First Pitch...

The University of Oklahoma baseball team is home for four games this week beginning Tuesday night against Wichita State. First pitch is set for 6:00 pm from L. Dale Mitchell Park.

About the Sooners...

The Sooners faced three top-25 opponents over the weekend and posted two losses, by a combined three runs, and a tie, due to travel restrictions. Oklahoma is 4-7-1 overall with all four wins coming at home. Freshman right-hander **Kyle Tyler** gets the ball for his first collegiate start. In two relief appearances, he has yet to allow an earned run on five hits and two walks in 5.1 innings. Tyler has also struck out five. He will become the third freshman to start on the mound for OU this season. Juniors **Sheldon Neuse** and **Jack Flansburg** each lead the Sooners with an identical .302 (13-for-43) batting average. Neuse picked up his team-leading ninth RBI of the season on a solo home run, his second of the year, at Dodger Stadium on Sunday afternoon. As a team, Oklahoma has struggled away from home with a .208 batting average as opposed to .286 at home. However, the Sooner freshman class is hitting .277 on the road. In Saturday's 4-2 loss at UCLA, OU freshmen accounted for six of the team's seven hits as **Hunter Southerland** and **Cade Harris** each recorded a two-hit day.

On the Air...

Tuesday night's game will air across the state on the Sooner Sports Radio Network. Locally, it can be heard on Sportstalk 1400 AM and 98.5 FM. Veteran OU broadcaster Toby Rowland returns to the booth to call the action. He will be joined by former MLB All-Star Mickey Tettleton providing color commentary. The game, originally scheduled to be televised by Sooner Sports TV, will be available for stream with a subscription to SoonerSports.tv.

• Juniors Alec Hansen and Sheldon Neuse each earned Louisville Slugger Preseason All-America honors from *Collegiate Baseball News* and are on the Golden Spikes Award Watch List.

• Neuse is just one RBI away from becoming only the second player to record 100 in his career since Max White (2010-13). Anthony Hermelyn (2013-15) finished his career with 103.

• The Sooners recorded their first tie since 2008 with a 5-5 decision against Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium.

• Hansen struck out 11 in his last outing: a 6.1-inning loss at No. 14 UCLA (3/5). It marked the second most strikeouts of his career.

• Six of the Sooners' seven losses have come by two runs or less. In 2015, OU went 14-12 in games decided by one or two runs.

• Oklahoma boasted a program-best 3.27 GPA in the fall 2015 semester: the highest for a men's sport at OU.

• Steele Walker has started all 12 games in center field and is the only Sooner to start each game at the same position.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 19 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 591-446-2 (.571), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98).

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children: Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Shockers...

Wichita State comes to Norman following a series against familiar foes for Oklahoma, Sam Houston State. The Shockers lost two of three to the Bearcats, but managed a total of 21 runs in the series. Overall, Wichita State is 4-7 on the season and 0-4 away from home. The bats have been hot to open up the year for the Shockers, who are hitting .304 as a team through their first 11 games. Infielder **Tanner Kirk** and catcher **Gunnar Troutwine** have led the charge, batting .429 (12-for-28) and .389 (14-for-36), respectively. Troutwine leads the team with three home runs on the season and first baseman **Ryan Tinkham** has drove in a team-high 12 runs. Freshman RHP **Clayton McGinness** (0-0) will make his first start of the season.

All-Time vs. Wichita State...

Oklahoma leads the all-time series with Wichita State, 14-11, including an 8-4 win for the Sooners at the 1992 College World Series in Omaha. Oklahoma had won seven straight over the Shockers prior to last season's meeting, where Wichita State overcame an early 6-0 deficit to earn the victory. **Hunter Haley** recorded two doubles in the loss, and catcher **Anthony Hermelyn** tallied three hits for the Sooners.

Sooner-Shocker Connection...

Wichita State's third-year head coach Todd Butler played at Oklahoma for two seasons, 1987-88. He was named an ABCA All-American in 1988 and set the Sooner record for stolen bases in a season with 46. He is tied for 14th all-time at OU with 53.

The Big Inning...

The Sooners have scored more than two runs in an inning only four times this season. Oklahoma scored a season-high six runs in the third inning in a win against Northeastern (2/21). The Sooners last plated more than two men in an inning against Abilene Christian (2/24). OU pitchers have limited the opposition to scoring more than twice in an inning six times. The Sooners have allowed three runs in the first or second inning four times this season.

One-Hit Shutout...

In his second career start, freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** threw seven innings of shutout, one-hit ball. He retired the first eight Central Arkansas (3/1) batters of the game before allowing the only hit of the day in the third. The Sooners totaled six hits in the win, including solo home runs from **Sheldon Neuse** and **Cody Thomas**. Freshman RHP **Connor Berry** finished the game with two scoreless innings of relief to earn the first save of his career, while tallying three strikeouts. The win marked the first shutout for OU since beating Alcorn State (4/22/15), 8-0. The Sooners have shutout UCA in back-to-back seasons by a score of 10-0. Andritsos has totaled 12 innings and 11 strikeouts in two starts with only two hits against and one run.

Road Test...

Gearing the schedule toward the RPI, Oklahoma plays 30 games away from L. Dale Mitchell Park, which includes the Bedlam Series hosted by Oklahoma State and a game at Dodger Stadium against Mississippi State. It is the most for the Sooners since 1999 when they played 32 games away from home. The last three times that Oklahoma went on the road 28 times or more in a season, the Sooners hosted a regional in Norman in 2006, 2009 and 2010.

Turf and Turf...

Through nine games, Oklahoma had played every game on a synthetic turf field. The Sooners are 4-2 at home on L. Dale Mitchell Park's new AstroTurf® surface. The first road trip of the season saw OU play on Sam Houston State's newly resurfaced Don Sander Stadium. The Sooners played their first game on natural grass this season last Friday at USC's Dedeaux Field.

Playing Horeshoes...

Six of Oklahoma's seven losses have come by two runs or less. The Sooners are 0-4 in one-run games and 0-2 in two-run games. In 2015, OU won 10 one-run games and went 14-12 when games were decided by two runs or less.

Major League Diamonds...

Since the Big 12 Championship was last hosted in Arlington at Globe Life Park (Ameritrust Field at the time) in 2004, Oklahoma has played at a Major League Baseball park five times. The Sooners are 3-1-1 in such games following a tie vs. Mississippi State (3/6). OU most recently defeated UT-Arlington (3/11/14), 3-2 in 10 innings, in Arlington. In 2008, Oklahoma went 2-1 at the Houston College Classic at Minute Maid Park. The Sooners lost the opener to Rice (2/29/08), 7-2, before picking up wins over Houston (3/1/08) and Tennessee (3/2/08) by scores of 8-5 in 10 innings and 2-0.

19 Ways Moves Beyond OU...

Head coach **Pete Hughes** started the 19 Ways community service initiative while at Virginia Tech as a tribute to his late mother, Alice. Since bringing the program to OU, 19 Ways has expanded to eight programs across the country aiming to impact their community in 19 different ways throughout the academic year. This offseason, Northeastern became the eighth program to start its own 19 Ways. Opening day marks the second time Oklahoma has faced another program with a 19 Ways initiative; the first being Notre Dame on opening weekend 2015.

New Field; Same Tradition...

Completion of the new synthetic turf field at L. Dale Mitchell Park on January 15 made OU the sixth team in the Big 12 with a turf playing surface. The surface is made of AstroTurf® 3D Xtreme and covers 150,000 square feet. The turf holds 351,000 lbs. of sand, 180,400 lbs. of rubber, covers 4,100 linear feet of drainage and can handle 4-6 inches of rain per hour. Among 61 power conference teams, 26 play on a turf field. Since 2011, 21 NCAA Regionals have been hosted on a turf playing field, while 12 teams with a home field of synthetic turf have appeared in the College World Series over that time.

Opening Day Starters...

Jake Elliott made his second opening day start on Friday. He became the first OU pitcher to start back-to-back opening days since **Dillon Overton** (2012-13). As a sophomore, Elliott became the first righty to start opening day for Oklahoma since **Michael Rocha** (2011). He was also the third sophomore to earn the nod in the four years after **Jacob Evans** (2014) and **Dillon Overton** (2012).

#YardWork...

Oklahoma posted its best home run total since 2011 with 39 in 2015. Since the inception of the BBCOR bat to college baseball in 2011, the Sooners season-high is 41 in 2011. **Sheldon Neuse** is OU's active career leader with 15 followed by **Hunter Haley** at 12.

Season Openers...

Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-19 on opening day and 24-3 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-2 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-6 going back to 1962, including 33-2 at L. Dale Mitchell.

Against the West...

Under head coach Pete Hughes, the Sooners are 4-2 against schools from California. When playing against teams from the Pacific or Hawaii Time Zones, OU is 10-7. When playing in the Pacific of Hawaii Time Zones, the Oklahoma is 8-4. In the last two seasons, the Sooners have played seven of the 11 Pac-12 schools and posted a 3-4 record.

Prospect Watch: 2016...

Several 2016 MLB Draft prospects highlight the Sooners' junior class just one year after OU claimed the nation's largest draft class. **Alec Hansen** rates near the top of most experts' draft boards entering opening day. **Sheldon Neuse** and **Jake Elliott** have also garnered their share of attention at the start of their draft-year.

Oklahoma is Home...

The Sooner roster features 11 players from within the state's borders and 11 from Texas. This season marks the most Oklahoma born players at OU since 12 in 2012 and the first time with as many or more players from Oklahoma than Texas since 2006. In 2006, 13 Sooner players called Oklahoma home, while just five were from Texas.

Opening the Gates...

Oklahoma broke its own opening weekend attendance record set in 2015 with 4,466 passing through the gates at L. Dale Mitchell Park to see the Sooners face Northeastern in 2016. The 2015 opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4,181. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

Power and Speed...

Senior outfielder **Hunter Haley** enters the 2016 season with 12 home runs and 27 stolen bases in his career. Over the last decade, he is one of just three players at Oklahoma to record more than 10 home runs and 25 steals in a career. **Max White** (2010-13) and **Jamie Johnson** (2008-09) are the other two to reach the feat in the last 10 years. White hit 23 homers and swiped 29 bags, while Johnson posted 18 and 38.

Preseason Poll...

Oklahoma landed in the fourth spot of the Big 12 Coaches' Preseason Poll: its highest rank since the start of the 2013 season when it was number one and went on to win the Big 12 Tournament. TCU came in at number one followed by Oklahoma State and Texas. Each of the top-three teams received three first-place votes. The Sooners were ranked fifth for the second consecutive season in 2015 and finished third in the standings at 13-11.

2K Ks and Counting...

Since the start of the 2012 season only 11 team's pitching staffs have recorded 2,000 or more strikeouts through the end of 2015. Oklahoma ranks 10th on that list with 2,022. The Sooners are second among Big 12 teams behind TCU (2,039). Over that stretch, **Jon Gray** struck out a team-best 251, while **Jake Elliott** (116) ranks sixth in that stretch and the highest total of active Sooners.
