First Pitch...

The Oklahoma baseball team is in Los Angeles for the weekend facing back-to-back-to-back Top-25 opponents at the Dodger Stadium Classic. The Sooners visit No. 22 USC and No. 21 UCLA on Friday and Saturday night. OU then plays No. 20 Mississippi State at Dodger Stadium.

About the Sooners...

The Sooners snapped a brief three-game slide with a 3-0 win over Central Arkansas at home on Tuesday evening. Oklahoma moves into the weekend at 4-5 on the season. Despite having an eight-game win streak ended on Tuesday, junior infielder **Jack Flansburg** leads OU with a .375 (12-for-32) batting average and 10 runs scored. Junior shortstop **Sheldon Neuse** is second on the team at .355 (11-for-31) with a 1.093 OPS (on-base plus slugging percentage) and seven RBI. Junior right-hander **Jake Elliott** (0-0) starts in the Friday role for the Sooners for the second straight season. In two no-decisions, he has pitched six innings in each outing with a 3.00 earned run average and a total of eight strikeouts. The OU bullpen owns a 1.79 ERA with 40.1 innings of work through nine games. Senior RHP **Keaton Hernandez** has appeared three times for 8.2 innings and a 1.04 ERA. Neuse has pitched out of the bullpen three times for a 1.50 ERA, while freshman RHP **Austin Hansen** sports a spotless 0.00 ERA in 5.2 innings across two relief outings.

• Juniors Alec Hansen and Sheldon Neuse each earned Louisville Slugger Preseason All-America honors from *Collegiate Baseball News* and are on the Golden Spikes Award Watch List.

• Oklahoma last played in a MLB ballpark in 2014: a 3-2 win over UT-Arlington in 10 innings on March 11 at Globe Life Park.

• The Sooners have played all three Dodger Stadium Classic teams multiple times in the NCAA Tournament: totaling a 4-6 record.

• OU went 5-12 against top-25 opponents in 2015 and are 10-25 vs. ranked opponents under coach Hughes. The Sooners last top-25 win came vs. No. 11 Oklahoma State (5/3/15), 5-3.

• Oklahoma boasted a program-best 3.27 GPA in the fall 2015 semester: the highest for a men's sport at OU.

• Steele Walker has started all nine games in center field and is the only Sooner to start each game at the same position.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 19 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 591-446-2 (.571), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children: Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Field...

Oklahoma faces its first top-25 competition of the season with all three games coming against ranked opponents. Starting off with No. 22 USC (all rankings according to D1Baseball.com), the Trojans are 5-3 following a win over Long Beach State on Tuesday. Senior RHP **Kyle Davis** (1-1) has started each Friday contest to the tune of a 3.00 ERA and .218 batting average against with 16 strikeouts in 15 innings pitched. Third baseman **Adalberto Carrillo** has slugged three home runs and driven in seven runs.

No. 21 UCLA fell to 3-5 with a Tuesday loss to UC Santa Barbara. The Bruins dropped a series to North Carolina opening weekend before taking two-of-three from at Cal Poly. Sophomore RHP **Griffin Canning** (1-0) started last Saturday for UCLA and holds a 2.25 ERA with 14 strikeouts in 12 innings. Right fielder **Eric Filia** has knocked in a team-high seven runs, while hitting .387.

Hitting the road for the first time this season, No. 20 Mississippi State enters the weekend at 7-2. Junior RHP **Zac Houston** (1-0) got the win last Sunday, while dropping his ERA to 0.93 with 13 strikeouts in 9.2 innings. **Jack Kruger** is hitting a team-high .563 (18-for-32) with a 1.000 slugging percentage on eight doubles and two homers.

All-Time vs. USC...

Oklahoma leads the all-time series with USC, 6-3, including an even 1-1 record in the NCAA Tournament. The two sides first met in Omaha at the 1951 College World Series. The Sooners eliminated the Trojans, 4-1, on the way to their first National Championship. They met again at Rosenblatt Stadium for the 1995 CWS: a 4-9 USC win. The last meeting came in 2013 with the Trojans winning at home, 5-3. Lefty **Dillon Overton** pitched an eight-inning, complete-game in the loss.

All-Time vs. UCLA...

The Sooners hold an 8-6 advantage over the Bruins since meeting for the first time in 1992 at the NCAA Starkville Regional. Oklahoma won twice over UCLA en route to reaching its eighth CWS. The Bruins lead the all-time postseason series, 4-2, having gotten the best of the Sooners twice in the 2000 and 2004 Oklahoma City Regionals. In the last meeting, Oklahoma defeated UCLA in Los Angeles, 4-0. The Bruins went on to win the National Championship later that season. Right-hander **Jonathan Gray** pitched seven-shutout innings and struck out eight in the win. **Matt Oberste** hit a three-run home run in the fourth. Haley started in left and batted ninth for OU.

All-Time vs. Mississippi State...

On the road, Oklahoma fell to Mississippi State in a winner's bracket game of the 1992 NCAA Starkville Regional before eliminating the Bulldogs, 10-6, before downing UCLA in the final, 10-0. The Sooners took the lead in the all-time series with Mississippi State in their last meeting in 2010 at the Whataburger Classic in Corpus Christi, Texas. Oklahoma erupted for 19 hits in a 16-5 win. Right-hander **Zach Neal** went 6.1 innings in the win and struck out eight. **Cameron Seitzer** was 3-for-3 with five RBI and **Ross Hubbard** finished 2-for-3 with four RBI. **Drew Harrison** came off the bench to add a two-run homer. The win was OU's ninth in a row to start 14-1 on the year.

One-Hit Shutout...

In his second career start, freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** threw seven innings of shutout, one-hit ball. He retired the first eight Central Arkansas (3/1) batters of the game before allowing the only hit of the day in the third. The Sooners totaled six hits in the win, including solo home runs from **Sheldon Neuse** and **Cody Thomas**. Freshman RHP **Connor Berry** finished the game with two-scoreless innings of relief to earn the first save of his career, while tallying three strikeouts. The win marked the first shutout for OU since beating Alcorn State (4/22/15), 8-0. The Sooners have shutout UCA in back-to-back seasons by a score of 10-0. Andritsos has totaled 12 innings and 11 strikeouts in two starts with only two hits against and one run.

Road Test...

Gearing the schedule toward the RPI, Oklahoma plays 30 games away from L. Dale Mitchell Park, which includes the Bedlam Series hosted by Oklahoma State and a game at Dodger Stadium against Mississippi State. It is the most for the Sooners since 1999 when they played 32 games away from home. The last three times that Oklahoma went on the road 28 times or more in a season, the Sooners hosted a regional in Norman in 2006, 2009 and 2010.

Turf and Turf...

Through nine games, Oklahoma has played every game on a synthetic turf field. The Sooners are 4-2 at home on L. Dale Mitchell Park's new AstroTurf® surface. The first road trip of the season saw OU play on Sam Houston State's newly resurfaced Don Sander Stadium. The Sooners will play their first game on natural grass this season on Friday at USC's Dedeaux Field.

Major League Diamonds...

Since the Big 12 Championship was last hosted in Arlington at Globe Life Park (Ameritrust Field at the time) in 2004, Oklahoma has played at a Major League Baseball park four times. The Sooners are 3-1 in such games having most recently defeated UT-Arlington (3/11/14), 3-2 in 10 innings, in Arlington. In 2008, Oklahoma went 2-1 at the Houston College Classic at Minute Maid Park. The Sooners lost the opener to Rice (2/29/08), 7-2, before picking up wins over Houston (3/1/08) and Tennessee (3/2/08) by scores of 8-5 in 10 innings and 2-0.

19 Ways Moves Beyond OU...

Head coach **Pete Hughes** started the 19 Ways community service initiative while at Virginia Tech as a tribute to his late mother, Alice. Since bringing the program to OU, 19 Ways has expanded to eight programs across the country aiming to impact their community in 19 different ways throughout the academic year. This offseason, Northeastern became the eighth program to start its own 19 Ways. Opening day marks the second time Oklahoma has faced another program with a 19 Ways initiative; the first being Notre Dame on opening weekend 2015.

New Field; Same Tradition...

Completion of the new synthetic turf field at L. Dale Mitchell Park on January 15 made OU the sixth team in the Big 12 with a turf playing surface. The surface is made of AstroTurf® 3D Xtreme and covers 150,000 square feet. The turf holds 351,000 lbs. of sand, 180,400 lbs. of rubber, covers 4,100 linear feet of drainage and can handle 4-6 inches of rain per hour. Among 61 power conference teams, 26 play on a turf field. Since 2011, 21 NCAA Regionals have been hosted on a turf playing field, while 12 teams with a home field of synthetic turf have appeared in the College World Series over that time.

Opening Day Starters...

Jake Elliott made his second opening day start on Friday. He became the first OU pitcher to start back-to-back opening days since **Dillon Overton** (2012-13). As a sophomore, Elliott became the first righty to start opening day for Oklahoma since **Michael Rocha** (2011). He was also the third sophomore to earn the nod in the four years after **Jacob Evans** (2014) and **Dillon Overton** (2012).

Up Next...

The Sooners are home for four games next week beginning with Wichita State on Tuesday night at 6:00 pm. It will be the first of 17 games televised by Sooner Sports TV this season. Oklahoma will then host Long Beach State on the weekend.

Season Openers...

Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-19 on opening day and 24-3 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-2 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-6 going back to 1962, including 33-2 at L. Dale Mitchell.

Prospect Watch: 2016...

Several 2016 MLB Draft prospects highlight the Sooners' junior class just one year after OU claimed the nation's largest draft class. **Alec Hansen** rates near the top of most experts' draft boards entering opening day. **Sheldon Neuse** and **Jake Elliott** have also garnered their share of attention at the start of their draft-year.

Oklahoma is Home...

The Sooner roster features 11 players from within the state's borders and 11 from Texas. This season marks the most Oklahoma born players at OU since 12 in 2012 and the first time with as many or more players from Oklahoma than Texas since 2006. In 2006, 13 Sooner players called Oklahoma home, while just five were from Texas.

Opening the Gates...

Oklahoma broke its own opening weekend attendance record set in 2015 with 4,466 passing through the gates at L. Dale Mitchell Park to see the Sooners face Northeastern in 2016. The 2015 opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4,181. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

Over the last decade, he is one of just three players at Oklahoma to record more than 10 home runs and 25 steals in a career. **Max White** (2010-13) and **Jamie Johnson** (2008-09) are the other two to reach the feat in the last 10 years. White hit 23 homers and swiped 29 bags, while Johnson posted 18 and 38.

In 2015, Sooner baseball alums combined to start 68 games on the mound in Major League Baseball. That total ranks the second highest among NCAA teams: second only to Long Beach State (70). **Garrett Richards** (32), **Chase Anderson** (27) and **Jon Gray** (9) each took to the hill in 2015 with Gray making his MLB debut on August 4.

Preseason Poll...

Oklahoma landed in the fourth spot of the Big 12 Coaches' Preseason Poll: its highest rank since the start of the 2013 season when it was number one and went on to win the Big 12 Tournament. TCU came in at number one followed by Oklahoma State and Texas. Each of the top-three teams received three first-place votes. The Sooners were ranked fifth for the second consecutive season in 2015 and finished third in the standings at 13-11.

2K Ks and Counting...

Since the start of the 2012 season only 11 team's pitching staffs have recorded 2,000 or more strikeouts through the end of 2015. Oklahoma ranks 10th on that list with 2,022. The Sooners are second among Big 12 teams behind TCU (2,039). CONFERENCE NOTES

After dropping its first contests of the season, TCU and West Virginia are undefeated since opening day with the Frogs riding a six-game win streak and the Mountaineers winners of five straight. TCU tops the league in batting average and ERA, while WVU is off to its best start since the 2006 season.

TCU claimed the 2016 Shriners Hospitals College Classic title after a 3-0 showing at the event and with a plus-25 run differential tiebreaker over Arkansas. The three victories were all against top 25 opponents as TCU outscored its opponents 27-2. Texas Tech went 2-1 in the tournament.

The field for the 2017 Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic will feature three Big 12 teams - Baylor, TCU and Texas Tech - against three SEC programs in LSU, Ole Miss and Texas A&M (March 3-5).

Big 12 teams will compete in 37 contests in the third week of the regular season with Baylor, Oklahoma, Texas and Texas Tech slated to face top 25 teams on the weekend. The Bears travel to No. 21 Houston, Oklahoma takes on No. 22 USC, No. 14 UCLA and No. 19 Mississippi State in the Dodger Stadium Classic, Texas hosts its second-straight Pac-12 opponent for a four-game series in No. 10 California, and Tech faces its fourth ranked opponent of the year as it hosts No. 22 Cal State Fullerton.

Texas Tech is currently in the midst of a 13-game stretch where the Red Raiders will face 10 games against ranked opponents while Texas will face 12 ranked teams in the span of 14 games.

The league is a combined 37-28 with 18 of its 28 losses by three runs or less. Of the 105 conference contests played in 2015, 62 were determined by three runs or less (59 percent).

Baylor, TCU and West Virginia all posted averages of .300 or higher last week with the Bears and Frogs totaling 38 and 37 RBI, respectively, over four games each.

Oklahoma State and TCU remain ranked for the third week in a row with the Frogs as high as No. 7 and the Cowboys at No. 22.

A different league team has won each of the past five Big 12 titles with Texas the last team to repeat as regular season champions while no single team has repeated as regular season champions since the 2010-11 season, the Big 12 postseason crown has also been won by a different league squad each of the last five years.
