbp) and former MLB All-Star **Mickey Tettleton** (color) on the call. The two in OKC will be streamed on SoonerSports.tv.

### Leading Off

- Craig Aikin set an OU single-game record with six hits vs. UALR (3/3). Sooners had recorded five hits in a game 26 times.
- Kolbey Carpenter was named the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week (2/23) and the Big 12 Player of the Week (2/23, 3/23, 4/20).
- OU starting pitchers have lasted six or more innings in 26 out of 48 starts this season, including 12 of seven or more innings.
- The Sooners are 4-6 against ranked opponents this season and 2-2 against top-10 teams.
- Oklahoma's junior class became the first-ever to win two series against the Longhorns in Austin. Before 2013, OU last won a series at Texas in 1997.
- The Sooners won on two extra-inning walk-offs vs. Kansas. They are 4-2 in extras this year and 9-3 under second-year head coach Pete Hughes.

## HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 553-414-2 (.572), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

**Scouting the Cowboys...** Ranked No. 11 nationally, Oklahoma State leads the Big 12 with 12-6 conference record and sits at 29-14 overall. In his third year with the program, head coach **Josh Holliday** led the Cowboys to their first Big 12 Conference championship in 2014 and back-to-back NCAA Tournaments appearances. Second baseman **Tim Arakawa**, who has scored a team-high 34 runs and driven in 32, is hitting .301, while outfielder **Corey Hassel** leads the way at .316. Left-hander **Michael Freeman** (7-2) gets the nod Friday with a 1.17 ERA.

**Bedlam 2014...** In last year's Bedlam, Oklahoma went 1-2, salvaging the final game of the regular season with an 8-1 win over No. 6 Oklahoma State. Hermelyn led the offense with two hits and two RBI. With four runs in the first, Oklahoma led for the first time in the three-game series. The Sooners saw two more runs in both the fourth and eighth innings to solidify the win.

**All-Time vs. Oklahoma State...** Winning the first game of a 70-year tradition, Oklahoma trails Oklahoma State in the all-time record 111-117. The Sooners hold the longest win-streak of the series an 11-game stretch from 1976 to 1978. Last year the Sooners held a 2-5 season record against the Cowboys.

**Shave for the Brave...** On April 1, the Sooners shaved their heads to support Vs. Cancer and fight childhood cancer. The team has surpassed its goal of \$20,000 for the second straight season by raising \$26,791. Half the proceeds go to the Vs. Cancer Foundation and half to OU Children's Hospital. **In 2014, the Sooners raised over \$29,000 towards childhood cancer research.**

**Reaching the Charts...** On April 13, Oklahoma became ranked for the first time in 2015 as it reached No. 23 in the *Collegiate Baseball News* Top-30. The Sooners, who are 4-6 against ranked opponents this season, were last ranked on April 7, 2014 when they were No. 26 by *CBN* and No. 28 by *NCBWA*. The ranking marks the highest for OU under second-year head coach **Pete Hughes**. The Sooners are currently ranked No. 25 by *CBN*.

**Up Next...** Oklahoma is off in the midweek before heading to Kansas State for a three-game series beginning May 8.

**Walk-Off AND a Win...** On April 2, junior **Jacob Evans** ignited a four-run rally with a pinch-hit single to start the ninth. After the Sooners tied the game, he went to the mound and pitched a 1-2-3 top of the 10th. Evans led off the bottom half of the inning with a solo, walk-off home run to right-center on a 3-2 pitch in just his seventh career at-bat. **Evans' homer was the first by an OU player that pitched in the same game since Ryan Mottern vs. Baylor (3/25/06).**

**Working Deep...** Oklahoma pitchers have combined to pitch through the sixth 26 times this season, including 12 starts through the seventh. Elliott leads the team with nine six-plus inning starts and Hansen has five. **Last season, OU starters pitched through the sixth 15 times in 58 games.**

**Kings of the K...** The Sooner pitching staff leads the Big 12 with 429 strikeouts; averaging a 8.91 per nine innings. Sophomore RHP **Alec Hansen** struck out 10 vs. Texas Tech (3/22) and leads all Big 12 pitchers with 81. Fellow sophomore righty **Jake Elliott** is fourth in the league at 65. **OU pitchers have combined to strike out 10-plus 24 times this season.**

**Bases Loaded...** Carpenter earned a record-setting third Big 12 Player of the Week honor on April 20. **Carpenter became the first Sooner to ever earn the award three times in a season and just the third in league history to do so.** He hit .421 (8-for-19) in a 2-2 week for Oklahoma. Carpenter slugged .684 with a .450 on-base percentage for an impressive 1.134 OPS. He hit the decisive two-run home run in a 2-0 win at West Virginia (4/17) in a two-hit night before adding a two-hit game on Saturday and a three-hit game on Sunday.

**Opening Day Roster...** Former Sooner, **Chase Anderson** earned a roster spot for Major League Baseball opening day. A right-handed pitcher, Anderson was named to the Arizona Diamondbacks rotation.

**Raking in the Awards...** Carpenter earned Big 12 and national recognition following an 8-for-17 week with three home runs. He was named the Big 12 Player of the Week and the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball News* on February 23. **Carpenter is the second Sooner to earn the national award; first won by Mac James in 2014.** Carpenter added a second Big 12 award on March 23 after going 5-for-11 in the Texas Tech series with a 4-for-4 day and decisive, three-run home run in game two.

**Hermelyn Leads the Way...** Hermelyn earned Big 12 Player of the Week on April 6 after hitting .529 (9-for-17) in a 4-0 week for the Sooners. He notched a multi-hit game in each, including three hits in the Saturday finale against Kansas (4/4). **Oklahoma has claimed the Big 12 Player of the Week award four times for the first time ever.**

**Complete Effort...** Hansen tossed the first complete game of his career, at any level, against No. 10 Texas Tech (3/21). He struck out 10 and surrendered only three hits, while working through a choppy fifth after four, no-hit innings to start the day. **Hansen flashed a fastball at 101 MPH in the third and sustained a 97 MPH heater through the ninth.** His complete game was the first by a Sooner since **Jonathan Gray** vs. Coastal Carolina (5/31/13) in the NCAA Blacksburg Regional.

**For the Record...** Single to center, single down the left field line, F7, single up the middle, three-run home run to right, double to right-center, infield-single to second. That was Aikin's record-setting day with a school-record six hits as he went 6-for-7 with four runs and six RBI in a 22-0 win over Arkansas-Little Rock (3/3). Aikin's home run was the first of his career as he set career marks in both runs scored and driven in.

**200 Hits and Counting...** In the series opener at Texas (4/10), Aikin collected the 200th hit of his career with a single in the second and later came around to score. He is the 17th player on record at OU to reach the 200-hit mark and the first since **Max White**, who finished his career with 269, in 2013. Aikin's career total is up to 219 as he has passed MLB veterans **Greg Norton** (206) and **Damon Minor** (210).

**Neuse Statement Heard...** Neuse claimed the Sooner's third weekly award from the Big 12 after being named the Player of the Week (3/9). He hit .688 (11-for-16) with a 1.375 slugging and .722 on-base percentage. Neuse homered three times and drove in 10 runs over a four-game stretch at home. He posted a perfect 4-for-4 day with a home run and a double against Purdue (3/7). As a freshman, Neuse was twice selected as the Big 12 Rookie of the Week in 2014.

**Hits by Pitchers...** Redshirt-senior **Robert Tasin** made 37 appearances on the mound, including five starts, in his first two seasons with OU. This year, he has pitched in 14 games with seven starts across 56 innings. To add depth to the Sooner bench and lineup from the left side of the plate, Tasin picked up a bat this offseason and is currently hitting .288 (21-for-73) with 12 RBI. Junior **Jacob Evans** has also stepped to the plate for 19 at-bats this season and has seven hits, including a walk-off home run, and five RBI.

**Turning Two...** The Sooners rank seventh in the country and second in the Big 12 with 47 double plays turned; averaging 0.98 per game. Oklahoma turned a season-high four vs. BYU (2/28). In 2014, OU turned just 28, averaging 0.48 per game.

**True North!...** Junior catcher **Chris Shaw** is the first Canadian to play for the Sooners since lefty **J.R. Robinson** (2009-10). He is the first Manitoban to ever play in the Big 12 and one of four D-I players from his home province. **A two-time MLB pick, Shaw became the highest Manitoban selected as the 14th round pick of the Cardinals in 2014.** Shaw, whose other sport as a youth was curling, attended Okotoks Dawgs Baseball Academy in high school and was also a member of Team Canada before heading to Midland College.

**Starting in Center Field...** Aikin has started all 48 games in center field; the only Sooner to start every game at the same position. He was the OU center fielder in 57 out of 58 games in 2014.

**#YardWork...** Oklahoma surpassed its 30-home run total from 2014 with Shaw hitting the team's 31st of the season against Sam Houston State (4/25). Through 48 games, the Sooners have gone yard 32 times, including a team-leading eight from Carpenter. Neuse and Carpenter are the team's active career home run leaders with 13. Junior left fielder **Hunter Haley** follows with 11.

**Big 12 Openers...** The Sooners are 9-10 in the first Big 12 match-up of the season after a 6-1 loss to Texas Tech (3/20/14). OU has won four of its last six conference openers. Oklahoma won its first Big 12 game in the league opener vs. Iowa State (3/7/14), 7-4.

**Fresh Records...** Neuse set an OU freshman record with seven triples and was second with 27 walks behind Aikin's 32 set in 2013. He also earned top-five finishes in home runs (7), hits (73), runs (43) and RBI (47) by a Sooner freshman.

**Putting the Ball in Play...** Oklahoma led the Big 12 in fewest strikeouts per game in 2014 at 4.86. Once again, the Sooners are at the top of the league; striking out at a rate of 5.54 per game. Kansas (5.95) is second. On balls hit in play, Oklahoma is hitting .319, led by Carpenter (.408) and Aikin (.386). Hermelyn (.329) is the third toughest to strikeout in the Big 12 with one strikeout for every 10.4 at-bats.

**Season Openers...** Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-18 on opening day and 24-2 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-1 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-5 going back to 1962, including 33-1 at L. Dale Mitchell.

**Slugging it Out...** The Sooners are the only team in the Big 12 to hit four home runs in a game and the only team to hit four triples in a game. Oklahoma slugged four homers against BYU (2/28) in Las Vegas and tripled four times against Oregon State (2/22) in Surprise, Ariz. OU repeated its four-home run effort against Purdue (3/8).

**On the Hill...** The OU pitching staff was tasked with replacing nearly 60% of its innings pitched from 2013 after losing five pitchers to the draft. **This season, the Sooners return 74% of innings pitched from a year ago.**

**Utility Blue Print...** Junior **Kolbey Carpenter** has been a steady performer in two-plus seasons at OU. He has appeared in games at five different positions and has started every opening day since his freshman season at a different position; 1B, DH, 2B.

**40+ Years of Head Coaching...** **Pete Hughes'** staff has totaled 41 years of head coaching experience and 1,306 wins. **Mike Anderson** won 337 games at Nebraska, **Jamie Pinzino** 212 at Assumption, Bryant and William & Mary and **Scott Loiseau** 176 at S. New Hampshire.

### CONFERENCE NOTES

❗ Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas Tech remain ranked this week with TCU staying in the top 5 of all five national polls, including a spot as high as No. 4. The Frogs and Cowboys appear are ranked on all five lists and are also No. 7 and No. 13 in this week's NCAA RPI, respectively.

❗ For the second week in a row, four of the Big 12's teams ranked 1-5 in the standings will face off with a pivotal Bedlam series between Oklahoma and Oklahoma State. Meanwhile, fourth-ranked Texas Tech will travel to fifth-place Texas. Oklahoma and TCU will meet in the last weekend of the regular season in Norman. West Virginia's final three conference series include TCU, Oklahoma State and Texas Tech.

❗ The Bedlam series will pit the league's top two pitching staffs in conference games against each other. OSU holds a 2.12 ERA in conference contests this year, while OU's staff has a 2.78.

❗ The Frogs earned their second straight series sweep of Texas over the weekend, extending their winning streak to eight contests. It is the fourth-longest active streak in the nation, while their 12-straight home victories is the longest active streak in the nation.

❗ Of the 25 conference series played this season, only six (24 percent) have resulted in sweeps, with TCU the only team with multiple sweeps on the year (vs. Baylor, vs. Texas). A league team has yet to record a road sweep on the season.

❗ With his recognition this week, Oklahoma State's Michael Freeman became the third pitcher in league history to win the Big 12 Pitcher of the Week honor four times in the same season, joining Harrison Musgrave (WVU, 2013) and Ryan Rupe (TAMU, 1998). The Cowboys have tallied eight weekly awards this season.

❗ Last weekend, K-State snapped a Big 12 series road losing streak of six with its first series win at Waco in program history. Brad Hill recorded his 800th career win in the series.

❗ With his next victory, TCU head coach Jim Schlossnagle will notch win No. 500 during his tenure with the Frogs.

❗ TCU currently leads the league in batting average and ERA (all games). The last time a team finished the season leading the league in both categories was 2008 (Oklahoma State) and the feat has only been achieved three times total (2000 - Nebraska and 1997 - Texas Tech).
