First Pitch...

Oklahoma baseball returns home briefly for a Tuesday midweek contest against Central Arkansas. First pitch is set for 4:00 pm from L. Dale Mitchell Park.

About the Sooners...

The Sooners are back in Norman looking to snap a three-game losing streak following a sweep at Sam Houston State over the weekend. Oklahoma is 3-5 on the season, including a 3-2 mark at home. Junior Jack Flansburg has started all eight games with at least one start at all four infield positions. He has started the season on an eight-game hit streak; batting .414 (12-for-29) with a 1.078 OPS (on-base plus slugging percentage). Sophomore infielder Kyle Mendenhall enters Tuesday hitting .300 (6-for-20) and has driven in a team-high seven runs; all in the last four games. Mendenhall drove in a career-high three against Abilene Christian (2/24) and hit his first career home run at Sam Houston State (2/27). Freshman Chris Andritsos (1-0) will make his second start on the hill for Oklahoma. He got the win vs. Abilene last week in five innings of one-run ball on just one hit and one walk, while striking out five. Andritsos has also made starts at first base and DH with a .250 (2-for-8) average, .333 OBP and one RBI. The OU bullpen owns a 1.88 team earned run average in 38.1 innings. In 35 complete innings pitched, Sooner relievers have totaled 28 shutout frames. Senior Keaton Hernandez has pitched a teamhigh 8.2 innings out of the pen to a 1.04 ERA, while freshman Austin Hansen has thrown 5.2-scoreless.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 18 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 587-441-2 (.571), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98). Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children: Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Bears...

Central Arkansas is 5-3 on the season, stringing together five consecutive wins after getting swept by Missouri State in their season opening series. The Bears pitching staff allowed just 11 runs in their four-game sweep over Eastern Illinois. This is the team's first trip away from home on the season, coming off a 2015 season where they finished with a 12-13 road record. Overall, the Bears were 29-24 in 2015 with a 16-14 mark in the Southland Conference. Infielder **Logan Preston** has been a catalyst for the Bears this season, hitting .448 with six runs scored. Outfielder **Tyler Langley** (.323, 10-31) and catcher **Justin McCarty** (.308, 8-26) have also been contributors. Head Coach **Allen Gum** is now in his fourth season at the helm for UCA, which includes a NCAA Regional appearance in 2013, a year in which the Bears finished with a school-record 42 wins.

All-Time vs. UCA...

This marks OU's third meeting with Central Arkansas, with wins over the Bears coming in 2009 (12-6) and 2015 (7-0). Both meetings were in Norman. Last season, Oklahoma outhit Central Arkansas, 14-5, on March 31. Lefty **Adam Choplick** struck out 10 and allowed just three hits in six innings of scoreless ball. The Sooners put up a pair of three-run innings and got home runs from **Kolbey Carpenter**, who drove in three for the day, and **Chris Shaw**.

Road Test...

Gearing the schedule toward the RPI, Oklahoma plays 30 games away from L. Dale Mitchell Park, which includes the Bedlam Series hosted by Oklahoma State and a game at Dodger Stadium against Mississippi State. It is the most for the Sooners since 1999 when they played 32 games away from home. The last three times that Oklahoma went on the road 28 times or more in a season, the Sooners hosted a regional in Norman in 2006, 2009 and 2010.

19 Ways Moves Beyond OU...

Head coach **Pete Hughes** started the 19 Ways community service initiative while at Virginia Tech as a tribute to his late mother, Alice. Since bringing the program to OU, 19 Ways has expanded to eight programs across the country aiming to impact their community in 19 different ways throughout the academic year. This offseason, Northeastern became the eighth program to start its own 19 Ways. Opening day marks the second time Oklahoma has faced another program with a 19 Ways initiative: the first being Notre Dame on opening weekend 2015.

Season Openers...

Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-19 on opening day and 24-3 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-2 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-6 going back to 1962, including 33-2 at L. Dale Mitchell.

New Field; Same Tradition...

Completion of the new synthetic turf field at L. Dale Mitchell Park on January 15 made OU the sixth team in the Big 12 with a turf playing surface. The surface is made of AstroTurf® 3D Xtreme and covers 150,000 square feet. The turf holds 351,000 lbs. of sand, 180,400 lbs. of rubber, covers 4,100 linear feet of drainage and can handle 4-6 inches of rain per hour. Among 61 power conference teams, 26 play on a turf field. Since 2011, 21 NCAA Regionals have been hosted on a turf playing field, while 12 teams with a home field of synthetic turf have appeared in the College World Series over that time.

Up Next...

The Sooners are back on the road this weekend for the Dodger Stadium Classic in Los Angeles. Oklahoma visits USC on Friday and UCLA on Saturday before facing Mississippi State at Dodger Stadium on Sunday.

Oklahoma is Home...

The Sooner roster features 11 players from within the state's borders and 11 from Texas. This season marks the most Oklahoma born players at OU since 12 in 2012 and the first time with as many or more players from Oklahoma than Texas since 2006. In 2006, 13 Sooner players called Oklahoma home, while just five were from Texas.

Opening the Gates...

Oklahoma broke its own opening weekend attendance record set in 2015 with 4.466 passing through the gates at L. Dale Mitchell Park to see the Sooners face Northeastern in 2016. The 2015 opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4.181. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

Power and Speed...

Senior outfielder **Hunter Halev** enters the 2016 season with 12 home runs and 27 stolen bases in his career. Over the last decade, he is one of just three players at Oklahoma to record more than 10 home runs and 25 steals in a career. Max White (2010-13) and Jamie **Johnson** (2008-09) are the other two to reach the feat in the last 10 years. White hit 23 homers and swiped 29 bags, while Johnson posted 18 and 38.

Big League Pitchers...

In 2015, Sooner baseball alums combined to start 68 games on the mound in Major League Baseball. That total ranks the second highest among NCAA teams; second only to Long Beach State (70). Garrett Richards (32), Chase Anderson (27) and Jon Gray (9) each took to the hill in 2015 with Gray making his MLB debut on August 4.

Preseason Poll...

Oklahoma landed in the fourth spot of the Big 12 Coaches' Preseason Poll; its highest rank since the start of the 2013 season when it was number one and went on to win the Big 12 Tournament. TCU came in at number one followed by Oklahoma State and Texas. Each of the top-three teams received three first-place votes. The Sooners were ranked fifth for the second consecutive season in 2015 and finished third in the standings at 13-11.

2K Ks and Counting...

Since the start of the 2012 season only 11 team's pitching staffs have recorded 2,000 or more strikeouts through the end of 2015. Oklahoma ranks 10th on that list with 2,022. The Sooners are second among Big 12 teams behind TCU (2,039). Over that stretch, **Jon Gray** struck out a team-best 251, while **Jake Elliott** (116) ranks sixth in that stretch and the highest total of active Sooners.
