#### First Pitch...

Postponed a day due to rain, the Oklahoma baseball team hosts Abilene Christian at L. Dale Mitchell Park at 4:00 pm on Wednesday, February 24. The game marks the first midweek contest of the season for OU and only the third match-up all-time between the two programs.

#### About the Sooners...

Oklahoma heads into week two of the season with an even 2-2 record and remains in the ranked in the top-25 at No. 25 by Baseball America. The Sooners overcame a slow start, two losses to Northeastern at home, to earn a series split against the Huskies with dominating wins of 10-4 and 13-4 to close the series. As a team, Oklahoma hit .291 with a .428 on-base percentage. Juniors Sheldon Neuse and Jack Flansburg each hit a team-high .538 (7-for-13) with OBPs of .684 and .650, respectively. Neuse drove in five runs, while Flansburg scored six and hit the Sooners' lone home run of the series. Senior outfielder Alex Wise returned healthy for the start of the season and hit .294 (5-for-17) with five runs scored and three knocked in. Junior outfielder Cody Thomas came back from a season off to hit .273 (3-for-11) with three RBI. The OU bullpen posted a 0.96 earned run average and .215 batting average against for the weekend. Freshman RHP **Kyle Tyler** pitched 4.1-scoreless innings out of the pen on Saturday in his Sooner debut.

#### **HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES**

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 587-441-2 (.571), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98). Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children; Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

**Scouting the Wildcats...**Abilene Christian went 17-38 and opened with a four-game sweep last weekend over Texas-Rio Grande Valley. The 2016 season is only ACU's third year at the Division I level; now competing in the Southland Conference. Against Texas-Rio Grande Valley, the Wildcats' pitching staff combined for a 2.00 ERA. Freshman **Mark Pearson** hit .357 in the series and junior **Braxton Wilks** hit .571; scoring three runs in seven at-bats.

#### Last Time vs. ACU...

Oklahoma earned 4-1 (3/5/14) and 3-1 (3/6/14) victories in 2014 against ACU in Norman. Craig Aikin tallied three hits for the Sooners in the 4-1 win and ACU managed just five hits. Mac James had three hits for OU in the 3-1 victory. Pitchers Jacob Evans. Connor **Buchmann** and **Ralph Garza Jr.** combined to strike out 12.

#### **OU-ACU Connection...**

Abilene Christian head coach Britt Bonneau lettered at Oklahoma in 1992 as an outfielder. He hit .285 and slugged .527 with nine home runs and 36 RBI in his one season in Norman. As head coach of the Wildcats, Bonneau has amassed 710 wins in his career.

#### 19 Ways Moves Beyond OU...

Head coach **Pete Hughes** started the 19 Ways community service initiative while at Virginia Tech as a tribute to his late mother. Alice. Since bringing the program to OU, 19 Ways has expanded to eight programs across the country aiming to impact their community in 19 different ways throughout the academic year. This offseason, Northeastern became the eighth program to start its own 19 Ways. Opening day marks the second time Oklahoma has faced another program with a 19 Ways initiative; the first being Notre Dame on opening weekend 2015.

#### Season Openers...

Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-19 on opening day and 24-3 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-2 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-6 going back to 1962, including 33-2 at L. Dale Mitchell.

#### New Field: Same Tradition...

Completion of the new synthetic turf field at L. Dale Mitchell Park on January 15 made OU the sixth team in the Big 12 with a turf playing surface. The surface is made of AstroTurf® 3D Xtreme and covers 150,000 square feet. The turf holds 351,000 lbs. of sand, 180,400 lbs. of rubber, covers 4.100 linear feet of drainage and can handle 4-6 inches of rain per hour. Among 61 power conference teams, 26 play on a turf field. Since 2011, 21 NCAA Regionals have been hosted on a turf playing field, while 12 teams with a home field of synthetic turf have appeared in the College World Series over that time.

#### **Opening Day Starters...**

**Jake Elliott** made his second opening day start on Friday. He became the first OU pitcher to start back-to-back opening days since **Dillon Overton** (2012-13). As a sophomore, Elliott became the first righty to start opening day for Oklahoma since Michael Rocha in 2011. He is also the third sophomore to earn the nod in the last four year after Jacob Evans (2014) and Dillon Overton (2012).

#### **Opening the Gates...**

Oklahoma broke its own opening weekend attendance record set in 2015 with 4,466 passing through the gates at L. Dale Mitchell Park to see the Sooners face Northeastern in 2016. The 2015 opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4,181. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

#### Power and Speed...

Senior outfielder **Hunter Haley** enters the 2016 season with 12 home runs and 27 stolen bases in his career. Over the last decade, he is one of just three players at Oklahoma to record more than 10 home runs and 25 steals in a career. **Max White** (2010-13) and **Jamie Johnson** (2008-09) are the other two to reach the feat in the last 10 years. White hit 23 homers and swiped 29 bags, while Johnson posted 18 and 38.

#### Oklahoma is Home...

The Sooner roster features 11 players from within the state's borders and 11 from Texas. This season marks the most Oklahoma born players at OU since 12 in 2012 and the first time with as many or more players from Oklahoma than Texas since 2006. In 2006, 13 Sooner players called Oklahoma home, while just five were from Texas.

#### Big League Pitchers...

In 2015, Sooner baseball alums combined to start 68 games on the mound in Major League Baseball. That total ranks the second highest among NCAA teams: second only to Long Beach State (70). **Garrett Richards** (32), **Chase Anderson** (27) and **Jon Gray** (9) each took to the hill in 2015 with Gray making his MLB debut on August 4.

#### Preseason Poll...

Oklahoma landed in the fourth spot of the Big 12 Coaches' Preseason Poll: its highest rank since the start of the 2013 season when it was number one and went on to win the Big 12 Tournament. TCU came in at number one followed by Oklahoma State and Texas. Each of the top-three teams received three first-place votes. The Sooners were ranked fifth for the second consecutive season in 2015 and finished third in the standings at 13-11.

#### 2K Ks and Counting...

Since the start of the 2012 season only 11 team's pitching staffs have recorded 2,000 or more strikeouts through the end of 2015. Oklahoma ranks 10th on that list with 2,022. The Sooners are second among Big 12 teams behind TCU (2,039). Over that stretch, **Jon Gray** struck out a team-best 251, while **Jake Elliott** (116) ranks sixth in that stretch and the highest total of active Sooners.

#### Kings of the K...

The Sooner pitching staff led the Big 12 in the regular season with 481 strikeouts and averaged 8.58 per nine innings; both of which ranked second by the end of the postseason.

- **Alec Hansen** struck out 10 vs. Texas Tech (3/22) and led all Big 12 pitchers with 94 through the regular season and finished ranked for third
- Jake Elliott finished seventh in the league at 80. OU pitchers combined to strike out 10-plus 26 times in 2015.
- In 2015, OU surpassed 500 strikeouts for the fourth time in six seasons and fifth time in program history with 524; which ranks fourth all-time.

#### Road Test...

Gearing the schedule toward the RPI, Oklahoma plays 30 games away from L. Dale Mitchell Park, which includes the Bedlam Series hosted by Oklahoma State and a game at Dodger Stadium against Mississippi State. It is the most for the Sooners since 1999 when they played 32 games away from home. The last three times that Oklahoma went on the road 28 times or more in a season, the Sooners hosted a regional in Norman in 2006, 2009 and 2010.
