A TEXAS TECH WIN WOULD...

- Make Texas Tech bowl eligible for the 37th time in program history and 23rd time in the past 25 seasons.
- Mark Texas Tech's first victory over a ranked opponent since defeating No. 16 Arizona State in the 2013 Holiday Bowl and first road win over a top-25 since topping No. 21 TCU in triple overtime in 2012.
- Give Texas Tech four-straight road victories (not including neutral sites) for the first time since the start of the 2008 season (at Nevada, K-State, Texas A&M and Kansas).
- Give Texas Tech three-straight Big 12 victories for the first time since defeating Kansas, Iowa State and West Virginia during the 2013 season.

TOP GAMEDAY STORYLINES

- Texas Tech enters its meeting with Oklahoma averaging 49.4 points per game which ranks third nationally behind only fellow Big 12 Conference members Baylor and TCU.
- This will be the 23rd all-time meeting in the series between Texas Tech and Oklahoma. The Sooners are 16-6 all-time against the Red Raiders and 9-2 in games played in Norman.
- The Red Raiders head into Saturday's game having scored at least 30 points in each of the first seven games of this season. Texas Tech has not previously had a team record 30 or more points in its first eight games of a season since 2008.
- Texas Tech boasts one of the most high-powered offenses in the country as the Red Raiders currently rank second nationally in total offense as well as passing offense.
- Texas Tech has scored 346 points through seven games this year, putting the Red Raiders on pace to break the school's single-season record of 569 points (43.8 per game) in 2008.
- Texas Tech is the only school in the country to have 10 different players catch a touchdown reception this season.
- Through four games in Big 12 Conference play, Texas Tech has already scored 50 or more points twice, marking just the sixth time in program history where the Red Raiders have had multiple 50-plus point performances against league foes (1953, 2002, 2003, 2005, 2008 and 2015).
- Texas Tech is averaging 45.8 points per game in Big 12 play despite already facing two top-five ranked opponents.
- The Texas Tech defense has fared well in forcing turnovers this season as the Red Raiders rank 11th nationally in the category and 17th in turnover margin.
- Behind the arm of Patrick Mahomes II, Texas Tech leads all power-five schools with 427.6 yards per game in the air. Mahomes, meanwhile, ranks third nationally in total offense as he averages 408.1 yards per game and 374.7 through the air.

TEXAS TECH TRAVELS TO NO. 17 OKLAHOMA ON SATURDAY

Texas Tech will travel to Norman, Okla. this Saturday, Oct. 24 to take on No. 17/15 Oklahoma at Gaylord Family Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. Kickoff is slated for 2:30 p.m. CT.

The game will be televised nationally on ABC with a reverse mirror on ESPN2. Adam Amin (play-by-play), Kelly Stouffer (analyst) and Olivia Harlan (sidelines) will call the game live from Memorial Stadium in Norman, Okla., while Brian Boyle will handle production.

Fans may tune into one of the 44 region-wide affiliates of the Texas Tech Radio Network. Brian Jensen returns to the broadcast booth as play-by-play announcer for his 16th consecutive season and is joined by veteran John Harris, who will be in his 33rd year of providing analysis. In his sixth season, Chris Level rounds out the crew as sideline reporter.

On a two-game win streak, Texas Tech (5-2, 2-2 Big 12) enters the contest after a 30-20 win at Kansas on Saturday. That victory gave Texas Tech its fifth win of the year, one more win than it registered during the 2014 season. Previously, the Red Raiders played one of the nation's most difficult three-game stretches that included a win at previously ranked Arkansas and back-to-back losses to consecutive top-5 ranked teams in No. 3 TCU (55-52 loss at home) and No. 5 Baylor (63-35 loss at AT&T Stadium in Arlington). It marked the first time in school history that Texas Tech faced two consecutive nationally ranked top-5 teams in back-to-back weeks.

In Oklahoma (5-1, 2-1 Big 12), Texas Tech faces its fifth Big 12 opponent of the year and plays its 1,007th all-time football game as the Red Raiders own a 549-425-32 all-time football record in 91 total seasons. The Red Raiders have accumulated 55 winning seasons and advanced to 36 bowl games. Last year, Texas Tech finished a disappointing 4-8 overall and 2-7 in the Big 12 Conference. The sub-.500 season marked Texas Tech's only second sub-.500 season in the last 22 years. With a win over Oklahoma, Texas Tech will be bowl eligible for the 23rd time in the last 25 seasons.

The Sooners are Texas Tech's third nationally ranked opponent of the year. Oklahoma enters the game ranked No. 17 in the Associated Press poll and No. 15 in the Amway coaches' poll. Texas Tech's last road win against a nationally ranked top-25 opponent was on Oct. 20, 2012, a 56-53 triple overtime win at No. 21 TCU (coaches' poll). Tech's last road win at an Associated Press top-25 ranked opponent was at No. 3 Oklahoma, 41-38, on Oct. 22, 2011.

Oklahoma enters Saturday's contest following a 55-0 road win at Kansas State. The victory came one week after a 24-17 loss to Texas.

TEXAS TECH-OKLAHOMA SERIES

- Texas Tech and Oklahoma meet for the 23rd time in series history with OU holding a 16-6 series advantage. The series began on Sept. 3, 1992. Texas Tech is 6-13 vs. Oklahoma since the Big 12 Conference was formed in 1996. The two schools have met each year for the last 19 consecutive seasons.
- Oklahoma has won each of the last three overall contests dating back to a Oct. 22, 2011 Texas Tech win (41-38) in Norman.
- On the road, Texas Tech is 2-9 all-time against the Sooners at Gaylord Family Oklahoma Memorial Stadium.
- Texas Tech and Oklahoma last met on Nov. 15, 2014. Oklahoma handed Tech a 42-30 loss at Jones AT&T Stadium before 59,014 fans. Samaje Perine scored three touchdowns and Cody Thomas threw for one score and ran for another to lead Oklahoma to the win. Perine, who finished with 213 yards on 25 carries, scored touchdowns from 2, 64 and 11 yards. Texas Tech quarterback Patrick Mahomes threw for four touchdowns and completed 27 of 50 passes for 393 yards. The Red Raiders led 14-7 at halftime.

RED RAIDERS BOAST MULTIPLE BIG PLAY THREATS

Through seven games this season, it is evident that Texas Tech has one of the most explosive offenses in the country. The Red Raiders have boasted 34 plays that have gone 30 yards or longer this season, including 20 for touchdowns. Texas Tech has found the endzone via various weapons as 13 players have scored a touchdown on offense and nine different players have registered 100 or more yards of offense in at least one game this year. Texas Tech is the *ONLY* school in the country to have 10 different players catch a touchdown pass this season. Six different Red Raiders are averaging at least seven yards per touch this season. Here's a look at Texas Tech's top explosive players:

MAHOMES AGAINST TOP TEXAS TECH QUARTERBACKS

Through the first 11 starts of his young career, Texas Tech sophomore quarterback Patrick Mahomes II has torched opposing defenses, throwing for 4,046 passing yards, 34 touchdowns and just eight interceptions. In comparison, Mahomes already ranks ahead of Texas Tech's top two career passers in program history—Graham Harrell and his head coach Kliff Kingsbury—over each of their first 11 starts of their careers. In addition, Mahomes is one of two Red Raider quarterbacks since 2000 to throw for four or more touchdowns in six of the first 11 starts of a career (B.J. Symons is the other). Below is a comparison of Kingsbury, Harrell and Mahomes over each of their first 11 starts:

MAHOMES PROPELLING TEXAS TECH OFFENSE

With stellar performances in Texas Tech's first seven games, two-time Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week sophomore quarterback Patrick Mahomes II has continued the success he showed as a true freshman in 2014. Making his 11th-consecutive start and 11th career start in his first 14 appearances, Mahomes has amassed 2,852 yards of total offense, thrown for 2,618 passing yards and completed 196 of 307 passes and 20 touchdowns over Texas Tech's first seven games in 2015. He has also rushed for 234 yards on 47 attempts with six touchdowns.

Mahomes has now thrown for 300-plus yards in nine of his last 10 games and passed for four or more touchdowns in six of his last 10 contests. Through seven games in 2015, Mahomes is currently ranked among national and Big 12 leaders in a variety of statistics:

Here are Mahomes' game-by-game performances:

- At Kansas (Oct. 17), Mahomes threw for 354 yards and completed 29 of 50 passes and one touchdown.
- Versus Iowa State (Oct. 10), Mahomes helped the Red Raiders amass the most offensive yards in school history (776) as he completed 33 of 46 passes for 428 yards and five touchdowns. He threw for 371 yards on 24 completions in the first half alone. It marked his eighth 300-yard performance and fourth time he has thrown for over 400 yards in his career.
- At AT&T Stadium against No. 5 Baylor (Oct. 3), Mahomes completed 32 of 50 passes for 415 yards and three touchdowns (two interceptions) and led the Red Raiders with 39 rushing yards in two attempts including a career-long 25-yard TD run.
- Against No. 3 TCU (Sept. 26), Mahomes threw for 392 yards, completing 25 of 45 passes and two touchdowns despite. Also ran for 36 yards on eight carries and one touchdown. Completed passes for 59, 50 and 44 yards.
- Versus Arkansas (Sept. 19), he threw for 243 yards, while completing 86.7 percent (26 of 30 passes) and one touchdown. The completion percentage came close to the school record for completion percentage held by Seth Doege (90.9%, 40-44) against New Mexico in 2011. Also a threw a block in the first series of the game that still has his teammates talking.
- Against UTEP (Sept. 12), he accounted for six touchdowns (four passing/two rushing), completed 18 of 33 passes for 361 yards, including 297 in the first half alone and ran for 27 yards on six carries. Following his performance in week two, garnered Big 12 Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors for the second time on Sept. 14, marking the third conference weekly honor of his career.
- The 425-yard passing game vs. Sam Houston State (Sept. 5) in the season opener marked the second highest total of his career and ranked tied for the 45th best-individual passing performance (yardage) in school history. He accumulated 473 yards of total offense, threw for 425 yards and completed 33 of 53 passes with four touchdowns and ran for 48 yards on five carries. Following his performance, earned the Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Player of the Week honors. He previously earned the award after he threw for a career-high, Big 12 freshman and

Texas Tech freshman record 598 yards, completed 30 of 56 passes with six touchdowns against Baylor.

QUICK STRIKE OFFENSE, FAST STARTS

- Of Texas Tech's 46 touchdown scoring drives this year, 21 have gone for under two minutes while 10 were under a minute.
- In time of possession, Texas Tech ranks No. 119 out of 127 schools (26:08). In those brief 26 minutes, Texas Tech is averaging 49.4 points per game (No. 3 nationally in scoring offense), 623.7 total yards per game (No. 2 nationally in total offense), 426.9 yards passing per game (No. 2 nationally in passing offense), 7.6 yards per play and a 53 percent third-down conversion rate (No. 3 nationally).
- Texas Tech ranks No. 1 nationally in two offensive categories: most offensive plays gaining 40 or more yards (32), most offensive plays gaining 50 or more yards (12) and most offensive plays gaining 10 yards or more (156). Tech ranks No. 2 nationally in most offensive plays gaining 30 or more yards (34) and most offensive plays gaining 20 or more yards (55).
- Texas Tech has scored on its opening drive in five of seven games this season, four of which that have come via touchdowns.
- In the first half this year, quarterback Patrick Mahomes II has completed 124 of 189 attempts (66 percent) for 1,775 yards and 17 touchdowns.

TEXAS TECH PILES ON THE POINTS

- Texas Tech is averaging 49.4 points per game, a mark that ranks third nationally and third in the Big 12 Conference.
- Texas Tech has scored 50 or more points four times this season for the fifth time in school history (1954, 2003, 2005, 2008). It is the second time in program history where the Red Raiders have reached 50 points four times in their first seven games of a season.
- Texas Tech has scored 30 or more points in each of its first seven games for the first time since 2011 when the Red Raiders also had at least 30 points in each of their first seven games.
- Texas Tech's 346 points mark the second highest total over the first seven games of a season in school history. The Red Raiders totaled 350 points during the same span in 2007.
- Texas Tech's 30 points at Kansas marked the 10th-straight game where the Red Raiders have scored 30 or more points dating back to the conclusion of the 2014 season. It is the longest streak for Texas Tech since the Red Raiders went 10 straight games with at least 30 points during the 2010-11 seasons (Nov. 20, 2010-Oct. 22, 2011).
- Texas Tech is averaging 45.8 points per game in Big 12 play despite already facing two top-five ranked opponents.
- Texas Tech has allowed just three third quarter touchdowns and has outscored opponents, 68-26, in the period this year.
- Texas Tech's 66 points scored against Iowa State ranked for the ninth most points scored in school history. The 66 points were the third-highest total scored in a conference game in program history. The Red Raiders also scored 66 points against Kansas State in 2009, 70 points against Nebraska in 2004 and a program-record 71 points against New Mexico A&M (now New Mexico State) in 1953.
- Texas Tech's 69 points against UTEP marked the eighth-most for a single game in program history and the most since the Red Raiders amassed 75 points vs. Northwestern State during the 2007 season.
- In the first half alone this year, Texas Tech has combined to score 208 points (20 at Kansas, 38 vs. Iowa State, 21 vs. Baylor, 28 vs. TCU, 21 vs. Arkansas, 38 vs. UTEP and 42 vs. Sam Houston State) through its first seven contests. Tech is averaging 29.7 points in the first half alone.
- Texas Tech's 38 first half points vs. Iowa State marked the most before the break in a Big 12 Conference game since the Red Raiders scored 38 vs. Kansas State on Oct. 10, 2009. It marked the third time this season that Tech had totaled at least 30 before halftime (Sam Houston State, 42; UTEP, 38).

GRANT DOES IT ALL

Senior all-purpose wide receiver Jakeem Grant has scored a touchdown in four different ways this year: threw a touchdown pass, returned a kickoff for TD, caught a pass and rushed for a TD. The all-around talent also ranks No. 7 nationally and No. 1 in the Big 12 in all-purpose yardage (168.6 yards per game), No. 5 nationally in kickoffs returned for touchdown (one), No. 14 nationally in receptions per game (7.1 per game), No. 8 nationally in total receiving yards (724) and No. 11 nationally in receiving yards per game (103.4 yards per game). He leads the Red Raiders with 1,180 all-purpose yards (168.6 per game). When Grant touches the ball either on a kick return, catch or run, Texas Tech averages 16.7 yards per play. His successful season has moved Grant into the top 10 in several offensive categories in the Texas Tech record book.

TEXAS TECH'S TURNOVER TURNAROUND

After seven games, Texas Tech has shown marked improvement in turnover margin, both in taking care of the ball and creating turnovers. The Red Raiders rank No. 17 nationally in turnover margin (0.86), No. 11 nationally in turnovers gained (15) and No. 46 nationally in turnovers lost (9). Defensively, Texas Tech has forced a total of 15 turnovers (intercepted eight passes and recovered seven fumbles). Here is a comparison of where the Red Raiders ranked in 2014:

THE LAST GAME: KANSAS POST-GAME NOTES

- The Texas Tech defense held Kansas scoreless through the first half. It is the first time Texas Tech has held an opponent scoreless in the opening half since facing Texas State in 2013. The Red Raiders had not previously shutout a Big 12 opponent in the first half since hosting TCU in 2013, the game prior to facing Texas State.
- Texas Tech has now scored 30 or more points in all seven games this season. It is the longest such streak to start a season since the Red Raiders put together a similar streak to start the 2011 season.
- Texas Tech scored at least 30 points for the 10th consecutive game dating back to the end of the 2014 season. It matched Tech's longest streak since the Red Raiders went 10-straight games with 30 or more points during the 2010-11 seasons.
- Texas Tech's 584 yards of total offense marked the fourth straight game in which the Red Raiders had totaled at least 500 yards of total offense.
- Patrick Mahomes recorded the eighth 300-yard passing performance of his career against Kansas as the sophomore finished 30-51 for 359 yards and a touchdown.
- Clayton Hatfield converted multiple field goals for the first time in his career as he connected on a successful 30-yard attempt with 36 seconds remaining in the first quarter, a 24-yarder with 10:13 remaining in the second quarter and then a 25-yard attempt with 1:17 in the third quarter. Hatfield's three successful field goals marked the most for a Red Raider since Ryan Bustin finished a perfect 3-3 on field goal attempts at West Virginia in 2013. Hatfield entered the game with three field goals on the year.
- J.J. Gaines forced the second fumble of his career early in the second quarter. Gaines, who also recovered the fumble, is now responsible for six turnovers this season, four that have come in the past three games.
- Texas Tech offensive lineman Le'Raven Clark gave TTU an 11-0 lead in the second quarter with a successful two-point attempt following a DeAndre Washington rushing touchdown. It was the first successful offensive two-point conversion for the Red Raiders since facing TCU in 2012.
- Pete Robertson recorded the 18th sack of his career with 4:25 remaining in the fourth quarter, moving him into sole possession of seventh place all-time at Texas Tech.
- Jah'Shawn Johnson recorded the second interception of his career and returned it for a touchdown to seal the victory with 4:07 remaining in the fourth quarter.

EXPERIENCED OFFENSIVE LINE ANCHORS TECH OFFENSE

A major strength for Texas Tech is its offensive line as the Red Raiders returned four of their five starters, including senior All-America candidate Le'Raven Clark (45 career starts), senior center Jared Kaster (32 consecutive starts), senior Alfredo Morales (26 career starts) and junior Baylen Brown (19 career starts). Redshirt freshman Justin Murphy has started in four of seven games. In addition, Alfredo's twin brother Tony Morales provides valuable senior leadership and depth. The group has allowed just seven sacks (28 yards) through its first seven games and ranks No. 11 nationally and No. 2 in the Big 12 in that category despite also leading the country with 346 pass attempts. In addition, the line has only allowed 4.0 tackles for loss, which ranks No. 7 nationally in that category. The offensive line is a major strength for the Texas Tech offense as it returned 73 percent of its starts from last year's team. The Red Raiders allowed just 13 sacks in 12 games in 2014, a figure that ranked No. 12 nationally.

WASHINGTON EYEING ANOTHER 1,000 YARD SEASON

Currently enjoying a successful senior season, running back DeAndre Washington continues to move up the national ranking charts. Washington ranks No. 11 nationally and No. 2 in the Big 12 in yards per rush (7.0), No. 15 nationally and No. 2 in the Big 12 in total rushing yards (743) and No. 27 nationally in rushing yards per game (106.1). So far this year, Washington has accumulated 743 yards on 106 carries (7.0 yards per rush) along with a team-best seven touchdowns and has caught 20 passes for 162 yards and a touchdown. He ranks second on the squad in all-purpose yardage with 905 yards total. Last year, Washington became the first running back at Texas Tech since Ricky Williams in 1998 to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season. There have been only six Red Raiders who have rushed for 1,000 yards in a single season—four of those players accomplished the feat twice. He is well on his way toward achieving a second 1,000-yard rushing season.

WASHINGTON RANKS IN TOP 10 IN CAREER RUSHING YARDS

Earlier this year, DeAndre Washington moved into Texas Tech's career top-10 list for rushing yards. With a 157-yard performance at Kansas on Saturday, Washington has now totaled 2,662 rushing yards in his four seasons, which currently ranks seventh in school history. Washington, who also passed Red Raider greats Donny Anderson, Baron Batch and Larry Isaac, could become only the sixth player in school history to run for over 3,000 yards in a career.

BRIEFLY

- Texas Tech has scored in 226-consecutive games dating back to Oct. 25, 1997. That streak is currently the second-longest active streak in the Big 12 Conference (TCU, 287).
- Texas Tech has posted 325-plus yards of total offense in 47 straight games, the longest active streak in the FBS.

JUSTIN STOCKTON: BIG PLAY/TOUCHDOWN MACHINE

Nicknamed "The Flash" for his speed, sophomore running back Justin Stockton has scored a touchdown in five of Texas Tech's seven games this season, including three rushing (54-yarder, 4-yarder and 22-yarder) and two receiving (46-yarder and 50-yarder). On offense, Stockton is averaging 9.2 yards per play (53-448) despite touching the ball only 53 times in seven games. In his two-year career, Stockton is averaging 8.1 yards per play (113-920).

GRANT RANKS SECOND IN CAREER KICK RETURN YARDS

Jakeem Grant continues to climb Texas Tech's career kickoff return yardage list. He currently averages 25.5 yards per kickoff return, which ranks No. 24 nationally and No. 4 in the Big 12 Conference. With his one kickoff return touchdown on the year, a 94-yard TD vs. Sam Houston State, Grant ranks No. 5 nationally in season kickoff return touchdowns. Only four players nationally have two kickoff return touchdowns. Grant sits in sole possession of second place on Texas Tech's career kickoff return list:

GRANT SETS CAREER KICKOFF RETURN TD RECORD

With his 94-yard kick return touchdown in the second quarter against Sam Houston State on Sept. 5, senior Jakeem Grant set a new school record for most career kick return touchdowns with three. He was previously tied with Jack Kirkpatrick (1952-55) for the program lead with two. Grant has scored on kick returns of 99-yards (vs. Minnesota on Dec. 28, 2012), 97 yards (vs. Baylor at AT&T Stadium, Nov. 24, 2012) and 94 yards (vs. Sam Houston State, Sept. 5, 2015). Two of those returns rank among the school's all-time longest kickoff returns. During his freshman season in 2012, he became just the second Red Raider in school history to return two kicks for touchdowns in the same season. Kirkpatrick was the other player to achieve that honor.

ROBERTSON WRECKS HAVOC ON OPPOSING QUARTERBACKS

Pete Robertson, a 2014 All-Big 12 second team selection, is one of the premier pass rushers in the country as the senior led the Big 12 Conference in sacks and ranked fourth nationally with 12 in 2014. His 12 sacks also ranked fourth among single-season leaders in school history. Robertson also became the first Red Raider during the Big 12 era (since 1996) to register a sack in six consecutive games (Sept. 25-Nov. 1, 2014). He concluded the 2014 season with at least one sack in eight of his last nine games played.

With two sacks for eight yards on the year, Robertson is now ranked seventh among school career sacks leaders with 18.0. The school record is 34.0 held by Aaron Hunt from 1999-2002. Last year, Robertson led the Red Raiders defense in tackles (81), tackles for loss (14.5-74), sacks (12), quarterback hurries (7) and forced fumbles (3).

TEAM CAPTAINS SELECTED FOR TECH

Texas Tech elected five senior captains before its season opener against Sam Houston State. Serving as team captains for the Red Raiders in 2015 are: Jared Kaster (OL), Le'Raven Clark (OL), DeAndre Washington (RB), Branden Jackson (DL) and Micah Awe (LB).

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- David Gibbs is in his first year as Texas Tech's Defensive Coordinator.
- Linebackers Dakota Allen (62) and Micah Awe (57) and defensive back Jah'Shawn Johnson (50) lead the Red Raiders in tackles. Allen ranks No. 3 in the Big 12 Conference with an 8.9 tackles per game average and No. 37 in the nation in total tackles. Awe ranks fifth in the Big 12 in tackles.
- Texas Tech has forced nine fumbles on the year with seven recoveries. Jah'Shawn Johnson and J.J. Gaines lead the Red Raiders in fumble recoveries with two apiece, while Johnson leads the team in forced fumbles with two. Both Johnson and Gaines rank tied for sixth nationally in fumble recoveries. Johnson was named the Big 12's Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 21) following his career-high 16 tackle performance at Arkansas.
- Senior linebacker Pete Robertson leads the Red Raiders in tackles for loss (8.5-23). Tech has registered 36 tackles for loss totaling 95 yards this year.
- J.J. Gaines ranks No. 10 nationally in interceptions with four on the year. He picked off passes in back-to-back games including one at Kansas and a career-high two in Texas Tech's victory over Iowa State. It was the first time a Red Raider had intercepted two passes in a game since Cornelius Douglas had two picks against Iowa State in 2012. Gaines now has nine interceptions during his career. He is now ranked tied for No. 10 in school history for most career interceptions.
- Texas Tech returns seven defensive starters from a youthful 2014 unit. Returning starters include Branden Jackson (DE), Pete Robertson (RUSH), J.J. Gaines (SS), Justis Nelson (CB), Keenon Ward (SS), Tevin Madison (CB) and Nigel Bethel II (CB).
- Last year, Texas Tech used a total of 26 newcomers on both sides of the ball, including nine true freshmen. Of that group, 17 were listed as defensive players.
- In 2014, Texas Tech used four true freshmen in its secondary as Nigel Bethel II, Derrick Dixon, Jah'Shawn Johnson and Tevin Madison all saw action during the season. Madison started the first five games at cornerback before Bethel earned the nod in each of the last seven contests. Dixon, meanwhile, made his first two career starts at Iowa State and vs. Baylor.
- Over half of the Red Raider defensive players (21 of 35) who recorded at least one tackle in 2014 were classified as a freshman, sophomore or newcomer to the Tech roster.
- Among Red Raiders defensive players with a tackle in 2014, eight were freshmen, seven were sophomores, 14 were juniors and six were seniors.
- In 2014, Texas Tech boasted one of the youngest secondaries in the country as the Red Raiders used a pair of true freshmen at cornerback (Tevin Madison and Nigel Bethel II) in the starting lineup as well as a true sophomore in Justis Nelson at the other corner spot, a sophomore in Keenon Ward and a junior in J.J. Gaines at the two safety spots. Jalen Barnes and Derrick Dixon, both freshmen, both recorded a start at safety as well. All those players are a year older now.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- Texas Tech ranks No. 1 nationally in blocked punts allowed (zero).
- The Red Raiders blocked a field goal attempt against TCU. They rank No. 42 nationally and lead the Big 12 in blocked kicks (1).
- Tech's return game is led by kick returner Jakeem Grant, one of the nation's best. He ranks No. 24 nationally and No. 4 in the Big 12 in yards per kick return (25.5) and No. 5 in kickoffs returned for TD (1). Punt returner Cameron Batson ranks fifth in the Big 12 in punt return average (5.0).
- All-Big 12 punter/kickoff specialist Taylor Symmank ranks No. 2 in the Big 12 in punting as he has averaged 46.6 yards per punt (19-886). He would be ranked fifth nationally, but he has taken limited attempts. Six of his punts have traveled 50 or more yards with a career-long of 68 yards. Only nine of his

punts have been returned (47 percent).

- As a kickoff specialist, Symmank has registered a phenomenal 27 touchbacks in 37 kickoffs with a 64.5 average per kick (37-238). Only 27 percent of Symmank's kickoffs have been returnable (10-37). In addition, Clayton Hatfield has had only 13 kicks returned in 25 kickoffs. Opponents have only returned 22 kicks for 491 yards (22.3 yards per return) on the Red Raiders.
- Texas Tech's two placekickers—Michael Barden and Clayton Hatfield—are a combined 8-for-10 on field goals this year. Hatfield, who is 25-for-26 on point after attempts, kicked Texas Tech's longest field goal of 37 yards against TCU.

TEXAS TECH: A MODEL OF SUCCESSFUL CONSISTENCY

Since 1993, Texas Tech has endured just two sub-.500 seasons. On that note, Texas Tech ranks among the nation's top-six programs in regards to experiencing the least sub-.500 seasons since 1993. Only four NCAA FBS college football programs—Florida State (0), Southern California (1), Ohio State (1) and Florida (1)—have fewer sub-.500 seasons in the last 22 years:

RECORD TURNOUT FOR SEASON OPENER

For the second consecutive season, Texas Tech fans turned out in record numbers for the season opener against Sam Houston State. Tech's attendance on Sept. 5 was 60,073, just 381 shy of a sellout. The crowd of 60,073 ranked as the second largest crowd to attend a season opener in school history, ranking second behind last year's sellout crowd of 60,778 against Central Arkansas on August 30, 2014. Prior to the last two seasons, the previous record was 57,528 for the SMU game in 2010. In addition, the 60,073 fans ranked as the 10th largest crowd in Jones AT&T Stadium history.

ATTENDANCE IN 2015 OFF THE CHARTS

Already in 2015, Texas Tech has registered two of the school's top-11 single-game crowds in school history. Tech drew 61,283 fans for its game against TCU on Sept. 26, the second largest crowd in Jones AT&T Stadium history. The largest crowd was 61,836 versus Oklahoma State in 2013. In addition, the season opener against Sam Houston State on Sept. 5 drew 60,073 fans, the 11th largest crowd in school history. Average attendance through three games is 58,482, which would rank as the second highest season average in school history. Tech's average attendance record of 58,934 was set last year (2014) for the third straight season.

GROUP OF 23 SENIORS PROVIDE LEADERSHIP FOR TECH

Texas Tech has the benefit of a 23-member senior class. It is the largest senior class that Kliff Kingsbury has had since he became head coach three years ago. Ten of those seniors were listed as starters on the 2014 preseason depth chart. Senior leaders for Texas Tech include DeAndre Washington (RB), Le'Raven Clark (OL), Pete Robertson (RUSH), Branden Jackson (DE), Jared Kaster (C) and Jakeem Grant (WR).

BACK-TO-BACK LOSING SEASONS ARE RARE AT TEXAS TECH

Texas Tech enters the 2015 season coming off only its second sub-.500 season in 22 years (4-8 in 2014). A sub-.500 season is a rarity for the Texas Tech football program. Even more of a rarity is back-to-back sub-.500 seasons at Texas Tech. The last time Tech had back-to-back losing seasons was in 1984-85. The Red Raiders endured six consecutive losing seasons from 1979-85.

FROM SUB-.500 SEASON TO SUCCESS

Since the 1985 season, the last five times Texas Tech went through a losing season, the Red Raiders responded the following season with a record of .500 or better. Furthermore, in four of those five seasons, the Red Raiders rebounded with a postseason bowl berth (2012-Meinecke Texas Bowl; 1993-John Hancock Bowl; 1989 All-American Bowl; 1986 Independence Bowl).

PRESEASON HONORS ROLL IN FOR LE'RAVEN CLARK

Texas Tech offensive left tackle Le'Raven Clark enters the 2015 campaign as an All-America candidate. The two-time All-Big 12 First Team honoree has been named to watch lists for the Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Trophy for the third-straight season. He was also selected to three preseason All-America teams including The Sporting News (Second Team), Athlon Sports (Third Team), Phil Steele (Fourth team).

WIDE RECEIVER U

Texas Tech easily stakes claim to the tag "Wide Receiver U" and has the numbers to prove it. Since 2000, Texas Tech receivers have caught 636 touchdown passes and hauled in 76,610 receiving yards—both of which lead the nation. In addition, the Red Raiders have two Biletnikoff Awards on display in their trophy case and two of the most prolific receivers in the NFL: Michael Crabtree and Wes Welker.

FOUR STRAIGHT BOWL WINS

Texas Tech has advanced to bowl games in 13 of its last 15 seasons. The Red Raiders have also registered wins in each of its last four bowl appearances. Tech currently holds the longest active bowl win streak in the Big 12 and the longest in school history. Tech's streak of bowl wins started in San Antonio with a 41-31 win over Michigan State in the 2009 Alamo Bowl. The Red Raiders last registered a 37-27 victory over No. 16 Arizona State in the 2013 National University Holiday Bowl. Texas Tech's 36 all-time bowl appearances ranks tied for No. 17 nationally.

GRADUATED STUDENT-ATHLETES

Texas Tech boasts seven football student-athletes who have already earned their degrees and are currently pursuing a master's degree. Education is a top priority for Coach Kingsbury as he graduated early and was named the 2002 Academic All-America Player of the Year.

- With two touchdown passes against TCU on Oct. 25, 2014, Webb moved into seventh place on the career touchdown passes list. He needs just three more touchdowns to move past Robert Hall into sixth place.
- Threw for 300 yards against TCU for his 10th career 300-plus yard passing game.

ATTENDANCE RECORD FALLS FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR

Texas Tech fans showed yet again why they are the most loyal fans in the country as an average attendance record was set in 2014 at Jones AT&T Stadium for the third consecutive season. Texas Tech needed just 53,004 in attendance at the final home game against Oklahoma on Nov. 15, but instead enjoyed a crowd of 59,014 in the home finale. The Oklahoma game attendance figure gave Texas Tech a final average of 58,934 which surpassed last year's mark of 57,932. Overall, Tech's attendance has increased in each of the last three seasons.

BEST STUDENT BODY IN THE BIG 12

Texas Tech's football student section was ranked No. 10 in the country in a recent poll by USA Today. Tech had the only student section recognized in the Big 12 Conference. College Football Index—a poll conducted by USA Today—is a cumulative data-based ranking of America's most engaged fan bases in 2014. In 2013, ESPN's Jake Trotter ranked the Red Raider students the best student section in the Big 12. Texas Tech students not only provide a tremendous home field advantage, but they have turned out in record-setting numbers. In 2013, Texas Tech set an average student attendance record of 11,249 and a Jones AT&T Stadium individual game record of 16,092 for the Red Raiders' 20-10 victory over No. 24 TCU. In an era where student attendance is in decline across the country, the opposite is occurring in Lubbock at Tech students not only set facility attendance records at football, but also in basketball and baseball.

KINGSBURY IN ELITE COMPANY

Texas Tech Head Coach Kliff Kingsbury is now one of only two NCAA Division I coaches nationally that finished in the Top-10 in the Heisman Trophy voting and played in the National Football League. Kingsbury joins Michigan's Jim Harbaugh as the only two active coaches to accomplish this feat. Harbaugh finished third in the 1986 Heisman Trophy race and played 13 seasons in the NFL. Former South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier was also in this category until he resigned in early October. Spurrier won the Heisman Trophy in 1966 and played 10 seasons in the NFL.

KINGSBURY IS YOUNGEST COACH IN POWER 5 CONFERENCES

At the age of 36, Kliff Kingsbury is the youngest head coach in the Power 5 and the third youngest coach in the FBS. He was named head coach at Texas Tech on Dec. 12, 2012.

FIVE ALUMNI FORM TECH COACHING STAFF FOUNDATION

Five Texas Tech alums form the nucleus of the coaching staff, including head coach Kliff Kingsbury, who earned his degree management in 2001. Joining Kingsbury are cornerbacks coach Kevin Curtis (Class of 2002), outside linebackers coach Trey Haverty (Class of 2004), offensive coordinator Eric Morris (Class of 2008) and co-defensive coordinator/defensive line coach Mike Smith (Class of 2004).

NEW COACHING STAFF FACES

Defensive Coordinator David Gibbs and linebackers coach Zac Spavital both are coaching in their first season at Texas Tech. Gibbs is a 22-year coaching veteran who has seven years of experience as a defensive coordinator on the NCAA FBS level and nine years of NFL coaching experience. He arrives at Tech after serving the past three seasons at the University of Houston Defensive Coordinator and Interim Head Coach. • Kliff Kingsbury (@TTUKingsbury) is in his third season as head coach at Texas Tech. He was named the 15th head coach in program history on Dec. 12, 2012.

• In his second season as head coach, Kingsbury led a young and inexperienced squad to a 4-8 overall record. His potent offense began to develop the balance he had been seeking, as running back DeAndre Washington became the first Red Raider to rush for over 1,000 yards in a single season since Ricky Williams did so in 1998. The Red Raider offense finished the season ranked 10th (504.1 yards-per-game) nationally while the pass offense ranked fifth (351.1 yards-per-game).

• In his first season in 2013, Kingsbury led the Red Raiders to an 8-5 overall record and a stunning 37-23 win over No. 16 Arizona State in the National University Holiday Bowl. He became just the second coach in school history to win a bowl game in his first season as the Red Raiders dismantled the heavily favored Sun Devils in San Diego. His popularity also helped revitalize the Texas Tech fan base as the Red Raiders set a new school record for average home attendance.

• Kingsbury returned to his collegiate roots after a one-year stint as offensive coordinator at Texas A&M in 2012 where he played a major role in leading freshman quarterback Johnny Manziel to the Heisman Trophy. Under his guidance, the Aggie offense finished third nationally in total offense by averaging 552.33 yards per game. The Aggies ranked 14th nationally in passing offense and 13th nationally in rushing offense, making Texas A&M one of the most balanced attacks in college football. For the second consecutive year, Kingsbury was named the national offensive coordinator of the year.

• Kingsbury made the move to Texas A&M from the University of Houston where he played a key role in the Cougars' record-setting 13-win season in 2011. The Cougars finished 2011 with a 13-1 record and posted the program's highest final BCS finish in school history (No. 19).

• Kingsbury served as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for the Cougars in 2011, and was named the 2011 Offensive Coordinator of the Year by FootballScoop.com. The Cougars led the nation in total offense, passing offense and scoring in 2011, while record-setting quarterback Case Keenum placed seventh in the Heisman Trophy voting and won the Sammy Baugh Award.

• After a five-year professional football career, Kingsbury entered the coaching ranks in the spring of 2008 when he joined Sumlin's staff as an offensive quality control assistant. He later earned his first full-time position as quarterbacks coach in 2010.

• Kingsbury was drafted by Bill Belichick and the New England Patriots after a record-setting career at Texas Tech. Kingsbury received multiple honors including Associated Press Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year as a quarterback for the Red Raiders. In addition, he set 39 school records, 16 Big 12 marks and 17 NCAA records during his career at Tech (1999-2002). As a senior he was awarded the Sammy Baugh Trophy, presented annually to the nation's best college quarterback.

• The first in a long line of record-setting Texas Tech quarterbacks under then-head coach Mike Leach, Kingsbury recorded more than 12,000 passing yards and total offense including over 1,000 pass completions making him only the third player in NCAA history to accomplish all three. Kingsbury also excelled in the classroom as he was one of 14 collegiate football players to receive a post-graduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame as he also garnered Academic All-America Player of the Year honors in 2002.

• A native of New Braunfels, Texas, Kingsbury graduated from Texas Tech in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in management.

OFFENSES UNDER KINGSBURY

Since earning his first coordinator position at Houston in 2010, Kliff Kingsbury has annually produced one of the nation's top offenses. A two-time National Offensive Coordinator of the Year honoree, Kingsbury has produced an offense that has ranked 11th or better nationally in each of the past five seasons. 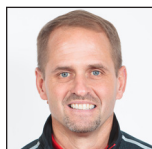

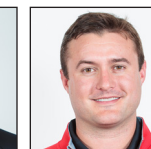

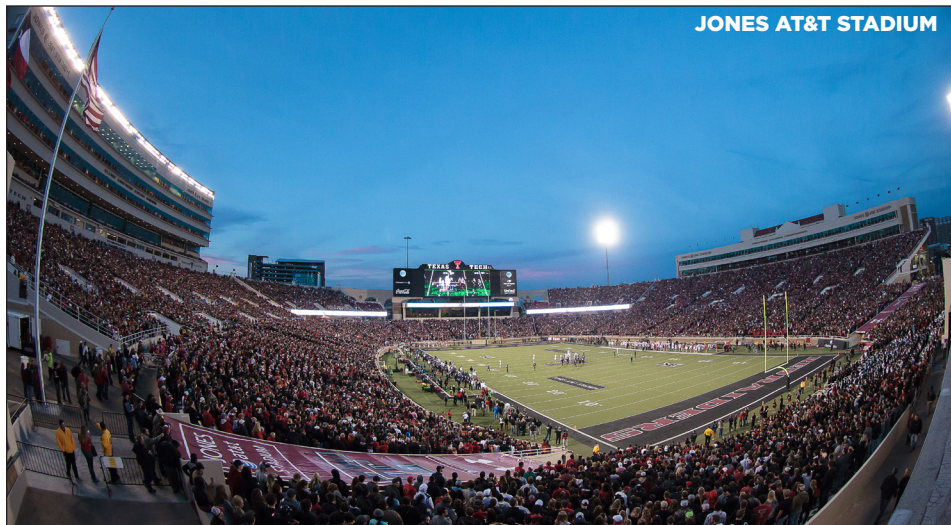

GAME 1 • TEXAS TECH 59, SAM HOUSTON STATE 45

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) - Patrick Mahomes threw for 425 yards and four touchdowns, two each to Ian Sadler and Devin Lauderdale, to lead Texas Tech past Sam Houston State 59-45 on Saturday.

The sophomore also ran for 48 yards on five carries. Jakeem Grant ran for his third career kickoff return for a TD on a 94-yarder. He also scored the Red Raiders (1-0) first TD on a 3-yard run.

Mahomes completed 33 of 53 passes with one interception. That pick led to the first of two TDs by Sam Houston State's Donovan Williams.

Lauderdale finished with 150 yards on eight catches.

The Bearkats (0-1), a Football Championship Subdivision team, stayed close in the first half but were shut out in the third quarter.

Sam Houston's Jared Johnson completed 18 of 28 passes for 144 yards with an interception. Backup Jeremiah Briscoe threw a 29-yard TD pass to Davion Davis.

Mahomes showed his mobility - the facet of his play that coach Kliff Kingsbury likes a lot - in the pocket early in the second quarter. On third and 4 from the Bearkats 10, he looked like he was going to run up the middle but then backed up and went to his right. When that path closed he reversed course and scampered until he saw Sadler just across the goal line. Mahomes squared his shoulders and fired the ball to his receiver to put the Red Raiders up 21-14.

Mahomes' lone pick came when one of his receivers tipped the ball and it was intercepted by Alfonso McMillian. Two plays later Williams scored on a 1-yard run.

It didn't appear that Grant would be able to return the kickoff far after he got trapped near the far sideline. But he cut back just past his own 20 and ran crossfield to the end zone.

It was the first kickoff return for a TD in a season opener since 2001 against New Mexico and the first since the 2013 Holiday Bowl (Reginald Davis).

Texas Tech forced three turnovers with all three coming in the second half. J. J. Gaines picked off Johnson in the third quarter and returned it 47 yards for a score, and Thierry Nguema picked off Briscoe in the fourth. Ohio State transfer Mike Mitchell recovered a fumble in the third quarter and Gaines got one in the fourth.

GAME 2 • TEXAS TECH 69, UTEP 20

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) - Patrick Mahomes threw for four touchdowns and ran for two more to lead Texas Tech past UTEP 69-20 on Saturday.

The sophomore completed 18 of 33 passes for 361 yards.

Mahomes' scoring passes went to Jakeem Grant (60 yards), Justin Stockton (46 yards), Reginald Davis (35 yards) and Devin Lauderdale (34 yards).

DeAndre Washington scored on a 51-yard run for the Red Raiders (2-0), and Mahomes' rushing TDs were from 7 yards and 1 yard.

Washington got 138 yards rushing on 12 carries.

Miners' running back Aaron Jones scored on a 91-yard rush - the longest running play in UTEP history. He got hurt and left the game just before halftime with a left ankle injury. The Miners (0-2) really needed him in the second half.

Jones also scored on a 24-yard pass from quarterback Mack Leftwich, who completed 14 of 22 passes for 164 yards.

The game was a far cry from last year's when Texas Tech had to come from behind to beat the Miners 30-26 in El Paso.

And it was a much better defensive outing for the Red Raiders, who gave up 637 total yards last week in their 59-45 win over Sam Houston State. On Saturday, Texas Tech gave up 414 total yards.

Mahomes came out early in the fourth quarter and was replaced by Red Raiders backup Davis Webb, who scored twice on rushing TDs, a 1-yarder and a 5-yarder.

Stockman's touchdown pass from Mahomes showcased the sophomore's blistering speed. He caught the ball with at least four blockers near him and he sprinted past them and potential tacklers on his way into the end zone to give the Red Raiders a 17-7 lead in the first quarter.

Grant, who almost matched his career-best game (155 yards on 12 catches) by halftime, got the first Red Raiders score. Mahomes found him wide open at the Miners 28, and Grant juke and darted left to outrun his defenders.

Grant had 141 yards on seven catches at halftime and didn't catch any passes in the second half.

Jones, the Miners leading rusher Saturday with 139 yards on 17 carries, returned to the field shortly after the beginning of the third quarter. He was on crutches and wearing a black boot on his left leg.

GAME 3 • TEXAS TECH 35, ARKANSAS 24

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. (AP) - Patrick Mahomes accounted for three touchdowns as Texas Tech remained unbeaten with a 35-24 non-conference win over reeling Arkansas on Saturday night.

The win improves the Red Raiders (3-0) to 9-1 in nonconference action under coach Kliff Kingsbury, and it makes amends for a 49-28 loss to the Razorbacks a year ago.

Mahomes finished 26-of-30 passing for 243 yards and a score, and he also rushed for 58 yards and a pair of touchdowns - leading a Texas Tech offense that finished with 486 total yards. Reginald Davis caught a pair of touchdowns, finishing with five catches for 115 yards.

Alex Collins had 170 yards rushing on 28 carries to lead Arkansas (1-2), which is now 0-9 under coach Bret Bielema in games decided by fewer than 10 points.

The Razorbacks gained 424 yards of total offense, including a 16-of-21 passing performance for 196 yards from quarterback Brandon Allen, but they were unable to rebound from last week's crushing loss to Toledo.

Texas Tech, meanwhile, never punted while scoring touchdowns on five of its nine possessions. Its only four non-scoring drives ended with a pair of interceptions thrown by Mahomes, a missed 22-yard field goal and the game-ending series of kneel downs.

The Red Raiders averaged 8.4 yards per play against an Arkansas defense that finished last season ranked 10th in the nation, and DeAndre Washington led the Texas Tech rushing attack with 75 carries on 11 carries.

Arkansas rushed 68 times for 438 yards in a dominating 49-28 win at Texas Tech a year ago, but the Razorbacks entered Saturday struggling to establish their once-dominant running attack - particularly in a shocking 16-12 loss to Toledo a week ago.

Led by Collins, Arkansas once again had its way with the Red Raiders 120th-ranked rushing defense in the first half. Collins had 92 of the Razorbacks 130 yards rushing in the half, helping a short-handed Arkansas offense hold the ball for 22:35 compared to just 7:25 for Texas Tech.

The Razorbacks entered the game without injured wide receiver Keon Hatcher and Cody Hollister with foot injuries, and they lost another starter in the first quarter when Jared Cornelius appeared to break his left arm during a 34-yard catch and run.

Despite the attrition, Allen threw a pair of touchdowns in the half - including a 24-yard strike to Drew Morgan late in the half to tie the game at 21-all.

Texas Tech, meanwhile, made the most of its limited possession.

The Red Raiders gained nearly 10 yards per play in the half - 243 on 25 plays - including a 72-yard touchdown pass from wide receiver Jakeem Grant to Davis to go up 21-14 in the second quarter.

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) - Patrick Mahomes II completed 25 of 45 passes for 392 yards in a loss to TCU on Saturday in the Big 12 opener for both teams.

On fourth-and-goal from the 4, Trevone Boykin's pass was high to Josh Doctson, but he got a hand on it and Green grabbed the ball as he fell out of the end zone. A video review confirmed Green had control of the ball and got a foot in bounds.

Mahomes, who was injured in the first quarter, completed 25 of 45 passes for 392 yards. He threw two touchdown passes and ran for another score for the Red Raiders (3-1, 0-1).

TCU went ahead 48-45 on Kyle Hicks' 21-yard run with 8:22 left. Texas Tech answered after two clutch third-down plays when Mahomes found Justin Stockton on a 50-yard scoring pass with 5:55 to go.

The teams traded empty possession before the Horned Frogs started at their own 47 and drove downfield for the winning touchdown.

The Red Raiders didn't give up after TCU scored. On the final play of the game - after time expired and a defensive penalty on TCU - Mahomes found DeAndre Washington for a 24-yard gain. He pitched it to a lineman, who pitched it to a receiver who got the ball to Jakeem Grant. He was pushed out of bounds at the TCU 10 to end the game.

Washington ran for four touchdowns and a career-high 188 yards.

Mahomes hurt his left knee early in the first quarter when he dove toward the end zone as he finished a 15-yard run. He got up limping but stayed in for the next play to hand the ball to Washington who scored on a 1-yard run.

Texas Tech will continue Big 12 play when they host Baylor next week.

GAME 5 • #5 BAYLOR 63, TEXAS TECH 35

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) - Seth Russell passed for 286 yards and four touchdowns and ran for two more scores, Shock Linwood rushed for a career-high 221 yards and two touchdowns and No. 5 Baylor began its bid for a third consecutive Big 12 championship with a 63-35 victory Saturday.

Baylor (4-0, 1-0) entered with the FBS' top offense in scoring (64.0 points per game), total offense (767.0 yards per game) and rushing yards (379.7 per game). The Bears gained 680 yards, 368 rushing.

Corey Coleman caught touchdown passes of 24, 16 and 16 yards.

Russell was 15 for 23 with one interception.

The Red Raiders (3-2, 0-2) dropped their second straight game after sweeping their nonconference opponents, They lost 55-52 to No. 4 TCU last week.

Texas Tech's Patrick Mahomes was 32 of 50 for 415 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions. Mahomes hurt his left knee last week in the first quarter against TCU, was listed as day to day during the week, but started and played into the fourth quarter.

Baylor went into the game as the only FBS school ranked in the top 10 in both rushing and passing offense.

The Red Raiders entered ranked fifth in total offense (594.5 yards per game), third in scoring (53.8 points per game) but 122nd in total defense (556.3 yards per game).

Linwood gained the fourth-most rushing yards in school history. His previous high was 187 against Texas Tech in 2013.

Linwood scored on runs of 79 and 8 yards, both in the first half. The longer score came on the Bears' third play from scrimmage, when he broke through the middle of the line, avoided one hand tackle and raced down the right sideline.

Baylor gained 333 yards in the first quarter, 499 in the half and scored touchdowns on its first five possessions to build a 49-21 halftime lead.

The Bears converted two of Texas Tech's four turnovers into touchdowns.

The Bears are 4-0 for the third consecutive season for the first time since 1915-17. This 28-point win was their smallest margin of victory yet.

Baylor has won five straight against Texas Tech, all at AT&T Stadium, averaging 58.4 points. The win gives the Bears a 37-36-1 edge in the series, which began in 1929.

The Red Raiders came off the TCU loss, in which the Horned Frogs scored the winning touchdown on a tipped pass with 23 seconds to play. They faced top-5 opponents in consecutive weeks for the first time.

GAME 6 • TEXAS TECH 66, IOWA STATE 31

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) - Patrick Mahomes II threw for 428 yards and five touchdowns, two to Jakeem Grant, to lead Texas Tech past Iowa State 66-31 on Saturday for the Red Raiders' first Big 12 win.

Grant had a career-high 166 yards on nine catches. He caught TD passes of 75 and 37 yards for Texas Tech (4-2, 1-2). It was Grant's third 100-plus-yard game this season.

DeAndre Washington had a receiving and a rushing TD, while Justin Stockton scored on a 54-yard rush.

The Red Raiders intercepted Cyclones quarterback Sam Richardson three times - two by J.J. Gaines - and Texas Tech scored touchdowns off two of them.

Mahomes was sacked for only the second time this season when he was called for intentional grounding. Redshirt freshman Mike Warren had his third straight game of more than 100 yards for the Cyclones (2-3, 1-1), finishing with a career-high 245 yards on 23 carries.

Iowa State quarterback Sam Richardson completed 10 of 21 for 139 yards and three interceptions. He had three coming into the game.

Joshua Thomas scored two rushing touchdowns for the Cyclones, each from a yard out.

Texas Tech's 776 total yards was a school record.

Red Raiders pass offense was the best in the country coming into the game but their receiving corps has thinned due to injuries. Ian Sadler and Devin Lauderdale, who have combined for five TDs and 527 yards, did not play.

That gave true freshman Jonathan Giles opportunities he might not have had. He caught a 3-yard touchdown from Mahomes and a 21-yarder from backup Davis Webb who took over for Mahomes in the fourth quarter. Giles' five catches and 59 yards receiving were career-highs.

Mahomes completed 33 of 46 passes with no interceptions.

The Red Raiders hadn't won a game since finishing up their nonconference schedule with a win at Arkansas in September. They then dropped games to then-No. 3 TCU - on a deflected reception in the end zone with 23 seconds remaining - before falling to then-No. 5 Baylor last week.

Texas Tech scored on its first three possessions and led the whole way. The Red Raiders second touchdown came on the first play of a drive when Mahomes found Grant at the Texas Tech's own 40. Grant cut back to the middle of the field and used at least two blockers to get into the end zone.

In the second quarter, Mahomes threw a screen pass on the far sideline to Washington, who cut back to the middle of the field and outran defenders to score.

GAME 7 • TEXAS TECH 30, KANSAS 20

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) - Patrick Mahomes threw for 354 yards and a score, De'Andre Washington rushed for 157 yards and a TD and Texas Tech held off a late-charging, winless Kansas team 30-20 on Saturday.

The Red Raiders (5-2, 2-2 Big 12) racked up 222 yards rushing and a touchdown on the ground. Texas Tech's 30 points were the least amount the team has scored all season.

Five different Texas Tech offensive playmakers recorded over 50 yards receiving. Zach Austin led the Red Raiders with 80 yards receiving. Jakeem Grant had 71 yards, Devin Lauderdale had 50, Cameron Batson, 58, and Reginald Davis, 57 yards and a score.

Texas Tech continued its streak of perfection, as the Red Raiders are 9-0 inside Memorial Stadium, a record dating to 1966.

Kansas (0-6, 0-3) is riding a nine-game losing streak and is 0-6 for the first time since 1988. Before this season, Kansas had only started 0-6 three times in program history, in 1954 and 1988. Head coach David Beaty is still waiting for his first win.

Freshman quarterback Ryan Willis was 35 of 50 for a career-high 330 yards passing in his second start for the Jayhawks. Willis turned the ball over three times, throwing two picks and dropped a fumble. Running back De'Andre Mann gained 107 yards on 15 carries.

Kansas had its share of bloopers, most of those coming on special teams.

Matthew Wyman missed an extra point attempt and two field goals, a 52-yard attempt and a 34-yard attempt, and Nick Bartolotta shanked a 22-yard field goal wide right.

But Kansas wasn't going out without a fight. Kansas had back-to-back touchdowns in the fourth quarter to put them down by 3.

With less than five minutes to go, Willis was backed up in his own end zone, which would have resulted in a safety, but he fumbled. Two Texas Tech defenders wrestled for the ball, but the ball rolled to Mann, who ran out of the end zone for a 4-yard gain.

But the momentum quickly shifted. On the next play, Willis threw a pick-six and Kansas' comeback hopes were dashed.
