First Pitch...

The University of Oklahoma baseball team is home this weekend for a three-game series with Long Beach State. Game one is set for a 6:00 pm first pitch on Friday night from L. Dale Mitchell Park.

About the Sooners...

Following a weekend against three-straight top-25 opponents, Oklahoma returned home for a 4-2 midweek win over Wichita State on Tuesday night. The Sooners are now 5-7-1 overall entering the second home series of the season. Oklahoma is 5-2 on its home turf to begin the year. Junior shortstop Sheldon Neuse leads OU with a .326 batting average and .674 slugging percentage on three doubles, two triples and three home runs. He has made four relief appearances as the Sooner closer to the tune of a 1.29 earned run average and .182 opponent batting average. In the rotation, Oklahoma has been led on Friday nights by junior righthander Jake Elliott, who moves into the Sunday role. He has three no-decisions to start the season despite a 3.24 ERA. Taking over the pitching duties in game one is junior RHP **Alec Hansen**. Coming off an 11-strikeout performance in a loss at No. 14 UCLA, he is 0-2 with a 5.23 ERA and a team-leading 17 strikeouts.

On the Air...

This weekend's series features the first televised games of the season for the Sooners. Sooner Sports TV will broadcast all three games with OU and MLB alum George Frazier on the call with former MLB All-Star Mickey Tettleton. All three games will be available nationally at FOX College Sports-Central. Locally, the games can be found on FSSW+ (Friday), FSOK+ (Saturday) and FSOK (Sunday). Television audio will be fed to the KREF 1400 AM and 98.5 FM broadcast. On Friday night, cable viewers in Oklahoma will only be able to watch the game on FCS-Central of the FOX Sports Go application online and on mobile devices.

HEAD COACH PETE HUGHES

Pete Hughes was named the ninth head baseball coach in program history on June 27, 2013.

Twice named both the New England Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Coach of the Year, as well as the 2000 American Baseball Coaches Association Northeast Region Coach of the Year, Hughes owns a well-deserved reputation for setting new standards of excellence at every stop during his 17-year coaching career.

Hughes recorded five straight 30-win seasons at Virginia Tech, including a pair of 40-win campaigns that culminated with NCAA Tournament berths in 2010 and 2013. He inherited a club that hadn't reached the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and went on to compile a 222-174 (.561) record in seven seasons with the Hokies from 2007-13.

In 19 seasons as a head coach, Hughes owns a career record of 591-446-2 (.571), including his stints at Boston College (1999-2006) and Trinity University (1997-98)

Hughes graduated from Davidson College in 1990 where he played third base on the baseball team and quarterback for the Wildcats' football team.

A native of Brockton, Mass., Hughes and his wife Debby reside in Norman with their five children: Thomas, Hal, Dominic, Grace and P.J.

Scouting the Dirtbags...

Long Beach State is off to an 8-4 start to the season, including 11 of 12 games played at home. The Dirtbags have picked up series wins over Holy Cross, Arizona State and Nebraska plus midweek wins at UCLA and against previously undefeated Fresno State. Third baseman **Zack Domingues** has emerged as the team's top hitter in the early going at .500 (13-for-26). Shortstop **Garrett Hampson** has been in the lineup all 12 games and hitting .413 (19-for-46) with 22 RBI and eight stolen bases.

All-Time vs. The Beach...

Oklahoma has lost two of its three match-ups against Long Beach State. The two teams first met in 1989 at the NCAA West I Regional in Tucson, Ariz. The Dirtbags won, 11-4, in a winner's bracket game. In 1997, LBSU got the better of OU, 1-0, in the opener of the NCAA South I Regional in Baton Rouge, La. Oklahoma picked up a win in the most recent meeting: a 2-1 decision at the Rice Tournament in 2006. **P.J. Sandoval** went toe-to-toe with future MLB pitcher **Vance Worley** to earn the win.

Oh man, oh man, oh man, not again...

Sheldon Neuse smashed his second home run of the season vs. Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium and followed with a home run against Wichita State (3/8). All three of his home runs have come over the last five games within an eight-day stretch. Neuse has homered in back-to-back games three times in his career. He did so twice in 2015 against BYU (2/28) and Little Rock (3/3) and later against Purdue (3/7-8). His 16 career home runs are the most among active Sooners and the second most at OU since the introduction of the BBCOR bats in 2011; behind Matt Oberste (2012-13) with 17.

Hog Tied...

Due to travel restrictions, Oklahoma's game with Mississippi State (3/6) at Dodger Stadium ended after nine innings in a 5-5 tie. It marked the 12th tie in OU history and first since a 5-5, 11-inning game at Nebraska (3/22/08). The Sooners overcame a 5-1 deficit after the third inning.

Bullpen Bagels...

The OU bullpen owns a 1.97 ERA with three saves and two wins on the season, while holding opponents to a .228 batting average. Sooner relievers have totaled 45 shutout innings in 51 complete innings pitched. Over the last two games, Oklahoma relievers have combined to throw a season-high 12-consecutive scoreless-innings.

The Big Inning...

The Sooners have scored more than two runs in an inning only four times this season. Oklahoma scored a season-high six runs in the third inning in a win against Northeastern (2/21). The Sooners last plated more than two men in an inning against Abilene Christian (2/24). OU pitchers have limited the opposition to scoring more than twice in an inning six times. The Sooners have allowed three runs in the first or second inning four times this season.

One-Hit Shutout...

In his second career start, freshman RHP **Chris Andritsos** threw seven innings of shutout, one-hit ball. He retired the first eight Central Arkansas (3/1) batters of the game before allowing the only hit of the day in the third. The Sooners totaled six hits in the win, including solo home runs from **Sheldon Neuse** and **Cody Thomas**. Freshman RHP **Connor Berry** finished the game with two-scoreless innings of relief to earn the first save of his career, while tallying three strikeouts. The win marked the first shutout for OU since beating Alcorn State (4/22/15), 8-0. The Sooners have shutout UCA in back-to-back seasons by a score of 10-0. Andritsos has totaled 12 innings and 11 strikeouts in two starts with only two hits against and one run.

In 2015, Sooner baseball alums combined to start 68 games on the mound in Major League Baseball. That total ranks the second highest among NCAA teams; second only to Long Beach State (70). Fresh Faces...

Coach Hughes started a season-high six freshmen in the lineup against Wichita State (3/8), including RHP **Kyle Tyler** making his first career start. The Sooners have started three or more freshmen in each of the last three games and four times this season.

Playing Horseshoes...

Six of Oklahoma's seven losses have come by two runs or less. The Sooners are 0-4 in one-run games and 1-2 in two-run games. In 2015, OU won 10 one-run games and went 14-12 when games were decided by two runs or less.

Against the West...

Under head coach Pete Hughes, the Sooners are 4-2 against schools from California. When playing against teams from the Pacific or Hawaii Time Zones, OU is 10-7. When playing in the Pacific of Hawaii Time Zones, the Oklahoma is 8-4. In the last two seasons, the Sooners have played seven of the 11 Pac-12 schools and posted a 3-4 record.

Road Test...

Gearing the schedule toward the RPI. Oklahoma plays 30 games away from L. Dale Mitchell Park, which includes the Bedlam Series hosted by Oklahoma State and a game at Dodger Stadium against Mississippi State. It is the most for the Sooners since 1999 when they played 32 games away from home. The last three times that Oklahoma went on the road 28 times or more in a season, the Sooners hosted a regional in Norman in 2006, 2009 and 2010.

Turf and Turf...

Through nine games. Oklahoma had played every game on a synthetic turf field. The Sooners are 4-2 at home on L. Dale Mitchell Park's new AstroTurf® surface. The first road trip of the season saw OU play on Sam Houston State's newly resurfaced Don Sander Stadium. The Sooners played their first game on natural grass this season last Friday at USC's Dedeaux Field.

Major League Diamonds...

Since the Big 12 Championship was last hosted in Arlington at Globe Life Park (Ameriquest Field at the time) in 2004, Oklahoma has played at a Major League Baseball park five times. The Sooners are 3-1-1 in such games following a tie vs. Mississippi State (3/6). OU most recently defeated UT-Arlington (3/11/14), 3-2 in 10 innings, in Arlington. In 2008, Oklahoma went 2-1 at the Houston College Classic at Minute Maid Park. The Sooners lost the opener to Rice (2/29/08), 7-2, before picking ups wins over Houston (3/1/08) and Tennessee (3/2/08) by scores of 8-5 in 10 innings and 2-0.

Going Back to Cali...

Oklahoma makes its second trip to the west coast next week for a five-game road swing. The Sooners play Fresno State in the midweek on Tuesday before heading to CSU Bakersfield for a four-game set beginning on Thursday.

19 Ways Moves Beyond OU...

Head coach **Pete Hughes** started the 19 Ways community service initiative while at Virginia Tech as a tribute to his late mother. Alice. Since bringing the program to OU, 19 Ways has expanded to eight programs across the country aiming to impact their community in 19 different ways throughout the academic year. This offseason, Northeastern became the eighth program to start its own 19 Ways. Opening day marks the second time Oklahoma has faced another program with a 19 Ways initiative; the first being Notre Dame on opening weekend 2015.

New Field; Same Tradition...

Completion of the new synthetic turf field at L. Dale Mitchell Park on January 15 made OU the sixth team in the Big 12 with a turf playing surface. The surface is made of AstroTurf® 3D Xtreme and covers 150,000 square feet. The turf holds 351,000 lbs. of sand, 180,400 lbs. of rubber, covers 4,100 linear feet of drainage and can handle 4-6 inches of rain per hour. Among 61 power conference teams, 26 play on a turf field. Since 2011, 21 NCAA Regionals have been hosted on a turf playing field, while 12 teams with a home field of synthetic turf have appeared in the College World Series over that time.

Opening Day Starters...

Jake Elliott made his second opening day start on Friday. He became the first OU pitcher to start back-to-back opening days since **Dillon Overton** (2012-13). As a sophomore, Elliott became the first righty to start opening day for Oklahoma since Michael Rocha (2011). He was also the third sophomore to earn the nod in the four years after **Jacob Evans** (2014) and **Dillon Overton** (2012).

Oklahoma posted its best home run total since 2011 with 39 in 2015. Since the inception of the BBCOR bat to college baseball in 2011, the Sooners season-high is 41 in 2011. **Sheldon Neuse** is OU's active career leader with 16 followed by **Hunter Haley** at 12.

Season Openers...

Since 1962, Oklahoma is 36-19 on opening day and 24-3 when playing the first game of the season at home, including 23-2 at L. Dale Mitchell Park. All-time in home openers, the Sooners are 49-6 going back to 1962, including 33-2 at L. Dale Mitchell.

Prospect Watch: 2016...

Several 2016 MLB Draft prospects highlight the Sooners' junior class just one year after OU claimed the nation's largest draft class. **Alec Hansen** rates near the top of most experts' draft boards entering opening day. Sheldon Neuse and Jake Elliott have also garnered their share of attention at the start of their draft-year.

Oklahoma is Home...

The Sooner roster features 11 players from within the state's borders and 11 from Texas. This season marks the most Oklahoma born players at OU since 12 in 2012 and the first time with as many or more players from Oklahoma than Texas since 2006. In 2006, 13 Sooner players called Oklahoma home, while just five were from Texas.

Opening the Gates...

Oklahoma broke its own opening weekend attendance record set in 2015 with 4,466 passing through the gates at L. Dale Mitchell Park to see the Sooners face Northeastern in 2016. The 2015 opening weekend attendance set a record for the first series of the season at 4,181. The single-game attendance record on opening day was set after the 1994 CWS National Championship team returned home to face Missouri Southern in front of a crowd of 2,183 in 1995.

Senior outfielder **Hunter Haley** entered the 2016 season with 12 home runs and 27 stolen bases in his career. Over the last decade, he is one of just three players at OU to record 10 home runs and 25 steals in a career. **Max White** (2010-13) and **Jamie Johnson** (2008-09) are the other two in the last 10 years. White hit 23 homers and swiped 29 bags, while Johnson posted 18 and 38.

Raising the Academic Standard...

Eleven OU baseball student-athletes were honored by the Big 12 for All-Academic Team recognition in 2015. It is the most for the Sooners in a single season since the league's inaugural season of 1997 when 12 earned the distinction. In the fall 2015 semester, the Sooners boasted a program-record 3.27 cumulative grade-point average.

Kings of the K...

The Sooner pitching staff led the Big 12 in the regular season with 481 strikeouts and averaged 8.58 per nine innings; both of which ranked second by the end of the postseason.

- Alec Hansen struck out 10 vs. Texas Tech (3/22) and led all Big 12 pitchers with 94 through the regular season and finished third.
- Jake Elliott finished seventh in the league at 80. OU pitchers combined to strike out 10-plus 26 times in 2015.
- OU surpassed 500 strikeouts for the fourth time in six seasons and fifth time in program history with 524; which ranks fourth all-time.

Working Deep...

OU pitchers combined to pitch through the sixth 29 times in 61 games during 2015, including 13 starts through the seventh. Jake Elliott led the team with nine six-plus inning starts and Alec Han**sen** tossed six. In 2014, OU starters pitched through the sixth just 15 times in 58 games.

CONFERENCE NOTES

- TCU remains atop the league standings and ranked in the top 10 nationally as the Frogs sit as high as No. 7 entering the fourth week of play.
- Along with the Frogs, Oklahoma State ranks in the top 25, sitting as high as No. 22.
- Week four action features 26 contests with Texas (at No. 14 UCLA) and Texas Tech (at No. 9 California) taking on ranked opponents on the road. TCU is also in on the Pac-I2 action, hosting USC for a three-game series this weekend. The Big I2 and Pac-I2 have faced off in 2I games so far this season.
- Conference play kicks off next week with a pair of series slated for the weekend of March 18 - Texas Tech at Baylor and West Virginia at TCU.
- Eight of the nine league teams have faced at least two ranked opponents on the season with a total of 19 games against ranked squads at the time of the meeting.
- K-State improved to 7-4 with a series sweep over Arkansas Pine Bluff over the weekend. The 'Cats scored 46 runs which marked the most in a threegame set since 2005 as they batted .4II in the series.
- TCU is one of two teams nationally that ranks in the top 15 in ERA and batting. The Frogs top the nation with a 1.23 ERA.
- Brian Howard (TCU) and Ross Vance (West Virginia) are among 55 pitchers nationally with three victories on the year.
- The league is a combined 55-46-I with I8 of its 40 losses by three runs or less. Big I2 teams combined for a I8-I8-I record in week three action with 12 of those loses by three runs or less, including six by one run. Of the 105 conference contests played in 2015, 62 were determined by three runs or less (59 percent).
- With his second accolade on the young season, TCU's Luken Baker becomes the first Frog to win Newcomer of the Week honors multiple times in the year season since TCU joined the league in 2013.
