First Pitch...

Away from home for its first road test of 2016, the Oklahoma baseball team heads to Sam Houston State for a three-game set over the weekend. The series gets underway Friday night at 6:30 pm from Don Sanders Stadium.

About the Sooners...

The Sooners have bounced back from a slow start on opening weekend to win three in a row and enter the second weekend at 3-2. Oklahoma took the final two games of its series with Northeastern before taking down Abilene Christian, 7-1, on Wednesday evening. Junior shortstop **Sheldon Neuse** is hitting a team-best .529 (9-for-17) with a 1.432 OPS, while driving in a team-high six runs and swiping four bags in four attempts. Junior infielder Jack Flansburg, a JuCo transfer, has made an immediate impact at the top of the OU lineup with a .500 (8-for-16) average, 1.328 OPS and nine runs scored. In his first five games back, junior outfielder Cody Thomas is hitting .308 (4-for-13) with a .982 OPS following his first career home run on Wednesday. At the top of the rotation, junior RHP Jake Elliott gets the ball on Friday. He took a nodecision in the season opener last Friday in a six-inning, two-run effort against the Huskies. He has been a mainstay in the Sooner rotation since his freshman year with 27 career starts and a 3.24 earned run average. As a team, Oklahoma is hitting .300 with a .438 on-base percentage. The Sooner bullpen owns a 0.79 ERA and has thrown 10 consecutive scoreless innings.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 587-441-2 (.571), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98). Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children: Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Bearkats...

Sam Houston State is 0-5 following a sweep at the hands of No. 6 UL-Lafayette and a pair of home, midweek losses to Texas-San Antonio and No. 23 Texas Tech. In 2015, the Bearkats finished 31-28 with a 17-12 mark in the Southland under now second-year head coach **Matt Deggs**. SHSU turns to RHP **Sam Odom** (0-0) in Friday's opener. He allowed just one run in eight innings of a no-decision last weekend against the Ragin' Cajuns. Designated hitter **Matt Broadbent** (.357, 5-for-14) is third on the team in hitting, but has driven in a team-leading five runs in four starts. Left fielder **Zach Smith** leads the way at .462 (6-for-13).

All-Time vs. SHSU...

Beginning the series in 1987, OU leads the Bearkats, 8-3 after dropping two out of three at home in 2015. SHSU opened the all-time series with a 5-1 win in 1987. The Sooners then rattled off eight wins in a row, including a 17-6 win at home in 1999. Last season marked the first three-game series between the two schools.

Last Time They Met...

No. 23 Oklahoma welcomed Sam Houston State to Norman on April 24, 2015 and opened the series with a 3-2 win. Kolbey Carpenter notched his sixth straight multi-hit game in a 3-for-4 effort, including the go-ahead home run in the seventh. Game two went to the Bearkats in extras as they tied it in the seventh before winning on a fly ball lost in the sun in right field during the top of the 11th inning. SHSU left Norman with the series win following an 8-5 win in the finale. Oklahoma rallied from eight down with three runs in the eighth and two in the ninth.

Road Test...

Gearing the schedule toward the RPI, Oklahoma plays 30 games away from L. Dale Mitchell Park, which includes the Bedlam Series hosted by Oklahoma State and a game at Dodger Stadium against Mississippi State. It is the most for the Sooners since 1999 when they played 32 games away from home. The last three times that Oklahoma went on the road 28 times or more in a season, the Sooners hosted a regional in Norman in 2006, 2009 and 2010.

19 Ways Moves Beyond OU...

Head coach **Pete Hughes** started the 19 Ways community service initiative while at Virginia Tech as a tribute to his late mother, Alice. Since bringing the program to OU, 19 Ways has expanded to eight programs across the country aiming to impact their community in 19 different ways throughout the academic year. This offseason, Northeastern became the eighth program to start its own 19 Ways. Opening day marks the second time Oklahoma has faced another program with a 19 Ways initiative: the first being Notre Dame on opening weekend 2015.

Season Openers...

Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-19 on opening day and 24-3 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-2 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-6 going back to 1962, including 33-2 at L. Dale Mitchell.

New Field; Same Tradition...

Completion of the new synthetic turf field at L. Dale Mitchell Park on January 15 made OU the sixth team in the Big 12 with a turf playing surface. The surface is made of AstroTurf® 3D Xtreme and covers 150,000 square feet. The turf holds 351,000 lbs. of sand, 180,400 lbs. of rubber, covers 4,100 linear feet of drainage and can handle 4-6 inches of rain per hour. Among 61 power conference teams, 26 play on a turf field. Since 2011, 21 NCAA Regionals have been hosted on a turf playing field, while 12 teams with a home field of synthetic turf have appeared in the College World Series over that time.

Opening the Gates...

Oklahoma broke its own opening weekend attendance record set in 2015 with 4.466 passing through the gates at L. Dale Mitchell Park to see the Sooners face Northeastern in 2016. The 2015 opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4.181. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

Power and Speed...

Senior outfielder **Hunter Haley** enters the 2016 season with 12 home runs and 27 stolen bases in his career. Over the last decade, he is one of just three players at Oklahoma to record more than 10 home runs and 25 steals in a career. Max White (2010-13) and Jamie **Johnson** (2008-09) are the other two to reach the feat in the last 10 years. White hit 23 homers and swiped 29 bags, while Johnson posted 18 and 38.

Oklahoma is Home...

The Sooner roster features 11 players from within the state's borders and 11 from Texas. This season marks the most Oklahoma born players at OU since 12 in 2012 and the first time with as many or more players from Oklahoma than Texas since 2006. In 2006, 13 Sooner players called Oklahoma home, while just five were from Texas.

Big League Pitchers...

In 2015, Sooner baseball alums combined to start 68 games on the mound in Major League Baseball. That total ranks the second highest among NCAA teams; second only to Long Beach State (70). Garrett Richards (32), Chase Anderson (27) and Jon Gray (9) each took to the hill in 2015 with Gray making his MLB debut on August 4.

Preseason Poll...

Oklahoma landed in the fourth spot of the Big 12 Coaches' Preseason Poll; its highest rank since the start of the 2013 season when it was number one and went on to win the Big 12 Tournament. TCU came in at number one followed by Oklahoma State and Texas. Each of the top-three teams received three first-place votes. The Sooners were ranked fifth for the second consecutive season in 2015 and finished third in the standings at 13-11.

2K Ks and Counting...

Since the start of the 2012 season only 11 team's pitching staffs have recorded 2,000 or more strikeouts through the end of 2015. Oklahoma ranks 10th on that list with 2,022. The Sooners are second among Big 12 teams behind TCU (2,039). Over that stretch, Jon **Gray** struck out a team-best 251, while **Jake Elliott** (116) ranks sixth in that stretch and the highest total of active Sooners.

The Sooner pitching staff led the Big 12 in the regular season with 481 strikeouts and averaged 8.58 per nine innings; both of which ranked second by the end of the postseason.

- **Alec Hansen** struck out 10 vs. Texas Tech (3/22) and led all Big 12 pitchers with 94 through the regular season and finished third.
- **Jake Elliott** finished seventh in the league at 80. OU pitchers combined to strike out 10-plus 26 times in 2015.
- OU surpassed 500 strikeouts for the fourth time in six seasons and fifth time in program history with 524; which ranks fourth all-time.

Working Deep...
